**Post-Game Notes**

- The Tampa Bay Lightning were defeated 4-3 in overtime by the Toronto Maple Leafs on Saturday night at AMALIE Arena.
- Tampa Bay fell to 2-2-2 this season, including a home record of 2-0-1.
- The Lightning are now 3-5-2 over their last 10 matchups with the Maple Leafs.
- Tampa Bay has lost each of their last four home matchups with the Maple Leafs in overtime (includes playoffs).
- The Lightning were outshot 52-33 by Toronto, including a 20-12 deficit in the third period and a 5-0 deficit in overtime.
- Toronto's 52 shots on goal are the third-most shots allowed in Lightning history.
- Nikita Kucherov led the Lightning with six shots on goal. He has 13 shots on goal over his last two games.
- Erik Cernak delivered a game-high four hits.
- Mikhail Sergachev blocked four shots, the most of any Bolt on Saturday. Sergachev leads Tampa Bay with 16 blocked shots this season.
- Tampa Bay won 40 of 63 faceoffs and was led at the dot by Luke Glendening who won 10 of his 13 draws.
- Lightning goaltender Jonas Johansson made a career-high 48 saves in defeat as his record moved to 2-1-2.
- Johansson passed his previous career-high by eight saves (3/4/21 at NYI – 40 saves).

- ❑ Tampa Bay sold out its 333<sup>rd</sup> consecutive home game (excludes 2021-22 due to COVID-19 restrictions).
- ❑ The Lightning went 2-for-2 on the power-play in the first period, scoring two goals in within 21 seconds from the time the penalties were taken.
- ❑ There have only been two instances in Lightning history where the Bolts have scored two power-play goals in the same game within less than 20 seconds or less from the time the penalties were taken (11/3/05 vs OTT – 15 seconds, 11/14/19 vs NYR – 11 seconds).
- ❑ After going 2-for-4 on Saturday, Tampa Bay's power play is running at a 35% success rate this season.
- ❑ The Bolts scored three goals on their first four shots of the game.
- ❑ William Nylander scored the game-opening goal for the Maple Leafs at 4:16 of the first period.
- ❑ Nikita Kucherov scored a power-play goal to tie the game 1-1 at 6:26 of the first period. Kucherov tallied his fifth goal and seventh point of the season. The goal also marked Kucherov's third power-play point of the season (2-1—3).
- ❑ Brayden Point tallied his sixth assist and point of the season with the primary helper on the play.
- ❑ Victor Hedman notched the secondary assist, marking his sixth point of the season (1-5—6).
- ❑ Alex Barre-Boulet notched his first goal of the season, tapping a back-door pass between the legs of Leafs goaltender Ilya Samsonov. The goal gave Tampa Bay a 2-1 lead at 10:04 of the first period.
- ❑ Barre-Boulet's last goal came on November 23, 2021 versus Philadelphia.
- ❑ Nikita Kucherov tallied his second point of the period with the primary assist on Barre-Boulet's goal.
- ❑ Brayden Point also picked up his second point of the period with an assist on Barre-Boulet's goal.
- ❑ Nikita Kucherov registered his third point of the period with another power-play goal at 13:29 of the first period. The goal marked Kucherov's sixth goal of the season and his third on the power play.

- Kucherov recorded his 15<sup>th</sup> career three-point period, one shy of Martin St. Louis' franchise benchmark (16).
- Mikhail Sergachev posted his second point of the season (1-1—2), setting up Kucherov for a one-timer from the point.
- Steven Stamkos recorded his sixth point of the season (2-4—6) with the secondary assist on the goal.
- Matthew Knies scored at 12:11 of the third period to cut the Bolts' lead to 3-2.
- Knies picked up his second goal of the game at 14:33 of the third period to knot the score at three.
- John Tavares scored at 4:05 of overtime to give the Leafs a 4-3 win.
- The Lightning return to action on Tuesday at AMALIE Arena where they will play host to the Carolina Hurricanes.
- Tampa Bay is 69-51-11 with 10 ties all-time against the Hurricanes, including a home record of 42-21-3 with three ties.
