SAN JOSE BARRACUDA BIOS



JON GUSTAFSON

President/SVP Governor

Jon Gustafson is Senior Vice President of SAP Center at San Jose & Sharks Ice, LLC and serves as the Governor for the San Jose Barracuda of the American Hockey League (AHL).

In his role at SAP Center, Gustafson oversees all areas of building operation including facility engineering, technical services, building services, guest services, merchandise, food and beverage operations, and more. Gustafson has been with Sharks Sports & Entertainment (SSE) for nearly 25 years, having also served as Vice President of SSE's public ice facilities (Sharks Ice at San Jose, Sharks Ice at Fremont, and the Oakland Ice Center), and Vice President of the Worcester Sharks.

In his time as General Manager of the public ice facilities, Gustafson played a significant role in growing the game of hockey throughout the Bay Area. This growth is exemplified in the vision and planning behind multiple expansions of the Sharks Ice at San Jose facility, which went from a two-rink complex, to four rinks, to, most recently, a six-rink complex featuring the state-of-the-art, 4,500 seat Tech CU Arena that opened in time for the 2022-23 AHL season. This most recent expansion project makes Sharks Ice at San Jose the largest ice facility in North America at over 400,000 sq ft.

Additionally, Gustafson is responsible for expanding the Sharks Ice Brand to both Fremont, Calif. and Oakland, Calif. adding a 1-rink facility in Fremont (Sharks Ice at Fremont) and a 2-rink facility in Oakland. Gustafson is also currently leading significant discussions to expand the Sharks Ice brand into Gilroy, Calif.

Furthermore, Gustafson started the Jr. Sharks Youth hockey program at Sharks Ice at San Jose in 2000.

With the AHL, Gustafson helped grow the League exponentially. After being named Vice President of the Worcester Sharks in 2013-14, Gustafson became the franchise's representative on the AHL's Board of Governors. In 2017, he joined the AHL's Executive Committee and, in 2019, was voted Chair of the AHL Executive Committee.

In 2015, Gustafson's leadership helped guide the birth of the AHL's Pacific Division, which saw six teams relocate from the East Coast to California, including the Worcester franchise to San Jose which was renamed as the Barracuda. Currently there are 10 teams in the Pacific Division.

In 2021, Gustafson was recognized by the AHL with the Thomas Ebright Award, presented annually to one AHL executive who has made outstanding career contributions to the League.

Early in his career, Gustafson served as General Manager and Vice President of Operations for the San Jose Rhinos of Roller Hockey International (RHI). The team, which played its home games at SAP Center, won the Murphy Cup as league champions in 1995 and Gustafson was named RHI "Executive of the Year" in 1999.

A former goaltender, Gustafson spent five seasons playing with various teams in the AHL, ECHL, CHL, WCHL and IHL. On April 15, 1992, he dressed as the back-up goaltender to Grant Fuhr for the Toronto Maple Leafs at Maple Leaf Gardens in a 4-2 win over the New York Rangers. The Fort Frances, Ontario native also played collegiately for four seasons at Colorado College earning a BA in Economics with a minor in Biology.

Jon and his wife Staci have two sons Luke (18) and Jake (16) and reside in San Jose.



JOHN MCCARTHY

Head Coach

In 2024-25, John McCarthy enters his third season as the head coach of the Barracuda. He was named to the role on May 18, 2022, replacing Roy Sommer who served as the head coach of the Sharks' top affiliate for 24 seasons.

On Dec. 27, 2019, McCarthy made his coaching debut with the Barracuda as an assistant against the Stockton Heat after announcing his retirement from pro hockey earlier in the day. On Dec. 10, McCarthy suffered an Ischemic stroke due to a previously undetected hole in his heart. Following swift medical attention from the team's medical staff and the physicians at Kaiser Permanente, McCarthy was stabilized and has made a complete recovery.

In 2019-20, McCarthy was named the winner of the Fred T. Hunt Memorial Award, which is given to the AHL player who best exemplifies the qualities of sportsmanship, determinations and dedication to hockey.

McCarthy, who was selected by the Sharks in the seventh round of the 2006 NHL Draft, holds all major Barracuda franchise records including games played (275), goals (62), assists (76), points (138), and shorthanded goals (5). He served as Barracuda team captain from 2016-20 and also served as team captain for the Worcester Sharks for the 2012-13 season.

