HOCKEY OPERATIONS



DON WADDELLPRESIDENT OF HOCKEY OPERATIONS AND ALTERNATE GOVERNOR

Don Waddell was named the president of hockey operations, general manager and alternate governor for the Columbus Blue Jackets on May 29, 2024. He oversees all hockey operations activities for the club.

Prior to Columbus, Waddell spent the past

10 years with the Carolina Hurricanes, serving as team president from 2014-18 and as team president and general manager from 2018-24. Over the last six seasons, Carolina compiled a 278-130-44 record to rank second in the NHL in points percentage (.664; Boston - .695) and third in wins (Boston - 289, Tampa Bay - 283). The Hurricanes won three division titles (2021-Central, 2022 and 2023-Metropolitan), advanced to the Stanley Cup Playoffs each year and earned trips to the Eastern Conference Finals twice (2019, 2023) during that time. Prior to his taking over as general manager, Carolina had missed the playoffs in 11 of the 12 previous seasons.

Waddell began his NHL career in 1997-98 and won a Stanley Cup championship as an assistant general manager with the Detroit Red Wings. The following year, he joined the expansion Atlanta Thrashers as vice president of hockey operations and general manager and would serve in that role until 2010 when he was named team president. He also served as executive vice president and co-chair of the executive committee of the Atlanta Spirit, the parent company of the Thrashers, the National Basketball Association's Atlanta Hawks and Philips Arena. He then had a three-year stint as a consultant and pro scout with the Pittsburgh Penguins before arriving in Carolina in 2014.

The Detroit, Michigan native also has served in several capacities with USA Hockey during his career. In 2013, he was named international consultant with a special focus on player identification and interface with the U.S. National Junior Team and USA Hockey's National Team Development Program. He served as general manager for Team USA at the 2006 Winter Olympic Games in Torino, Italy, and at the 2001, 2002 and 2005 International Ice Hockey Federation (IIHF) World Championships. As a player, he helped Team USA to win the gold medal at the 1983 IIHF World Championships.


Prior to embarking on his NHL management career, Waddell spent a decade as executive vice president and general manager of International Hockey League (IHL) franchises in San Diego (1990-95) and Orlando (1995-97) and was twice named IHL Executive of the Year (1992-93, 1995-96). In Orlando, he was vice president of RDV Sports and served on the executive committee that oversaw the NBA's Orlando Magic, the IHL's Orlando Solar Bears and the company's retail and aviation interests.

Waddell played four seasons of Division I collegiate hockey as a defenseman and majored in business management at Northern Michigan University from 1976-80. He was a seventh-round pick of the Los Angeles Kings at the 1978 NHL Draft and spent three years with the organization. He went on to play parts of nine seasons as a professional, mostly in the IHL. He also served as head coach of the IHL's San Diego Gulls in 1991-92 and was interim head coach of the Thrashers on two occasions (2002-03, 2007-08) during his tenure with the club.





HOCKEY OPERATIONS



JOHN DAVIDSON SENIOR ADVISOR AND ALTERNATE GOVERNOR

John Davidson currently serves as a senior advisor and alternate governor for the Columbus Blue Jackets. He previously served as president of hockey operations for the club from October 24, 2012 to May 17, 2019 and when he rejoined the organization on May 20,

2021 through May 28, 2024.

During his initial tenure with the club, the Blue Jackets posted a 285-209-46 record (.570 pct.) over seven seasons, registering 42-plus wins in five of the last six campaigns and earning four Stanley Cup Playoff berths. Columbus enjoyed the best season in franchise history in 2016-17 with a 50-24-8 mark (108 pts.) and in 2018-19 swept the Presidents' Trophy-winning Tampa Bay Lightning, 4-0, in the Eastern Conference Quarterfinals to record the first playoff series win in club history.

Davidson spent the 2019-20 and 2020-21 seasons as president of hockey operations for the New York Rangers. The team went 64-51-11 over that span and posted back-to-back winning seasons for the first time since 2015-17.

Davidson also spent six years as president of hockey operations with the St. Louis Blues from 2006-12. He joined a Blues team that posted a 21-46-15 record (57 pts.) in 2005-06 and led a turnaround that saw the club average 39 wins and 90 points per season, culminating with a 49-22-11 mark (109 pts.) and Central Division championship in 2011-12.

