WINNIPEG JETS

All-Time Wild Record: 29-24-6 (17-10-3 at Grand Casino Arena, 12-14-3 at Winnipeg)

2024-25: Minnesota went 0-2-1 vs. Winnipeg last season...The Jets won the series-opening game, 2-1, in overtime at Canada Life Centre (10/13), the second contest, 4-1, at Grand Casino Arena (11/25) and the series finale, 5-0, vs. Winnipeg (12/21)...D **Jake Middleton** led the Wild with two points (2-0=2)...D **Brock Faber** (0-1=1), LW **Marcus Johansson** (0-1=1) and C **Marco Rossi** (0-1=1) each had an assist...G **Filip Gustavsson** is 0-1-1 with a 2.51 GAA and a .924 SV% in two starts...G **Jesper Wallstedt** stopped 19-of-24 shots faced in the third game...RW **Cole Perfetti** (1-3=4) and D **Neal Pionk** (1-3=4) led Winnipeg with four points...RW **Alex Lafallo** (2-1=3), LW **Kyle Connor** (1-2=3), C **Adam Lowry** (1-2=3) and C **Mark Scheifele** (1-2=3) all had three points...G **Connor Hellebuyck** went 3-0-0 with a 0.66 GAA, a .978 SV% and one shutout in three games for the Jets.

WILD LEADERS: Johansson (5-21=26, in 39 games) and RW **Vladimir Tarasenko** (13-13=26, in 35 games) lead Minnesota with 26 points each vs. Winnipeg...RW **Mats Zuccarello** owns 24 points (11-13=24) in 29 games...LW **Marcus Foligno** has 21 points (11-10=21) in 35 games...LW **Kirill Kaprizov** owns 19 points (6-13=19) in 14 matches...D **Jared Spurgeon** owns 17 points (1-16=17) in 43 games.

WILD GOALIES: Gustavsson is 4-2-1 with a 1.95 GAA and a .937 SV% in seven starts...Wallstedt is 0-1-0 with a 5.02 GAA and a .792 SV% in his lone start.

JETS LEADERS: C **Jonathan Toews** leads Winnipeg with 52 points (18-34=52) in 53 career games vs. Minnesota...Scheifele has 34 points (14-20=34) in 44 games against Minnesota...Connor owns 26 points (10-16=25) in 26 games...RW **Gustav Nyquist** has 21 points (6-15=21) in 26 games...D **Josh Morrisey** owns 17 points (2-15=17) in 30 games...Lowry has 16 points (6-10=16) in 38 games.

JETS GOALIES: Hellebuyck is 15-10-2 with a 2.49 GAA, a .921 SV% and four shutouts in 30 games (29 starts) vs. the Wild...G **Eric Comrie** is 0-1-0 with a 4.95 GAA and a .846 SV% in two games (one start) vs. the Wild.

CONNECTIONS: Wild D **Zach Bogosian** tallied 127 points (40-87=127) in 393 games in parts of seven seasons (2008-15) with the Atlanta Thrashers and Winnipeg Jets...RW **Nino Niederreiter** collected 228 points (110-118=228) in 434 games in parts of six seasons with the Wild (2013-19)...D **Dylan Semberg** is from Saginaw and played three seasons at the University of Minnesota Duluth (2017-20)...Pionk was raised in Hermantown and played two seasons (2015-17) at the University of Minnesota Duluth...LW **Cole Koepke** is from Two Harbors and played three seasons at the University of Minnesota-Duluth (2018-21)...Nyquist collected 12 points (3-9=12) in 25 games with Minnesota over parts of two seasons (2022-23, 2024-25).

FAST FACTS: The Wild is 10-6-0 in the last 16 contests vs. the Jets at Grand Casino Arena...Minnesota's sweep of the Jets in 2018-19 (5-0-0) marked the third time in franchise history Minnesota swept a season series of more than four games: 5-0-0 vs. Chicago (2015-16) and 6-0-0 vs. Edmonton (2010-11)...The Wild fell, 4-1, in its first-ever postseason meeting against the Jets in the 2018 First Round.

NOTES & MILESTONES

Team: Leads the NHL with 13 PPG (40 PPO) and ranks second with a 32.5 PP%...Through the first 10 games of a season, ranks first in franchise history in PP% and T-2nd in PPG.

Matt Boldy: Ranks second in the NHL with 40 shots, T-4th with three PPG, and T-6th with six PPP (3-3=6).

