Derek Lalonde is in his third season as head coach of the Detroit Red Wings. Lalonde, 52, was named the 28th head coach in franchise history on June 30, 2022 after spending the previous four seasons as an assistant coach with the Tampa Bay Lightning, helping the team win back-to-back Stanley Cup titles in 2019-20 and 2020-21.

IN THE RIGHT DIRECTION

Detroit finished the 2023-24 season with its most wins (41) and points (91) since 2015-16. The Red Wings held the second Wild Card spot in the Eastern Conference after a 3-1 victory over Buffalo on April 7 at Little Caesars Arena. The last time Detroit occupied a playoff spot this late in a season (minimum 50 GP) was in 2015-16 when it maintained a playoff spot for the final nine days of the campaign en route to clinching its 25th-straight Stanley Cup Playoff berth.

The Red Wings continued their push for a Stanley Cup Playoff berth with three comeback wins in a four-day span to end the 2023-24 season. **Dylan Larkin** tallied a power play goal 41 seconds into overtime to secure a 5-4 victory over Toronto on April 13 at Scotiabank Arena. Detroit remained in contention as **Lucas Raymond** scored the game-tying goal with 1:17 left in regulation before netting the game-winner with 24.4 seconds remaining in overtime to earn a 5-4 win over Montréal on April 15 at Little Caesars Arena. One night later, **David Perron** scored the game-tying goal with 3.3 seconds left in regulation as the Red Wings captured a 5-4 shootout win at Montréal in their regular-season finale. However, Washington used an empty-net goal to claim a 2-1 victory at Philadelphia on April 16 and clinch the second Wild Card spot in the Eastern Conference.

EVERYBODY LOVES RAYMOND

- * The Red Wings re-signed forward **Lucas Raymond** to an eight-year contract with an average annual value of \$8.075 million on Sept. 16, keeping him in Hockeytown through the 2031-32 campaign.
- * **Raymond** has picked up three assists in three games to begin the 2024-25 season, including a pair of helpers on Oct. 10 vs. Pittsburgh. He paced the Red Wings with 21 multi-point games in 2023-24, including nine multi-assist outings.
- * **Raymond** enjoyed a breakout season with the Red Wings in 2023-24, ranking among the team leaders with 31 goals (2nd), 41 assists (2nd), 72 points (1st), six power play goals (4th), 16 power play points (6th), three overtime goals (T1st), four game-winning goals (T3rd), 163 shots (3rd) and a 19.0 shooting percentage (1st) in 82 games.
- * Has compiled 24 points (14-10-24) and a 25.9 shooting percentage in 21 games since March 12 at Buffalo. Only Steven Stamkos (16), Filip Forsberg (16), Sam Reinhart (16), Artemi Panarin (16), Kirill Kaprizov (16), Auston Matthews (16), Brayden Point (15) and Mikko Rantanen (15) have scored more goals than **Raymond** since March 12.
- * Became the third Red Wings skater in the past 35 years to lead the team in points at season's end at age 22-or-younger, joining **Dylan Larkin** (2018-19 and 2017-18) and Steve Yzerman (1987-88).
- * **Raymond** also became the fourth Red Wings player in the previous 30 years to record at least 30 goals in a season at age 22-or-younger, joining **Larkin** (32 in 2018-19), Vyacheslav Kozlov (34 in 1993-94) and Keith Primeau (31 in 1993-94).
- * **Raymond** scored the game-tying goal with 1:17 left in regulation before netting the game-winner with 24.4 seconds remaining in overtime on April 15 vs. Montréal. He joined Ray Sheppard (Nov. 12, 1991 at Calgary) as the second player in Red Wings history to score a game-tying goal in the final two minutes of regulation and the overtime winner in the same contest.
- * Scored his fifth career overtime goal on April 15 vs. Montréal, tying Brett Hull, Gustav Nyquist and John Sorrell for the eighth-most in franchise history. **Raymond** also netted the overtime goal on Dec. 29, 2023 vs. Nashville and Oct. 30, 2023 at the New York Islanders.
- * Ended the season on a six-game point streak (6-5-11 in 6 GP), matching the longest such run of his NHL career. He also recorded six-game point streaks from March 12-21 (7-2-9 in 6 GP) and Nov. 11-26, 2023 (4-2-6 in 6 GP).
- * Matched career highs in goals (3) and points (4) on April 11 at Pittsburgh. It marked his second NHL hat trick, and first since recording three goals and an assist on Oct. 24, 2021 at Chicago.
- * Logged his 100th career NHL assist on April 9 vs. Washington.
- * **Raymond** tallied the shootout-deciding goal on Jan. 4 at Los Angeles and Dec. 22, 2023 vs. Philadelphia. In all, he is 6-for-13 (46.2 percent) in shootout attempts to begin his NHL career, including four shootout-deciding goals.
- * Matched a career high with three assists on Jan. 2 at San Jose and Oct. 22, 2023 vs. Calgary.