Prior to his successful management career, Davidson enjoyed a long and distinguished broadcast career that earned him the prestigious Foster Hewitt Memorial Award for outstanding contributions as a hockey broadcaster by The Hockey Hall of Fame, into which he was inducted on Nov. 9, 2009 and for whom he is the past chairman of the Hall's selection committee. The NHL and USA Hockey honored Davidson with the Lester Patrick Award for his contributions to ice hockey in the United States in March 2004.



BASIL MCRAE ASSISTANT GENERAL MANAGER

Basil McRae was named assistant general manager for the Columbus Blue Jackets on June 13, 2019 after serving the previous three seasons as director of player personnel. He also was a scout for the club in 2013-14.

McRae, who has been a part owner of the Ontario Hockey League's London Knights

since 2000, also spent two years as alternate governor and general manager of the OHL club from 2014-16. London captured OHL and Memorial Cup

championships in 2016. Prior to his original stint in Columbus, McRae served as a scout for the St. Louis Blues for five seasons.

In addition to two decades of scouting experience, McRae played 16 seasons in the NHL between 1981-96, registering 53 goals and 83 assists for 136 points with 2,453 penalty minutes in 576 games with the Quebec Nordiques, Toronto Maple Leafs, Detroit Red Wings, Minnesota North Stars, Tampa Bay Lightning, St. Louis Blues and Chicago Blackhawks.

The Beaverton, Ontario native was a fifth round pick of Quebec in the 1980 NHL Draft.



JOSH FLYNN ASSISTANT GENERAL MANAGER

Josh Flynn was named assistant general manager for the Blue Jackets on June 13, 2019 after previously serving as the director of hockey administration. He is responsible for assisting in all facets of the hockey operations department, including salary cap management,

contract negotiations and research, salary arbitration, statistical research and strategic planning, and is the club's liaison to the National Hockey League on matters pertaining to the NHL-NHLPA collective bargaining agreement.

Flynn joined the Blue Jackets hockey operations department in June 2008 after spending the previous two seasons with KO Sports Agency in Denver, Colorado, where he worked on contract negotiations for several NHL players represented by the agency.

Flynn was born on December 8, 1982 in Toronto, Ontario. He received a bachelor's degree in political science from the University of Toronto in 2004 and earned his Juris Doctorate from the Sturm College of Law at the University of Denver in 2007.



CHRIS CLARK DIRECTOR OF PLAYER PERSONNEL AND GM OF THE CLEVELAND MONSTERS

Chris Clark was promoted to director of player personnel for the Blue Jackets on June 13, 2019 after spending the previous seven seasons with the club as a development coach and most recently its drector of player development.

While continuing to be involved with the

development of players throughout the organization, he also has an active role in evaluating personnel at the NHL level and serves as the general manager of the Cleveland Monsters, the club's American Hockey League affiliate, leading the club to its first division title in franchise history in 2023-24.

Internationally, Clark served as general manager of the United States Men's National Team that competed at the 2023 IIHF World Championships in Tampere, Finland.

A native of South Windsor, Connecticut, Clark registered 103-111-214 and 700 penalty minutes in 607 career NHL games with the Blue Jackets, Washington Capitals and Calgary Flames, including 8-12-20 and 59 penalty minutes in 89 games with Columbus from 2009-11. He spent four-plus seasons with the Capitals, tallying 60-63-123 and 278 penalty minutes in 240 games with the club and served as captain from 2006-09.

Calgary's third round pick, 77th overall, in the 1994 NHL Draft, Clark earned All-ECAC honors during four seasons at Clarkson University from 1994-98. He then spent six seasons in the Flames organization from 1998-04, and helped the club reach the 2004 Stanley Cup Final.

HOCKEY OPERATIONS



RICK NASH DIRECTOR OF PLAYER DEVELOPMENT

Rick Nash was named the club's director of player development in June 2021 after joining the organization as a special assistant to the general manager on June 13, 2019.

Nash supervises the club's development coaches, oversees the progress of prospects throughout the organization and provides

feedback to management on player advancement.

Internationally, Nash served as general manager of Canada's Men's National Team at the recently completed 2024 IIHF World Championships in Czechia.

