BUILDING ON THE FOUNDATION

The 2022-23 season represented a new era in Sharks hockey, with **Mike Grier** taking over as General Manager and Head Coach **David Quinn** serving in his first year behind the bench in San Jose. The club saw several returning regulars notch career highs, including:

- » F Alexander Barabanov in goals (15), assists (32) and points (47)
- » D Matt Benning in assists (23) and points (24)
- » F Nico Sturm in goals (14), assists (12) and points (26)
- » F Tomas Hertl in assists (41)

Additionally, a handful of Sharks prospects found their way into the lineup for the Sharks last season, earning valuable NHL experience:

- » F Thomas Bordeleau posted two assists in an eight-game stint.
- » D **Nick Cicek** made his NHL debut and appeared in 16 games for the Sharks, finishing with four assists.
- » F William Eklund notched a pair of goals and finished with three points (2g, 1a) in eight games.
- » F Danil Gushchin found the scoresheet in each of the two games in which he played, scoring a goal and adding an assist.
- » F Adam Raska appeared in three games.
- » F Tristen Robins played in three games to close out the campaign.
- » D Henry Thrun notched two assists in his debut and skated in eight games.

FRESH FACES

The summer was spent reshaping the roster for the Sharks, who added many players with NHL experience. The work started on June 27 with a trade with the New Jersey Devils to acquire G Mackenzie Blackwood, then continued in in July with the acquisition of F Anthony Duclair from the Florida Panthers and with the additions of F Ryan Carpenter, D Kyle Burroughs, F Givani Smith and F Filip Zadina in free agency. Another haul came in August, when the Sharks received F Mikael Granlund, F Mike Hoffman and D Jan Rutta.

HIGH MARKS FOR LOGAN

Sharks captain Logan Couture posted a strong season in 2022-23, finishing second on the club in goals (27) and points (78), tied for the second-most assists (40). His goal total was tied for his most since 2017-18, and his point total was the second-best of his career (2018-19; 70).

Couture, who was second among San Jose forwards with 25 points after the All-Star Break, became the fifth player from the 2007 NHL Draft class to reach 700 career points, reaching the milestone with an assist on April 10 at Winnipeg. He had a five-point outing (2g, 3a) against Pittsburgh on Jan. 28, his best single-game scoring effort of his career. The Guelph, Ontario native enters the season with 927 career NHL games played.

ALL-TIME PRESEASON SERIES

The Sharks trail in the all-time preseason series against Los Angeles, **10-20-23**.

Last year, the Sharks took both games against the Kings.

GAME ONE RECAP

SJS 5, VGK 2... Behind three-point efforts from **Henry Thrun** (2g, 1a) and **Tomas Hertl** (1g, 2a), the Sharks jumped out to an early lead and never looked back en route to a preseason-opening win. **Kyle Burroughs** (1g, 1a) also posted a multi-point effort and **Kaapo Kahkonen** made 32 saves on 34 shots faced in the victory.

GAME TWO RECAP

SJS 2, ANA 4... Goals from William Eklund and Marc-Edouard Vlasic helped San Jose nearly climb out of a three-goal, first-period deficit, but the Sharks could not find the equalizer in a 4-2 setback. Kevin Labanc, Shakir Mukhamadullin and Nico Sturm each registered an assist in the contest. Mackenzie Blackwood made 21 saves on 24 shots faced in his first preseason appearance in teal.

GAME THREE RECAP

SJS 2, ANA 4... Nathan Todd netted his second goal of the preseason and Justin Bailey lit the lamp for the first time in teal, but the Sharks were unable to overcome four goals by the Ducks for the second consecutive game. San Jose struck on the power play for the third consecutive game while Georgi Romanov made his first appearance in net with the Sharks.

