## **Post-Game Notes**

The Tampa Bay Lightning defeated the Carolina Hurricanes 3-0 on Tuesday night at AMALIE Arena.
The Lightning improved to 3-2-2 with a 3-0-1 record on home ice.
The Lightning are now 4-4-2 over their last 10 games against Carolina and 6-2-2 over their last 10 meetings on home ice.
The Bolts improved to 3-0-0 when scoring the first goal of the game.
The Lightning were outshot 32-23 by Carolina, including a 13-5 deficit in the third period.
The Bolts won their first game when being outshot and moved to 1-2-2 when they are outshot.
Victor Hedman led Tampa Bay with three shots on goal.
Mikey Eyssimont led dished out a game-high three hits.
Anthony Cirelli blocked a game-high three shots and led Tampa Bay at the dot, winning 10/19 faceoffs.
Lightning goaltender Jonas Johannson earned his first shutout as a Bolt and the second of his career, stopping all 32 shots he faced as he improved his record to 3-1-2.
Johansson's first career shutout came on April 9, 2021, against the Ducks as a member of the Avalanche.
Johansson is 2-0-2 over his last four starts with a .931 save percentage and 2.46 goals against average.

Tampa Bay is 13 for 13 on the penalty kill since its home opener on October 10 against Nashville.
Brayden Point gave the Lightning a 1-0 lead on the power play, redirecting a shot from the blueline with 54 seconds remaining in the first period. The goal was Point's first of the season and it marked his eighth point.
Point's game-opening goal was the 42 <sup>nd</sup> of his career, the sixth most in the NHL since Point made his debut in the 2016-17 season.
Victor Hedman took the shot that Point would deflect to earn the primary assist on the play, notching his seventh point of the season (1-6—7).
Hedman has eight points over his last 12 games against Carolina (2-6—8) and has pointed in 10 of his last 13 home matchups with the Canes (4-9—13).
Nikita Kucherov tallied his 10 <sup>th</sup> point of the season (6-4—10) with the secondary assist on the power-play marker.
Kucherov has pointed in 12 consecutive home games against Carolina (5-14—19) and has posted at least one point in 12 of his 13 career home games versus the Canes.
Kucherov has found the scoresheet in 19 of his 25 career meetings with the Hurricanes (7-22—29) with points in 14 of his last 17 games games against Carolina (3-18—21).
Alex Barré-Boulet scored his second goal in as many games, redirecting a shot from Darren Raddysh to give the Bolts a 2-0 lead at 17:51 of the second period.
Darren Raddysh notched the primary assist, making a shot-pass from the point to find Barré-Boulet's stick in front.
Brayden Point notched the secondary assist to earn his ninth point of the season (1-8—9).
Point has posted eight points over his last five games versus Carolina (4-4—8) and has pointed in nine of his last 13 home games against the Canes (7-8—15).
Nick Paul scored his fourth goal of the season to extend Tampa Bay's lead to 3-0 at 17:04 of the third period.
Brandon Hagel registered his seventh point of the season (4-3—7) and Mikhail Sergachev posted his third point of the season (0-3—3) with assists on Paul's goal.

The Lightning continue their five-game homestand on Thursday night against the San Jose Sharks.
The Bolts are 25-20-1 with two ties all-time against the Sharks, including a home record of 13-10-1 with two ties.
