VANCOUVER CANUCKS

All-Time Wild Record: 53-39-15 (31-18-6 at Grand Casino Arena, 22-21-9 at Vancouver)

2025-26: Minnesota won the series-opening game, 5-2, in St. Paul (11/1)... RW **Vladimir Tarasenko** led the Wild with three points (1-2=3)... D **Jonas Brodin** (1-1=2), C **Joel Eriksson Ek** (0-2=2) and C **Vinnie Hinostroza** (1-1=2) each posted two points... G **Filip Gustavsson** saved 26-of-28 shots to earn the victory for the Wild... LW **Drew O'Connor** scored both of Vancouver's goals... C **Autu Raty** collected two assists (0-2=2)... G **Thatcher Demko** stopped 23-of-27 shots faced for the Canucks.

WILD LEADERS: Tarasenko leads Minnesota with 32 points (13-19=32) in 32 games against Vancouver... RW **Mats Zuccarello** has 28 points (10-18=28) in 25 career contests... D **Jared Spurgeon** owns 19 points (4-15=19) in 44 games... LW **Kirill Kaprizov** has 18 points (9-9=18) in 12 contests.

WILD GOALIES: Gustavsson is 6-3-1 with a 2.45 GAA, a .910 SV % and one shutout in 11 career games (10 starts) vs. Vancouver... G **Jesper Wallstedt** has not faced the Canucks.

CANUCKS LEADERS: LW **Evander Kane** leads Vancouver with 22 points (13-9=22) in 34 career games against Minnesota... C **Elias Pettersson** owns 12 points (7-5=12) in 17 games... RW **Brock Boeser** (3-8=11 in 20 games) and D **Quinn Hughes** (1-10=11 in 14 games) have 11 points each.

CANUCKS GOALIES: Demko is 0-4-2 with a 3.51 GAA and a .893 SV% in five career starts against Minnesota... G **Kevin Lankinen** is 1-1-3 with a 2.56 GAA and a .924 SV% in seven career games (five starts)... G **Nikita Tolopilo** has not faced Minnesota.

CONNECTIONS: Minnesota Associate Coach **Jack Capuano** played in three games with Vancouver in 1990-91... Wild Assistant Coach **Jason King** was selected by Vancouver in the seventh round (212th overall) of the 2001 NHL Draft and recorded 23 points (12-11=23) in 55 games in parts of two seasons with the Canucks (2002-04)... King also served as an Assistant Coach for Vancouver for three seasons (2020-23) and five seasons as an Assistant Coach with the Canucks AHL affiliate in Utica (2016-20)... Boeser is from Burnsville... D **Derek Forbort** is from Duluth... Canucks Assistant Coach **Brett McLean** was an Assistant Coach for the Iowa Wild for three seasons (2017-20), spent three seasons as an Assistant Coach with Minnesota (2020-23) and two seasons as the Iowa Wild Head Coach (2023-25).

FAST FACTS: The Wild set single-game franchise records for goals scored (10) and single-period goals scored (seven, third period) vs. Vancouver on 2/19/24... Minnesota is 16-4-0 in its last 20 games vs. Vancouver (since 3/9/8) and 5-1-0 in the last five meetings (since 12/16/23)... The Wild won eight consecutive meetings against Vancouver, outscoring the Canucks 28-16, before a 2-0 loss on 12/7/23... Minnesota is 12-5-0 in the last 17 games played in Vancouver (since 3/18/13)... The Wild is 13-5-1 in the last 19 games played in Saint Paul (since 3/10/13)... Minnesota's 53 wins and 121 points vs. the Canucks are its fourth-most against any franchise.

NOTES & MILESTONES

Team: Recorded an 12-game point streak (10-0-2) from 11/7 - 12/2, the third-longest run in franchise history and the club's longest since a franchise-record 14-game run (11-0-3) from 2/17 - 3/15/23... Is 12-2-2 (.813) since Nov. 1, ranking T-1st in the NHL in wins and second in points (26)... Since Nov. 1, leads the NHL in team SV% (.943) and team GAA (1.70) and T-4th with a plus-17 goal differential... Has killed 38-of-41 opponent power-play opportunities since Nov. 1 and leads the NHL with a 92.7 PK% in that span... Has not allowed a PPG in eight consecutive games (20-for-20) since 11/19, tied for the longest active streak in the NHL and second-longest overall this season, and tied for the eighth-longest streak in franchise history... Has scored first in 17 games this season, T-2nd in the NHL... Leads the NHL with six shutouts... Ranks T-2nd in NHL with six extra-time victories (three OTW, three SOW).