In 577 career AHL games with Worcester, Chicago, and San Jose, he has collected 297 points (130 goals, 167 assists), 233 penalty minutes and a plus-62 rating. He also posted 11 points (three goals, eight assists) in 27 playoff games with the Barracuda over a four-year stretch before his retirement.

In addition, McCarthy skated in 88 NHL games with the Sharks between 2009-2016, accumulating six points (three goals, three assists) and 22 penalty minutes.

In total, McCarthy appeared in 640 regular season games with San Jose's NHL and AHL franchises. In 2018, McCarthy was selected to the United States Men's Olympic Ice Hockey Team, appearing in five games at the Pyeongchang Olympics.

Prior to his professional career, McCarthy spent four seasons at Boston University where he won a 2009 National Championship as one of the team's co-captains.

John resides in San Jose with his wife Aaron and son Jack.

**KYLE HAGEL****Assistant Coach**

Hagel enters his third season as an assistant coach with the San Jose Barracuda in 2024-25. He spent the previous five seasons as an assistant coach with the Seattle Thunderbirds of the WHL after a nine-year pro-playing career between the ECHL and AHL. Hagel, who played mostly left-wing as a player, spent four years at Princeton before beginning his pro career. During his nine seasons as a professional, he spent time with the AHL's Rockford IceHogs, Peoria Rivermen, Hamilton Bulldogs, Portland Pirates, and Charlotte Checkers, amassing 43 points (15 goals, 28 assists) and 1,001 penalty minutes in 373 games. In the ECHL, he skated in 80 games between the Fresno Falcons, Reading Royals and Las Vegas Wranglers, totaling 28 points (14 goals, 14 goals).

The native of Hamilton, Ontario, won the 2015 Yanick Dupre Memorial Award, which is given out annually to the AHL's man of the year for service to his local community.

Kyle resides in San Jose with his wife Jes and kids Liv and Macx.

**LOUIS MASS****Assistant Coach**

Mass enters his third season as an assistant coach with the San Jose Barracuda in 2024-25. Outside of the AHL, Mass has 13 years of coaching experience between the ECHL, NCAA and WHL. Before joining the Barracuda prior to the 2022-23 season, the Anchorage, Alaska native spent the prior four years with the Everett Silvertips, where he served as an associate coach in 2021-22 and the three prior years as an assistant. While in Everett, Mass, who worked predominantly with the defense corps, helped the Silvertips become one of the stingiest teams in the entire Canadian Hockey League. Before his time in Everett, he coached four seasons as an assistant coach at the University of Alaska-Anchorage and the five campaigns before that as an assistant coach with the ECHL's Alaska Aces.

Mass, who was a defenseman as a player, skated four years in the USHL between the Rochester Mustangs and Lincoln Stars, winning a Clark Cup with Lincoln in 1997. After the USHL, he played four seasons at Bowling Green State University before turning pro. His pro career spanned five years in the ECHL with the Pensacola Ice Pilots, Pee Dee Pride, Louisiana IceGators and Alaska Aces, winning a Kelly Cup in 2006 with the Aces. In 312 ECHL games, he notched 51 points (nine goals, 42 assists), 452 penalty minutes and a plus-17 rating.

**ERIC PINSKY****Video Coach and Coordinator of Hockey Operations**

Pinsky, a native of San Jose and a former San Jose Jr. Shark, enters his third season with the Barracuda in 2024-25 after spending the last six years with the ECHL's Idaho Steelheads in various capacities. Most recently he served as the team's video coach during all home games and was even on the bench for select home games as part of his graduate program at Boise State in 2021-22.

Following his final year as a player with the Jr. Sharks 18U AAA, Pinsky would go on to play two games with the Aberdeen Wings in the NAHL in 2016-17 before playing four years of ACHA D II Hockey with the Broncos.

While at Boise State, Pinsky earned a master's degree in athletic leadership and a bachelor of arts with an emphasis in production. In his role with the Barracuda, he works hand-in-hand with head coach John McCarthy and his staff, assisting in various capacities, including cutting game clips, assisting with practice and more. Additionally, he books and organizes all team travel and lodging while on the road.

**TIM LEROY****Equipment Manager**

2024-25 will be Leroy's first as the head equipment manager of the Barracuda. He most recently served as the equipment manager for the U.S. National Sled Hockey Team during the 2023-24 season. Before his time with U.S. Hockey, Leroy spent 22 years as the head equipment manager for the NHL's Columbus Blue Jackets, a position he held from the franchise's inception in 2000 until his departure in 2022.