A REHASH OF NASH

The Sharks made nine picks in the 2023 NHL Draft, which took place in Nashville, Tennessee on June 28 and 29. Highlighted by two first-round selections, including the team's highest since 1998 at fourth overall, San Jose added the following players to the pipeline:

DEEPER WATERS

Sharks general manager Mike Grier has made an impact since arriving in San Jose, adding to the team's draft capital and prospect pool while reshaping the NHL roster. Since taking the reins for the Sharks, the club has seen the departures of forward Timo Meier and defenseman Erik Karlsson via trade while adding three first round picks: 26th overall in 2023 (Quentin Musty), a conditional first from New Jersey in 2024 and Pittsburgh's (top-10 protected) in 2024, as well as later-round selections, to go along with prospects highlighted by defensemen Shakir Mukhamadullin and Nikita Okhotiuk from New Jersey, among others.

Among other trades since the start of the 2022-23 season in which the Sharks received future picks, the club received a 2023 fourth-round selection from Seattle (originally from Colorado, 123rd overall; D Luca Cagnoni) in exchange for D Jaycob Megna, a 2025 fourth-round selection in exchange for F Vladislav Namestnikov.

In total, Grier has acquired 14 draft picks since being named Sharks GM.

FUTURE FISH

- » F Thomas Bordeleau was selected to participate in the AHL All-Star Classic and finished the season with 41 points (22g, 19a) in 65 games.
- » F Filip Bystedt was named SHL Rookie of the Year after tallying 20 points (7g, 13a) in 45 games with Linkoping HC.
- » F Ethan Cardwell was named Sharks Prospect of the Year presented by Kaiser Permanente after tallying 90 points with Barrie (OHL) in 2022-23.
- » G Magnus Chrona earned First Team All-NCHC recognition and was named NCHC Goaltender of the Year after going 22-8-0 with a .915 SVP and 2.19 GAA.
- » D Jake Furlong was named Halifax Mooseheads (QMJHL) Most Improved Player in 2022-23, finishing the year with 50 points in 67 games.
- » F Danil Gushchin led Barracuda rookies with 45 points (22g, 23a) in 67 games.
- » F Cam Lund earned Hockey East All-Rookie Team honors and was named Northeastern's Rookie of the Year.
- » D Shakir Mukhamadullin made his North American debut with the Barracuda on March 21 and finished his 12 AHL games with 10 points (1g, 9a).
- » F Will Smith finished his USNTDP career with the second-most career points (191) and had the second-highest single-season point total (127) in the program's history in 2022-23. He earned the Bob Johnson Award for excellence in international hockey competition.
- » F Alex Young notched an 18-game point streak for Colgate and has transferred to Arizona State ahead of the 2023-24 season.

LA KINGS PRESEASON QUICK HITS

Going Down Under!

The Kings and Coyotes games are historic as they mark the first ever NHL games played in the Southern Hemisphere. This year's Global Series also marks the first time the Kings have played abroad since the NHL China Games in 2017. Headlining the roster are a trio of two-time Stanley Cup Champions with the Kings, including captain **Anze Kopitar**, alternate captain **Drew Doughty**, and forward **Trevor Lewis**. After helping the Kings capture the first Stanley Cup in franchise history in 2012, the trio led the Kings to a Western Conference Final appearance in 2013 before winning the Stanley Cup again in 2014.

In total, the roster features 23 players who played at least one game with the Kings during in 2022-23 NHL season, including 2023 NHL All-Star Game participant **Kevin Fiala** and 2022 NHL All-Star Game participant **Adrian Kempe**, who entering his eighth season as a King after establishing a new single-season career high in goals with 41 in 2022-23 to become the first Kings skater since **Luc Robitaille** in 1993-94 to score at least 40 goals in a season (44). Defenseman **Vladislav Gavrikov** is set to play in his second consecutive NHL Global Series (Tampere, Finland) after doing so last year with the Columbus Blue Jackets.

