- **Miro Heiskanen** (0-1-1) recorded an assist on **Mavrik Bourque's** goal, extending his assist streak to five games and tied Craig Hartsburg for the most by a defenseman in franchise history according to NHL Stats.
- **Heiskanen's** assist also surpassed Gordie Roberts (224) to take the 5th-most assists among all-time Stars defensemen.
- **Wyatt Johnston** registered a hat trick (3-0-3), the team's first hat trick of the season, and became the youngest player in franchise history to score a natural hat trick.
- **Roope Hintz** tallied three assists (0-3-3), his second time registering a three-point outing this season (last: Oct. 19 vs. Edmonton).

GAME NOTES

THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

- Tonight is the first of three games the Stars will play against the Canucks this season and the first of two times the teams are facing off in Dallas this year. They face each other next on March 9 in Vancouver.
- Dallas won their 32nd game of the season in their last game on Jan. 25 against the Golden Knights - their 50th game of the year. The teams 32 wins are their most through their first 50 games played of a regular season since 2005-06, when the team posted a 33-15-2 record in its first 50 games.
- The Stars enter tonight's game with a 32-17-1 record for 65 points and a .650 points percentage. Their .650 points percentage was the fifth-best mark in the NHL this year entering play Thursday.
 - Of the top five ranked teams, four of them are in the Western Conference: Winnipeg (.702), Edmonton (.670), Vegas (.657) and Dallas. The Washington Capitals (.730) top both the NHL and the Eastern Conference.
- Defenseman **Brendan Smith** has played in each of Dallas' last three games as a forward. He's logged a 52.0 percent Corsi rating in those games according to Natural Stat Trick, which is the best mark of any Stars skater during that span.
- **Matt Duchene** enters tonight's game two assists shy of totaling his 500th NHL assist. When he reaches the milestone, he will become the 27th active skater and the fourth played from the 2009 Draft class to tally 500 career assists.
- Entering play Thursday, the Stars and the Washington Capitals were the only NHL teams this season that have not lost more than two consecutive games.
- The Stars have allowed only 2.46 goals against per game this season, which was the third-best mark in the NHL entering play Thursday. Dallas has allowed two or fewer goals in 28 of the 50 games that they have played this year.

WHALE WATCHING

- Dallas is 98-75-29 all-time vs. Vancouver, with an 86-43-22 mark at home.
- **Sam Steel** has eight points (8-0—8) in 10 career games vs. Vancouver, including his lone hat trick on March 26, 2019 at Vancouver (w/ Anaheim). Steel has goals in six of his 10 appearances against the Canucks.
- **Roope Hintz** enters tonight's contest riding a two-game point streak against the Canucks, earning four points (2-2—4) during that span. In all, **Hintz** has registered eight points (5-3—8) in 12 career games against Vancouver.
- Among active Stars, **Jamie Benn** ranks first in goals (17) and in points (17-19—36) and is second in assists (19) in 41 career games against the Canucks. He also is first in game-winning goals (5) against them.
- **Jason Robertson** rides a two-game point streak against Vancouver heading into tonight's matchup, totaling four points (1-3—4) in those games. In all, **Robertson** has six points (1-5—6) in nine career games against the Canucks.