Prior to his tenure in Columbus, Leroy worked on the Florida Panthers' equipment staff from 1993 to 2000 and served as the head equipment manager for the IHL's Kansas City Blades from 1990 to 1993. The Blades, the top affiliate of the San Jose Sharks during his final two years with the team, won the Turner Cup as IHL Champions in the 1991-1992 season.

While working for the Blades, Leroy notably served as the team's backup goaltender for a game in Salt Lake City, while still performing his equipment duties, after Arturs Irbe was called up to the Sharks last minute and the team had no alternative solution.

Leroy began his equipment journey as a stick boy for the Western Michigan hockey team during junior high and later attended college at Western Michigan, where he volunteered with the IHL's Kalamazoo Wings.

Tim and his wife Angie have one son, Kolter, who is a goalie.

**JOSH WOODARD****Assistant Equipment Manager**

2024-25 will be Woodard's second as the assistant equipment manager of the Barracuda. A graduate of the University of Arizona, Woodard began his career in hockey on the sales side with the San Diego Gulls in 2019 before transitioning to a locker room assistant with the Gulls in 2022.

Before joining the Barracuda, Woodard spent a season in minor league baseball as the assistant clubhouse manager for the Inland Empire 66ers, Low-A Affiliate of the Los Angeles Angels.

Woodard is a native of Carlsbad, CA.

SAN JOSE BARRACUDA BIOS

**JAIME GARCIA****Head Athletic Trainer, Manager of Sports Medicine**

2024-25 will be Garcia's first as the head athletic trainer and manager of sports medicine of the Barracuda. Garcia most recently spent the last three seasons (2020-2023) with the AHL's Milwaukee Admirals as the team's assistant athletic trainer. Before his time in Milwaukee, he held the same role with the AHL's Rochester Americans for three seasons (2017-2020).

Prior to his tenure in the AHL, Garcia was the head athletic trainer for the ECHL's Allen Americans for three seasons (2014-2017), where the Americans served as the Sharks' AA affiliate for his final two years.

A native of Houston, TX, Garcia earned his Bachelor of Science from the University of Houston and his Master's in Athletic Training from Stephen F. Austin University.

Garcia will work closely with Mike Potenza who was named the Sharks' director of high performance in June of 2024.

**EMI TAKAHASHI****Assistant Athletic Trainer, Manager of Player Rehabilitation**

2024-25 will be Takahashi's third as the assistant athletic trainer of the Barracuda. She returned to the team in 2022-23 after serving as an intern athletic trainer during the 2016-17 season, the club's most successful year in franchise history. From 2019 to 2022, she worked at Dartmouth College in Hanover, NH, primarily assisting with the Women's Ice Hockey team, Lightweight Rowing team and Women's and Men's Squash teams.

Prior to her time with the Big Green, the native of Osaka, Japan, worked for USA Hockey (U18 Woman's National Team, USA U18 Select Camp), Washington State University, the Portland Winterhawks of the Western Hockey League (WHL), the University of Washington Medical School and volunteered with the Japan Paralympic Wheelchair Basketball Team.

Takahashi has a bachelor of science in physical education, a master's of athletic training at Texas Tech, and a doctorate of athletic training from the University of Idaho.

**RACHEL LLANES****Strength and Conditioning Coach**

Llanes a native of San Jose and a graduate of Northeastern University where she played NCAA DI hockey for four years, enters her third season with the Barracuda in 2024-25.

Following her collegiate career, she would go on to play nine seasons of pro between the Boston Pride (National Woman's Hockey League), Kunlun Red Star/Shenzhen and KRS Vanke Rays (CWHL and Russian Woman's Hockey League). She was the first player in history to win a Championship in all three professional leagues. In 2022, Llanes represented China at the Olympic Games in Beijing, China and also served as the team's strength and conditioning coach. In 2023 she played for Team China at the Woman's IIHF World Championships in Shenzhen, China, collecting a pair of assists in five games.

