

**FLAMES LAST GAME RECAP****February 27, 2024 – CALGARY FLAMES [4] vs. LOS ANGELES KINGS [2]**[Game Summary](#) | [Event Summary](#)

The Calgary Flames welcomed the Los Angeles Kings to the Scotiabank Saddledome on Tuesday night. The Kings would open the scoring midway through the second period off the stick of Phillip Danault, before Andrew Mangiapane responded under a minute later to level the score at one a piece. The Flames would go up 2-1 after Blake Coleman recorded his 24<sup>th</sup> of the season to give Calgary their first lead of the night, but the Kings would tie things up before the break, and the teams headed into the third knotted at two apiece. Yegor Sharangovich would give the Flames their lead back in the third, and an empty netter from Mikael Backlund would seal it as the Flames knocked off the Kings 4-2.

**TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS**

This is the second and final meeting this season between the Flames and Penguins. Calgary fell 5-2 in the clubs' first meeting back on October 14<sup>th</sup>.

This is a Pacific Division versus Metropolitan Division matchup; the Flames have a record of 4-7-2 against Metropolitan Division teams and a record of 11-11-3 against Eastern Conference opponents.



### KIPPER NIGHT:

The Calgary Flames will be retiring Miikka Kiprusoff's number 34 tonight against the Pittsburgh Penguins. The ceremony will begin on the ice at 6:20 PM. At the conclusion of the ceremony the Calgary Flames and Pittsburgh Penguins will conduct their standard player warmup, with game time set for 8:00 PM. The ceremony will feature special appearances by Calgary Flames Alumni, Hockey Hall of Fame trophies from Miikka's career, a video tribute, and a thank you from Miikka Kiprusoff. The ceremony will conclude with his number 34 heading to the rafters to join Lanny McDonald, Jarome Iginla and Mike Vernon as retired numbers for the Calgary Flames, along with honoured members and hockey hall of famers Joe Nieuwendyk and Al MacInnis. Calgary Flames players will be wearing commemorative Kiprusoff warm-up jerseys, a selection of which will be auctioned off benefiting the Calgary Flames Foundation. The players will also sport a custom jersey patch for the evening dedicated to Miikka. The number 34 will be placed in the ice behind both nets to commemorate the night.

### MIIKKA'S LEGACY:

The native of Turku, Finland, Kiprusoff played nine of his 12-year career with the Flames and retired as the franchise leader in wins (305), shutouts (41), goals against average (2.46), save percentage (.913) and games played by a goaltender (576). He also is the franchise leader in playoff shutouts (6) and sits second behind Hockey Hall of Famer Mike Vernon in games played and wins in the playoffs. He holds the four single highest regular season win totals for the Flames with the highest being 45 in 2008-09. He was named a Vezina Trophy finalist on three occasions, winning the award for the NHL's best goaltender in 2006. Finishing the 2005-06 season with a 42–20–11 record and a team-record 10 shutouts, he was also named a first team all-star, awarded the William M. Jennings Trophy and was named as a Hart Trophy finalist as League MVP.

### **FIRST MEETING:**

The Calgary Flames and Pittsburgh Penguins met for the first time this season at PPG Paints Arena on October 14<sup>th</sup>. Jacob Markstrom was the star of the show early, stopping several high-danger chances and all 11 first period shots he faced while Penguins netminder Alex Nedeljkovic also stood tall to keep the game even at zeros. It would take until the 18:22 mark of the second period for the game's first tally and it would be rookie Matt Coronato who would bury his first NHL goal to give the Flames the lead. The Pens would score two quick goals early in the third and go on to win 5-2.

### **WHOLE LOTTA BREAD:**

Flames forward Andrew Mangiapane skated in his 400<sup>th</sup> NHL game on Tuesday against Los Angeles, celebrating with a goal. Mangiapane's first NHL game came on December 31<sup>st</sup>, 2017 against the Chicago Blackhawks, with all 400 of his games coming in a Flames sweater. Mangiapane became the 13<sup>th</sup> active player selected in the sixth-round to skate in their 400<sup>th</sup> NHL game, and the only sixth-round selection from the 2015 draft class to achieve the feat. In his 400 games, Mangiapane has 107 goals and 101 assists for 208 career points.

### **TRICK OF THE TRADE:**

The Calgary Flames announced on Wednesday evening that they acquired defenseman Artem Grushnikov along with a second-round pick in the 2024 NHL Draft and a conditional third-round pick in the 2026 NHL Draft from Dallas in exchange for Chris Tanev in a three-way deal involving New Jersey. Calgary will retain fifty percent of Chris Tanev's salary. Grushnikov, a native of Voskresensk, Russia, is a defensive defenseman with the AHL's Texas Stars who has played in 44 games this season netting a goal and four assists for five points along with 32 penalty minutes. The former second round pick (48th overall) in the 2021 NHL Draft spent two seasons in the OHL with the Hamilton Bulldogs accumulating 13 goals and 16 assists for 29 points and 77 penalty minutes in the regular season in addition to capturing the 2022 Ontario Hockey League Championship and advancing to the Memorial Cup Finals.

### **SHARK ATTACK:**

Yegor Sharangovich scored his third game-winning goal of the season and 21<sup>st</sup> of the campaign on Tuesday against the Kings. Only three other Flames players in the past decade have scored as many in their first season in Calgary: Nazem Kadri (24 in 2022-23), Elias Lindholm (27 in 2018-19) and Sean Monahan (22 in 2013-14). Sharangovich also ranks fourth in goals among skaters from the 2018 NHL Draft, trailing only Brady Tkachuk (151), Andrei Svechnikov (125) and Joel Farabee (77).

### **FANTASTIC FEBRUARY:**

Through 10 games in the month of February, the Flames posted a 7-3-0 record, outscoring their opponents 36-29 and posting a .700 win-percentage. The Flames seven wins through the month were tied for the sixth-most in the league despite tying eight other clubs for the fifth-fewest games played.

### **THE KUZMENK-SHOW:**

Andrei Kuzmenko is currently sitting at 99 points in his NHL career (50-49 – 99) and is one point shy of the 100-point plateau. Kuzmenko's 99 points currently lead all skaters in the NHL that have played 150 games or less in their careers, with Matias Maccelli (95pts in 146 GP) and Matty Beniers (90pts in 144 GP) currently ranking second and third respectively. Kuzmenko is looking to become the 35<sup>th</sup> active-undrafted skater in the NHL to reach 100 points in their career with his .750 points-per-game ranking fourth among all undrafted skaters in the NHL right now.

### **HEY DID YOU KNOW?**


In Calgary and Pittsburgh's first meeting this season, Noah Hanifin skated in his 600<sup>th</sup> NHL game and at the time became the first player from the 2015 NHL draft to eclipse the mark.

Penguins forward Matthew Phillips was born in Calgary, AB and spent six seasons with the Flames organization from the tail end of 2016-17 through the 2022-23 campaign. Phillips made his NHL debut in a Flames sweater on May 19<sup>th</sup>, 2021 against the Vancouver Canucks.

Jonathan Huberdeau scored his first goal as a Flame in these clubs last meeting at the Scotiabank Saddledome back on October 25<sup>th</sup>, 2022.
