ANAHEIM DUCKS POSTGAME NOTES

The Anaheim Ducks concluded a two-game homestand with a 3-1 win vs. the San Jose Sharks at Honda Center, improving to 2-1-0 at home in 2024-25.

The Ducks have won four straight games against the Sharks dating to Jan. 31. The last time Anaheim won four straight contests against the franchise was a 5-0-0 stretch from April 6, 2021 to March 6, 2022 (5-0-0).

LUKAS DOSTAL stopped 27-of-28 shots to improve to 3-1-1 on the season. He now ranks second among NHL goalies with 160 saves, tied for sixth in wins and tied for 10th in SV% (.936).

TROY TERRY opened the scoring at 6:56 of the second period with Anaheim's first power-play goal of the campaign, extending his point streak to five games (4-1=5). The point streak marks his longest since a six-game point streak Jan. 20-31, 2024 (4-6=10).

CUTTER GAUTHIER collected his first career multi-point/assist game (0-2=2) with helpers on each of Anaheim's first two goals.

LEO CARLSSON recorded his second career game-winning goal to become the fourth teenager in franchise history with multiple game winners, joining Cam Fowler (3), Mason McTavish (2) and Stanislav Chistov (2).

JACKSON LACOMBE earned an assist for his first point of 2024-25 and MASON MCTAVISH recorded his third assist of the season.

Tonight's attendance was 17,174, a sellout. Anaheim will embark on a four-game road trip beginning Saturday, Oct. 26 against the New York Rangers (4 p.m. PT). Anaheim also visits the New Jersey Devils (Sunday, Oct. 27, 4 p.m. PT), New York Islanders (Tuesday, Oct. 29, 4 p.m. PT) and Pittsburgh Penguins (Thursday, Oct. 31, 4 p.m. PT).

TERRY TROY

On breaking the power play goal drought

It was sort of an unorthodox power play goal, but that's just how it works. It just felt like kind of a weight off. Even before that one went in on that power play specifically, I thought we were attacking the net more and shooting pucks. The other unit was shooting. I think that's kind of the key to it and it's nice to feel the weight kind of lifted.

On his start to this season compared to last

I feel confident. I had a good summer, I feel strong and it just helps when you get one early, honestly. It wasn't going in at the start of last year and I was trying to push too much and kind of riding that emotional rollercoaster a bit too much last year. This year, it's nice they went in early and I'm just trying to keep it going.

CUTTER GAUTHIER

On his first multi-point game

It feels great. Obviously, that first one was a little bit of a treat there, missing wide and then Troy's doing his thing, going down and scoring. That was obviously nice to get on the board and get some confidence going into the long road trip.

On the second power play goal

It's huge, kind of like what Troy was talking about, when we get power plays we need to create momentum. We haven't done it the last couple games and it was nice to get a few there.

On playing with Robby Fabbri

He's great. Me and Leo like to play a fast, skilled game and having [Fabbri] on the line, he works hard. Dog and a bone mentality, and he's willing to give us the puck and get to the net, which is definitely huge. I thought he opened up a lot of space for us and turning pucks over. He's a really easy player to play with.

HEAD COACH GREG CRONIN

On the bounceback performance

Tonight, I think we were a little bit tentative to start and then we got out of that. I thought we were moving the entire game. [San Jose] is a fast team. I'm impressed with them. I watched them play Colorado in the pre-scout and Colorado drilled us, but San Jose was with them the whole game. They're not a zero win team, so it was a good win for us.

On the power play

When we scored the first it was a hell of a shot by Troy, but the power plays after that, they seemed to have some confidence. They were passing the puck with some zip and accuracy and I think we could've had another one too. The last one we came close to getting one. Power plays go on streaks, it's very well noted early in the year when you zero for whatever. Now we got two for whatever we are. It's a confidence builder and hopefully we can carry that into the road trip.

MIKAEL GRANLUND

On taking too many penalties

Penalties hurt and couldn't find a way to win the hockey game. It's been a story and we just got to find a way to get on the other side of these games and get the win.

On how to keep the morale high

We have practice tomorrow and we get back to work. That's all you can do, go day-by-day. It's not easy to lose, we all know that but at the same time we're only seven games in, six games in so let's just keep going and show up to practice tomorrow.

HEAD COACH RYAN WARSOFSKY

On hitting the post multiple times

Yeah, that's the game of hockey, right? That's sports, sometimes it goes in, it's a game of inches and sometimes they don't. You hit some posts, we have to be resilient, keep pushing forward and keep the momentum and keep the way we need to play with our identity more consistently when those things don't happen.