Her training background began in 2013, as she served as the strength and conditioning coach for Dan Boothby Performance Training, which serves various prep and collegiate programs in the Boston area, along with current NHL players and prospects. While still working for Dan Boothby Performance Training, Llanes assisted the Buckingham Browne and Nicholas Prep School hockey programs. For the 2015-16 school year, she was a grad assistant strength and conditioning coach for Northeastern University Athletics, and from 2016-17, she was the head strength and conditioning coach and assistant coach for the New England Hockey Club (Junior Woman's Hockey League). From 2015-17, she was the head strength coach and on ice development coach/evaluator for Massachusetts Hockey Development under the umbrella of the USA Hockey. Since 2014, she has also owned her own performance training company, Train Perform Repeat. She still manages and coaches Chinese National Team players who are based out of North America.

**NICK NOLLENBERGER****Sr. Broadcast & Public Relations Manager**

Nollenberger aka "Nolly" returns for his ninth season as the Sr. Broadcast & Public Relations Manager for the Sharks top affiliate in 2024-25. During this time, he has called over 500 games at the AHL level. On November 11, 2023, in Anaheim, he made his NHL regular-season debut on the radio, filling in for the longtime voice of the Sharks, Dan Rusanowsky, who was inducted into the Hockey Hall of Fame.

In addition to his duties with the Barracuda, Nollenberger serves as a television analyst during select Sharks broadcasts on NBC Sports California and was the rink-side reporter for the 2024 AHL All-Star game on the NHL Network. He also does play-by-play for all Barracuda telecasts on NBCSCA.

A San Jose Jr. Sharks alum, Nolly was the Director of Broadcast and Media Relations for the Odessa Jackalopes of the North American Hockey League (NAHL) before joining the Barracuda. Prior to Odessa, he served as the assistant director of broadcast and media relations for the Kannapolis Intimidators, the Class 'A' affiliate of the Chicago White Sox.

The Santa Cruz, CA native graduated from the University of Arizona in 2014 with a degree in Broadcast Journalism. While at the University of Arizona, he served as the radio voice of the school's hockey team for parts of three seasons and called games for the school's basketball, football, and baseball teams.

In addition to his work with the Barracuda, Nollenberger has called multiple NHL preseason games for the Sharks and various sports on the Pac-12 Network, NBC Sports Bay Area, and the Mountain West Network.

TECH CU ARENA



Tech CU Arena opened in August of 2022 and is the crown jewel of a 200,000 square foot expansion of the Sharks Ice at San Jose public skating facility.

Tech CU Arena has a capacity of 4,200 and included training facilities and executive office space for the Barracuda, an in-arena video board and LED display, 12 premium suites, eight loge boxes, one theatre suite, a 46-person party deck, three bar locations including one at ice level, seven food concession stations, a press room and press box and two team merchandise stores.

In January 2020, the San Jose City Council unanimously approved the 200,000 square-foot expansion of Sharks Ice at San Jose, adding two additional recreational ice sheets to the facility, increasing the building's total ice sheets to six and doubling the facility's footprint to just under 400,000 square feet.

The Barracuda played its first seven season in San Jose at the SAP Center at San Jose.

2023-24 IN REVIEW



In 2023-24, the Barracuda set a franchise record by deploying 53 players, including a record 39 forwards and 20 defensemen. Of the 52, 36 were in their first full season within the organization, and nine of the 53 were drafted by the Sharks. Twelve were acquired via trade, 11 made their AHL debuts during the season, and 23 were considered rookies.

Of the 20 players who were in the lineup for the Barracuda on opening night in October, 15 remained on the roster at the end of the year. Sixteen different players spent time between the Barracuda and the Sharks, and three made their NHL debuts during this past year (**Magnus Chrona**, **Shakir Mukhamadullin**, **Georgi Romanov**).

The Barracuda finished the year with a record of 24-34-10-4, earning 62 points (AHL: T-29th, WC: T-15th, PAC: 10th) and were held out of the postseason for the third consecutive year.