Matt Boldy: Since Nov. 6, owns 10 goals (T-6th in the NHL) and 16 points (T-18th in the NHL) in 14 games... T-1st on team assists (14) and second in goals (15) and points (15-14=29)... Ranks T-11th in the NHL in 12 PPP (5-7=12), T-12th in goals (15) and T-14th in shots (91).

Zeev Buium: Owns eight power-play points (2-6=8) this season, second among NHL rookies and ranking T-6th among NHL defensemen... Ranks fifth among NHL rookies with an 18:38 TOI/G average, sixth with 10 assists and T-6th with 13 points (3-10=13).

Joel Eriksson Ek: Ranks second in the NHL in faceoffs won (309) and total faceoffs taken (596).

Filip Gustavsson: Went 5-1-2 with a 2.06 GAA and .923 SV% in November... Is 3-1-1 in his last five games, posting a 1.94 GAA and a .931 SV% with one shutout... T-2nd in the NHL with two shutouts this season.

Brock Faber: Since 10/26, ranks T-3rd among NHL defensemen in goals (six), T-5th in shots (47) and T-12th in points (6-9=15).

Marcus Johansson: Leads the team with a plus-8 rating and ranks third in points (8-12=20) and goals and T-3rd in assists.

Kirill Kaprizov: Ranks T-3rd in the NHL with seven PPG, T-4th with 17 goals, T-11th in shots (95) and T-16th with 31 points (17-14=31)... Leads the Wild in goals and points while ranking T-1st in assists... Currently owns 69 career PPG, tied with Zach Parise for the franchise record... Ranks third in franchise history with 142 power-play points (69-73=142), trailing Mikko Koivu (251) and Marian Gaborik (145).

Yakov Trenin: Leads the NHL with 131 hits.

Jesper Wallstedt: Posted a 33-save shutout at EDM (12/2) for fifth career shutout in his 15th career game, the second-fewest appearances in NHL history to reach the landmark (F. Brimsek, nine GP on 12/18/38)... Is 7-0-0 in his last six starts, stopping 235 of 242 shots faced for a 0.98 GAA, .971 SV% and four shutouts... Per NHL Stats, joins Jeremy Swayman (8-0-0 in 2021-22) as the second rookie goaltender in the last five years to record a win streak of seven or more games... Owns shutouts in four out of his last six games... Is the second rookie Wild goaltender to post a winning streak of at least seven games, following Kaapo Kahkonen (9 GP in 2020-21)... For the season, leads the NHL with a .944 SV%, 1.74 GAA and four shutouts... Has set the franchise benchmark for longest season-opening point streak (8-0-2), besting Niklas Backstrom (6-0-1 in 2008-09)... Wallstedt's current 10-game point streak is tied for the fourth-longest goalie point streak by a rookie in NHL history, and tied for the sixth-longest goalie point streak in Wild history... Following his shutout win at EDM (12/2), became the second-youngest goaltender in NHL history (23 years, 18 days) with a season-opening point streak of at least 10 games (P. Peeters, 27 GP in 79-80 w/ PHI - 22 years old)... Was named the NHL's Rookie of the Month for November after going 6-0-0 with a league-best 1.14 GAA, .967 SV% and three shutouts. He joined Brock Faber (Jan. 2024) as the only Wild players to receive the award.

Mats Zuccarello: With an assist vs. BUF (11/29), reached 700 career points (218-482=700)... Per NHL Stats, is the third undrafted player to debut in the past 30 years to record 700 points, joining Martin St. Louis (1,033) and Artemi Panarin (896)... Owns 10 points (1-9=10) in 13 games played since making his season debut 11/7 at NYI... Team is 10-1-2 with him in lineup.

WILD AT THE OLYMPICS

Wild General Manager and President of Hockey Operations **Bill Guerin** is serving as the General Manager of the 2026 United States Men's Ice Hockey Team. He is joined on Team USA's staff by Wild Head Coach **John Hynes**, who will serve as an assistant coach; Wild Assistant General Manager **Chris Kelleher**, who will work on the management staff; Wild Head Athletic Trainer **John Worley** and Assistant Athletic Trainer and Massage Therapist **Travis Green**, who will work as athletic trainers, and Wild Orthopedic Surgeon **Joel Boyd**, who will serve as team physician.