Game start times in Australian Eastern Standard Time (AEST) and Pacific Standard Time (PST) are as follows:

- Game 1: Saturday, September 23 at 2:00 p.m. AEST (Friday, September 22 at 9:00 p.m. PST)
- Game 2: Sunday, September 24 at 2:00 p.m. AEST (Saturday, September 23 at 9:00 p.m. PST)

Captain's Camp

King's forward **Anze Kopitar** is set to play in his 18th season with the Kings, and his eighth season as captain. Kopitar led all Kings in scoring last year for a sixth consecutive season with 74 points (28-46-74). It was the 15th time in his career he led the Kings in scoring, a franchise a record that trails only **Gordie Howe** (17) for most seasons leading a single franchise in scoring in league history.

Kopitar enters camp having signed a new two-year contract extension worth an average annual value (AAV) of \$7,000,000 through the 2025-26 season. Last season, Kopitar became the first player in NHL history to play in all 82 regular season games and take fewer than five penalty minutes (PIM) while averaging over 20 minutes of time-on-ice (TOI), culminating in him being awarded his second career Lady Byng Trophy. He joined **Pavel Datsyuk** as the only players in NHL history to win multiple Selke Trophies and multiple Lady Byng Trophies. Kopitar became the third player to record 1,100 points in a Kings sweater last season, and his 1,141 points trail only **Luc Robitaille** (1,154) and **Marcel Dionne** (1,307) for the most in Kings history.

King of the Blueline

Drew Doughty enters camp as the longest tenured defenseman and second-longest tenured skater on the Kings roster, entering his 16th season as a member of the team. The four-time All-Star and former Norris Trophy winner recorded 52 points (9-43=52) in 2022-23, his fourth season of at least 50 points as a King, joining **Rob Blake** and **Steve Duchesne** for the most 50-point season from a blueliner in franchise history. Doughty also scored his 30th career game-winning goal last season, passing Blake for the most by a defenseman in Kings history.

New Kids on the Block

Originally a first-round pick of the Columbus Blue Jackets, the Kings acquired forward **Pierre-Luc Dubois** (3rd overall, 2016) via a trade with the Winnipeg Jets on June 7, in exchange for forwards **Alex Iafallo, Gabriel Vilardi, Rasmus Kupari,** and a 2024 second-round draft pick. Dubois posted career-highs in assists (36) and points (27-36=63) in 73 games with the Jets and added four points (2-2=4) in five Stanley Cup Playoff games last season.

The 2022-23 season marked the first time he's produced consecutive 60-point campaigns (60 points (28-32=60); 2021-22) and the second time he's surpassed 20 goals in back-to-back seasons (2017-19). Dubois was signed to an eight-year contract carrying an AAV of \$8,500,000 through the 2030-31 season this summer.

The Kings also signed goaltender **Cam Talbot** to a one-year, \$1-million contract on July 1. Talbot made 32 starts for the Ottawa Senators last season, posting a 17-14-2 record with one shutout, a 2.93 goals-against average (GAA) and a .898 save percentage (SV%) in 36 appearances. Talbot reunites with Kings head coach **Todd McLellan**, who he played under while in Edmonton for parts of four seasons (2015-19).

Gavrikov Locked Down

Kings defenseman **Vladislav Gavrikov** is set to take part in his first training camp as a member of the Kings. After being acquired via trade with the Columbus Blue Jackets on March 1, 2023, Gavrikov played in 20 regular-season games with the Kings last season, earning nine points (3-6=9). During that time, Gavrikov led all Kings defensemen in plus/minus (plus-12), tied for most takeaways by a defenseman (8), ranked second on the blue line in TOI (21:01 min.) and shorthanded TOI (1:59 min.) and finished third amongst team blueliners in blocked shots (26). Gavrikov also recorded an assist in six playoff games during the 2023 Stanley Cup Playoffs. On June 7, the Kings signed Gavrikov to a two-year contract extension worth an AAV of \$5,875,000 through the 2024-25 season.