Star Bright: Although the AHL is a national league, spanning over two countries, 15 states, and five provinces, teams can be quite regional, only going out of their division on a handful of occasions. For context, the Barracuda played the Charlotte Checkers in 2023-24, the first-ever meeting against an Eastern Conference opponent in the team's nine-year history. The AHL All-Star Game and Skills Competition is the league's marquee event, broadcasted internationally on AHLTV.com, in the US on the NHL Network, and in Canada on TSN. It's the only chance for every team in the league to be represented by players and staff under the same roof. Tech CU Arena, the home of the Barracuda, was the perfect site for the event on Feb. 4-5, 2024. It was just the second time in the AHL's nearly 90-year history, and the first time since 2020 in Ontario, that the event was held in California. With the Barracuda's initial All-Star selection, **Danil Gushchin**, out with an injury, **Shakir Mukhamadullin** was added to the Pacific Division's roster days before. At the time, he was still up with the Sharks in the NHL. With inclement weather affecting flights all along the West Coast, several players were delayed getting into San Jose, including Mukhamadullin. After multiple flights, including an unscheduled layover in Los Angeles, Shak managed to make it to Tech CU Arena halfway through the Skills Competition on Sunday. After receiving a standing ovation from the home crowd, he jumped right into the breakaway competition and scored. The next night he'd help Team Pacific win the three-on-three All-Star Challenge.

The Gush is Loose: No one on the Barracuda finished hotter than sophomore forward **Danil Gushchin** who collected goals in his final four games, which included seven points during that span (4+3=7), and notched points in 11 of 12 (6+10=16) to wrap up the year with the Cuda (6+10=16). Despite playing in 11 fewer contests than he did in 2022-23, Gushchin recorded 11 more assists and nine more points in the AHL. He also surpassed his franchise record in shots (209) which ranked T-sixth in the AHL. The Yekaterinburg, Russia native's 0.96 points-per-game is the third-best in a single season in Barracuda history (minimum of 20 games). Among SJB skaters, he ranked first in shots, T-first in power-play goals (6), and game-winning goals (4), second in goals (20), and points (54), and T-third in assists (34). Named to the All-Star Game in February, Gushchin was unable to participate with an upper-body injury that held him out for 13 games. In addition to his 56 contests in the AHL, Gushchin skated in four games with the Sharks, posting two points (1+1=2). He was called up to the Sharks at the end of the year and played the team's final two games.

Todd's Time: In his first season with the Barracuda, **Nathan Todd** led the team in scoring (55) and assists (36), and ranked T-first in power-play goals (6), second in games played (69), points-per-game (.80), and shots (185), and third in goals (19). Todd, who tore his ACL last year while with the Springfield Thunderbirds, set career-highs in 2023-24 in games, goals, assists, points, power-play goals, and shots. On Feb. 2, he collected his 100th AHL point (goal) in a 2-1 win over the Abbotsford Canucks and three games later notched his first AHL hat trick in a 4-2 victory over the Bakersfield Condors. After notching just one goal and four assists through the first 15 games, Todd would go on to collect 18 points and 32 assists over his next 55 including two seven-game point streaks.

Coles Notes: In his first season with the Barracuda, **Cole Cassels** set career-highs in power-play goals (6) and shots (106). Additionally, he skated in the second-most games of his career (67), and notched the second-most goals (11), assists (34), and points (45). Among SJB skaters, he was T-first in power-play goals (6), T-third in assists (34), and third in points (45). On Feb. 21, he collected a pair of assists in a 4-5 loss at the Coachella Valley Firebirds and the first of the two helpers was his 200th AHL point.

Full Deck: **Ethan Cardwell** finished his rookie season with a team-high 23 goals and 71 games played. His 23 goals matched the most by a rookie in franchise history and his 71 games played matched the most played in a season by any player. The Courtice, Ontario native would have played all 72 games had it not been for his gear not making it on a team flight to Calgary in early November. Among AHL freshmen, he finished fourth in goals, T-fifth in shots (165), and T-ninth in points (43).

Jacked Up: On March 7, the Sharks acquired a 2024 third-round selection and defenseman **Jack Thompson** from the Tampa Bay Lightning in exchange for forward Anthony Duclair and San Jose's 2025 seventh-round selection. Thompson, who was an AHL All-Star this season with the Syracuse Crunch, finished his outstanding sophomore campaign first among AHL defenders in power-play points (24) and power-play assists (21), T-sixth in assists (35), and T-seventh in points (41). After the trade to San Jose, Thompson skated in 16 games with the Cuda, totaling nine points (1+8=9). In addition, he dressed in two games with the Sharks at the end of the season. The native of Courtice, Ontario, made his NHL debut with the Lightning on Jan. 6, 2024, at the Boston Bruins.