SHOWTIME!

- * The Red Wings brought back one of the greatest U.S.-born players in NHL history for the 2024-25 season, signing forward **Patrick Kane** to a one-year contract extension on June 30.
- * **Kane** picked up his 814th career assist on Oct. 14 at the New York Rangers, passing Mike Modano for the second-most by a U.S.-born skater in NHL history behind Phil Housley (894).
- * **Kane** joined the Red Wings during the 2023-24 season and ranked among the team leaders with 20 goals (4th), 27 assists (8th), 47 points (T6th), two power play goals (T10th), 15 power play points (7th), three overtime goals (T1st), seven game-winning goals (1st) and 147 shots (6th) in 50 games.
- * Paced all Red Wings skaters with seven game-winning goals, including overtime goals on March 19 vs. Columbus, Feb. 25 at Chicago and Feb. 22 vs. Colorado. He tied Tomas Tatar (7 in 2014-15) for the most game-winning goals by a Red Wings player in a single campaign since 2013-14.
- * **Kane** scored his 52nd career shootout goal on April 16 at Montréal, tying Jonathan Toews for the most in NHL history. It also marked **Kane's** 22nd shootout-deciding goal, moving into sole possession of second place in NHL history behind Frans Nielsen (23).
- * Scored his 20th goal of the season on April 9 vs. Washington. He reached the 20-goal mark for the 16th time in his career, tying Modano for the most 20-goal seasons by a U.S.-born skater in NHL history.
- * **Kane** recorded a 10-game point streak from Feb. 10-29 (6-9-15 in 10 GP). It marked his eighth career point streak of at least 10 games, and first since a 12-game run from Dec. 31, 2019-Feb. 1, 2020 (5-13-18 in 12 GP).
- * Became the eighth player in Red Wings history with a point streak of at least 10 games in their first season with the club, and first since Dino Ciccarelli posted an 11-game point streak from March 18-April 15, 1993 (9-12-21 in 11 GP).
- * **Kane** had three-consecutive multi-point games from Feb. 24-27 (2-4-6 in 3 GP) and Dec. 18-22, 2023 (3-4-7 in 3 GP). He became the first Red Wings player age 35-or-older with multiple points in three-straight games since Henrik Zetterberg, who did so from Oct. 9-13, 2015 (2-5-7 in 3 GP).
- * **Kane** recorded his 800th career NHL assist on Feb. 19 at Seattle. He is one of three active players to reach the 800-assist mark along with Sidney Crosby (1,009) and Evgeni Malkin (807).
- * **Kane** skated in his 1,200th career NHL game on Feb. 10 vs. Vancouver. He is one of nine active players to play in 1,200 NHL games.
- * **Kane** posted a four-game goal streak from Dec. 20-27, 2023 (5-2-7 in 4 GP). He became the first Red Wings player to post a four-game goal streak at age 35-or-older since Pavel Datsyuk, who did so from Oct. 25-Nov. 2, 2014 (5-3-8 in 4 GP).
- * Named the NHL's Third Star for the week ending Dec. 24, 2023, scoring eight points (4-4-8) in four games from Dec. 18-23, 2023.
- * Scored a power play goal on Dec. 9, 2023 vs. Ottawa, marking his first goal in a Detroit uniform.

- * **Kane** made his Red Wings debut on Dec. 7, 2023 vs. San Jose, recording three shots in 16:33 time on ice.
- * A three-time Stanley Cup champion, **Kane** has racked up 1,285 points (471-814-1,285) in 1,233 NHL games with the Chicago Blackhawks, New York Rangers and Red Wings since 2007-08, trailing only Crosby (1,602), Alex Ovechkin (1,553) and Malkin (1,307) for the most among active skaters.