BACK TO DECEMBER

- Since Dec. 23, the Stars have posted a 13-4-1 record for 27 points and a .750 points percentage. Dallas' win total, point total and points percentage during that span all topped the NHL entering play Thursday.
- During that span, the Stars have outscored their opponents 56-40. Their plus-16 goal differential was the third-best mark in the league since Dec. 23 entering play Thursday, trailing only the Washington Capitals and the Winnipeg Jets (both plus-18).
 - Only the Buffalo Sabres (58) and Vegas Golden Knights (57) had scored more goals than the Stars since Dec. 23 entering play Thursday.
- Thirty-nine of the Dallas' 52 goals since Dec. 23 have been scored at 5-on-5, which was tied for third in the NHL entering play Thursday, trailing only Buffalo and Carolina (41 each).
- The Stars have gone 552-for-1046 at the faceoff dot since Dec. 23 for a 52.8 percent success rate, which was the third-best mark in the league during that span entering play Thursday.
- **Jason Robertson** is the team's leading scorer since Dec. 23, totaling 24 points (10-14—24) in 18 games played. His 24 points were the third-most in the NHL during that span entering play Thursday, trailing only Boston's David Pastrnak and Tampa Bay's Nikita Kucherov (25 each).
- Fourteen different Stars skaters have scored at least one goal since Dec. 23: **Jason Robertson** (10), **Wyatt Johnston** (8), **Jamie Benn** (7), **Roope Hintz** (6), **Matt Duchene** (5), **Evgenii Dadonov** (5), **Mavrik Bourque** (4), **Thomas Harley** (3), **Esa Lindell** (2), **Logan Stankoven** (2), **Oskar Bäck** (1), **Colin Blackwell** (1), **Matěj Blümel** (1) and **Miro Heiskanen** (1).
 - **Robertson's** 10 goals since Dec. 23 were tied for the fifth-most in the NHL entering play Thursday.

JOHNNY B. GOODE

- **Wyatt Johnston** scored his second career hat trick in Dallas' last game – a 4-3 overtime win over the Vegas Golden Knights on Jan. 28. The first of **Johnston's** three goals was shorthanded, the second at even strength and the third was the overtime winner.
- **Johnston's** hat trick hit several league and franchise historical milestones according to NHL Stats:
 - **Johnston** (21 years, 259 days) became the youngest player in franchise history to score a natural hat trick, besting **Tyler Seguin** (21 years, 310 days on Dec. 7, 2013).
 - He became the first player in Stars/North Stars history to record a hat trick which included a shorthanded goal and overtime-winning tally. **Johnston** became the eighth player on record to achieve the feat and second in over a decade (Elias Lindholm on Oct. 23, 2021).
 - He became the sixth player in Stars/North Stars history to cap a hat trick with an overtime-winning goal. The last player to do so for Dallas was **Roope Hintz** on Dec. 29, 2023.
 - Additionally, **Johnston** became one of eight players in NHL history to complete a natural hat trick in overtime. The only other active players to do so are Evander Kane (Nov. 15, 2023 w/ EDM), Kirill Kaprizov (Feb. 26, 2023 w/ MIN) and Tomas Hertl (Jan. 8, 2022 w/ SJS). **Johnston** (21 years, 259 days) is the youngest to do so.
- **Johnston's** shorthanded tally was the fifth of this career and second of the season. He joined former Star Brian Bellows (9) as the only player in franchise history to have at least five shorthanded goals at age 21 or younger according to NHL Stats.
- **Johnston** became the fifth active player to score at least five shorthanded goals before his 22nd birthday according to NHL Stats, joining Jordan Staal (10), Sebastian Aho (5), Anze Kopitar (5) and Anthony Cirelli (5).
- **Johnston's** first goal of the night was his 40th of the season. He has now tallied at least 40 points in each of the three NHL seasons that he has played.
- **Johnston's** 42 points (14-28—42) this season ranked third among players that are age 22 or younger entering play Thursday, trailing only Chicago's Connor Bedard (44) and Utah's Logan Cooley (43).
- **Johnston** is now pacing to finish the year with 23 goals, 46 assists and 69 points. Forty-six assists and 69 points would both be a career high for the forward.
- **Johnston** enters tonight's game having totaled 35 points (12-23—35) in 33 games since Nov. 20. His 35 points during that span trail only **Jason Robertson** (38) for the team lead.
- Since Nov. 28, the Stars are outscoring their opponents 24-15 at 5-on-5 when **Johnston** is on the ice according to Natural Stat Trick. His 24 5-on-5 on-ice goals for since Nov. 28 are the most of any Stars skater.
- **Johnston** enters tonight's game two points shy of totaling 150 career points. When he reaches the milestone he:
 - Will become the first player from the 2021 Draft class to total 150 points.
 - Will become the 63rd skater in franchise history to total 150 points with the Stars.

