- With Tuesday's win, the Stars extended their point streak to seven games, going 4-0-3 during that span. It's the team's longest point streak since they earned a point in 10 consecutive games from March 16 to April 3, 2025.
- **Mikko Rantanen** (2-1—3) extended his point streak against the Oilers to five games, totaling eight points (3-4—8) during that span. He now has 24 points (11-13—24) in 23 career games against Edmonton.
 - His first goal of the night marked as his 300th NHL career goal. He is now the fourth Finnish skater in NHL history, the second player drafted in 2015 and the 39th active NHL skater to score 300 career goals. Rantanen is also the thirdfastest Finn to score 300 NHL goals, doing so in his 665th career game.
- With three assists and the game-deciding goal in the shootout on Tuesday, Wyatt Johnston now has 10 points (5-5—10) in 10 career games against Edmonton.
- **Jason Robertson** scored the team's first goal in the shootout and is now 19-for-33 in career shootout attempts. His 57.6 percent success rate is the fourth-best mark all-time among NHL skaters to take at least 20 shootout attempts.

GAME NOTES

THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

Tonight is the first of three games the Stars will play against the Ducks this season. The two teams will face each other again Dec.
 19 and Jan. 13 with both games being played in Anaheim.

- A win or overtime loss tonight would extend the team's point streak to a season-best eight games. The Stars have posted a 4-0-3 record in their last seven games despite playing without Oskar Bäck, Jamie Benn, Matt Duchene, Roope Hintz and Nils Lundkvist for all or parts of that streak.
 - o This is the team's longest point streak since they earned a point in 10 consecutive games from March 16 to April 3, 2025.
- The Stars have combined for 224 blocked shots this season, which ranked sixth in the NHL entering play Wednesday. Their 16.84 blocked shots per 60 was the fifth-best mark in the League entering play Wednesday.
- Justin Hryckowian scored his first career NHL goal on Saturday against the Panthers, making him the 17th Stars skater to score a
 goal for Dallas this season. Entering play Wednesday, only the Carolina Hurricanes (18) and Edmonton Oilers (18) had more unique
 goal scorers than the Stars this year.
- The defensive pair of Miro Heiskanen and Esa Lindell (60.8 percent) ranked third the NHL in expected goal share among defensive pairs to play at least 100 minutes together entering play Wednesday according to MoneyPuck.com.
- Lindell has also totaled 51:47 of shorthanded ice time, which was the third-highest mark in the NHL entering play Wednesday.

DUCK HUNTING

- Dallas is 84-40-15 all-time vs. Anaheim, including a 51-13-6 mark on home ice.
- The Stars have won 11 of their last 15 games against the Ducks (11-4-0) dating back to Dec. 12, 2018. Dallas has also won nine of their last 10 games played vs. Anaheim at American Airlines Center (9-1-0).
- Mikko Rantanen has five points (0-5—5) in his last three games played vs. Anaheim. In all, Rantanen has recorded 33 points (15-18—33) in 30 career games against the Ducks.
- Matt Duchene has 12 points (6-6—12) in his last 11 games against the Ducks dating back to March 10, 2022. In all, Duchene has earned 31 points (14-17—31) in 41 career games vs. Anaheim.
- Roope Hintz has registered 13 points (5-8—13) in 14 career games against the Ducks, also carrying a plus-minus rating of +4.
- Tyler Seguin enters tonight's contest riding a three-game point streak vs. Anaheim (0-3—3). He has totaled 16 points (0-16—16) in 29 career games against the Ducks.
- Jason Robertson has nine points (4-5—9) in 12 career games vs. Anaheim, upholding a plus-minus rating of +4.
- Thomas Harley registered a three-point outing in his last game played against the Ducks (1-2—3). He has six points (3-3—6) in seven career games played vs. Anaheim, carrying a plus-minus rating of +5.
- Mavrik Bourque enters tonight's matchup riding a two-game point streak vs. Anaheim, earning two points (0-2—2) during those
 games.
- Jake Oettinger has posted a 9-1-0 record with a .925 save percentage, 1.98 goals-against average and one shutout in 10 career games against the Ducks.
 - o Oettinger's nine wins against Anaheim since the start of the 2020-21 season are tied for the most in the NHL.
- Casey DeSmith has a 4-2-0 career record against the Ducks, posting a .919 save percentage, a 2.36 goals-against average and one shutout in those games.