YEAR OF THE CAT

- * **Alex DeBrincat** factored on all three of Detroit's goals on Oct. 10 vs. Pittsburgh, recording two goals and an assist. He collected 18 multi-point games and seven three-point performances in 2023-24.
- * **DeBrincat** skated in all 82 games during the 2023-24 season and ranked among the team leaders with 27 goals (3rd), 40 assists (3rd), 67 points (3rd), 34 penalty minutes (T10th), 11 power play goals (2nd), 19 power play points (3rd) and 237 shots (1st).
- * Has registered 10 points (5-5-10) in his last seven games dating back to April 11 at Pittsburgh.
- * Reached the 40-assist mark for the first time in his NHL career in 2023-24, becoming the first forward to record at least 40 assists in his first season with the Red Wings since Brendan Shanahan (41 in 1996-97).
- * Also reached the 60-point mark for the third-consecutive season and fourth time in his NHL career.
- * Recorded three-consecutive multi-point games from April 11-15 (3-4-7 in 3 GP). It marked the first time **DeBrincat** has tallied multiple points in three-straight games since Dec. 12-17, 2022 as a member of the Ottawa Senators (2-6-8 in 3 GP).
- * Matched a career high with three assists on April 11 at Pittsburgh and Dec. 22, 2023 vs. Philadelphia.
- * **DeBrincat** skated in his 500th career NHL game on Jan. 31 vs. Ottawa. He is one of five members of the 2016 NHL Draft class to reach the 500-game mark, joining Matthew Tkachuk (592), Auston Matthews (566), Clayton Keller (525) and Pierre-Luc Dubois (518).
- * **DeBrincat** represented Detroit at the 2024 NHL All-Star Game at Scotiabank Arena in Toronto on Feb. 3. It marked his second career All-Star selection, having represented the Chicago Blackhawks at the 2022 NHL All-Star Game in Las Vegas.
- * Named the NHL's Third Star for the week ending Feb. 4 after helping Team Matthews win the 2024 NHL All-Star Game and \$1 million prize. He finished with six points (3-3-6) in two games, skating primarily on a line with Mathew Barzal and Filip Forsberg.
- * **DeBrincat's** first power play goal on Dec. 18, 2023 vs. Anaheim was the 400th point of his NHL career. With 443 career points, he has the third-most points of any skater in the 2016 NHL Draft class behind Matthews (652) and Matthew Tkachuk (581).
- * **DeBrincat** scored his 200th career NHL goal on Dec. 2, 2023 at Montréal. With 216 career goals, he is one of four players from the 2016 NHL Draft class to eclipse the 200-goal milestone, joining Matthews (369), Matthew Tkachuk (218) and Patrik Laine (204).
- * Recorded his fifth career NHL hat trick and added an assist on Oct. 22, 2023 vs. Calgary.
- * The Farmington Hills, Mich., native became the fifth Michigan-born player in Red Wings history to score a hat trick, joining Jimmy Carson (4x), **Dylan Larkin** (2x), Justin Abdelkader (2x) and Kevin Miller (1x).

CAPTAIN FANTASTIC

- * **Dylan Larkin** is in his fifth season as Detroit's Captain and 10th NHL campaign. He was named the 37th Captain in franchise history on Jan. 13, 2021, becoming the first Michigander and Metro Detroit native to wear the 'C' for the Red Wings, assuming a captaincy that had been vacant for two seasons following the end of Henrik Zetterberg's career in 2017-18 due to injury.
- * Recorded his 500th career NHL point with an assist on **Lucas Raymond's** second goal on April 11 at Pittsburgh. **Larkin** became the 14th player in Red Wings history to reach the 500-point milestone, and the 10th Michigan-born player in NHL history to register at least 500 career points.
- * Since making his NHL debut as a 19-year-old in 2015-16, **Larkin** leads the Red Wings in games played (655), goals (214), assists (295), points (509), penalty minutes (413), power play goals (59), power play points (125), shorthanded goals (8), overtime goals (9), game-winning goals (28) and shots (1,957). He has represented Detroit at three NHL All-Star Games (2016, 2022, 2023).
- * **Larkin** has collected 94 points (45-49-94) in 92 games since signing an eight-year contract extension with an average annual value of \$8.7 million on March 1, 2023.

LOVE TO "C" IT

- * **Dylan Larkin** has scored in each of his last two games. He has recorded 14 points (6-8-14) in 11 games since March 30 at Florida.
- * **Larkin** skated in 68 games during the 2023-24 season and ranked among the team leaders with 33 goals (1st), 36 assists (4th), 69 points (2nd), 39 penalty minutes (T6th), 14 power play goals (1st), 26 power play points (2nd), two shorthanded goals (T1st), two overtime goals (T3rd), five game-winning goals (2nd) and 221 shots (2nd). The Red Wings posted a 37-22-9 record with **Larkin** in the lineup, which paces to 100 points over a full 82-game campaign.
- * Averaged over a point-per-game for the first time in his NHL career in 2023-24 (33-36-69 in 68 GP). He became the first Red Wings skater to average a point-per-game (minimum 48 GP) since Pavel Datsyuk did so in 2014-15 (26-39-65 in 63 GP).
- * Set a career high with 33 goals during the 2023-24 season, which were the most by a Red Wings skater since Marián Hossa (40) and Johan Franzén (34) in 2008-09.
- * Scored his ninth career overtime goal on April 13 at Toronto, tying Steve Yzerman and Brendan Shanahan for the second-most in franchise history behind Sergei Fedorov (12).
- * **Larkin** (214-295-509 in 655 GP) is the sixth member of the 2014 NHL Draft class to reach the 500-point milestone, joining Leon Draisaitl (853), David Pastrnak (732), Brayden Point (556), Sam Reinhart (546) and William Nylander (532).

