

**FLAMES LAST GAME RECAP****March 7, 2024 – CALGARY FLAMES [6] at TAMPA BAY [3]**[Game Summary](#) | [Event Summary](#)

The Calgary Flames travelled to Tampa Bay to begin a three-game road trip against the Lightning. The teams would trade goals in the first with Dryden Hunt opening the scoring for Calgary with his second of the year, before Tampa Bay tied things in the latter stages of the frame to knot things at one through 20. In the second, two Yegor Sharangovich goals, along with Jakob Pelletier's first of the season saw the Flames extend their lead to 4-1. Tampa would get one back before the end of the middle stanza, but in the third, Blake Coleman and Andrew Mangiapane iced things, and the Flames left Tampa with a 6-3 win.

TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS

This is the second and final meeting this season between the Flames and Panthers. Calgary knocked off Florida 3-1 in these clubs' first meeting in Calgary on December 18th.

This is a Pacific Division versus Atlantic matchup; the Flames have a record of 8-4-1 against Atlantic Division teams and a record of 13-11-2 against Eastern Conference opponents.

DEADLINE DAY BREAKDOWN:

The Flames made two transactions on trade deadline day. First, the Flames extended centre Kevin Rooney to a one-year, 1.3M contract, keeping him in Calgary until the end of the 2024-25 season. Next, the Flames acquired Nikita Okhotiuk from the San Jose Sharks in exchange for a fifth-round pick in the 2024 NHL Draft. Okhotiuk, a 23-year-old, has skated in 43 games with the San Jose Sharks this season, scoring one goal and seven assists for eight points along with 44 penalty minutes. He made his NHL debut on April 21st, 2022 and has 58 games of NHL experience split between San Jose and New Jersey with three goals and eight assists for 11 points. The 6'1" rearguard spent three seasons with the OHL's Ottawa 67's, where he accumulated 47 points (10G, 37A) through 148 games with a +72 career plus/minus in junior. Okhotiuk helped guide the 67's to the 2019 OHL Finals, playing in all 18 playoff games for Ottawa.

FIRST MEETING:

The Calgary Flames welcomed the Florida Panthers to the Scotiabank Saddledome back on December 18th. Both teams would find the back of the net in the opening 20, with Martin Pospisil giving the Flames a 1-0 lead midway through the first before Sam Reinhart evened the score with 31 seconds remaining in the frame and the teams skated into the break knotted at ones. The middle stanza would see 16 shots between the two teams, but nobody would score, and this game remained deadlocked at one a piece. In the final frame, Mikael Backlund would shelf a backhander over the glove of Anthony Stolarz to give the Flames a 2-1 lead. Blake Coleman would add an empty netter, and the Flames would these clubs first meeting 3-1.

THE ROON-DOG:

The Calgary Flames announced yesterday the signing of centre Kevin Rooney to a one-year contract extension. Rooney, a native of Canton, Massachusetts has played in 13 games for the Flames this season after missing the first four months of the campaign with a shoulder injury. The 30-year-old scored his first goal as a Flame on February 8th against New Jersey and has accrued 240 games in his NHL career, split between the New Jersey Devils, the New York Rangers, and the Calgary Flames. Rooney's extension carries an AAV of 1.3M.

SHARKNADO:

Yegor Sharangovich recorded his fifth multi-goal game as a member of the Flames on Thursday night in Tampa Bay to increase his goal total to 25 on the campaign. The Minsk, BLE native also registered two assists to register a four-point performance, the first Calgary player with as many points in a game since Tyler Toffoli (2-2—4 at VGK on March 16, 2023) and first four-point effort of his career. Sharangovich is one of two players with 25-plus goals for a new team this season, alongside Tyler Toffoli (26 w/ NJD) – whom he was traded for in June, and his 10th multi-point game of 2023-24 is the fourth most among all Flames players this season behind Nazem Kadri (12), Blake Coleman (11) and Jonathan Huberdeau (11).

MIRO, MIRO ON THE WALL:

Daniil Miromanov, a native of Moscow, Russia, has played in four games with the Vegas Golden Knights so far this season, as well as five games for the AHL's Henderson Silver Knights where he has scored one goal and five assists for six points. The 26-year-old has 29 NHL games of experience with two goals and five assists for seven points in his career. Miromanov represented the Henderson Silver Knights at the 2023 AHL All-Star Classic and was a free agent signing by Vegas on March 16th, 2021. The Flames signed Miromanov to a two-year contract extension with an AAV of 1.25 million following his acquisition on Wednesday.



HELPING HAN-LEY:

Joel Hanley made his Calgary Flames debut on Thursday night in Tampa Bay, registering an assist in 17:42 of ice-time. The Flames claimed the blueliner off waivers from the Dallas Stars on Tuesday. The Keswick, Ontario, native skated in 32 games for Dallas this season, registering three assists along with 23 penalty minutes prior to joining Calgary. Since making his NHL debut on March 20th, 2016, the 32-year-old has played 184 NHL games with Montreal, Arizona, Dallas and Calgary.

HEY DID YOU KNOW?

In Calgary and Florida's first meeting, Mikael Backlund scored his 17th career shorthanded goal and surpassed Kent Nilsson (16) for sole possession of the second most in Flames history, behind only Theo Fleury (28).