THE FINNISH FOUR

- Dallas' roster currently houses four Finns: Miro Heiskanen, Roope Hintz, Esa Lindell and Mikko Rantanen. Dallas' four Finns all hail from different Finnish cities: Espoo (Heiskanen), Nokia (Hintz), Nousiainen (Rantanen) and Vantaa (Lindell).
- All four players ranked in the top 15 in scoring by Finnish players this season entering play Wednesday. Rantanen leads all Finnish players goals (7), assists (10) and points (17) this season. He's followed by Hintz (8, tied sixth), Heiskanen (6, 11th) and Lindell (4, tied 14th).
 - o **Rantanen** currently ranks second in career scoring among active, Finnish players with 722 points (301-421—722).
- Heiskanen, Lindell and Rantanen were three of the six players selected to Finland's preliminary Olympic roster with Hintz expected
 to join them in Milan this year. Prior to their time together on the Stars, various combinations of the four Finns had played together in
 international competition.
 - All four players were selected to represent their home country at the Four Nations Face-Off last February before Heiskanen had to withdraw due to injury.
 - Heiskanen and Lindell won a gold medal together at the 2022 IIHF World Championship.
 - o Heiskanen and Rantanen represented Finland together at the 2018 IIHF World Championship.
 - Lindell and Rantanen won a silver medal together at the 2016 IIHF World Championship.
 - Hintz and Rantanen played together at the 2015 and 2016 IIHF World Junior Championships, winning a gold medal in 2016.
- The four Finns, along with current Ducks forward and former Star Mikael Granlund, started Game 2 of the Western Conference Final
 against the Oilers during the 2025 Stanley Cup Playoffs. It marked the first time in a regular-season or playoff game since the NHL
 began tracking starers in 1997-98 that all five skaters starting were from Finland.
- In all, 34 Finnish players (28 skaters and six goalies) have appeared in at least one regular-season game for the Stars, the most of any NHL franchise in League history.

TOEING THE LINE

- Wyatt Johnston, Mikko Rantanen and Jason Robertson have started Dallas' last two games on a line together. In all this season, the trio has played 39:06 together at 5-on-5.
- When the line of **Johnston**, **Rantanen** and **Robertson** is on the ice during 5-on-5 play, the Stars are outscoring their opponents 3-1, have 33 scoring chances to their 18 and have 16 high-danger scoring chances while holding their opponents to five according to Natural Stat Trick.

- - Additionally, the line owns a 65.3 percent expected goal share according to MoneyPuck.com.
 - Entering play Wednesday, all three of Johnston, Rantanen and Robertson ranked in the top 20 among all NHL forwards in average
 ice time per game. Johnston (21:43) ranked sixth, Rantanen (21:41) seventh and Robertson (21:04) 16th.
 - Entering play Wednesday, the Stars and the Rangers were the only two teams to have three forwards ranked inside the top 20.
 - Robertson (56) and Johnston (43) also ranked third and tied for 19th, respectively, in shots taken this season entering play Wednesday.

IT AIN'T OVER 'TIL IT'S OVER

- Each of the Stars last four games have gone to overtime, with the team erasing a one-goal deficit against Tampa Bay, a two-goal
 deficit against Florida and a two-goal deficit against Edmonton to earn at least a point in each game.
 - Mikko Rantanen evened the score at three with 2:41 remaining in the third period against Florida, marking the Stars' latest game-tying goal since Thomas Harley on Jan. 7, 2025 (57:21) according to NHL Stats.
- If tonight's game requires extra time, it will be the first time the Stars have played in four consecutive overtime games since March 16 to 22, 2025, posting a 2-0-2 record in those contests.
- The Stars have won three games this season when trailing after the first period, which was tied with New Jersey for the most in the NHL entering play Wednesday.
- Dallas has also won three games this season when trailing by two goals, which was the most in the NHL entering play Wednesday.
- Jason Robertson scored the team's first goal in the shootout in their win over the Oilers and is now 19-for-33 in career shootout
 attempts. His 57.6 percent success rate is the fourth-best mark all-time among NHL skaters to take at least 20 shootout attempts.

OTTER DOMINANCE

- Jake Oettinger has not allowed a 5-on-5 goal against for 162:27 of game play, with his last 5-on-5 goal allowed coming at 19:49 of the first period against the Carolina Hurricanes on Oct. 25.
- **Oettinger** posted a shutout streak of 135:13 from Oct. 25 against the Hurricanes to Oct. 30 against the Lightning, which was the longest shutout streak by any NHL goaltender this season entering play Wednesday. He made 66 saves during that streak.
- **Oettinger** turned away all 24 shots he faced in the Stars game on Oct. 28 against Washington to record the 13th shutout of his career, saving 3.59 goals-against in the game according to MoneyPuck.com.
 - o His 13 career shutouts rank sixth in franchise history and are the fifth-most among active, American goaltenders.
- He then saved 2.38 goals above expected the following game, a 2-1 overtime loss to the Tampa Bay Lightning according to MoneyPuck.com, making 30 saves during the game.
- Entering play Wednesday, he ranked eighth in the NHL with 7.1 goals saved above expected this season.