- * **Larkin** has recorded his third-consecutive 30-goal season and fourth of his NHL career, becoming the first Red Wings to record at least three-straight 30-goal seasons since Henrik Zetterberg (4 from 2005-06 to 2008-09)
- * **Larkin** also reached the 60-point mark for the third-consecutive season and fifth time in his NHL career.
- * Authored a 12-game point streak from Jan. 4-31 (10-6-16 in 12 GP). It marked the second-longest point streak of his NHL career behind a 14-game stretch which lasted from Dec. 4-31, 2018 (7-10-17 in 14 GP).
- * **Larkin** scored a goal in four-straight games from Jan. 23-31 (5-1-6 in 4 GP), tying the longest streak of his NHL career.
- * **Larkin's** first goal on Jan. 27 vs. Vegas marked the 200th of his NHL career. He became the 16th player in Red Wings history to reach the 200-goal milestone. Additionally, he is the 10th Michigan-born player in NHL history to score at least 200 career goals.
- * Posted four-consecutive multi-point games from Oct. 18-24, 2023 (3-8-11 in 4 GP). He also logged four-straight multi-point games last season from Feb. 11-16, 2023 (5-5-10 in 4 GP).
- * Opened the 2023-24 season with an eight-game point streak from Oct. 12-26, 2023 (4-11-15 in 8 GP). He became the first Red Wings skater with a season-opening point streak of at least eight games since Zetterberg authored a 17-game point streak (13-14-27 in 17 GP) to begin the 2007-08 campaign.

MO-MENTUM

- * The Red Wings re-signed **Moritz Seider** to a seven-year contract with an average annual value of \$8.55 million on Sept. 19, keeping him in Hockeytown through the 2030-31 campaign.
- * **Seider** recorded assists in back-to-back games to open the 2024-25 season. He has played in 249-consecutive games dating back to his NHL debut on Oct. 14, 2021 vs. Tampa Bay, surpassing Bryan McCabe (246 GP from Oct. 7, 1995-April 19, 1998) for the seventh-longest "Iron Man" streak by a defenseman from the start of his NHL career.
- * **Seider** logged 42 points (9-33-42) and 51 penalty minutes in 82 games during the 2023-24 season, trailing only **Shayne Gostisbehere** (10-46-56 in 81 GP) for the team's scoring lead among defensemen.
- * **Seider** was the only NHL player with least 200 hits and 200 blocks in 2023-24, setting franchise records for hits (211) and blocks (212) while leading all Red Wings skaters in average time on ice (22:22).
- * Recorded 10 blocks on April 7 vs. Buffalo, which are the most by a Red Wings player in a single game since the stat was tracked by the NHL in 2005-06.
- * **Seider's** second assist on Jan. 27 vs. Vegas marked the 100th of his NHL career. **Seider** tallied his 100th assist in his 213th career game to become the third-fastest defenseman in franchise history to reach the 100-assist mark, trailing only Reed Larson (185) and Nicklas Lidström (194).
- * **Seider**, who celebrated his 23rd birthday on April 6, ranks among Detroit's top defensemen age 22-or-younger with 240 games played

(1st), 20 goals (5th), 112 assists (1st), 132 points (1st), five game-winning goals (2nd) and 27 multi-point games (1st).

* **Seider** recorded his 100th career point with an assist on Oct. 26, 2023 vs. Winnipeg. He reached the 100-point mark in his 172nd career game, becoming the third-fastest defenseman in Red Wings history to achieve 100 career points behind Larson (139) and Lidström (160).

WELCOME TO THE TARASENK-SHOW

* The Red Wings added another established scorer to their lineup ahead of the 2024-25 season, signing forward **Vladimir Tarasenko** to a two-year contract with an average annual value of \$4.75 million on July 3.

* **Tarasenko** scored a goal in his Red Wings debut on Oct. 10 vs. Pittsburgh. Currently at 294 career NHL goals, he has the fourth-most goals among active Russian-born players, trailing only Alex Ovechkin (853), Evgeni Malkin (500) and Nikita Kucherov (324).

