- Eight different Stars skaters recorded a point during the game and five had multi-point efforts.
- The Stars victory was their league-leading 16th since Jan. 1 and extended their home winning streak against the Kings to six games.
- The victory was also the 141st win of Jake Oettinger's career, which tied Gilles Meloche for the fifth-most in franchise history.
- Matt Duchene scored and recorded his second straight 60-point season. He became the ninth player in franchise history to reach the mark in at least two straight campaigns from the start of his tenure according to NHL Stats.

# **GAME NOTES**

### THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

- Tonight is the final of three games the Stars will play against the Blues this. Dallas won each of their two previous meetings against St. Louis, defeating them 2-1 in overtime on Dec. 14 and then 2-0 on Jan. 25.
- The Stars enter tonight's game with a 38-19-2 record for 78 points and a .661 points percentage. Their point total and points percentage ranked third in the NHL this season and their 38 wins were tied for second entering play Saturday.
- Jamie Benn enters tonight's game two goals shy of scoring his 400th career goal. When he reaches the milestone, he
  will become...
  - The second player in franchise history to score 400 goals, joining Mike Modano (557). 438 of Modano's 557 goals were scored with the Star after the team relocated to Dallas.
  - o The second player drafted in 2007 to score 400 goals, with the other being Detroit's Patrick Kane (485).
  - The 10th active skater to score 400 career goals.
- Matt Duchene enters tonight's game leading the Stars with 60 points (24-36—60) this season. It puts him on pace to finish the year with 33 goals, 50 assists and 83 points. Fifty assists would be a career high, and 33 goals and 83 points would both be the second-best marks of his career.
  - o If he were to finish the year with at least 83 points, it would make him the highest-scoring Star since **Jason Robertson** had 109 points in 2022-23. It would also make him the third Stars skater in the last 10 years to have at least 83 points in a season, joining **Robertson** and **Jamie Benn** in 2014-15 (87) and 2015-16 (89).
- Entering play Saturday, the Stars and the Washington Capitals were the only NHL teams this season that have not lost more than two consecutive games.

- Entering play Saturday, the Stars ranked in the top five in the NHL this season in both goals for per game (3.36, fourth) and goals against per game (2.56, third).
  - o Dallas has allowed two or fewer goals in 31 of the 59 games that they have played this year.

#### SINGING THE BLUES

- Dallas is 122-131-56 all-time vs. St. Louis, including a 75-50-28 mark on home ice.
- The Stars have earned points in eight of their last nine contests against the Blues (7-1-1). Since the 2013-14 season Dallas has earned 22 wins against St. Louis, which is tied for the third-most of any team across the NHL during that span.
- Dallas' .833 points percentage against the Blues since the start of the 2022-23 season top the NHL.
- **Jamie Benn** has scored 51 points (22-29—51) against St. Louis during his career, his second-highest total against any opponent since making his NHL debut in 2009-10. His 51 points against the Blues rank third among active NHL skaters and his 22 goals rank second among active NHL skaters.
- Matt Duchene has 17 points (6-11–17) in his last 15 games against the Blues dating back to Feb. 15, 2020.
- **Mikael Granlund** enters tonight's matchup riding a five-game point streak vs. St. Louis, earning six points (1-5—6) during that span. In his career against the Blues, Granlund has totaled 29 points (8-21—29) in 44 games played.
- Evgenii Dadonov has registered 12 points (3-9–12) in 18 career games against St. Louis. In the nine total games where Dadonov has earned a point against the Blues, his team has a 7-1-1 record, dating back to Jan. 9, 2018.
- Jason Robertson has 11 points (5-6—11) in 13 career games against the Blues including registering three points in his last two games (1-2—3).
- Esa Lindell enters tonight's contest riding a three-game point streak against St. Louis (1-2—3). In all, Lindell has recorded 10 points (1-9—10) in 31 career games against the Blues.