Wild forward **Nico Sturm** was selected to Germany's preliminary roster. The native of Augsburg had eight points (six goals, two assists) in 10 games at the 2023 for silver-winning Germany at the 2023 Worlds, and he also competed at the tournament the following year.

TEAM NOTES



ON THE POWER PLAY

- Ranks T-3rd in the NHL with 22 PPG and 11th with a 22.4 PP% this season.
- Through the first 28 games of a season, ranks fourth in franchise history in PP% and T-8th in PPG.
- Scored nine consecutive power-play goals, the longest streak in franchise history and tied for the third-longest streak in the NHL since the 1933-34 season, from 10/11 - 10/14.
- Since the 1933-34 season, only the 1987-88 New York Rangers (11 PPG) recorded more power-play goals in a season's first four games. Since 1977-78, no team with 20-plus power-play opportunities recorded a higher power-play percentage.
- The Wild opened the season by scoring a power-play goal in four consecutive games, achieving the feat for the sixth time in franchise history. The run trailed only the 2010-11 season (six-game streak) and the 2022-23 season (five-game streak) for the longest season-opening runs in franchise history.

LOCKING IT DOWN

- Leads NHL with six shutouts this season.
- Leads the NHL with 1.75 goals against/game and 28 goals allowed since November 1.

- Has killed 38-of-41 opponent power-play opportunities since Nov. 1 and leads the NHL with a 92.7 PK% in that span.
- The Wild hasn't allowed a PPG in eight consecutive games (20-for-20) since 11/19, tied for the longest active streak in the NHL and second-longest overall this season. The eight-game run is also tied for the eighth-longest streak in franchise history
- Minnesota hasn't allowed a PPG in 14 out of 16 games played since Nov. 1.
- Is allowing 2.36 opponent power-play opportunities per game this season, tied for first in the NHL.

OUT IN FRONT

- Has scored first in 17 games this season, T-2nd in the NHL.
- Owns a 12-2-3 record (.794) when scoring first this season.
- From 11/7 - 11/26/25, did not trail in regulation for over eight consecutive games, a franchise-record span of 505:41 minutes, the 17th longest streak in NHL history.
- The Wild scored the game-opening goal in 12 consecutive contests from 10/30 - 11/23, a franchise record. The run was tied for the 10th-longest streak in NHL history and is the longest since Colorado's 13-game streak in the 2022-23 season.
- As a franchise, holds a 668-178-109 all-time record (.757) when scoring first in a regular-season game.

HEATING UP

- Recorded an 12-game point streak (10-0-2) from 11/7 - 12/2, the third-longest run in franchise history and the club's longest since a franchise-record 14-game run (11-0-3) from 2/17 - 3/15/23.
- Is 12-2-2 (.813) since Nov. 1, ranking T-1st in the NHL in wins and second in points (26).
- Since Nov. 1, leads the NHL in team SV% (.943) and team GAA (1.70) and T-4th with a plus-17 goal differential
- Posted a seven-game win streak from 11/15 - 11/28/25, tied for the fourth-longest in franchise history and the team's longest since an eight-game run from 11/24 - 12/9/21.
- Finished 11-1-2 (.857) in November, ranking T-1st in the NHL in wins and points (24).
- Minnesota's 24 points in November 2025 was the highest November total in franchise history, while its 11 wins ranked T-1st (also Nov. 2011).
- Matt Boldy and Kirill Kaprizov were Minnesota's co-leaders in goals in November, with each player scoring 10 goals in 14 games. It marked the first time in team history that the Wild had two players each score 10 or more goals in the same calendar month.

SETTLING IN FOR THE SECOND

- Ranks T-1st in the NHL with 17 second-period goals allowed this season and is fourth with a plus-nine goal differential in the middle frame.
- Minnesota's .944 team save percentage in the second period leads the NHL.
- The Wild has held opponents scoreless in 15 of 28 second periods this season.

IN EXTRA TIME

- Ranks T-2nd in NHL with six extra-time victories (three OTW, three SOW).
- Since losing three out of four extra-time games to start the season, has won five out of seven extra-time games.
- T-2nd in NHL with three SOW this season.