ROBO ON THE GOGO

- **Jason Robertson** enters tonight's matchup having totaled 33 points (12-21—33) in his last 28 games played dating back to Dec. 1 against the Winnipeg Jets. His 33 points during that span are the most of any Stars skater and were tied for eighth in the NHL entering play Thursday.
 - **Robertson** has multi-point efforts in eight of the last 15 games that he has played.
- **Robertson** scored two goals in Dallas' game on Jan. 24 against Vegas — including the game winner — to bring his career total to 150. He is the 19th skater in franchise history to score 150 goals with the team.
- **Robertson's** second goal of the game was 358th career point (150-208—358), giving him sole possession of 19th on the franchise's all-time scoring list.
- **Robertson** factored in on all three of Dallas' goals in their Jan. 18 game against the Avalanche, scoring two goals and adding an assist to bring his season total to 40 points (14-26—40). **Robertson** has recorded at least 40 points in each of the five full NHL seasons that he has played.
 - His two goals came just 39 seconds apart, marking the fastest two goals by a Stars skater since Joe Pavelski on Nov. 26, 2021 (0:19) according to NHL Stats.
- **Robertson** scored the deciding goal in the shootout in Dallas' Jan. 11 game, a 2-1 victory over the Montréal Canadiens.
 - In his career, **Robertson** has gone 16-for-28 in shootout attempts. His 57.1 career percent success rate in the shootout is tied for the sixth-best mark among all active NHL skaters that have at least five shootout attempts.
- **Robertson** recorded two assists in Dallas' game on Jan. 2 against the Ottawa Senators for his 100th career multi-point game, becoming the 15th player in Stars/North Stars history to record 100 multi-point games according to NHL Stats. Only four players in franchise history have posted 100 multi-point games before age 26: Brian Bellows (151 GP), Mike Modano (126 GP), Bobby Smith (123 GP) and Dino Ciccarelli (101 GP).
- **Robertson** tallied three points (1-2—3) in Dallas' game on Dec. 31 against the Sabres to take sole possession of 21st on the franchise's all-time scoring list, passing Joe Nieuwendyk and Al MacAdam. **Robertson** has 344 career points (142-202—344) in 329 regular-season games.
- **Robertson's** second assist against the Sabres was the 200th of his career, making him the 27th player in Stars franchise history at the seventh player from the 2017 draft class to total 200 NHL assists.
- Additionally, **Robertson** — who turned 25 on July 21 — became the third player in Stars team history to register 200 career assists at age 25 or younger (all assists w/ DAL) according to NHL Stats.

WALKING A TIGHT ROOPE

- **Roope Hintz** recorded the primary assist on all three of **Wyatt Johnston's** goals in Dallas' last game on Jan. 28 against the Vegas Golden Knights. His three assists tied his single-game career high that he had reached on four previous occasions, most recently on April 10, 2023 against the Detroit Red Wings.
- **Hintz'** three assists brought his career point total to 342 (167-175—342), passing Joe Nieuwendyk and Al MacAdam (340 each) to take sole possession of 22nd on the franchise's all-time scoring list.
- **Hintz** enters tonight's game riding a three-game point streak, totaling five points (1-4—5) during that span. A goal or an assist tonight would give him a point in four consecutive games for the first time since he had a point in six straight from Dec. 18 to 31, 2023.
- If he were to tally an assist tonight, it would give him assists in three consecutive games for the first time since Oct. 30 to Nov. 2, 2023.
- **Hintz** scored his 20th goal of the season in Dallas' game on Jan. 24 against the Golden Knights. **Hintz** is the sixth Stars skater in the last 30 years to have at least four consecutive 20-goal seasons according to NHL Stats, joining Mike Modano (8: 1995-96 – 2002-03), **Jamie Benn** (6: 2013-14 – 2018-19), **Tyler Seguin** (6: 2013-14 – 2018-19), Loui Eriksson (4: 2008-09 – 2011-12) and Joe Pavelski (4: 2020-21 – 2023-24).