### **ROBO ON THE GOGO**

- Jason Robertson enters tonight's contest having recorded multi-point efforts in three consecutive games:
  - o He scored a goal and added two assists on Feb. 28 against the Kings.
  - o He notched a goal and an assist on Feb. 25 against the Blue Jackets.
  - He scored a hat trick on Feb. 23 against the Islanders.
- If **Robertson** were to have at least two points again tonight, it would give him multi-point efforts in four consecutive games for the first time since March 31 to April 6, 2023.
- Roberston's goal against the Kings was his 25th of the season, making the 2024-25 season the fourth consecutive season in which he has scored at least 25 goals. Roberston is sixth Dallas player in the past 30 years to record four or more consecutive 25-goal campaigns, joining Jamie Benn (6), Tyler Seguin (6), Mike Modano (5), Joe Pavelski (4) and Loui Eriksson (4).\*
- Robertson's hat trick on Feb. 23 was the fourth of his career. Only three players in Stars/North Stars history have as many at age 25 or younger: Dino Ciccarelli (8), Tyler Seguin (7) and Steve Payne (6).\*
- All three of **Roberston's** hat trick goals game in the second period, making him the first Stars skater to score three goals in a single period since Jamie Benn did so on April 7, 2018.\*
- Robertson's three goals came within a 8:40 span, marking the fastest hat trick by a Stars player since April 7, 2018 when Jamie Benn scored three in 5:17.\*
- Robertson's younger brother Nicholas also scored twice for the Maple Leafs on Feb. 23, making the Robertsons the first pair of brothers to score multiple goals on the same day since Pavel Bure and Valeri Bure on March 1, 2000.\*

## **BIKER GANG**

- Thomas Harley notched two assists in Dallas' last game a 6-2 win over Los Angeles on Feb. 28 to give him 10 points (3-7—10) in his last nine games played dating back to Jan. 31. His 10 points during that span are tied for fourth on Dallas' roster.
- Harley's 10 points since Jan. 31 were also tied for the third-most among all NHL defensemen during that span entering play Saturday, trailing only Buffalo's Rasmus Dahlin and Colorado's Cale Makar, who have 11 points each during that span.
- When Harley had been on the ice during even-strength play this season, the Stars have outscored their opponents 69-38. Entering play Saturday, his plus-31 goal differential was the best mark in the NHL this year and his 69 on-ice goals for ranked third.
  - Additionally, Harley has logged a plus-29 plus/minus rating this season, which was tied for fourth in the NHL entering play Saturday.
- In all, **Harley** has totaled 33 points (10-23—33) in 57 regular-season games this season, which would put him on pace to finish the 2024-25 regular season with 14 goals, 32 assists and 46 points. Thirty-two assists would match his career high, and 14 goals and 46 assists would both be one shy of his career bests that he set last year.
  - His 10 goals this season were tied for the seventh-most among all NHL defensemen this season entering play Saturday.
- Since Jan. 31 Dallas' first game without **Miro Heiskanen Harley** has been averaging 25:17 of ice time per game, which tops all Stars skaters and ranked 10th in the NHL entering play Saturday.

#### **HEATING UP**

- Roope Hintz tallied four assists in Dallas' last game, which set a single-game career high for the forward. It also marked the fifth time in his career that he has had four points in a game and the first time since Jan. 24, 2024 against the Detroit Red Winas.
- Hintz enters tonight's contest riding a three-game point streak and has totaled 22 points (8-14-22) in 21 games dating back to Dec. 31, 2024.
- Mikael Granlund has 14 points (3-11-14) in his last 14 games played, including tallying six assists in his first eight games as a member of the Stars
- Logan Stankoven recorded the third two-goal game of his career in Dallas' last game on Feb. 28. When Stankoven was on the ice during 5-on-5 play in that game, the Stars outscored the Kings 3-0 and outshot them 10-6 according to Natural Stat Trick.

#### **NEW YEAR, NEW ME**

- Since Jan. 1, Jason Robertson, Matt Duchene and Wyatt Johnston were all ranked in the top 10 in the NHL in scoring entering play Saturday. Robertson's 31 points (16-15—31) ranked fifth, and with 27 points each, Duchene (10-17—27) and Johnston (9-18-27) were tied for seventh.
- Entering play Saturday, the Stars were the only team to have three players ranked in the top 10 in league scoring since the New Year.
- Robertson's 16 goals ranked third in the NHL since the start of the New Year entering play Saturday.
- Roope Hintz has been playing at a point-per-game pace since Jan. 1, totaling 21 points (7-14-21) in 20 games. His 21 points during that span rank fourth on Dallas' roster.
- Thomas Harley has scored six goals since Jan. 1, which was tied for fourth among all NHL defensemen entering play Saturday.