2022-23 IN REVIEW

Shak Attack: The Barracuda's Team MVP and Top Prospect, as voted on by the media, **Shakir Mukhamadullin** put together an outstanding first season in North America in 2023-24. The Ufa, Russia native made his NHL debut on Jan. 27 versus the Buffalo Sabres and two games later collected his first NHL assist in Anaheim against the Ducks. In February, he represented the Barracuda in San Jose at the 2024 AHL All-Star Classic presented by Tech CU. In 55 games with the Barracuda, he led all team defenders in scoring, assists, and shots.

Sabs Sizzling: The team's Most Inspirational Award winner, Scott Sabourin, did a little bit of everything for the Barracuda in 2023-24, his first in the organization. The 11-year pro set personal bests in games played (59), goals (18), penalty minutes (192), power-play goals (5), game-winning goals (3), and shots (140). Among Cuda skaters, he ranked first in PIMs, second in power-play goals, fourth in goals, and fifth in shots. In the AHL, he ranked third in penalty minutes (192) and minors (36).

Fresh Frisch: In his first season of pro, Ethan Frisch finished with a team-best plus-17 rating. On Jan. 16, the Moorehead, Minnesota native notched his first pro goal, which turned out to be the game-winner in a 3-0 victory versus the Calgary Wranglers. Frisch also dropped the gloves on three separate occasions, tying for the team lead in fighting majors among defenders, and ranked second in penalty minutes (41) among team rear-guards. After sitting out 16 of the team's first 24 games, Frisch became a regular in the lineup, skating in the final 46 of 47 to finish out the year.

Fil the Thrill: Sharks' 2022 first-rounder Filip Bystedt recorded seven points (4+3=7) in eight games with the Barracuda at the end of the year after finishing up his season in Sweden. The 20-year-old collected three points (2+1=3) in his AHL debut on April 3 in San Diego, becoming just the third player in franchise history to score three points and two goals in his AHL debut.

Trade Winds: The Sharks and Barracuda executed multiple trades this season that significantly impacted the Barracuda's roster:

November 8: The Sharks traded forward Adam Raska to the Minnesota Wild for defenseman Calen Addison. Before the deal, Raska had skated in seven games with the Barracuda and 110 over the last three seasons.

December 15: The Sharks dealt defenseman Nick Cicek and a 2024 sixth-rounder to the Vancouver Canucks in exchange for forward Jack Studnicka. Studnicka played in 17 games with the Sharks, collecting zero points, and 27 games with the Barracuda, scoring six goals and adding eight assists.

March 8: The Sharks traded defenseman Nikita Okhotiuk to the Flames for a conditional 2024 fifth-round pick. Okhotiuk played in five games with the Barracuda at the beginning of the year on a conditioning stint.

January 23: The Barracuda acquired forward Jordy Bellerive from the Lehigh Valley Phantoms for future considerations. On March 15, Bellerive was traded to the Syracuse Crunch for forward Joe Carroll.

March 8: The Sharks sent Barracuda captain Radim Simek to the Red Wings for forward Klim Kostin.

February: The Sharks terminated defenseman Leon Gawanke's contract, allowing him to return to his native Germany.

March 16: The Sharks loaned 2022 first-rounder Ozzy Wiesblatt to the Milwaukee Admirals for the remainder of the season.

December 11: The Barracuda signed veteran forward Kyle Rau to an AHL contract for the remainder of the season. Rau notched 30 points (7+23=30) in 48 games with the Barracuda.

Gone But Not Forgotten: On January 16, Sharks Sports & Entertainment and the San Jose Barracuda announced the sudden and shocking loss of Frank Torres, vice president of Barracuda business operations, who passed away suddenly on January 15 after a brief illness. Frank was an integral part of the Barracuda, overseeing all aspects of the team's business operations. His supportive and empowering leadership style gave his employees the tools and confidence to succeed. He was dedicated to the AHL, having spent 15 years in the league at three different stops. Frank's legacy and impact on those who knew him and worked for him will never be forgotten.

Three's Company: The Barracuda relied on three different goaltenders throughout the season: Magnus Chrona, Georgi Romanov, and Eetu Makiniemi. Chrona and Romanov played in three different leagues (NHL/AHL/ECHL) during the campaign. Romanov led the team in wins (9), save percentage (.904), and tied with Makiniemi in goals-against average (3.14). Despite playing in the fewest games of the bunch, Makiniemi led the goalie room in shutouts, including two in his final five games. On March 20, in relief, Makiniemi made a franchise-record 22 saves in the third period, leading to a 6-4 win.