Zeev Buium: Ranks second among NHL rookies with six assists, T-2nd with eight points (2-6=8), third with a 20:00 TOI/G average and T-6th in shots (14)...Ranks T-8th in the NHL with four PPA and T-14th with five PPP (1-4=5), while ranking T-1st among all defensemen in both categories...Ranks T-3rd in points among NHL defensemen...Per NHL Stats, is the first player in Wild history to record a point in each of the first four regular-season home games of his career...His eight points (2-6=8) is the most by a Wild defenseman through 10 career regular-season games.

Joel Eriksson Ek: Leads the the NHL in faceoffs taken (217) and in faceoffs won (114).

Brock Faber: Notched three assists (0-3=3) vs. SJS (10/26), tying his single-game career-high in assists and points...The total also tied the franchise single-game high for assists by a defenseman (23rd occurance).

Marcus Foligno: Posted nine hits vs. UTA (10/25), the second-highest single-game total for his career.

Ryan Hartman: Scored the 100th goal of his Wild career vs. SJS (10/26), becoming the 14th player in franchise history to reach the mark.

Marcus Johansson: Has three goals (3-0=3) in his last two games...Is currently seven games from 1,000 for his career.

Kirill Kaprizov: With three assists (0-3=3) vs. SJS (10/26), pushed his career point total to 400 (190-210=400) and tied Zach Parise (199-201=400) for fourth-most points in franchise history...He also tied Evgeni Malkin as the fourth-fastest active NHL player to reach 400 career points, doing so in his 329th game...Skated a season-high 27:08 of TOI vs. SJS (10/26), the highest total by an NHL forward this season...Notched the 10th career game with three-plus assists vs. SJS (10/26), moving past Mats Zuccarello for sole possesion of second-most games in Wild history...Ranks T-1st in the NHL in PPG (four) and PPP (4-4=8) and T-4th in points (5-9=14)...Notched a PPA vs. SJS (10/26) to reach 139 career PPP (66-73=139) and move past Ryan Suter (21-117=138) for third-most in Wild history...Currently ranks second in franchise history with 66 career PPG (Zach Parise, 69).

Jared Spurgeon: Currently at 299 career assists, could join Mikko Koivu (504 assists) and Ryan Suter (314 assists) as the only players to reach 300 assists with the Wild...Scored a power-play goal vs. LAK (10/13) to reach 133 career powerplay points (35-98=133) and tie Pierre-Marc Bouchard (29-104=133) for sixth-most in Wild history.

Vladimir Tarasenko: Ranks T-8th in the NHL with four PPA...His 305 career goals leads the current Wild roster...Ranks 37th among active NHL players in goals.

Yakov Trenin: Leads the NHL with 46 hits this season...Currently at 99 career points (55-44=99).

Danila Yurov: Scored his first career NHL goal at NYR (10/20, Shesterkin), becoming the 233rd player in franchise history to score a regular-season goal with the club.

The Wild announced former players Pierre-Marc Bouchard, Marian Gaborik, Brian Rolston and Stephane Veilleux will attend the team's first 25th anniversary celebration night on Tuesday, October 28 when it hosts the Winnipeg Jets at 7:00 p.m. Fans who purchase a special 25th Anniversary Bobblehead ticket will receive a Marian Gaborik bobblehead and have the opportunity to get an autographs from Bouchard, Gaborik, Rolston or Veilleux at a special pre-game signing.

WILD AT THE OLYMPICS

Wild General Manager and President of Hockey Operations **Bill Guerin** is serving as the General Manager of the 2026 United States Men's Ice Hockey Team. He is joined on Team USA's staff by Wild Head Coach **John Hynes**, who will serve as an assistant coach; Wild Assistant General Manager **Chris Kelleher**, who will work on the management staff; Wild Head Athletic Trainer **John Worley** and Assistant Athletic Trainer and Massage Therapist **Travis Green**, who will work as athletic trainers, and Wild Orthopedic Surgeon **Joel Boyd**, who will serve as team physician.

Wild forward **Nico Sturm** was selected to Germany's preliminary roster. The native of Augsburg had eight points (six goals, two assists) in 10 games at the 2023 silver-winning Germany at the 2023 Worlds, and he also competed at the tournament the following year.

TEAM NOTES



ON THE POWER PLAY

- Leads the NHL with 13 PPG (40 PPO) and ranks second with a 32.5 PP%. Through the first 10 games of a season, ranks first in franchise history in PP% and T-2nd in PPG.
- Scored nine consecutive power-play goals, the longest streak in franchise history and tied for the third-longest streak in the NHL since the 1933-34 season, from 10/11 - 10/14.
- Since the 1933-34 season, only the 1987-88 New York Rangers (11 PPG) recorded more power-play goals in a season's first four games. Since 1977-78, no team with 20-plus power-play opportunities recorded a higher power-play percentage.
- The Wild opened the season by scoring a power-play goal in four consecutive games, achieving the feat for the sixth time in franchise history. The run trailed only the 2010-11 season (six-game streak) and the 2022-23 season (five-game streak) for the longest season-opening runs in franchise history.



