- The Stars defeated Chicago 3-1 in Dallas – their first game back from the 2024 Global Series in Finland.
- The win was **Pete DeBoer's** 620th as a head coach, which tied him with Bryan Murray for 20th on the all-time head coaching wins list.
- The win also improved Dallas' record to 6-0-0 while playing at the American Airlines Center this season.
- With the 3-1 victory, the Stars improved their record to 11-3-0 against Chicago since the start of the 2021-22 season, outscoring them 53-30 in those games.

GAME NOTES

THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

- Tonight is the fourth game that the Stars will play against a Central Division opponent this season, having gone 3-0-0 in their previous three games (Oct. 10 at Nashville, Oct. 26 vs. Chicago and Nov. 7 vs. Chicago).
- Since the start of the 2022-23 season, the Stars have gone 17-for-18 on the penalty kill against the Jets for a 94.4 percent success rate. Only the Philadelphia Flyers (100 percent) and Washington Capitals (100 percent) have a higher success rate on the penalty kill against the Jets than the Stars during that span.
- The Stars have allowed only 2.33 goals against per game this season, which was the second-best mark in the NHL in the NHL entering play Friday.
- **Esa Lindell** is averaging 3:47 of shorthanded time on ice per game this season, which was the sixth-highest mark in the NHL entering play Friday.
- Entering play Friday, he ranked in the top 10 in the NHL in both goals-against average (2.03, fourth) and save percentage (.922, tied ninth) this season.
- Stars head coach **Pete DeBoer** is one victory away from recording the 621st win of his career, which will give him sole possession of 20th on the all-time head coaching wins list.

GROUNDING THE JETS

- **Evgenii Dadonov** (2-1-3) and **Roope Hintz** (1-2-3) both have three points in their last three games against the Jets.
- **Jake Oettinger** has a 5-1-1 career record against Winnipeg, posting a .924 save percentage and a 1.99 goals-against average in those contests.
- **Jason Robertson** has 12 points (9-3-12) in nine career games against Winnipeg, which includes tallying six points (5-1-6) in six career road games against the Jets.
 - **Robertson's** nine goals against the Jets since the start of the 2019-20 season are tied for the sixth-most in the NHL.
 - His nine goals are also tied for his third-most against a single opponent, trailing only the 10 he has scored against both Minnesota and Nashville.

- **Tyler Seguin** has recorded 54 points (29-25—54) in 49 career regular-season games against the Jets.
 - **Seguin's** 54 career points against Winnipeg are the fifth-most among active NHL Skaters. Only Alex Ovechkin (100), Sidney Crosby (60), Steven Stamkos (59) and Connor McDavid (56) have more. His 29 goals rank third behind Ovechkin (60) and Stamkos (32).
 - His goal, assist and point totals against the Jets are all his highest marks against any opponent in his career.

SAVING FACE

- In Dallas' last game on Nov. 8 against Chicago, **Jamie Benn** went a perfect 16-for-16 at the faceoff dot. It marked the first time in his career that he has taken at least 16 draws in a game without losing one.
 - His 16 faceoff wins were also just one off of matching his single-game career high.
- Since the NHL began tracking faceoffs in 1997-98, **Benn** is just the sixth player to go undefeated at the faceoff dot when taking at least 16 draws.
- In all this season, **Benn** has gone 62-for-95 at the faceoff dot this season. His 65.3 percent success rate is the second-best mark in the NHL this year among skaters to take at least 50 draws.
- **Benn** has finished each of the last two seasons with a faceoff win percentage above 60 percent, winning 60.1 percent of his draws in 2022-23 and 61.2 percent in 2023-24.
- Last game, **Roope Hintz** also went 12-for-14 at the faceoff dot. His 12 faceoff wins were his most in a single game since Jan. 20, 2022 against Buffalo and were also just two shy of matching his single-game career high.
- In all, the Stars went 40-for-56 at the faceoff dot against the Blackhawks, which is the 10th-highest single-game mark in franchise history (since the NHL began tracking faceoffs in 1997-98).

TYLER THE CREATOR

- **Tyler Seguin** scored the game-winning goal in Dallas' last game against Chicago and now has recorded at least a point in each of the last five games he has played in, totaling seven points (4-3—7) in those contests.
- **Seguin** has recorded a point in seven of the eight games that he has played this year (6-4—10) and enters tonight's matchup against the Jets ranked third on the team in scoring.
- A goal or an assist tonight would give **Seguin** points in six consecutive games played for the first time since March 19 to 28, 2018.
 - Please note that **Seguin's** streak is not reflected in league rankings because it has not come in consecutive team games played.
- If he were to score tonight, **Seguin** would have goals in three consecutive games played for the first time since he scored in four straight from Jan. 4 to 10, 2024.
- **Seguin's** 10 points through his first eight games played of the season is his highest scoring rate to begin a year since he had 11 points (3-8—11) in the first eight games he played in 2018-19.
- With six goals and 10 points in eight games, **Seguin** is playing at a 59-goal and 98-point pace.
- When **Seguin** has been on the ice this year during 5-on-5 play, the Stars have outscored their opponents 5-1 according to Natural Stat Trick. Entering play Friday, he was one of nine skaters this season to be on the ice for five even-strength goals for a one of fewer even-strength goals against.

