February 28, 2026 – **CALGARY FLAMES [0] vs. LOS ANGELES KINGS [2]**

The Calgary Flames suffered a 2–0 setback at the hands Los Angeles Kings on Saturday night at Crypto.com Arena. In a tightly checked game that featured no penalties for either side, the Flames generated 29 shots but were unable to solve Anton Forsberg, who turned aside every attempt. After a scoreless first period, Alex Laferriere broke the deadlock late in the second. Calgary pushed for an equalizer from there, but Adrian Kempe sealed the result with an empty-net goal in the final minute. Dustin Wolf was outstanding in between the pipes for the Flames, stopping 35 of 36 shots.

TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS

This is the second of four meetings this season between the Flames and Ducks. Calgary fell 4-3 in overtime to Anaheim in these clubs first matchup on January 25 at the Scotiabank Saddledome.

This is a Pacific Division matchup; the Flames have a record of 10-7-1 against Pacific Division teams and a record of 14-19-2 against Western Conference opponents.

FIRST MEETING WITH ANAHEIM:

The Calgary Flames earned a point in their first matchup with Anaheim on January 25 at the Scotiabank Saddledome, falling 4–3 in overtime. Calgary jumped out to a 2–0 advantage in the opening period, first Jonathan Huberdeau registered his ninth of the campaign before Hunter Brzustewicz scored his first NHL goal. Anaheim would equalize things in the middle frame, but Calgary regained the lead early in the third when Matt Coronato converted on a Flames powerplay. Anaheim would respond again later in the stanza to force overtime. In the extra frame, the Ducks scored 2:54 in. Matt Coronato finished with a goal and an assist, while Mikael Backlund, Adam Klapka, Joel Farabee, Nazem Kadri and Matvei Gridin all chipped in with helpers as Calgary outshot Anaheim 35–21 on the night.

DUCK HUNTERS:

The Flames enter tonight's contest with points in six-consecutive contests against the Anaheim Ducks, dating back to April 12, 2024. Since that game, the Flames are 4-0-2 against their Pacific Division foe, with Matt Coronato posting a team-leading seven points from four goals and three assists in Calgary's last six meetings with Anaheim.

HARVARD ALUMNI:

Tonight's matchup features two Harvard alumni with Anaheim's Alex Killorn and Calgary's Matt Coronato set to faceoff. Coronato spent the 2021-22 and 2022-23 campaigns with the Crimson, totaling 38 goals and 34 assists for 72 points in 68 contests for Harvard. Killorn spent four years at Harvard from 2008 to 2012, amassing 109 total points in 130 NCAA games. The pair accounted for two the 11 Harvard alumni who cracked opening-night rosters to begin 2025-26, with Crimson having the most alumni in the NHL among ECAC teams:

WEEGSY BABY:

MacKenzie Weegar enters today's game with 128 hits and 137 blocked shots on the campaign to rank as one of four defencemen in the league to eclipse 100 hits and blocks so far in 2025-26.

Weegar has also contributed offensively, recording assists four of his last five outings dating back to January 31. Earlier in February, he became the 15th defenceman in franchise history to reach the 150-point plateau, registering 35 goals and 116 assists through 302 games as a member of the Flames.



MAGIC NUMBER:

With their four-goal outburst against San Jose on February 26, the Calgary Flames have won 50-straight games when scoring four or more goals, dating back to December 16, 2023. Calgary is 13-0-0 this season when reaching or surpassing the four-goal mark in a game, having done so in their last two victories.

BACK-TO-BACKS:

The Calgary Flames are set to finish their seventh back-to-back set of the 2025–26 season following last night's 2-0 set back in Los Angeles. Calgary's last back-to-back set came at the start of the calendar year when visited Montreal on January 7th before travelling to Boston the following night. The Flames have two more back-to-back sets remaining this season after tonight and tomorrow, with their next coming on March 9 when they face the Washington Capitals at Capital One Arena before heading to Madison Square Garden to face the New York Rangers the following night. Calgary began their 2025-26 season with a back-to-back set and played four of their first five contests on the campaign in back-to-back scenarios.

KILLER CONFIDENCE:

The Calgary Flames went a perfect 3-for-3 on the PK on Thursday night in San Jose and enter tonight's contest with the NHL's third-best penalty kill unit since December 29, sitting at 88.1% on the kill over that span. In that timeframe, the Flames have successfully killed 40 of 45 shorthanded situations with the second-lowest powerplay goals against per game average in the NHL at 0.26.

MARCH MADNESS:

The Flames are set to kick off their March schedule, with the club playing 16 games through the month. Following tonight, the Flames will return to Calgary for a three game homestand before starting a five-game Eastern Conference road trip. Calgary has nine home games and seven road contests in March.

HEY DID YOU KNOW?

Anaheim Ducks defenceman Olen Zellweger was born in Calgary.