Hey Now, You're an All-Star

In his first season with the Kings, **Kevin Fiala** was selected to his first NHL All-Star Game and enjoyed a point-per-game pace season for the second-consecutive year, registering 72 points (23-49=72) in 69 games. Among his season highlights: first Kings skater since 1999-00 to record 60 points in 60 games or less; first Kings skater since 2017-18 to record five-or-more 3+ point games in season; fifth Kings player in the last 20 years to reach the 30-point mark in 28 games or fewer; fifth-fastest skater in Kings history to eclipse the 20-assist mark; and 20-multi-point games, the most by a King in their first season since 2005-06. For his performance, he was named the Kings' "Best Newcomer" in 2022-23.

Starting QB

Kings forward **Quinton Byfield** is entering his fourth season with the Kings. He is projected to start the season on the King's top-line after finding success in the role last season playing alongside forwards **Adrian Kempe** and **Anze Kopitar**, establishing new single-season career highs in assists (19), points (22), games played (53) and plus/minus (plus-13). Byfield also recorded a career-long five-game point and assist streak (0-5=5) from Feb. 28 - March 9, becoming the first Kings skater 20 years of age or younger since **Drew Doughty** (20 y/o, 1-6=7, Feb. 8 to March 4, 2010) to record a five-game point streak and the first since **Darryl Sydor** (20 y/o, 0-5=5, Feb. 27 to March 9, 1993) to record a five-game assist streak.

Young Gun

Already a cornerstone of the Kings defense corps, **Mikey Anderson** currently ranks second on the Kings in both time-on-ice per game (21:03) and plus/minus rating (+30) since making the Kings opening night roster in 2020-21. His 2022-23 campaign was one to remember as he established single-season career-highs in nearly every statistical category. Known for his selfless defensive play and leadership qualities, Anderson ranks among the Kings team leaders in blocked shots, hits, takeaways and time-on-ice per game. As a result, on Feb. 15, the Kings signed the 24-year-old blueliner to an eight-year contract extension worth an AAV of \$4,125,000 through the 2030-31 season.

Moore History in the Making

Kings Forward **Trevor Moore** is entering his fifth season as a member of the Kings, the first season of his five-year contract extension signed on Dec. 15 worth an average annual value (AAV) of \$4,200,000 through the 2027-28 season. The Thousand Oaks, Calif. native tallied his 100th career NHL point on Nov. 10 vs. Chicago, becoming the seventh California-born player in league history and 24th active undrafted skater to reach such a mark. He also scored his 100th career point as a member of the Kings on March 25 vs. Winnipeg to become the second California-born player in league history to score at least 100 points for a California-based team.

Moore is the first California-born player in NHL history to score a hat trick for a California-based team, doing so on Nov. 16 in Edmonton. He enters the 2023-24 season with 105 points (40-65=105) as a member of the Kings, just five points shy of the most points by a California-born skater for a California-based team in NHL history, a mark currently held by Pittsburgh Penguins forward **Matt Nieto**, who scored 109 points (47-62=109) in 364 games for the San Jose Sharks.

Rise of the Pheonix

Kings goaltender **Pheonix Copley** enters his second season with the Kings and his first full season having started last season with the Ontario Reign, the Kings' primary American Hockey League (AHL) affiliate. On March 6, 2023, against the Washington Capitals, Copley stopped 20-of-22 shots to record his 20th victory as a King in just his 29th appearances of the season with the club, becoming the fastest goaltender in Kings history to reach the 20-win mark in a single season, breaking the previous record of 30 games played (**Jonathan Quick**, 30 GP in 2015-16). Copley currently stands 10 wins shy of 50 in his NHL career.

Returning Faces

27 of the 68 players participating in Training Camp were drafted by the Kings, including returning forward **Trevor Lewis** (17th overall, 2006) and goaltender **J.F. Berube** (95th overall, 2009). Lewis played for the Kings from 2008-20, putting up 163 points (70-93=163) in 674 Games Played with the team. He was signed as an unrestricted free agent on July 1, 2023, and will take part in his first Kings training camp since 2019-20. Berube signed a Professional Tryout Agreement (PTO) with the Kings on Sept. 5, 2023, returning to the franchise for the first time since a stint with the Ontario Reign in 2020-21.