* **Tarasenko** split the 2023-24 season between the Ottawa Senators and Florida Panthers, recording 41 points (17-24-41), a plus-13 rating and 12 penalty minutes in 57 games with the Senators before tallying 14 points (6-8-14) in 19 regular-season games with the Panthers.

* Helped the Panthers win their first Stanley Cup championship in franchise history, logging nine points (5-4-9) in 24 postseason contests. He also captured a Stanley Cup title with the St. Louis Blues in 2019.

* Set career highs in assists (48), points (82) and game-winning goals (9) in 75 games with St. Louis in 2021-22. He netted a career-best 40 goals with the Blues during the 2015-16 season.

* In all, **Tarasenko** has compiled 630 points (294-336-630) and 197 penalty minutes in 754 NHL games with the St. Louis Blues, New York Rangers, Ottawa Senators, Florida Panthers and Red Wings since 2012-13, reaching the 30-goal mark six times and the 70-point mark four times.

* Selected to four NHL All-Star Games, including three-consecutive appearances from 2015-17.

* Named to the NHL Second All-Star Team in 2014-15 and 2015-16, and was a finalist for the Lady Byng Memorial Trophy in 2016-17.

LIGHTS, CAM, ACTION!

* The Red Wings added another goaltender prior to the 2024-25, signing **Cam Talbot** to a two-year contract with an average annual value of \$2.5 million on July 1.

* **Talbot** stopped all 42 shots he faced to secure his first victory in a Red Wings uniform. It marked his 32nd NHL career shutout.

* **Talbot** became the third Red Wings goaltender in as many seasons to record a shutout in his first start with the club, joining Ville Husso (Oct. 14, 2022 vs. Montréal) and James Reimer (Oct. 16, 2023 at Columbus).

* **Talbot** (37 years, 99 days) became the third goaltender in Red Wings history to post a shutout at age 37-or-older, joining Dominik Hasek (17x; oldest: 43 years, 61 days) and Ed Giacomin (3x; oldest: 37 years, 154 days)

* **Talbot** has posted shutouts with seven different clubs in his 488-game NHL career (New York Rangers, Edmonton, Calgary, Minnesota, Ottawa, Los Angeles and Detroit). He became the second goaltender in NHL history to record a shutout for at least seven different franchises (also Sean Burke w/ 7).

* **Talbot** has competed in two NHL All-Star Games, representing Los Angeles in 2024 and Minnesota in 2022.

* Originally signed as an undrafted free agent by the New York Rangers on March 30, 2010, the University of Alabama in Huntsville product has compiled a 246-176-42 record with a 2.63 goals-against average, a 0.914 save percentage and 32 shutouts in 488 NHL games since 2013-14.

PRO BLUE

Detroit forwards **J.T. Compher**, **Andrew Copp**, **Dylan Larkin** and **Tyler Motte** were teammates at the University of Michigan in 2014-15. Under the direction of longtime Head Coach and Red Wings alumnus Red Berenson, the Wolverines finished the 2014-15 campaign with a 22-15-0 record (12-8-0, Big Ten).

* Michigan won the 2014 Great Lakes Invitational at Joe Louis Arena, earning 2-1 victories over Michigan Tech and Michigan State.

* Returned to Hockeytown in March for the 2015 Big Ten Tournament, falling 4-2 against top-ranked Minnesota in the title game.

* **J.T. Compher** was an alternate captain at Michigan as a sophomore in 2014-15, notching 24 points (12-12-24) and 40 penalty minutes in 34 games. He also appeared in five games at the 2015 IIHF World Junior Championship in Toronto, Ont. and Montréal, Que.

* **Andrew Copp** served as team captain of the Wolverines as a junior in 2014-15 and was selected to the Big Ten Second All-Star Team after logging 31 points (14-17-31), a plus-six rating and 29 penalty minutes in 36 games. Originally selected by the Winnipeg Jets in the fourth round (104th overall) of the 2013 NHL Entry Draft, he recorded an assist in his NHL debut on April 11, 2015 vs. Calgary.

* **Dylan Larkin** was named Big Ten Freshman of the Year after racking up 47 points (15-32-47), a plus-18 rating and 38 penalty minutes in 35 games in his lone season with the Wolverines. He added seven points (5-2-7) in five games at the 2015 IIHF World Junior Championship. Selected by Detroit in the first round (15th overall) of the 2014 NHL Entry Draft, he signed a three-year entry-level contract with the club on May 21, 2015 and tallied five points (3-2-5) in six playoff games with the AHL's Grand Rapids Griffins.

* **Tyler Motte** was a sophomore at Michigan in 2014-15, recording 31 points (9-22-31) and 14 penalty minutes in 35 games. He also logged one assist, a plus-one rating and two penalty minutes with Team USA at the 2015 IIHF World Junior Championship.