KIRILL THE THRILL

- **Kirill Kaprizov** Ranks T-3rd in the NHL with seven PPG, T-4th with 17 goals, T-11th in shots (95) and T-16th with 31 points (17-14=31).
- Leads the Wild in goals and points while ranking T-1st in assists
- Scored two goals (2-0=2) vs. COL (11/28) to reach 201 career goals and move past Zach Parise (199 goals) for third in franchise history. Currently three goals shy of tying Mikko Koivu for second in franchise history.

- Reached 200 career goals in his 344th career game, becoming fourth-fastest player drafted in fifth round or later to hit the landmark (Brett Hull, 280 GP; Luc Robitaille, 323 GP; Pavel Bure, 328 GP).
- With two goals vs. COL (11/28), reached 115 career home goals, moving past Mikko Koivu (113 home goals) for most in franchise history.
- Tallied the 115th MPG of his career with two goals (2-0=2) vs. COL (11/28), moving past Marian Gaborik (114 MPG) for second in franchise history.
- Reached 69 career PPG with a PPG at CHI (11/26), tying Zach Parise for the franchise record.
- Currently ranks third in franchise history with 142 power-play points (69-73=142), trailing Mikko Koivu (251) and Marian Gaborik (145).

- Scored a goal vs. WPG (10/28) and reached 401 career points (191-210=401) to pass Zach Parise (199-201=400) for fourth-most points in franchise history.
- With three assists (0-3=3) vs. SJS (10/26), pushed his career point total to 400 (190-210=400) and tied Evgeni Malkin as the fourth-fastest active NHL player to reach the landmark, doing so in 329 games. Among all-time NHL players born outside of North America, Kaprizov tied Malkin as the seventh-fastest to hit 400 points. Overall, Kaprizov and Malkin are tied as the 22nd-fastest players in NHL history to reach 400 career points.

- Currently at 215 career assists, needs four assists to pass Marian Gaborik (218) for seventh in franchise history.
- Skated a season-high 27:08 of TOI vs. SJS (10/26), the highest total by an NHL forward this season.
- Notched the 10th career game with three-plus assists vs. SJS (10/26), moving past Mats Zuccarello for sole possession of second-most games in Wild history.
- Notched a PPA vs. SJS (10/26) to reach 139 career PPP (66-73=139) and move past Ryan Suter (21-117=138) for third-most in Wild history.
- Posted a career-high 11 shots on goal vs. CBJ (10/11), tying the franchise single-game record (Parise, 1/17/19 vs. ANA; Rolston, 10/7/06 vs. ANA).
- Currently with 42 career multi-assist games, tied with Mats Zuccarello (42) for fourth-most in franchise history.

HE'S GOING STREAKING

- Kaprizov recorded a seven-game point streak (7-2=9) from 11/16 - 11/29.
- Recorded a season-long five-game goal streak (6-1=7) from 11/21 - 11/29, tied for the fourth-longest streak in the NHL this season.
- Per NHL Stats, Kaprizov is the only player among all 32 NHL clubs to hold the franchise record (outright or tied) for all three scoring milestones: goal streak, assist streak and point streak.