#### **POWER UP**

- Since Jan. 1, the Stars have gone 19-for-58 on the power play for a 32.8 percent success rate, which ranked second in the NHL during that span entering play Saturday.
- The team's 19 power-play goals since Jan. 1 were the second-most in the NHL entering play Saturday, trailing only the Detroit Red Wings (24) for the league lead.
- The Stars have scored at least one power-play goal in four of their last five games played, including scoring twice on the power play on both Feb. 28 against the Kings and on Feb. 23 against the Islanders.
- Five of those 19 goals have been scored by Jason Robertson. Since Jan. 1, only Detroit's Dylan Larkin (7) and Edmonton's Leon Draisaitl (6) had scored more power-play goals than Robertson entering play Saturday.

#### JOHNNY B. GOODE

- Wyatt Johnston scored a goal in Dallas' last game and enters tonight's matchup riding a five-game point streak. A goal or an assist tonight would give him points in six consecutive games for the fourth time this season.
- His goal extended his home point streak to 11 games, becoming the third player in franchise history to post a run of that length before age 22, joining Mike Modano (13 GP in 1990-91) and Tom McCarthy (11 GP in 1981-82) according to NHL
- Johnston's tallied his 34th assist of the season in Dallas' Feb. 25 game against the Columbus Blue Jackets, which set a career high for the forward. His assist was also the 84th of his career, which tied Buffalo's Owen Power for the most by a player selected in the 2021 NHL Draft.
  - Johnston's 74 career goals and 158 career points are both the most of any player from the 2021 Draft class.
- Johnston now has 52 points (18-34-52) in 59 games this season, which ranks third on the Stars in scoring and makes the 2024-25 season his second-consecutive 50-point season.
- He's now on pace to finish the year with 72 points, which would be a career high for Johnston.
- Johnston's scored his third shorthanded goal of the season in Dallas' Feb. 22 game against the New Jersey Devils. Entering play Saturday, his three shorthanded goals were tied for third in the NHL this year.
- The goal was also the sixth shorthanded tally of his career. Since Johnston made his NHL debut, his six shorthanded goals rank second on Dallas' roster (Roope Hintz; 7) and are tied for eighth in the NHL.
- Johnston has been playing at a point-per-game pace since Nov. 10, totaling 46 points (17-29-46) in 46 games played.

### **GOALIE GANG**

- Jake Oettinger has an 12-4-1 record in his last 17 games played dating back to Dec. 29, posting a .913 save percentage and a 2.48 goals-against average during that span.
  - His 12 wins since Dec. 29 were tied for the second-most in the NHL entering play Saturday.
- Casey DeSmith has won each of the last four games that he has played dating back to Jan. 25 against the St. Louis Blues, posting a .935 save percentage and a 2.01 goals-against average in those contests.
  - His save percentage was the sixth-best mark in the NHL during that span entering play Saturday.
- In all, Oettinger and DeSmith have combined for a .906 save percentage this season, which was tied for the fourthbest mark of any team in the NHL this season entering play Saturday. Only Winnipeg (.916), Tampa Bay (.908) and Washington (.907) ranked higher.

The duo's 2.54 goals-against average last season also ranked fourth in the NHL this year entering play Saturday.

#### **KILLING IT**

- The Stars have had an 85.5 percent success rate on the penalty kill this season, which was the best mark in the NHL this year entering play Saturday.
- No team in the league this season has allowed fewer power-play goals against than the Stars' 23, and their -17 goal differential on the penalty kill this year was also the best mark in the NHL entering play Saturday.
- If the Stars maintain this pace, it would make the 2024-25 season their best on the penalty kill since 2007-08, when the team finished the season with an 85.6 percent success rate on the penalty kill.
- Since the beginning of February, the Stars have a plus-1 goal differential on the penalty kill, allowing one power-play goal against and scoring two shorthanded goals. During that span, the Stars were the only team in the NHL that has a positive goal differential on the penalty kill entering play Saturday.
- The Stars are also one of the least-penalized teams in the league, ranking 28th in the league in both total penalty minutes (400) and penalty minutes per game (6:46) entering play Saturday.
- Entering play Saturday, Esa Lindell was leading all NHL skaters in both total shorthanded ice time (205:40) and shorthanded ice time per game (3:29) this season.
- Among players that have played at least 100 minutes on the penalty kill this season, Thomas Harley and Sam Steel both ranked in the top five in the NHL in power-play goals against entering play Saturday.
  - o Harley, who has played 102:03 of shorthanded ice time, ranked second with 3.53.
  - Steel ranked third with 3.84. He has totaled 109:29 of shorthanded ice time and is averaging 1:55 of shorthanded ice time per game, both of which top all Dallas forwards this season.