POWER UP

- The Stars have gone 14-for-45 on the power play this season for a 31.1 percent success rate, which was the fifth-best mark in the NHL entering play Wednesday. Only the Minnesota Wild (17) had scored more power-play goals this season than the Stars entering play Wednesday.
 - The Stars didn't score their 14th power-play goal of the season until their 24th game played during the 2024-25 campaign.
- When playing at the American Airlines Center this season, the Stars have gone 10-for-25 on the power play for a 40.0 percent success rate, which was the best mark in the League entering play Wednesday. Their 10 home power-play goals trailed only Minnesota (14) for the most in the NHL.
- The Stars have scored at least one power-play goal in six of their last seven games played.
- Dallas has scored two power-play goals in a game five different times this season on Oct. 14 vs. Minnesota, on Oct. 16 vs.
 Vancouver, on Oct. 23 vs. Los Angeles, on Oct. 25 vs. Carolina and on Nov. 1 at Florida. Entering play Wednesday, the Stars and the Wild were the only teams this season to have scored two or more power-play goals in five games.
 - o In 2024-25, the Stars recorded their fifth multi power-play goal game in their 43rd game of the season.
- The Stars scored two power-play goals 14 seconds apart in their game on Nov. 1 at Florida, which set the franchise record for the fastest consecutive power-play goals for. They bested the previous record of 15 second set by Steve Payne and Mike Fidler on March 21, 1979 against the Philadelphia Flyers while the team was still located in Minnesota.
- Dallas' 14 power-play goals have been scored by eight different skaters: Wyatt Johnston (4), Mikko Rantanen (3), Jason Robertson (2), Matt Duchene, Miro Heiskanen, Justin Hryckowian, Tyler Seguin and Sam Steel. Entering play Wednesday, Dallas, Florida (8), Minnesota (8) and Ottawa (8) were the only teams in the NHL season to have eight different skaters score a power-play goal.
 - Steel's power-play goal against the Hurricanes was only the second of his career and his first since Nov. 18, 2018
 against the Washington Capitals while he was playing for the Anaheim Ducks.
- Entering play Wednesday, **Johnston's** four power-play goals were tied for the fourth-most in the NHL. His four power-play goals this season are already the second-most in a single season in his career.
- Rantanen has totaled 10 points (3-7—10) on the power play this season, which was tied with Edmonton's Connor McDavid (1-9—10) for the highest mark in the NHL entering play Wednesday.

- Lian Bichsel has totaled a team-high 40 hits this season, which ranked third among all NHL defensemen entering play Wednesday. He is currently on pace to finish the season with 252 hits, which would tie Steve Ott in 2010-11 for the fourth-most hits in a single season by a Stars skater in franchise history.
 - Ott, with 278 in 2011-12, currently holds the single-season franchise record.
- Bichsel has recorded eight hits in a game twice this season, on Oct. 23 vs. Los Angeles and Oct. 28 vs. Washington. Entering play Wednesday, Bichsel and Minnesota's Marcus Foligno were the only skaters this season to have two eight-hit games.
- If he were to have at least eight hits in a game again, he would become the ninth player in franchise history to have recorded three eight-hit games and the sixth player to do so in one season, joining Mark Fistric (3; 2009-10, 5; 2011-12), Jani Hakanpää (3; 2023-24), Joel Lundqvist (4; 2006-07), Brendan Morrow (3; 2005-06, 3; 2009-10), Steve Ott (5; 2008-09, 7; 2009-10, 6; 2011-12) and Stephane Robidas (3; 2009-10).
- Adam Erne has totaled 35 hits in 10 games played this season. Entering play Wednesday, his 20.81 hits per 60 were the eighth-best mark in the NHL among players to appear in at least 10 games this season.
- In all, the Stars have recorded 296 hits as a team in 13 games played this season, which ranked 10th in the NHL entering play Wednesday. Their 22.25 hits per 60 was also the 10th-best mark in the League.