BOLDY AND THE BEAUTIFUL

- **Matt Boldy** notched the game-deciding shootout goal vs. COL (11/28).
- Tallied three points (1-2=3) at CHI (11/26), recording his 72nd career MPG to tie Ryan Suter for seventh-most in Wild history.
- Recorded his 22nd career game with three-plus points at CHI (11/26), moving past Mats Zuccarello (21) for fourth in franchise history.
- Since Nov. 6, owns 10 goals (T-6th in the NHL) and 16 points (T-18th in the NHL) in 14 games.
- T-1st on team assists (14) and second in goals (15) and points (15-14=29).
- Ranks T-11th in the NHL in 12 PPP (5-7=12), T-12th in goals (15) and T-14th in shots (91).
- Currently at 273 career points (117-156=273) in 312 games, the second-highest total in franchise history by a player 24 years or younger. Marian Gaborik leads the list with 299 points (150-149=299).
- Scored his first career SHG vs. CAR (11/19), as well as the game-deciding shootout goal.
- Has played in 182 consecutive games dating back to 11/2/23, the 24th-longest active streak in the NHL.
- Currently at 70 career multi-point games, tied with Ryan Suter for seventh in franchise history.
- Reached 259 career points (109-150=259) in his 300th career game at CAR (10/6), the second-highest point total through a player's first 300 games with the franchise (Kaprizov, 366 pts).
- Per NHLStats, the only Wild players with more goals through their first 300 games with the club are Kaprizov (174 G), Zach Parise (114 G) and Eric Staal (109 G).
- Currently fifth in franchise history with 25 career GWG, four behind Kirill Kaprizov (29).
- Notched an assist vs. VAN (11/1) to reach 150 career assists and become the second-fastest player in Wild history (298 GP) to reach the landmark with the club (Kaprizov, 249 GP).
- According to NHL Stats, became the sixth different Wild player to record a point in each of his team's first five games of a season.
- Posted a four-game goal streak from 10/9 - 10/14, becoming the first player in franchise history to achieve the feat in a season's first four games.
- Recorded a career-high 10 shots on goal at DAL (10/14), tied for the fourth-highest single-game total in franchise history.
- Led the Wild with 73 points (27-46=73), 27 goals and 46 assists and ranked second with six PPG in 2024-25.
- Established single-season career highs in games played (82), points and assists in 2024-25.
- Finished T-3rd in the NHL with 10 GWG (franchise record) and seventh with 271 shots in 2024-25.
- Is the first player in Wild history to record three 25-goal seasons before turning 24. Is the fifth player in Wild history to record consecutive 40-assist seasons, joining Mats Zuccarello (three from 2021-22 to 2023-24), Ryan Suter (three from 2017-18 to 2019-20), Mikko Koivu (three from 2008-09 to 2010-11) and Mikael Granlund (two from 2016-17 to 2017-18).
- Is the fourth player in franchise history to record three consecutive 60-point seasons (also Kaprizov, Koivu, Zuccarello).

BROCKED AND LOADED

- **Brock Faber** skated a season-high 28:30 vs. COL (11/28).
- Recorded a four-game point streak (3-3=6) from 11/19-11/26.
- Since 10/26, ranks T-3rd among NHL defensemen in goals (six), T-5th in shots (47) and T-12th in points (6-9=15).
- Scored his first career shorthanded goal at WPG (11/23), becoming the youngest defenseman in franchise history to do so (23 years, 93 days).
- Posted two assists (0-2=2) and a season-high plus-3 rating at PIT (11/21).
- Scored his a goal and registered a game-high 25:45 of TOI v. CAR (11/19).
- Recorded two assists (0-2=2) vs. NSH (11/4) while skating a season-high 27:24 and tying a career high with six blocked shots.
- Finished with a game-high seven shots on goal vs. WPG (10/28), the second-highest single-game total of his career.
- Notched three assists (0-3=3) vs. SJS (10/26), tying his single-game career-high in assists and points. The total also tied the franchise single-game high for assists by a defenseman (23rd occurrence).
- Owns a 25:02 TOI/G average in 190 career games, holds the third-highest average by an NHL player prior to turning 24 since 2000-01.

OH CAPTAIN MY CAPTAIN

- **Jared Spurgeon** recorded a plus-minus rating of even or better in 12 consecutive games since 11/7/25 - 12/2.
- Recorded the 100th PPA of his career at CAR (11/6).
- Currently at 135 PPP (35-100=135), needs one PPP to tie Andrew Brunette (55-81=136) for fifth-most PPP in franchise history.
- Posted a PPA vs. NSH (11/4) to reach 134 career PPP (35-99=134) and pass Pierre-Marc Bouchard for sixth in Wild history.
- Recorded an assist vs. WPG (10/28) to reach 300 assists for his career and joined Mikko Koivu (504 assists) and Ryan Suter (314 assists) as the only players to reach the landmark with the Wild.
- Scored a power-play goal vs. LAK (10/13) to reach 133 career powerplay points (35-98=133) and tie Pierre-Marc Bouchard (29-104=133) for sixth-most in Wild history.
- Posted two points (1-1=2) at SEA (3/4/25) to record the 73rd multi-point game of his career and moved past Ryan Suter (72 mpg) for most multi-point games by a Wild defenseman. Now with 74 career multi-point games, ranks sixth all-time in multi-point games among all Wild skaters.