HEATING UP

- **Jake Oettinger** has an 9-2-0 record in his last 11 games played dating back to Dec. 29, posting a .922 save percentage and a 1.98 goals-against average during that span.
 - His nine wins since Dec. 29 were tied with Washington's Logan Thompson for the most in the NHL entering play Thursday.
- Since Jan. 1, **Mavrik Bourque** has scored four goals — including the Stars first of the game in their last matchup on Jan. 28 against the Vegas Golden Knights. His four goals during that span were tied for the second-most among all NHL rookies entering play Thursday.
 - In all, **Bourque** has totaled six points (4-2—6) during that span, which is one shy of the seven (2-5—7) he had from the start of the regular season through Dec. 31.
- **Evgenii Dadonov** has totaled four points (1-3—4) in his last three games. He is now on pace to finish the year with 44 points, which would be his highest-scoring season since he had 47 points for the Florida Panthers in 2019-20.
- **Esa Lindell** has recorded a point in each of Dallas' last two games — scoring a goal on Jan. 25 against the Blues and tallying an assist on Jan. 28 against the Golden Knights. A goal or an assist tonight would give **Lindell** points in three consecutive games for the first time this season.
- **Lian Bichsel** has recorded at least four hits in each of the three games that he has played since being recalled from Texas (AHL). In all this season, he is averaging 15.64 hits per 60, which tops the Stars roster and ranked ninth among all NHL rookies this season that had played in at least five games entering play Thursday.

JUST IN CASE

- **Casey DeSmith** recorded his second shutout of the season in Dallas' Jan. 25 game – a 2-0 win over the St. Louis Blues – stopping all 33 shots he faced.
- According to MoneyPuck.com, **DeSmith** saved 2.73 goals above expected. The Stars were outshot 19-33 in the game.
- The shutout was the 12th of **DeSmith's** career, making him one of 31 NHL goaltenders to record at least 12 shutouts since the start of the 2017-18-season.
- **DeSmith** is now one shutout shy of tying his career high of three that he set in 2018-19 and matched in 2021-22, both while playing for the Pittsburgh Penguins.
- In all this season, **DeSmith** has a 7-6-0 record with a 2.42 goals-against average and a .913 save percentage. He has allowed two or fewer goals in nine of the 15 games he has played in.

LEAGUE LEADERS

- **Miro Heiskanen** is averaging 25:10 of ice time per game this season, which was the sixth-most in the NHL this year entering play Thursday.
- **Thomas Harley** enters tonight's matchup against the Canucks with a plus-26 on-ice, even-strength goal differential this season, which was tied for the fifth-best mark in the NHL this year entering play Thursday.
 - In all this season, **Harley** has a plus-23 plus/minus rating, which was the third-best mark among all NHL defensemen entering play Thursday.
- **Oskar Bäck** has gone 73-for-133 at the faceoff dot this season for a 54.9 percent success rate, which ranked second among rookies that have taken at least 20 draws this season entering play Thursday.

IRON SHARPENS IRON

- The Stars have four skaters that have played in at least 200 consecutive games: **Jamie Benn** (347), **Jason Robertson** (260), **Esa Lindell** (220) and **Wyatt Johnston** (214). Entering play Thursday, Dallas was the only team in the NHL to have four players riding Iron Man streaks of at least 200 games.
- Dallas' last game on Jan. 28 against the Golden Knights was the 347th consecutive game that **Benn** played in, which is the fifth-longest active Iron Man streak in the NHL. He is one of seven players to have an Iron Man streak of at least 300 games.
- **Robertson's** 26--game Iron Man streak is the 13th-longest in the NHL. The Stars and the Detroit Red Wings were the only teams to have two players ranked in the top 15 entering play Thursday.
- **Lindell's** 220-game Iron Man streak ranks eighth among all NHL defensemen.
- **Johnston's** Iron Man Streak began when he made his NHL debut on Oct. 13, 2022. He is one of 44 players in NHL history to begin their NHL career by playing in at least 200 consecutive games according to NHL Stats.

ONE FOR THE HISTORY BOOKS

- **Jake Oettinger's** next shutout will be the 12th of his career, which will tie Jon Casey for the sixth-most in franchise history.
- **Esa Lindell** enters tonight's contest one assist shy of tying Alex Goligoski (155) for 25th all-time among Stars/North Stars defensemen.
- **Jason Robertson** is four goals shy of tying J.P. Parise (154) for 17th-most goals in franchise history.
- **Roope Hintz** is 11 points shy of tying Danny Grant (353) for 21st-most in points in franchise history.