JOHNNY B. GOODE

- Wyatt Johnston has totaled 14 points (7-7—14) in Dallas' first 13 games played of the season and enters tonight's game ranked second on the team in scoring.
- Johnston had three assists in Tuesday's win against the Oilers, tying his single-game career high in both points and assists. It is the fourth time in his career that he has had three points in a game and the third time he has had three assists.
- Johnston also scored the game-deciding goal in the shootout. It marked the second shootout goal of his career and the first time he has scored a game-winner in the shootout.
- Johnston skated a career-high 26:49 in last Thursday's game against the Lightning, leading all skaters on both teams in ice time.
- Johnston's 26:49 of ice time is the second-most by any NHL forward in a single game this season and was also the most by a Stars forward since Tyler Seguin skated 28:50 on Dec. 2, 2017 against the Chicago Blackhawks, a 3-2 shootout win.
- He is averaging 21:43 of ice time per game this season, which was the sixth-highest total amongst all NHL forwards entering play
- Johnston's tying goal against the Predators on Oct. 26 was the 95th goal of his career, tying Steven Payne for the fourth-most by a Stars/North Stars player prior to age 23 (Johnston turns 23 on May 14) according to NHL Stats. He trails only Brian Bellows (159), Mike Modano (123) and Dino Ciccarelli (102) on the list.
- He now enters tonight's game four goals shy of scoring 100 NHL goals. When he reaches the milestone, he will become:
 - The first player selected in the 2021 NHL Draft to score 100 NHL goals.
 - The 26th player in franchise history to score 100 goals for the Stars/North Stars.
- If Johnston, who is 22 years and 176 days old today, scores his 100th goal on or before Dallas' April 13th game against the Maple Leafs, he will become the third-youngest player in franchise history to total 100 goals with the club according to NHL Stats. The team's matchup against Toronto is their second-to-last game of the 2025-26 regular season.
 - Brian Bellows currently holds the franchise record, scoring his 100th goal with the Stars when he was 20 years and 179 days old.
 - Currently ranked third in franchise history, Dino Ciccarelli scored his 100th NHL goal when he was 22 years and 335 days old.

BIKER GANG

- Last Thursday's game against the Lightning was the first that defenseman Thomas Harley played after signing an eight-year, \$84.696 million contract extension with the Stars. With the extension, Harley is now the sixth Stars player signed through at least the 2029-30 season, joining Roope Hintz, Wyatt Johnston, Esa Lindell, Jake Oettinger and Mikko Rantanen.
- Harley enters tonight's game ranked fourth on the team in scoring with nine points (1-8—9) in 13 games played this season. His nine points were tied for 14th among all NHL defensemen entering play Wednesday.
- Harley has also totaled a team-leading 35 blocked shots this year, which was the fourth-most in the NHL entering play Wednesday.
- Harley has totaled 112 points (33-79—112) in 210 regular-season games with Dallas since making his NHL debut during the 2021-22 season. Originally selected by the Stars with the 18th overall pick of the 2019 NHL Draft, he ranks third among defensemen drafted that year in career scoring and leads all 2019 draftees with 27 career playoff points (5-22-27).
- Since the start of the 2023-24 season, Harley has totaled 106 points (32-74—106) in 170 regular-season games, tying for 15th among all defensemen in scoring during that span and tying for eighth among all NHL skaters with five overtime goals.
- Since Jan. 1 of this year, Harley has totaled 42 points (13-29—42) in 57 regular-season games, which was the ninth-most among all NHL defensemen during that span entering play Wednesday. Additionally, his 13 goals during that span were tied for the thirdmost by any NHL defenseman entering play Wednesday.
 - He enters tonight's game three points shy of matching his point total from the 2024 calendar year (10-37—47).
- Harley's 13 regular-season goals since Jan. 1 are already tied for the 10th-most by a Stars defenseman in a single calendar year according to NHL Stats.
 - He's tied with Sergei Zubov in both 2001 and 1997, Mark Tinordi in 1993 and Craig Hartsburg in 1986.
- Harley enters tonight's game three goals shy of surpassing Barry Gibbs (35) and Mark Tinordi for the 15th-most goals by a defenseman in franchise history. Gibbs and Tinordi both scored 35 goals in 375 regular-season games with the Stars.

Harley played in his 200th NHL game in the Stars' game against the Wild on Oct. 14. In reaching the milestone, Harley became the
24th skater and fourth defenseman drafted in 2019 to play in 200 NHL games, and the 39th defenseman in franchise history to play
in 200 games for the Stars.