THE GUS BUS IS ROLLING

- **Filip Gustavsson** is 3-1-1 in his last five games, posting a 1.94 GAA and a .931 SV% with one shutout.
- Stopped all 19 shots faced at PIT (11/21) to reach 13 career shutouts and pass Manny Fernandez (12 SO) for fourth-most in Wild history.
- Ranks T-2nd in the NHL with two shutouts this season. Went 5-1-2 with a 2.06 GAA and .923 SV% in November.
- Is now 37-27-10 with a 2.55 GAA, .915 SV% and eight shutouts in road games since joining the Wild prior to the 2022-23 season. He ranks first in the NHL in road shutouts, T-2nd in road SV% and fourth in road GAA during that span (min. 50 gp).
- Posted a 26-save shutout at STL (10/9) to become the first goaltender in franchise history to post a shutout in multiple season openers (also 10/12/23) and the only active goalie to accomplish the feat for any franchise.
- Is 80-54-20 in his career with the Wild since joining the franchise in 2022-23. Gustavsson ranks T-4th in the NHL during that span with a .913 SV% and T-5th with 13 shutouts (min. 50 games).
- Posted a 31-19-6 record in 2024-25 and ranked T-4th in the NHL in shutouts (five), sixth in SV% (.914) and T-6th in wins.
- Is the fifth goaltender in franchise history to reach 30 wins in a single season.
- His five shutouts last season were tied for the second-highest single-season total in Wild history (Backstrom, eight in 2008-09).
- Stopped a penalty shot at SEA (3/4/25) to remain a perfect 4/4 against penalty shots for his career.
- Is the fifth Swedish goaltender in NHL history to record three consecutive 20-win seasons.

CROWN JOEL

- **Joel Eriksson Ek** Won 15-20 faceoffs taken (75%) vs. BUF (11/29), a season-high faceoff percentage.
- Ranks second in the NHL in faceoffs won (309) and total faceoffs taken (596).
- Posted two points (1-1=2) and a season-high plus-3 rating at PIT (11/21).
- Tallied a goal (1-0=1) and skated a season-high 24:32 vs. VGK (11/16).
- Ranks third on the team with 11 assists.
- Scored a goal at STL (10/9) to reach 300 career points (137-163=300) and become the 11th player to reach the landmark in a Wild sweater.
- Scored the game-tying goal with 21 seconds remaining in regulation vs. ANA (4/15/25) to help the Wild clinch a postseason berth.
- Returned from injury to score four goals (4-0=4) vs. SJS (4/9/25), setting a new career-high and becoming the second player in franchise history with four-plus goals in a game (Gaborik, five goals vs. NYG, 12/20/07).
- Registered his third career hat trick vs. SJS (4/9/25), tying Zach Parise and Matt Boldy for third-most in franchise history.

THE WALL OF ST. PAUL

- **Jesper Wallstedt** posted a 33-save shutout at EDM (12/2) to reach five career shutouts in his 15th career game, the second-fewest appearances in NHL history to reach the landmark (F. Brimsek, nine GP on 12/18/38).
- Is 7-0-0 in his last six starts, stopping 235 of 242 shots faced for a 0.98 GAA, .971 SV% and four shutouts.
- Per NHL Stats, joins Jeremy Swayman (8-0-0 in 2021-22) as the second rookie goaltender in the last five years to record a win streak of seven or more games.
- Owns shutouts in four out of his last six games.
- Is the second rookie Wild goaltender to post a winning streak of at least seven games, following Kaapo Kahkonen (9 GP in 2020-21).
- For the season, leads the NHL with a .944 SV%, 1.74 GAA and four shutouts.
- Has set the franchise benchmark for longest season-opening point streak (8-0-2), besting Niklas Backstrom (6-0-1 in 2008-09).
- Wallstedt's current 10-game point streak is tied for the fourth-longest goalie point streak by a rookie in NHL history, and tied for the sixth-longest goalie point streak in Wild history.
- Following his shutout win at EDM (12/2), became the second-youngest goaltender in NHL history (23 years, 18 days) with a season-opening point streak of at least 10 games (P. Peeters, 27 GP in 79-80 w/ PHI - 22 years old).
- With a 32-save shutout victory at WPG (11/23), became the youngest goaltender in franchise history (23 years, 9 days) to register a five-game winning streak, besting Darcy Kuemper (5 GP in 2013-14, 23 years and 302 days).
- Recorded a career-high 42 saves vs. CAR (11/19), tied for the second-highest single game total by a Wild rookie.
- Posted a shutout streak of 175:12 across parts of four games from 11/7 - 11/19, the longest shutout streak by a rookie in franchise history and fourth-longest overall.
- Posted his second consecutive shutout with a 28-save performance vs. ANA (11/15), becoming the first rookie and youngest goaltender in team history to record consecutive shutouts.
- Notched his first shutout of the season vs. CGY (11/9) with 36 saves.
- Now with five career shutouts, is the only Wild goaltender to earn four or more shutouts as a rookie.