CALL IT A COMEBACK

* The Red Wings set a franchise record with 14 third-period comeback wins during the 2023-24 season, tying the New York Rangers for the most among all NHL clubs. In total, Detroit earned 23 comeback wins in 2023-24, trailing only the Rangers (28), Colorado Avalanche (26) and Dallas Stars (26) for the league lead.

* The Red Wings posted seven multi-goal comeback wins in 2023-24, accomplishing the feat on Oct. 30 at the New York Islanders, Nov. 4 vs. Boston, Jan. 4 at Los Angeles, Feb. 10 vs. Vancouver, March 19 vs. Columbus, April 15 vs. Montréal and April 16 at Montréal. The Red Wings overcame multi-goal deficits in back-to-back days against the Canadiens to end the 2023-24 season. It marked the third time Detroit overcame a multi-goal deficit to win on consecutive days, having previously done so on Nov. 9-10, 2018 and Dec. 4-5, 1984.

* Additionally, the Red Wings led all NHL clubs with 11 overtime wins during the 2023-24 season, with goals coming from **Patrick Kane** (3), **Lucas Raymond** (3), **Dylan Larkin** (2), **Jake Walman** (2) and **Ben Chiarot** (1).

DATSYUK GETS THE CALL

Former Red Wings forward **Pavel Datsyuk** was elected to the Hockey Hall of Fame in the Player Category in 2024. Elected in his first year of eligibility, **Datsyuk** is one of seven individuals who will be formally inducted to Hockey Hall of Fame Honored Membership in the Player or Builder Category, joining Natalie Darwitz, Jeremy Roenick, Shea Weber, Krissy Wendell, former Red Wings player and Assistant Coach **Colin Campbell** (builder) and David Poile (builder). The Red Wings will face the Toronto Maple Leafs in the annual Hockey Hall of Fame Game on Friday, Nov. 8 at 7:00 p.m. at Scotiabank Arena before the 2024 Hockey Hall of Fame Induction Celebration takes place on Monday, Nov. 11 at 7:30 p.m. at Brookfield Place in Toronto.

* Helped the Red Wings win Stanley Cup championships in 2002 and 2008. He places among the team's all-time postseason leaders with 157 games played (8th), 42 goals (T8th), 71 assists (5th), 113 points (6th), a plus-34 rating (4th), 15 power play goals (T6th), 38 power play points (T7th), seven game-winning goals (T10th) and 424 shots (5th).

* Won or tied for Detroit's scoring lead in six consecutive seasons (2003-04 to 2009-10), including back-to-back 97-point campaigns in 2007-08 and 2008-09. He was named to the NHL's Second All-Star Team in 2008-09 after recording 97 points (32-65-97), a plus-34 rating and 22 penalty minutes in 81 games.

* Selected to four NHL All-Star Games (2004, 2008, 2009, 2012), though he did not participate in the 2009 edition due to injury. He also competed in the 2002 NHL YoungStars Game.

* Won the Lady Byng Memorial Trophy four consecutive times from 2005-06 to 2008-09, the Frank J. Selke Trophy as the NHL's top defensive forward in three successive seasons from 2007-08 to 2009-10, and the NHL Plus-Minus Award in 2007-08 after leading all skaters with a plus-41 rating.

* Member of the exclusive Triple Gold Club, winning a gold medal representing his country at the 2012 IIHF World Championship in Helsinki, Finland and Stockholm, Sweden, before captaining the Olympic Athletes from Russia to a gold medal at the 2018 Winter Olympics in Pyeongchang, South Korea. He also earned a silver medal at the 2010 IIHF World Championship and was named the tournament's best forward after logging seven points (6-1-7) in six games.

* On the international stage, Datsyuk competed in five Winter Olympics (2002, 2006, 2010, 2014, 2018), seven IIHF World Championships (2001, 2003, 2005, 2010, 2012, 2016, 2018) and two World Cup of Hockey events (2004, 2016).