#### DALLAS MAVRIK

- Since Jan. 1, Mavrik Bourque has scored seven goals including the Stars fourth of the game in their game on Feb. 25 against the Columbus Blue Jackets. His seven goals during that span were tied for the second-most among all NHL rookies entering play Saturday, trailing only Detroit's Marco Kasper (8).
  - Bourque's seven goals since Jan. 1 are tied for fourth on Dallas' roster.
- In all, Bourque has totaled 12 points (6-6-12) since Jan. 1, which is five points better than the seven he had from the start of the regular season through Dec. 31. His 12 points since Jan. 1 ranked seventh among all NHL rookies entering play Saturday.
- Since Jan. 1, the Stars have outscored their opponents 12-9 when Bourque has been on the ice during even-strength

## BACK TO DECEMBER

- Since Dec. 23, the Stars have posted an 19-6-2 record for 40 points and a .741 points percentage. Dallas' win and point total were both the best marks in the league during that span entering play Saturday, and their points percentage ranked second (Winnipeg; .760).
- During that span, the Stars have outscored their opponents 97-68. No team had scored more goals than the Stars since Dec. 23 entering play Saturday. Their 3.59 goals per game during that span ranked second in the NHL behind the Buffalo
- The team's plus-29 goal differential was the second-best mark in the league since Dec. 23 entering play Saturday, trailing only the Winnipeg Jets (plus-30).
- Sixty-seven of Dallas' 97 goals since Dec. 23 have been scored at 5-on-5, which was the best mark in the NHL during that span entering play Saturday.
- Jason Robertson is the team's leading scorer since Dec. 23, totaling 37 points (18-19-37) in 27 games played. His 37 points during that span were tied for second in the NHL entering play Saturday, trailing only Boston's David Patrnak (38).
  - His 17 goals during that span were the third-most in the NHL entering play Saturday.

### **IRON SHARPENS IRON**

- The Stars have four skaters that have played in at least 200 consecutive games: Jamie Benn (356), Jason Robertson (269), Esa Lindell (229) and Wyatt Johnston (223). Entering play Saturday, Dallas was the only team in the NHL to have four players riding Iron Man streaks of at least 200 games.
- Dallas' last game on Feb. 28 against the Kings was the 356th consecutive game that Benn played in, which is the fifthlongest active Iron Man streak in the NHL.
- Robertson's 269-game Iron Man streak is the 13th-longest in the NHL. The Stars and the Detroit Red Wings were the only teams to have two players ranked in the top 15 entering play Saturday.
- Lindell's 229-game Iron Man streak ranks eighth among all NHL defensemen.
- Johnston's Iron Man Streak began when he made his NHL debut on Oct. 13, 2022. He is one of 44 players in NHL history to begin their NHL career by playing in at least 200 consecutive games according to NHL Stats.

#### ONE FOR THE HISTORY BOOKS

- Jake Oettinger's next shutout will be the 12th of his career, which will tie Jon Casey for the sixth-most in franchise
- Thomas Harley is 11 assists shy of tying Gary Sargen (71) for 25th-most by a defenseman in franchise history.
- Jason Robertson is one point shy of tying John Klingberg (374) for 18th-most points in franchise history.
- Roope Hintz is four points shy of tying Loui Eriksson (357) for 20th-most points in franchise history.
- Roope Hintz is six goals shy of tying Danny Grant (176) for 15th-most goals in franchise history.
- Esa Lindell is seven assists shy of tying Stephane Robidas (165) for 10th-most assists by a defenseman in franchise history.

### **CONNECT FOUR**

- Five Stars players represented their home country at the recently completed 4 Nations Face-Off: Mikael Granlund (Finland), Thomas Harley (Canada), Roope Hintz (Finland), Esa Lindell (Finland) and Jake Oettinger (United States). Dallas defenseman Miro Heiskanen was originally selected to Finland's roster but had to withdraw from the tournament due to injury.
- The Stars were also well-represented among the 4 Nations staff, with Jim Nill (Associate GM), Pete DeBoer (Assistant Coach) and Misha Donskov (Assistant Coach) all joining Canada's staff for the tournament. Additionally, former Star Jere Lehtinen served as Finland's General Manager.
- Harley, Nill, DeBoer and Donskoy won the 4 Nations Face-Off Championship after Canada defeated the United States 3-2 in overtime on Feb. 20.
- Harley, who was originally added to Canada's roster as an injury replacement, appeared in two games for his home country, both against the United States. He tallied one assist and averaged 20:07 of ice time per game.
- When Harley was on the ice during 5-on-5 play in the two games he played, the Canadians outshot the Americans 17-11. His plus-6 on-ice shot differential was the best mark of any Canadian defenseman in those two games.
- Granlund finished the tournament with four points (3-1-4) in three games for the Finns. His three goals were tied for the second-most among all skaters and his four points tied for fourth.
- Lindell and Hintz each appeared in three games for Finland, with Lindell scoring one goal.
- The 4 Nations Face-Off marked the first time that Granlund, Hintz and Lindell played for Finland together. Granlund and Lindell had previously represented Finland together three times: at the 2016 and 2022 IIHF World Championships and at the 2016 World Cup of Hockey.
- Oettinger started one game for the Americans, stopping 21 of the 23 shots he faced for a .913 save percentage and a 2.06 goals-against average.