MATS-TER OF HIS CRAFT

- **Mats Zuccarello** notched an assist vs. BUF (11/29) to reach 700 career points (218-482=700).
- Per NHL Stats, is the third undrafted player to debut in the past 30 years to record 700 points, joining Martin St. Louis (1,033) and Artemi Panarin (896).
- Owns 10 points (1-9=10) in 13 games played since making his season debut 11/7 at NYI. Team is 10-1-2 with him in lineup.
- Owns 15 shootout goals in a Wild sweater, tied with Zach Parise for second-most in team history.
- He owns 40 career shootout goals, fifth among active NHL skaters.
- Ranked third on the team in assists (35) and fourth in points (19-35=54) last season. Also ranked second on the Wild with 25 penalties drawn.
- Currently ranks second in Wild history with a 0.60 assist/game average (min. 100 games).

FEELING THE MOJO

- **Marcus Johansson** owns 16 points (7-9=16) in his last 19 games.
- Leads the team with a plus-8 rating and ranks third in points (8-12=20) and goals (eight).
- Recorded a career-long, nine-game point streak (5-6=11) from 10/25 - 11/9, tied for the fifth-longest streak in the NHL this season.
- Played in his 1,000th NHL game vs. CGY (11/9), becoming the 20th Swedish-born player to reach the milestone and 412th player overall.
- Was the 11th player to play his 1,000th game while in a Wild sweater.
- Per NHL Stats, was only the second player in NHL history to carry an active point streak of nine games or longer through their 1,000th career game (Bobby Hull, 17-game streak following his 1,000th game on 1/15/72).
- Was the fourth player to record a point while skating in their 1,000th NHL game with the Wild (Koivu, 12/1/19; Suter, 10/25/18; Cullen, 1/10/12).
- Since entering the NHL in 2010-11, has recorded the fewest PIMs (158) by a player with 800-plus games.

TRICKS UP HIS ZEEV

- **Zeev Buium** owns eight power-play points (2-6=8) this season, second among NHL rookies and ranking T-6th among NHL defensemen.
- Ranks fifth among NHL rookies with an 18:38 TOI/G average, sixth with 10 assists and T-6th with 13 points (3-10=13).
- Skated a career-high 26:08 and tied his career high with four shots vs. SJS (11/11).
- Per NHL Stats, is the first player in Wild history to record a point in each of the first four regular-season home games of his career, doing so from 10/11 - 10/26.
- Per NHL Stats, recorded his sixth career assist vs. UTA (10/25) and tied Nick Schultz for the second most by a Wild defenseman before age 20. Jonas Brodin leads the list with nine. He also became the fourth player in Wild history to record a point in each of the first three regular-season home games of his career. The others: Brent Burns (3 GP in 2003-04), Marian Gaborik (3 GP in 2000-01) and Maxim Sushinsky (3 GP in 2000-01).
- According to NHL Stats, is one of five NHL rookies since the 1933-34 NHL season to record five-plus PPP in his team's first four games.
- Finished with two points (1-1=2) and scored his first career NHL goal (Merzlikins) vs. CBJ (10/11), becoming the fourth-youngest defenseman in Wild history to score a goal (19 years, 308 days).
- Finished with a career-high 24:39 of TOI vs CBJ (10/11), joining Jonas Brodin (18 occurrences) as the only players in Wild history to post 24-plus minutes of TOI before turning 20 years old.
- Notched the first assist of his NHL career vs. VGK (4/24) to become the second-youngest player in Wild history (19 years, 138 days) to record their first Stanley Cup Playoff point, behind Pierre-Marc Bouchard (19 years, 19 days in Game 4 of 2003 CF).
- Became the 12th-youngest player (19 years, 134 days) in NHL history to make his League debut during the Stanley Cup Playoffs vs. VGK (4/20) and 152nd player overall.
- He was the 326th player (304th skater) to play in a regular-season or Stanley Cup Playoff game for the Wild.