Nash spent his first nine NHL seasons with Columbus after the club selected him with the first overall pick at the 2002 NHL Draft and served as the club's captain from 2008-12. He is the franchise's all-time leader in games played, goals, assists and points as he registered 289-258-547 and 568 penalty minutes in 674 games from 2002-12. On Mar. 5, 2022, he became the first player in franchise history to have his number - 61- retired.

Nash was a finalist for the Calder Memorial Trophy as the NHL's top rookie and an All-Rookie Team selection in 2002-03. He won the Maurice "Rocket" Richard Trophy as the NHL's top goal scorer in 2003-04 when he notched 41-16-57 in 80 games and received the NHL Foundation Player Award in 2008-09 for his contributions off the ice and in the community. He appeared in five All-Star Games as a Blue Jacket (2004, 2007, 2008, 2009, 2011) and one as a Ranger (2015). In 1,060 career NHL games, he tallied 437-368-805 and 750 penalty minutes with the Blue Jackets, New York Rangers and Boston Bruins.

The Brampton, Ontario native was a stalwart for Canada in international competition as he represented his country at three Olympic Games (2006, 2010-gold and 2014-gold), four IIHF World Championships (2005-silver, 2007-gold, 2008-silver, 2011) and one IIHF World Junior Championship (2002-silver).



VILLE SIREN DIRECTOR OF AMATEUR SCOUTING

Ville Siren was named director of amateur scouting of the Columbus Blue Jackets on July 6, 2016 after serving as the club's head amateur scout since joining the organization on July 8, 2013.

Siren spent nine seasons as a member

of the St. Louis Blues scouting staff from 2003-13. During that time, he was instrumental in the club's selection of current NHL players such as Vladimir Tarasenko (1st Rd., 2010), Lars Eller (1st Rd., 2007), Patrik Berglund (1st Rd., 2006), Nikita Nikitin (5th Rd., 2004) and Roman Polak (6th Rd., 2004).

Prior to joining the Blues, he spent the 2002-03 season working with Tampere of the Finnish Elite League and scouted for the Washington

Capitals from 1999-2002. A defenseman, Siren was selected by the Hartford Whalers in the second round, 23rd overall, at the 1983 NHL Draft and made his NHL debut with the Pittsburgh Penguins during the 1985-86 season. He went on to register 14 goals and 68 assists for 82 points with 276 penalty minutes in 290 career NHL games with the Penguins and Minnesota North Stars from 1985-90.

He also played nine seasons in Finland, Sweden and Switzerland before retiring in 1999, and represented Finland in numerous international competitions including the 1984 and 1992 Olympic Games, 1987 and 1991 Canada Cup tournaments, 1983 and 1984 World Junior Championships and 1985, 1991 and 1993 World Championships.



TREVOR TIMMINS ASSISTANT DIRECTOR OF AMATEUR SCOUTING

Trevor Timmins joined the Columbus Blue Jackets as assistant director of amateur scouting in 2022, bringing nearly three decades of NHL experience to the club's hockey operations department.

Timmins comes to Columbus after

spending two decades with the Montreal Canadiens, joining the

organization in 2002 as director of player development. In 2013-14, he served as director of player personnel and the following year was named vice president of player personnel. He served as the club's assistant general manager from 2017-21.

Prior to joining the Canadiens, the Almonte, Ontario native was a member of the Ottawa Senators organization for 10 years, including as the club's director of player development from 1998-02.

Scouts like Levshunov's finesse and poise, particularly with the puck. "He's big, he's strong, he competes and he makes plays," one scout said. "Levshunov has done nothing but improve all year long, playing at a really high level against older players."

It's expected Levshunov will sign immediately with the team that drafts him, making him a one-and-done player in the NCAA. The only question is whether he'll be a full-time player at the NHL level or will require AHL seasoning.

One scout said if Levshunov had been free to create more offense, he probably would've had 20 more points. "I see a lot of Noah Dobson in him," another scout said. "He can make plays, and he has a good sense of patience. He won't force things. He has so much ability to play the game that's in front of him."

But Parekh also impressed NHL decision-makers with his gumption. "Last year, in the playoffs against Flint, he got targeted, and it was almost like Slap Shot," said one scout. "He took a pounding and kept getting back up. Any doubts on whether he'll make the transition to the NHL after that series went away for me. He's never going to be a shutdown guy, but there's a place for him because of everything else. When he gets the puck in his zone, it's getting out one way or another. He's near an elite offensive defenseman."