PLAYER NOTES



MARCO POLO

- Marco Rossi** notched a two-point game (1-1=2) vs. SJS (10/26).
- Saw his streak of 173 consecutive regular-season games played snapped when he did not play 10/20 at NYR due to injury. The streak was the longest among Wild players and T-30th among active NHL players.
- Notched his first career shootout goal vs. LAK (10/13), the game winner.
- Opened the season with two points (1-1=2) at STL (10/9).
- Led the team in PPG (seven), ranked second in assists (36) and points (24-36=60) and third in goals (24) last season.
- Reached 101 career points with two assists (0-2=2) vs. SJS (4/9/25).
- Scored the GWG in overtime vs. DAL (4/6/25), his third GWG of the 2024-25 season.
- Notched his 30th assist of the season at COL (2/28/25) to become the second Austrian player in NHL history to reach the 30-assist mark in a single campaign (Thomas Vanek, 7x).
- Is the third Austrian player with multiple 20-goal seasons in the NHL, joining Thomas Vanek (11x) and Michael Grabner (4x). Also the third Austrian player with 50 points in a season, joining Vanek (9x) and Grabner (1x).
- Named the NHL's First Star of the Week after recording eight points (3-5=8) in three games for the period ending Jan. 5, 2025.

TRICKS UP HIS ZEEV

- Zeев Buium** ranks second among NHL rookies with six assists, T-2nd with eight points (2-6=8), third with a 20:00 TOI/G average and T-6th in shots (14).
- Ranks T-8th in the NHL with four PPA and T-14th with five PPP (1-4=5), while ranking T-1st among all defensemen in both categories.
- Ranks T-3rd in points among NHL defensemen.
- Per NHL Stats, is the first player in Wild history to record a point in each of the first four regular-season home games of his career.
- His eight points (2-6=8) is the most by a Wild defenseman through 10 career regular-season games.
- Per NHL Stats, recorded his sixth career assist vs. UTA (10/25) and tied Nick Schultz for the second most by a Wild defenseman before age 20. Jonas Brodin leads the list with nine. He also became the fourth player in Wild history to record a point in each of the first three regular-season home games of his career. The others: Brent Burns (3 GP in 2003-04), Marian Gaborik (3 GP in 2000-01) and Maxim Sushinsky (3 GP in 2000-01).
- According to NHL Stats, is one of five NHL rookies since the 1933-34 NHL season to record five-plus PPP in his team's first four games.
- Finished with two points (1-1=2) and scored his first career NHL goal (Merzlikins) vs. CBJ (10/11), becoming the fourth-youngest defenseman in Wild history to score a goal (19 years, 308 days).
- Finished with a career-high 24:39 of TOI vs CBJ (10/11), joining Jonas Brodin (18 occurrences) as the only players in Wild history to post 24-plus minutes of TOI before turning 20 years old.
- Notched the first assist of his NHL career vs. VGK (4/24) to become the second-youngest player in Wild history (19 years, 138 days) to record their first Stanley Cup Playoff point, behind Pierre-Marc Bouchard (19 years, 19 days in Game 4 of 2003 CF).
- Became the 12th-youngest player (19 years, 134 days) in NHL history to make his League debut during the Stanley Cup Playoffs vs. VGK (4/20) and 152nd player overall.
- He was the 326th player (304th skater) to play in a regular-season or Stanley Cup Playoff game for the Wild.

KIRILL THE THRILL

- Kirill Kaprizov** posted three assists (0-3=3) vs. SJS (10/26), pushing his career point total to 400 (190-210=400) and tying Zach Parise (199-201=400) for fourth-most points in franchise history.
- With three assists (3-0=3) vs. SJS (10/26), tied Evgeni Malkin as the fourth-fastest active NHL player to reach 400 career points, doing so in his 329th game. Among all-time NHL players born outside of North America, Kaprizov tied Malkin as the seventh-fastest to hit 400 points. Overall, Kaprizov and Malkin are tied as the 22nd-fastest players in NHL history to reach 400 career points.