MAN OF STEEL

- Sam Steel tied his single-game career high with three points (0-3—3) in Dallas' game on Nov. 1 at Florida. It also marked the first time in his career that he had three assists in a single game.
 - Steel last had three points in a game when he scored his first-career hat trick on March 26, 2019 against the Vancouver Canucks while he was playing for the Anaheim Ducks.
- Steel's performance against the Panthers was the third three-point game by a Stars skater this season, joining Mikko Rantanen on Oct. 9 against the Jets (1-2—3) and Roope Hintz on Oct. 14 against the Wild (1-2—3).
 - o Since then, Wyatt Johnston (0-3—3) and Rantanen (2-1—3) had three-point nights against the Oilers.
- Steel has totaled five points (1-4—5) this season and enters tonight's game tied for seventh on the team in scoring. It puts him on pace to finish the regular season with a career-high 32 points.

IRON SHARPENS IRON

- The Stars have two players on their roster that have played in at least 100 consecutive regular-season games: **Jason Robertson** (305) and **Wyatt Johnston** (259).
- Robertson's 305-game Iron Man streak was the eighth-longest active such streak in the NHL entering play Wednesday.
- **Johnston** has not missed a regular-season game since making his debut in the 2022-23 season opener on Oct. 13, 2022, making him one of 27 players in NHL history to begin their NHL career by playing in at least 259 consecutive games according to NHL Stats. Entering play Wednesday, it was tied for the 16th-longest active Iron Man streak in the NHL.
- **Johnston** was one of 21 players to appear in at least 246 regular-season games from 2022-23 to 2024-25. Only Will Borgen (248) and Charlie Coyle (247) appeared in more.
 - o Borgen (84) and Coyle (83), who were traded midseason, both played in more than 82 regular-season games in 2024-25.

- Stars forward Sam Steel was originally selected by Anaheim in the first round (30th overall) in the 2016 NHL draft. He played for the Ducks from 2018-19 to 2021-22.
- Stars defenseman Ilya Lyubushkin played in Anaheim during the 2023-24 season, appearing in 55 games.
- Ducks forward Mikael Granlund skated for the Dallas Stars during the 2024-25 season, appearing in 31 games.
- Stars forwards **Mikko Rantanen** and **Roope Hintz** and defenseman **Esa Lindell** and Ducks forward Mikael Granlund all represented Team Finland during the 2025 NHL Four Nations Faceoff tournament.
- Stars defensemen Esa Lindell and Miro Heiskanen were teammates with Ducks forward Mikael Granlund on Team Finland during the 2022 IIHF World Championship.
- Stars forward **Mikko Rantanen** and defenseman **Miro Heiskanen** shared the ice with Ducks forward Mikael Granlund on Team Finland during the 2018 IIHF World Championship.
- Stars defenseman Esa Lindell and Ducks forward Mikael Granlund both played for Team Finland during the 2017 World Cup of Hockey.
- Stars forward Mikko Rantanen and defenseman Esa Lindell skated with Ducks forward Mikael Granlund on Team Finland during the 2016 IIHF World Championship.
- Stars forwards **Matt Duchene** and **Colin Blackwell** were both teammates with Ducks forward Mikael Granlund while in Nashville. Blackwell skated with Granlund for two seasons (2018-19 and 2019-20). Duchene would join the two in 2019-2020 and skated with Granlund through the 2022-23 season.
- Stars goaltender Casey DeSmith and Ducks forwards Mikael Granlund and Ryan Poehling shared the ice in Pittsburgh during the 2022-23 season.
- Stars defenseman Kyle Capobianco skated with Ducks forward Jansen Harkins on Team Canada during the 2015 IIHF U18 World Junior Championship.
- Stars forward Colin Blackwell and Ducks forward Alex Killorn were teammates at Harvard University (NCAA) during the 2011-12 season.
- Stars forward Matt Duchene and Ducks forward Alex Killorn both represented Team Canada during the 2017 IIHF World Championship.
- Stars forward Colin Blackwell and Ducks forwards Ryan Strome and Chris Kreider played together in New York (Rangers) during the 2020-21 season.
- Stars defenseman Nils Lundkvist and Ducks forwards Ryan Strome, Frank Vatrano and Chris Kreider were all members of the New York Rangers for the 2021-22 season.
- Stars forward Justin Hryckowian skated with Ducks forward Sam Colangelo at Northeastern University (NCAA) from 2021-22 to 2022-23.
- Stars goaltender Casey DeSmith and Ducks forward Cutter Gauthier represented Team USA during the 2023 IIHF World Championship.
- Stars goaltender Jake Oettinger and Ducks forward Chris Kreider shared the ice on Team USA during the 2025 NHL Four Nations Faceoff Tournament.

- Stars forward Wyatt Johnston and Ducks forward Mason McTavish skated together on Team Canada during the 2021 IIHF U18
 World Junior Championship.