This year, he wasn't just the OHL's top-scoring D-man. he tied for sixth overall. "He creates off the rush, distributes on the power play and gets pucks on net," said another scout. "He has great hands. His offensive instincts are highly developed. The defense is concerning, but if you're drafting Parekh, you know what he brings to the table."



"He's one of those guys people won't know who will probably go higher than people think," one scout said. "Some team might get a steal."

Artamonov makes up for his skating with great hockey sense and offensive-zone playmaking ability. One scout said there isn't much separating him and the higher-ranked Ivan Demidov. "(Artamonov) might be the smartest Russian in this draft, and that's saying something," another said. "This guy's sense is really good, and he has really good compete."

Countless NHLers have ironed out skating issues with the help of specialized coaches, and any team that drafts Artamonov will set him up with somebody right away.



He's really strong on his skates, and he gives an honest effort."

Miettinen has good size and makes an impact with his netfront presence. His skating will have to get better. It shouldn't be a detriment at the next level, however, because he's smart and works hard. "I like him," another scout said. "I was impressed with how he adjusted to the North American game."

"He scored goals and made plays, and he's very smart," one scout said. "He's not the biggest guy, and he's not the fastest guy. But he's one of the smartest guys, and he has really good hands."

There are concerns about his speed but not his ability to make an offensive impact. Parascak makes up for his skating with elite skill and a deceptive release. "He has the ability to change release points and shoot in stride," another scout said. "He's not a speedster, but he's great with the puck. He has good sense with and without the puck."

And therein lies the rub. In a vacuum, the Providence commit could go high, but teams are weary of how controversial additions impact NHL dressing rooms (e.g. the Bruins and another Tri-City product, Mitchell Miller). So, would a scout vouch for Connelly in the first round? "Probably not," said another scout. "All I can do is tell them what he does on the ice and give them information about him off the ice. It's a hard sell."

He can find the seam pass for a one-timer and finds open ice for himself. He's great on the power play, too. He's a significant player for Medicine Hat."

Basha's late 2005 birthday meant he wasn't eligible for the world under-18s with Canada, but he did have a good showing at the CHL Top. Prospects Game in Moncton and brings a solid package of skills to the table. "He has excellent speed and can create off the rush," said another scout. "He's got quick hands and a quick shot. He's a dangerous offensive threat. He needs to round out his twoway play for the next level."

He's hard in on the forecheck, hard on the backcheck. He understands the position."

After Guelph was ousted in the first round of the OHL playoffs, Luchanko took his talents to the world under-18s with Team Canada.

"He's talented, but the injuries this year really hurt him." one scout said. "He has really good skill, but he's selfish. He doesn't use his linemates very well. Once you get rid of that selfishness and he learns to distribute the puck better, maybe you have something there."

Ritchie is skilled and a superb skater, and he scored at almost a point-per-game pace when healthy. He also finished better than he started. leading to the hope that that's a portent of things to come.

The perception among scouts is that when he's engaged, Ritchie can be a contributor. "Some games you watch him, and unless he's got the puck and he's bursting down the wing, he's not really too interested," another scout said. "He's a one-way player with good speed and skill."

"He quietly put up significant numbers," said one scout. "He was maybe a little inconsistent early, but he has deceptive speed, a good shot and a quick release. He plays pretty well away from the puck. Those Brantford kids are well-coached. This guy is probably going to score at every level he plays at. We're just scratching the surface on what he could become."

What talent hawks really like is the effort is always there, and Vanacker's skill set screams "pro" all day long. "He looks bigger than he's listed," said another scout. "He thinks fast, skates fast and moves pucks fast. Hove his pace. He's got some jam. He's not afraid to finish hits. He has good puck skills and a good shot. Vanacker just plays the game and never disappoints you."

I think he'll be a winger in the NHL, but, at this level, he's so responsible. He's a big guy in great condition. He plays hard, and he plays both ends of the ice. Even when he doesn't score, he never lets you down. Such an honest player"

After winning gold with Canada at 2023 Hlinka Gretzky, he hooked up with the national side again at the world U-18s in April. "He's one of the best in the draft in terms of work ethic on and off the ice," said another scout. "The skating needs to improve, but it's not an issue, because he competes so hard and has shown offensive ability as well. Probably the best example of a prototypical power forward in the draft for the OHL."

perspective, the good news is that once Elick figures out what kind of player he wants to be, he has the size and tools to make an impact. The bad news is that he's not there just yet.