- Skated a season-high 27:08 of TOI vs. SJS (10/26), the highest total by an NHL forward this season.
- Notched the 10th career game with three-plus assists vs. SJS (10/26), moving past Mats Zuccarello for sole possession of second-most games in Wild history.
- Ranks T-1st in the NHL in PPG (four) and PPP (4-4=8) and T-4th in points (5-9=14).
- Notched a PPA vs. SJS (10/26) to reach 139 career PPP (66-73=139) and move past Ryan Suter (21-117=138) for third-most in Wild history.
- Ranks second in franchise history with 66 career PPG (Zach Parise, 69).
- Opened the season with a four-game point streak from 10/9 - 10/14. Per #NHL Stats, became the fifth NHL player in the last 30 years to record a season-opening point streak of four-plus games in three or more consecutive seasons.
- Posted a career-high 11 shots on goal vs. CBJ (10/11), tying the franchise single-game record (Parise, 1/17/19 vs. ANA; Rolston, 10/7/06 vs. ANA).
- Along with Matt Boldy, became the first players in Minnesota history to open a season with consecutive three-plus point games (10/9-10/11).
- Notched three assists (0-3=3) in the season opener at STL (10/9), becoming the second player in franchise history to achieve the feat (Bouchard, 0-3=3, 10/5/05).
- Has now registered a point in six consecutive season openers (1-9=10), the longest streak in Wild history.
- Moved his career assist total to 204 at STL (10/9), passing Andrew Brunnette and Jonas Brodin (202 each) for eighth in franchise history.
- Currently with 42 career multi-assist games, tied with Mats Zuccarello (42) for third-most in franchise history.
- Ranked second on the team in goals (25), third in points (25-31=56) and fourth in assists (31) in 2024-25.
- Played in his 300th career game vs. CHI (11/29), tallying an assist to move his career point total to 366 (174-191=366). The only active players with more points through 300 games include: Sidney Crosby (407), Connor McDavid (394), Alex Ovechkin (384) and Evgeni Malkin (371). Only Ovechkin (204) and Auston Matthews (176) had more goals through 300 games among active skaters.
- Among players selected in the fifth round of the NHL Draft or later, only four skaters have tallied as many goals as Kaprizov at the time of their 300th career contest: Brett Hull (226), Pavel Bure (187), Luc Robitaille (185) and Alexander Mogilny (176).

HE'S GOING STREAKING

- Kaprizov notched a point in 16-of-20 road games played in 2024-25 (11-20=31), including a franchise-record 11-game road point streak (8-16=24) from 10/15 - 11/21.

- Kaprizov posted a multi-point streak of eight games on the road (6-14=20) from 10/15 - 11/8/25, joining Steven Stamkos (8 GP in 2017-18) and Roman Josi (8 GP in 2021-22) as the only active players to achieve the mark.
- Kaprizov recorded seven-game multi-point and assist streaks (6-11=17) from 10/15 - 11/1/25.
- His streak of seven consecutive games with multiple points set a franchise record and T-4th longest in the NHL since the 2000-01 season.

BOLDY AND THE BEAUTIFUL

- Matt Boldy** ranks second in the NHL with 40 shots, T-4th with three PPG, and T-6th with six PPP (3-3=6).
- Posted a five-game point streak from 10/9-10/17, tied for the fifth-longest season-opening streak in franchise history.
- According to NHL Stats, became the sixth different Wild player to record a point in each of his team's first five games of a season.
- Posted a four-game goal streak from 10/9 - 10/14, becoming the first player in franchise history to achieve the feat in a season's first four games.
- Recorded a career-high 10 shots on goal at DAL (10/14), tied for the fourth-highest single-game total in franchise history.

THE GUS BUS IS ROLLING

- **Filip Gustavsson** is now 35-25-10 with a 2.56 GAA and a .915 SV% in road games since joining the Wild prior to the 2022-23 season. He ranks third in the NHL in road GAA and fourth in road SV% during that span (min. 50 gp).
- Posted a 26-save shutout at STL (10/9), reaching 12 for his career and tying Manny Fernandez for fourth-most in Wild history.
- Is the first goaltender in franchise history to post a shutout in multiple season openers (also 10/12/23) and is the only active goalie to accomplish the feat for any franchise.
- Is 75-51-17 in his career with the Wild since joining the franchise in 2022-23. Gustavsson ranks fourth in the NHL during that span with 12 shutouts and a .913 save percentage (min. 50 games).
- Posted a 31-19-6 record in 2024-25 and ranked T-4th in the NHL in shutouts (five), sixth in SV% (.914) and T-6th in wins.
- Is the fifth goaltender in franchise history to reach 30 wins in a single season.
- His five shutouts last season were tied for the second-highest single-season total in Wild history (Backstrom, eight in 2008-09).
- Was named the NHL's First Star of the Week for the period ending March 23, 2025, going 3-0-0 with a 0.67 goals-against average, .976 save percentage and one shutout.
- Posted a 161:49 shutout streak from 3/17 - 3/22/25, the longest home shutout streak in franchise history and the sixth-longest shutout streak in the NHL this season and in franchise history.