CONNECT FOUR

- Stars forward **Roope Hintz** (Finland), defensemen, **Esa Lindell** (Finland) and goaltender **Jake Oettinger** (United States) have all been selected to represent their home country at the 4 Nations Face-Off, which will be held in Montreal and Boston from Feb. 12 to 20, 2025.
- Dallas is one of six NHL teams to have at least one forward, defenseman and goaltender from their roster to be selected for the 4 Nations Face-Off, with the others being Boston, Minnesota, Vancouver, Vegas and Winnipeg.
- All three players have previously represented their home countries in international competition.
 - **Lindell** suited up for the Fins at the 2014 IIHF World Junior Championship, where he won a gold medal. He again represented Finland at the 2015, 2016 (silver) and 2022 (gold) IIHF World Championships and at the 2016 World Cup of Hockey.
 - **Hintz** previously played for Finland at the 2015 and 2016 IIHF World Junior Championships, winning a gold medal at the later tournament.
 - **Oettinger** has played for Team USA at the 2017 and 2018 IIHF World Junior Championships and at the 2021 IIHF World Championship. He medaled in all three tournaments, winning bronze in 2018 and 2021 and gold in 2017.
- The 4 Nations Face-Off will mark the first time that all three **Hintz** and **Lindell** are playing for Finland together.
- The Stars will also be well-represented among the 4 Nations staff, with **Jim Nill** (Associate GM), **Pete DeBoer** (Assistant Coach) and **Misha Donskov** (Assistant Coach) all set to join Canada's staff for the tournament. Additionally, former Star **Jere Lehtinen** will serve as Finland's General Manager.

CONNECTIONS

- Stars GM **Jim Nill**, goaltender **Casey DeSmith** and Player Development Assistant **Jordie Benn** were all members of the Canucks. Nill skated for Vancouver from 1981-82 to 1983-84, DeSmith from 2023-24 and Benn from 2019-20 to 2020-21.
- Stars assistant coach **Misha Donskov** coached Canucks forward Teddy Blueger in Vegas when he played there during the 2023-24 season.
- Stars goaltender **Casey DeSmith** and Canucks forwards Teddy Blueger and Danton Heinen played together in Pittsburgh. DeSmith and Blueger played together from 2018-19 to 2022-23, and Heinen joined them from 2021-22 to 2022-23.
- Stars forward **Colin Blackwell** and defenseman **Brendan Smith** played with Canucks forward Phillip Di Giuseppe with the New York Rangers. Blackwell played with Di Giuseppe from 2019-20 to 2020-21 and Smith joined the two during the 2020-21 season.
- Stars defenseman **Ilya Lyubushkin** played alongside Canucks forward Conor Garland in Arizona from 2018-19 to 2020-21.
- Stars forward **Sam Steel** and Canucks forward Danton Heinen played together in Anaheim during the 2019-20 and 2020-21 seasons.
- Stars forward **Sam Steel** and Canucks forward Kiefer Sherwood played together in Anaheim during the 2018-19 and 2019-20 seasons.
- Stars forward **Matt Duchene** and Canucks forward Kiefer Sherwood and goaltender Kevin Lankinen played together in Nashville during the 2022-23 season.
- Stars defenseman **Brendan Smith** and Canucks forward J.T. Miller shared the ice with the New York Rangers during the 2017-18 season.
- Stars Player Development Coordinator **Ben Bishop** and Canucks defenseman Derek Forbort shared the ice in Los Angeles during the 2016-17 season.
- Stars Player Development Assistant **Jordie Benn** and Canucks defenseman Derek Forbort played together in Winnipeg during the 2020-21 season.
- Stars forward **Mason Marchment** and Canucks defenseman Noah Juulsen briefly played together for the Florida Panthers in 2020-21.
- Stars defenseman **Matt Dumba** and Canucks defenseman Carson Soucy were teammates in Minnesota from 2017-18 to 2020-21.
- Stars forward **Colin Blackwell** and Canucks defenseman Carson Soucy skated together in Seattle during the 2021-22 season.
- Stars defenseman **Ilya Lyubushkin** played under Canucks head coach Rick Tocchet when Tocchet was the head coach in Arizona from 2018-19 to 2020-21.