DOUBLE DUTCH

- **Matt Duchene** enters tonight's game having totaled 15 points (7-8—15) in 12 games this season, which includes recording five multi-point efforts this year.
- 2024-25 marks the first time in **Duchene's** career that he has had 15 or points through his first 12 games played of a season.
- **Duchene** has recorded a point in nine of the 12 games he has played this season and enters tonight's game leading the Stars in both goals (seven) and points (15). Only **Logan Stankoven** (10) has more assists than **Duchene** this season.
- When **Duchene** has been on the ice this season during 5-on-5 play, the Stars have outscored their opponents 8-3 according to Natural Stat Trick. His plus-4 on-ice goal differential is tied with **Mason Marchment** for the best mark on the team this season.
- **Duchene** was named the NHL's Third Star of the Week for the week ending on Oct. 27 after totaling six points (3-3—6) in three games, a stretch that included a three-point performance (1-2—3) against Boston.
- He is currently pacing to finish the year with 48 goals, 55 assists and 103 points, which would all be career highs for the 16-year veteran.

ROOKIE REPORT

- **Logan Stankoven** has 12 points (2-10—12) through his first 12 games played this season and enters tonight's game leading the Stars in assists and ranked second on the team in scoring.
- Entering play Friday, **Stankoven** was leading all rookies in assists and points this season. His 1.00 points per game this season was the highest mark of any first-year player to appear in at least four games this season.
- **Stankoven** recorded his 10th assist of the season (12 GP) in Dallas' last game on Nov. 7 against Chicago, establishing a franchise mark for fewest games to 10 helpers in a season by a Stars/North Stars rookie according to NHL Stats. The previous mark of 14 games was shared by Don Barber (1989-90 w/ MNS), Tim Young (1975-76 w/ MNS) and Danny O'Shea (1968-69 w/ MNS).

- **Stankoven** (8-18—26 in 36 GP) added an empty-net goal against Chicago to become the second-fastest player in Stars team history to record 25 career points, following **Jason Robertson** (33 GP) according to NHL Stats.
- With his assist on Oct. 15 against the Sharks, **Stankoven** became just the second rookie in Stars/North Stars history to record five or more assists through his first four games of a season, joining Marc Bureau (5 in 4 GP in 1990-91) according to NHL Stats.
- He recorded three assists in Dallas' 4-3 win over the Predators on Oct. 10, making him the only rookie to have a three-point game this season.
- According to NHL Stats, **Stankoven** became the second rookie in franchise history to record three points in the team's season-opening contest, alongside Roland Eriksson (0-4—4 w/ MNS) on Oct. 6, 1976.
- Originally selected by the Stars in the second round (47th overall) of the 2021 NHL Draft, **Stankoven** appeared in 24 regular-season games for Dallas last year, totaling 14 points (6-8—14) in those contests and adding eight points (3-5—8) in 19 Stanley Cup Playoff games.
- His 10 assists this season have already surpassed his total from last year and he is two points shy of matching his total from 2023-24.
- **Stankoven** is pacing to finish the year with 68 assists and 82 points. Sixty-eight assists would establish a franchise record for assists by a Stars/North Stars rookie and 82 points would make him the second-highest scoring rookie in franchise history (Neal Broten, 100 points).

BENN THERE DONE THAT

- Stars captain **Jamie Benn** enters tonight's contest having played in 309 consecutive games.
- Dallas' Oct. 13 matchup against the Kraken marked the 300th consecutive game that **Benn** had played in, making him the fourth player in franchise history to play in 300 consecutive games for the team according to NHL Stats.

- **Benn's** current 309-game Iron Man streak is the fifth-longest active streak in the NHL.
- **Benn** is one of 16 players to have an active Iron Man streak of at least 200 games and is one of 11 NHL players to appear in each of his team's 246 regular-season games between 2021-22 and 2023-24.
- The Stars captain leads all Dallas players in career games played (1,124), goals (386), assists (527) and points (913). His 913 career points rank 13th among active NHL skaters, and he is the second-highest scoring fifth-round draft pick in NHL history (Alexander Mogilny; 1,032).

ONE FOR THE HISTORY BOOKS

- **Esa Lindell** has several franchise milestones withing reach:
 - He is six points shy of becoming the 49th player and 13th defenseman in franchise history to record 200 points with the Stars.
 - **Lindell** is two goals away from tying Philippe Boucher for 10th in franchise history in goals scored by a defenseman.
 - He is also 19 games shy of tying Lou Nanne (635) for ninth on the franchise's all-time games played list by defensemen.
- **Tyler Seguin** is four assists away from bringing his total with the stars to 380, which would tie him with Brian Bellows for fifth-most assists by a skater in franchise history.
- **Jake Oettinger's** next shutout will be the 12th of his career, which will tie Jon Casey for the sixth-most in franchise history.
- **Miro Heiskanen** is seven assists shy of tying Dennis Hextall (216) for 23rd on the franchise's all-time assists list. He's also eight assists shy of trying Brad Maxwell (217) for 7th on the all-time assists list by defensemen.