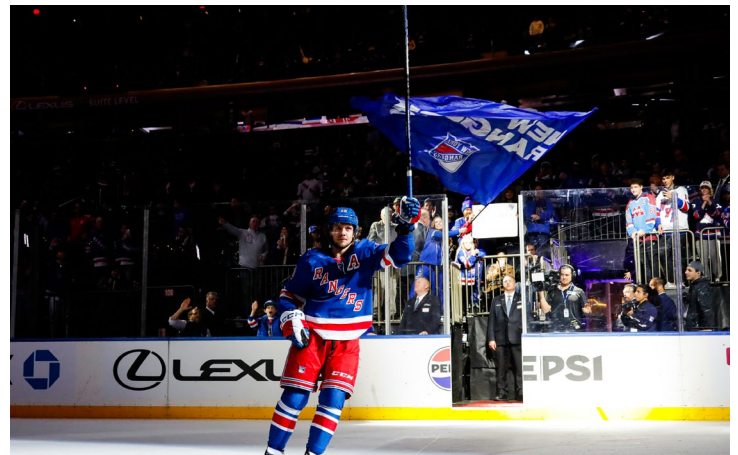

RANGERS RUNDOWN

- The New York Rangers begin a three-game road trip, against the Detroit Red Wings on Thursday night (7:30 PM ET - TV: ESPN Plus/HULU - Radio: ESPN 880 AM).

- The Blueshirts have earned points in each of their first three games for the first time since the 2015-16 season (3-0-0). The last occurrence of New York having points in its first four games was 2008-09 (4-0-0).

- The Rangers will aim to win their first two road games of a season for the first time since the 2015-16 season. On the road last year, the Blueshirts had a 25-12-4 record for 54 points. It marked the fifth time in team history they had 25 or plus road wins in a year. Their 25 road wins ranked tied for third in the NHL.

- The Rangers have earned at least one point in 12 of their last 13 games against Detroit (10-1-2) and 19 of their last 21 games against the Red Wings, dating back to Jan. 22, 2017 (14-2-5 record).

- New York has scored 15 goals through the first three games of the season, tied for the most in franchise history (Others: 1983-84 and 1979-80). The team record for the most goals through four games is 22 (1976-77).

- Eleven different Rangers have scored a goal through the first three games of the season, the most in the NHL. In addition, 16 different Rangers have tallied a point this year, which is tied for the most in the league.

- Artemi Panarin has points (2G-5A) in four-straight against the Red Wings and in nine of his last 10 contests against them (3G-12A).

- Over the first three games, Rangers defensemen have accounted for 10 points (2G-6A). Last season, the 201 combined points (44G-157A) from New York blueliners ranked fourth in the NHL.

- Rangers assistant general manager Ryan Martin had a 16-year stint (2005-21) with the Red Wings, including 11 seasons (2010-21) as the team's assistant general manager and eight seasons as the general manager of the Grand Rapids Griffins (2013-21).
- Red Wings defenseman Erik Gustafsson skated for the Rangers in 2023-24, recording 31 points (6G-25A) in 76 games and a plus-3 rating.
- Red Wings forward Patrick Kane played in 19 regular season games for the Blueshirts last season and an additional seven playoff games.
- Red Wings forward Tyler Motte had two stints with the Rangers, during the 2021-22 and 2022-23 seasons.
- Red Wings forward Vladamir Tarasenko was a trade acquisition by New York during the 2022-23 season, recording 21 points (8G-13A) in 31 regular season games.
- Red Wings goaltender Cam Talbot played his first two seasons (2013-14 - 2014-15) with the Rangers, making 53 starts

with the team.

- Red Wings forward Andrew Copp played for the Rangers at the end of the 2021-22 season following his acquisition at the trade deadline. Copp finished with the second most points by an in-season acquisition in Rangers history, behind Steve Larmer in 1994 (16 PTS in 23 GP). Copp accumulated 32 points in 36 total games with the Rangers (8G-10A in 16 RS GP & 6G-8A in 20 PS GP).

TEAM NOTES

BREAD WINNER

Artemi Panarin (2G-5A) is the eighth player in Rangers history with at least seven points through the team's first three games of a season. He joins Mika Zibanejad (8 in 2019-20), Bernie Nicholls (8 in 1990-91), Rod Gilbert (8 in 1976-77), Pierre Larouche (7 in 1986-87), Phil Esposito (7 in 1977-78), Walt Tkaczuk (7 in 1973-74) and Andy Bathgate (7 in 1961-62).

Panarin is also the fourth player in Rangers history to record multiple points in three straight games to start a season. The others: Chris Kreider (3 GP in 2016-17), Bernie Nicholls (3 GP in 1990-91) and Mike McEwen (3 GP in 1978-79).

His 37 multi-point games since the beginning of last season are the fifth most in the NHL.

Chris Kreider has three goals in three games in his 13th season, his latest being a game-winning tally on Monday night. Kreider's 45 career game-winning goals are the third most in franchise history behind Rod Gilbert (52) and Jean Ratelle (46).

Since 2021-22, Kreider's 10 shorthanded goals are tied for the most in the NHL (Travis Konecny).

Kreider has 111 career power play goals, the second most in franchise history.