The learning curve continues for Elick, who was excellent at last summer's U-18 Hlinka Gretzky Cup and this year's under-18 worlds. "He's a good skater, and in a couple of years, he's going to be a power-based defenseman who has above-average agility" one scout said. "He does run over guys. Some kids who have an identity crisis don't like the physical stuff, but this kid has no issue with that. He's big, heavy, makes impactful hits, and he'll block shots."

Part of the issue for scouts is that Elick wants to make plays with the puck, but that isn't a big part of his skill set. "He's a big body on the back end who can really skate," another scout said. "His puck game is probably limited. To be successful, he'll have to be more of a shutdown defenseman. I don't see him being a big offensive guy."

Howe didn't put up quite as many points as he did playing with Bedard, but he finished 25 points ahead of the player who finished second in scoring on a weak Regina team. Now, if there were only something he could do about his size. "The poor kid is just small, plain and simple," one scout said. "There's nothing he doesn't do well. He's a high-energy guy who is really competitive and plays bigger than his size. You just love his compete level."

Scouts also like Howe's versatility. He can play in all situations – including taking draws on the PK – and can line up at either wing or center. Most of his success comes from determination and a willingness to do what it takes to overcome his lack of size. "He's a pro with a promentality," another scout said. "If you're not worried about the size factor, I think this guy finds a way to play for you."

"I'm a Lucas Pettersson guy," one scout said. "You'd like him to be a little bigger and stronger, but he comes from a good hockey background. I think as an NHL player, he fits somewhere on the second or third line."

Pettersson was a prolific scorer at the junior level this season, and, like so many other players from Sweden, he knows his way around the defensive side of the ice. "He plays a more mature defensive game than a lot of players his age," one scout said. "And because he's in the right position and he's smart, he's able to make solid plays that lead to bigger results. He can provide offense, but he's going to be really good defensively. He's above average in almost every area."

ADAM **Jecho**

He certainly has the size and talent set to be an impact player, and there are times when he is just that. But too often, Jecho was ineffective for long periods of time. "A lot of our guys think he's soft," one scout said. "I have seen snippets of compete, but I haven't seen any games where he competed from start to finish. It's actually a little off-putting."

Added another scout: "He's a big body, and he has some skill, but he doesn't come across as a guy who wants to pay the price to get things done. His compete level as it is right now is not going to get him to the NHI."

Some of that lackluster effort might have been due to the fact he played for a bottom-feeding Oil Kings team this season. But if Jecho does manage to raise his compete level, he could be a very intriguing prospect with an NHL future.

"He's big, strong and smart, and he has good skills, but his skating is just average," one scout said. "And the work ethic doesn't make the skating a non-factor. If a guy works his butt off, he can overcome skating issues, but Max doesn't always work hard enough to overcome his skating."

Scouts were encouraged by Masse's increased level of urgency and better play in the second half. His size also helps him be strong on the puck, and he has a good shot. "He finds a way to get where he needs to be, and he has no issues going to the net," another scout said. "For me, he's a mid-second-round guy, and he has the potential to be a good, solid third-line player."

Surin is something of a mystery man, since North American-based scouts have never had the chance to see him play live. But they know he's capable of putting up gaudy numbers. In 61 regularseason and playoff games in Russia's top junior league this season, Surin had 75 points.

Teams will have more of a chance to dig in on Surin in the days leading up to the draft, when he and several other Russian and Belarusian players will take part in a showcase in Florida, "We like him." one scout said. "He's a wild card in that he has some good hockey sense and skill, and he plays with an edge. He could go anywhere, but somebody is getting a pretty good player." Added another scout: "The base thing for him is excellent skill and excellent sense. His skating is just OK.'

SAHLIN WALLENIUS

His calling card is his skating, particularly when going in a straight line. Even though his vitals don't indicate it, scouts see Sahlin Wallenius as undersized. "He's got tweener-type size," one scout said. "But he's smooth, and sometimes these kids grow."

Sahlin Wallenius has put up impressive offensive numbers, both in Sweden's junior league and international competition. At an under-18 Five Nations event in February, he tied for the team scoring lead with seven points, as the Swedes won all four games en route to winning the tournament.

