FLAMES LAST GAME RECAP December 9, 2023 – CALGARY FLAMES [2] vs. NEW JERSEY DEVILS [4]

Game Summary I Event Summary

The Calgary Flames finished a six-game homestand on Saturday afternoon by welcoming the New Jersey Devils to the Scotiabank Saddledome. It would take until the final minute of the first period for the first goal of the game, but it would be Yegor Sharangovich who converted on a shorthanded breakaway to give the Flames a 1-0 lead through one. In the middle frame, New Jersey would score a pair in the middle frame to go up 2-1. New Jersey would go up 3-1 early in the third, before a Nazem Kadri goal brought Calgary within one but that is as close as they would come as the Flames fell 4-2 to the Devils.

TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS

This is the second of three meetings this season between the Flames and Avalanche. The Flames fell 3-1 in their first matchup on November 25th.

This is a Pacific Division versus Central Division matchup; the Flames have a record of 4-5-0 against Central Division teams and a record of 8-7-0 against Western Conference opponents.

LAST MEETING:

The Calgary Flames finished up a four-game road trip in Colorado in the clubs first meeting back on November 25th. It would be the Avalanche who opened the scoring prior to the midway point of the first off the stick of Jonathan Drouin and Colorado led 1-0 through 20. In the second, Ryan Johansen extended Colorado's advantage to two goals, before Mikael Backlund made it goals in back-to-back games to give Calgary life and make it 2-1. Nathan MacKinnon would score later in the frame to restore the Avalanche's two-goal lead and make it 3-1 through 40. Calgary would outshoot Colorado 15-6 in the third period but couldn't find an answer and fell 3-1 in game one of their season-series.

WORKIN' ON A COLE MINE:

With his helper on Yegor Sharangovich's first period goal, Blake Coleman recorded his third point over his last two games. Coleman recorded his 100th NHL assist and scored on Thursday for his second multi-point game of the season. The Plano, TX native's goal on Thursday was shorthanded, which ties him with Brad Marchand (14) for the third-most shorthanded markers since he entered the League in 2016-17 behind only Sebastian Aho (17) and Cam Atkinson (15).

KILLER CONFIDENCE:

Following Yegor Sharangovich's shorthanded marker on Saturday against the Devils, Calgary as a team scored their fifth shorthanded goal. The goal was Sharangovich's team-leading second marker while on the penalty kill, while Blake Coleman, Rasmus Andersson, and Elias Lindholm have also struck shorthanded. Only four teams in the NHL have scored more on the kill that the Flames: St. Louis Blues (7), Philadelphia Flyers (7), Dallas Stars (6), Carolina Hurricanes (6), and tonight's opponent the Colorado Avalanche are tied with the Flames at five shorthanded markers.

RAS 400:

Rasmus Andersson skated in his 400th NHL game on Saturday against New Jersey, celebrating with an assist on Nazem Kadri's third period marker. The Malmo, SWE native's first game came back on April 8th, 2017 in San Jose, and he has skated in all 400 games of his NHL career as a member of the Flames, totaling 31 goals and 145 assists for 176 points. Andersson is the Flames all-time leader in games played by a Swedish-born defenceman and has become one of just eight defenceman to reach 400 games in a Flames uniform.

ROCKY MOUNTAIN TIES:

Avalanche defenseman Cale Makar was born in Calgary and played his junior hockey just two hours east of his hometown with the Brooks Bandits of the AJHL. Nazem Kadri also spent time in Colorado, skating in 178 games over three seasons with the Avs scoring 155 points (58G, 97A) over that span. Kadri was also a key contributor in the 2022 playoffs Avalanche, scoring seven goals and eight assists for 15 points en route to winning the Stanley Cup. A.J. Greer was a Colorado Avalanche second-round draft pick in 2015 and played in 37 games with Colorado over three seasons. Flames defenseman Dennis Gilbert also played three games with the Colorado Avalanche during the COVID-shortened 2021 season.

BACK-TO-BACKS:

The Flames gear up to enter their fourth back-to-back set of the 2023-24 season tonight in Colorado. Following tonight, Calgary heads to Vegas for their second of four meetings against the Golden Knights. The Flames previous three back-to-back scenarios came on Nov. 24 at DAL, Nov. 25 at COL Oct. 19 at BUF, Oct. 20 at CBJ and Nov. 10 at TOR, Nov. 11 at OTT. Following this, Calgary will have four more back-to-back sets this season with their next coming on Jan. 6-7 in Philadelphia and Chicago.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN:

Following a six-game homestand, the Flames will play their next three games away from the 'Dome. Calgary will face Colorado and Vegas in a back-to-back scenario tonight and tomorrow, before heading to Minnesota to close out a brief three-game road swing on Thursday.

HEY DID YOU KNOW?

Mikael Backlund recorded an assist on Thursday against Carolina for his 506th point as a Calgary Flame. In reaching 506-points, Backlund passed Garry Roberts for sole possession of 10th place on the Flames all-time scoring list.