PUCK STOPPING SHESTERKIN

Igor Shesterkin has two wins on the young season, allowing one or fewer goals in both victories. He has 17 career wins in the month of October (24 GP). His .708 win percentage is the second highest in NHL history in the calendar month of October (min. 15 GP), behind only Linus Ullmark (.714).

Since the beginning of last season, the 20 games in which Shesterkin has allowed one or fewer goals rank first among NHL goaltenders.

Shesterkin began the season with a 31-save shutout, the first by a Ranger goaltender in their season-opening game since October 12, 1956 when Gump Worsley blanked the Blackhawks. The only other goaltenders in Rangers history to record a season-opening shutout are John Ross Roach (Nov. 11, 1930 & Nov. 15, 1928), Dave Kerr (Nov. 7, 1937) and Hal Winkler (Nov. 16, 1926).

Last season, Igor Shesterkin finished tied for third in wins (36), tied for fifth in save percentage (.913), and seventh in GAA (2.58).

He posted his third consecutive 30-win season. Only two other goaltenders in franchise history have had three 30-win campaigns in their career: Henrik Lundqvist (11) and Ed Giacomin (5).

He also finished 16-5-1 in his last 22 games of the year.

FORECHECK, BACKCHECK, TROCHECK

Vincent Trocheck has two points (1G-1A) through the first three games of the season.

In 2023-24, Trocheck posted a career-high in assists (52) and points (77). On New York, he finished fifth in goals, third in assists and second in points.

With a 58.7 percent clip in the faceoff dot, Trocheck had the fourth highest percentage in the NHL among players who took 700 or more draws.

Trocheck was named last year's winner of the Steven McDonald Extra Effort Award, which is presented annually to the Ranger who, as chosen by the fans, "goes above and beyond the call of duty."

LIVE, LAF, LOVE

Alexis Lafreniere has points (2G-2A) in all three games to start the season. On October 12 against Utah, Lafreniere skated in his 300th career NHL game.

Since his rookie season in 2020-21, he has the fifth most points on the Blueshirts (152) and in that same frame, ranks third on the Rangers in even strength goals (72) and fourth in even strength points (139).

Last year, Lafreniere had a career high in goals (28), assists (29) and points (57) in 2022-23 and was one of five players on New York to play in all 82 games. On the Rangers, he ranked second in even strength goals (26) and third in even-strength points (51).

FANTASTIC MR. FOX

Adam Fox tallied three assists in the home opener on October 12. It was his 12th career game with three or more assists and first since Feb. 15, 2024 against Montreal. Since 2019-20, his 12 such games ranks fifth among NHL defensemen.

Since 2022-23, Fox's 36 multi-point games rank fifth among NHL defensemen. Cale Makar and Quinn Hughes are tied for the lead with 47.

Last season, Fox set a career-high in 17 goals and posted 56 assists and 73 points last season. He scored the most goals by a Rangers defenseman since Brian Leetch in 2000-01 (21).

Among NHL blueliners, he ranked tied for sixth in goals, sixth in points, and eighth in assists.

MIKA'S MISSION

Mika Zibanejad is in his ninth season with the Rangers after being acquired ahead of the 2016-17 season. In that time frame, Zibanejad ranks fifth in the NHL in power play goals with 101 which is also the fifth most in Rangers history.

Zibanejad sits one assist away from being the 13th player in Rangers history to notch 300 helpers.

Last season, he notched 40 assists in a season for the third consecutive year and 25 goals for the sixth time in his career in 2023-24.

He had double-digit power play goals (12) for a seventh straight season. The only other player that has reached 10-plus power play goals in the last seven seasons is Steven Stamkos.

2023-24 RECAP

The Rangers earned a trip to the Eastern Conference Final last season, after defeating Washington in the First Round and Carolina in the Second Round. Their playoff run came after a regular season that saw them finishing with a 55-23-4 record for 114 points.

They earned first place in the League standings for the fifth time in franchise history, won the Metro Division and eighth division title in franchise history. New York set the franchise record in wins (55) and points (114).

Other notes from the 2023-24 season include:

- The Rangers recorded a 26.4 power play percentage, the second-best mark in franchise history (1977-78) and third best in the NHL.
- With an 84.5 clip, the Blueshirts finished with the third highest penalty kill percentage in the NHL.
- New York's 52.3 faceoff percentage ranked tied for the third highest in team history and highest since the 2007-08 season.
- The Blueshirts had a franchise record and league-high 28 comeback victories. Fourteen of the 28 came when trailing during the third period, tied for the most in the league. The Blueshirts also had 20 wins when trailing first in a game, the most in a single season in franchise history.
- The Rangers' 106 third period goals were the eighth most in franchise history and the most since 1991-92. In the NHL, the goal number was the second best in the NHL.