Some scouts see a player who needs to think the game faster, especially if he's going to continue to play at an elevated pace. "Sometimes, his skating and skill outpace his sense," another scout said. "When you're playing as fast as he does, you have to process things a little more quickly. He needs to simplify his game a little."

POTKKINENJESSE

FOR A PLAYER who went undrafted last year – and did so as a late 2004 birthday – Pulkkinen is still very much a project. But it's an exciting project.

"He has lots of skill, and he loves to deke and make others look foolish when he has the puck," said one scout. "But there's also some hardness to his game. When things get tough, he's not going to shy away. He doesn't throw his way. He doesn't throw his but when he wants to destroy someone, he'll do it."

The huge frame and high-end puck skills are obvious strengths. But he's still considered raw because, last year, evaluators saw a player who just didn't take things seriously. This season, Pulkkinen has made a remarkable turnaround.

"I've never seen something like that before," said another scout. "It's fascinating and confusing. You could compare him to Dustin Byfuglien. This guy can make unbelievable game-breaking plays and has the physical element where I've seen him lay some heavy hits and reverse hits."

Vinni was Finland's thirdstringer at the 2024 WJC but didn't see game action. His late 2005 birthday also meant he was too old to play at this year's world under-18s, though he was there last year. Vinni has been on the radar in Finland for a while, and the past couple of years have been up and down. "I still think he's very talented, but there are question marks about his personality," said another scout. "Some good, some bad. He needs to mature and grow up mentally, but he's passionate and has good size. He's a high-end talent."

Gill is a smart player with good hockey sense, and scouts like his competitive drive. He has worked on his defensive game over the course of this season, and the sense is it will continue to improve.

It's fair to describe Gill as a raw talent who has room for improvement. How much he embraces that challenge will determine his NHL future.

"He has a chance to be very good when he fills out" one scout said. "We love his hockey sense and his compete, and he just makes smart play after smart play in a pretty big body. I don't think he's a high-end offensive guy, but he makes a good first pass to clear the zone. Once he thickens up and fills out. I think he can be a very good No. 4 or 5 defenseman.

Kleber was the top-scoring blueliner on a Lincoln team that squeaked into the USHL playoffs, though his stats were modest compared to some of the league's flashier D-men.

Committed to Minnesota-Duluth, Kleber is going to a program known for developing blueliners of all stripes, such as Dylan Samberg, Scott Perunovich and Wyatt Kaiser. This season was vital for Kleber's growth "He's taken a nice step," another scout said. "He's going to play and be a bottom-pair, PK guy. There's limited upside. What you see is what you get. It will depend on his ability to process the play in the 'D' zone and make a good first pass, if he can improve there."

the WHL's green jacket this season, but let's just say that late in the season, he was having his measurements taken. In the end, Roberts' minus-30 fied for 10th-worst in the league.

Some of that had to do with the fact he was charged with playing a lot of tough minutes for a middling Giants team against the opponents' best players. And some of it had to do with what scouts see as an unrefined game. "He plays a sloppy game that seems to have a lot of highs and lows," one scout said. "He's probably going to have to be a defensefirst guy. He's a little above average in a lot of areas, but there's no defining trait."

There is definitely some potential there with his size. but a lot of work lies ahead in developing the fundamentals of his game. If meat and potatoes are on a team's draft menu, though, Roberts could be an intriguing prospect. "He's a big guy who's pretty basic and clean," another scout said. "He's not a bad skater, but he can sometimes get beaten by speed."

play as an underager, Kivihariu came into the season as a potential top-10 pick. But a serious knee injury wiped out almost his entire campaign, and it's not the first time he's had that issue.

Luckily, he returned for the world under-18s, so NHL evaluators did get a look. "It Tooked like he didn't miss a beat with his skill and IQ," one scout said. "But the speed hasn't improved since the start, which is understandable given the injury he had."

That's one of the knocks on Kiviharju. His lack of size is another. But there are reasons to be tempted by the kid, who played nearly half of 2022-23 in the Liiga and captained Finland at the U-18s this year.

"Everybody knows how good he is, and he's a delightful, bright kid," another scout said. "No question marks there. A smallish defenseman who's not a great skater, but he is a really good player, so what's the forecast? How good can he be despite his physical limitations? Somebody is going to take him, but when? It will be very interesting."