## CONNECTIONS

- Blues GM Doug Armstrong was the assistant GM with the North Stars in 1992-93 and the Stars from 1993-94 to 2001-02 before becoming the GM in Dallas mid-season in 2001-02 until the middle of the 2007-08 season.
- Blues assistant coach Steve Ott was drafted by the Dallas Stars with the 25th pick of the 2000 NHL Draft. He played for the Stars in 2003-04 and 2005-06 to 2011-12 where he served as the assistant captain his last two seasons.
- Stars GM Jim Nill and Player Development Coordinator Ben Bishop played for the Blues during their careers. Nill during the 1981-82 season and Bishop in 2008-09 and 2010-11.
- Blues forward Radek Faksa was drafted by the Stars 13th overall in the 2012 NHL Draft and played for Dallas from 2015-16 to 2023-24.
- Blues head coach Jim Montgomery played for the Stars for nine games during the 2001-02 and 2002-03 seasons. He also was the head coach in Dallas from 2018-19 to 2019-20.
- Blues defenseman Ryan Suter played for Dallas from 2021-22 to 2023-24.
- Stars Special Assistant to the President Marty Turco and Blues defenseman Nick Leddy played together with the Chicago Blackhawks during the 2010-11 season.
- Stars Director of Player Personnel Rich Peverly and Blues defenseman Ryan Suter played together in Nashville from 2006-07 to 2008-09.
- Stars defenseman Brendan Smith and forward Colin Blackwell played with Blues forward Pavel Buchnevich as members of the New York Rangers. Smith and Buchnevich were teammates from 2016-17 to 2020-21, Blackwell joined the duo for the 2020-21 season.
- Stars goaltending coach Jeff Reese and Blues forward Brayden Schenn were both with the Philadelphia Flyers from 2011-12 to 2014-15 when Reese was a goalie coach in Philadelphia.
- Stars forward Sam Steel and defenseman Matt Dumba were teammates with Blues forward Oskar Sundqvist in Minnesota, when Sundavist played 15 games for the Wild during the 2022-23 season.
- Stars forward Matt Duchene and Blues forward Alexandre Texier played two games together with the Columbus Blue Jackets at the end of the 2018-19 season.
- Stars goaltender Casey DeSmith and Blues defenseman Pierre-Olivier Joseph were teammates in Pittsburgh from 2020-21 to 2022-23.
- Stars defenseman Matt Dumba, forward Mikael Granlund and Blues defenseman Ryan Suter were teammates in Minnesota. Dumba and Suter played together from 2013-14 to 2020-21, while Granlund joined Suter from 2012-13 to 2018-19.

- Stars defenseman Brendan Smith and Blues assistant coach Steve Ott played together in Detroit during the 2016-17 season.
- Stars defenseman Cody Ceci and Blues forward Dylan Holloway and defenseman Philip Broberg were teammates in Edmonton. Ceci and Holloway played together from 2022-23 to 2023-24, while Broberg was in Edmonton from 2021-22 to 2023-24 with Ceci.
- Stars defenseman Cody Ceci and Blues forward Nathan Walker were members of the Edmonton Oilers during the 2017-18 season.
- Stars defenseman **Thomas Harley** and Blues defenseman Colton Parayko and goaltender Jordan Binnington both played for Team Canada in the 2025 Four Nations tournament.
- Stars Player Development Assistant Jordie Benn and Blues assistant coach Steve Ott were teammates at the end of the 2016-17 season in Montreal.
- Stars Director of Player Development Rich Peverly and Special Assistant to the President Marty Turco played under Blues assistant coach Claude Julien when Julien was the head coach in Boston. Peverly played under Julien in Boston from 2010-11 to 2012-13, winning a Stanley Cup together in 2011, and Turco played under Julien in 2011-12.