Upcoming Milestones

The Kings have many skaters nearing potential milestones for the 2023-24 season. In the Games Played category, King's defenseman **Drew Doughty** is five games from 1,100 in his career, which would make him the fourth player in team history to play 1,100 games in a Kings sweater. Additionally, Doughty would become the 12th defenseman in NHL history to skate in at least 1,100 games with a single franchise. Doughty is also 17 games shy of surpassing **Dave Taylor** for the third-most games played in Kings history. Kings captain **Anze Kopitar** is five games shy of surpassing former teammate **Dustin Brown** for most games played in franchise history. Kopitar is also eight games from 1,300 in his NHL career. He would become the first player in Kings history to skate in 1,300 games for the club and the 15th player in NHL history to skate in 1,300 games for a single franchise. Other upcoming games played milestones are as follows:

- Forward Quinton Byfield, one game from 100.
- Forward Jaret Anderson-Dolan, four games from 100.
- Defenseman Andreas Englund, 20 games from 100.
- Defenseman **Mikey Anderson**, six games from 200.
- Forward Carl Grundstrom, 14 games from 200.
- Forward Arthur Kaliyev, 63 games from 200.
- Defenseman Matt Roy, 12 games from 300.

- Defenseman Vladislav Gavrikov, 24 games from 300.
- Forward **Trevor Moore**, 37 games from 300.
- Forward **Blake Lizotte**, 42 games from 300.
- Forward **Kevin Fiala**, 12 games from 500.
- Forward Adrian Kempe, 28 games from 500.
- Forward Pierre-Luc Dubois, 66 games from 500.
- Forward **Phillip Danault**, 47 games from 600.
- Forward Trevor Lewis, eight games from 900.

In the goals category, captain **Anze Kopitar** is seven goals shy of 400 in his career. He would become the fourth player in team history to score 400 goals as a member of the Kings, joining **Dave Taylor** (431), **Marcel Dionne** (550) and **Luc Robitaille** (557). Additionally, defenseman **Drew Doughty** is nine goals shy of 150 in his career, which would make him the 46th defenseman in NHL history to reach the mark. Other upcoming goal milestones are as follows:

- Forward **Trevor Lewis,** 10 goals from 100.
- Forward Viktor Arvidsson, 27 goals from 200.

In the assist category, defenseman **Drew Doughty** is 22 assists shy of 500 in his career. Doughty would become the fifth skater and first defenseman in Kings history to record 500 career assists with the team. Additionally, King's captain **Anze Kopitar** is 10 assists shy of passing **Marcel Dionne** for most assists in franchise history (757). Other upcoming assist milestones are as follows:

- Forward **Trevor Moore**, 27 assists from 100.
- Forward Pierre-Luc Dubois, 24 assists from 200.
- Forward Viktor Arvidsson, 26 assists from 200.

Lastly, in the points category, King's captain **Anze Kopitar** is 14 points shy of surpassing **Luc Robitaille** for second-most points in King's franchise history (1,154). Additionally, Kopitar is 59 points from 1,200 in his career. Kopitar has scored at least 60 points in every full 82-game NHL season since 2017-18. Other upcoming point milestones are as follows:

Broadcast Breakdown

On Sept. 14, the Kings announced the team's television schedule for the 2023-24 season. The schedule features 63 regular-season games on Bally Sports West and six games on KCAL-TV (Channel 9), with 13 additional games nationally televised across ESPN, TNT and Hulu. The Kings begin their transition to a singular broadcast team across television and audio this season, as Hall of Famer **Nick Nickson** will serve as club play-by-play announcer, working closely with award-winning analyst **Jim Fox** and analyst **Daryl Evans**. **Carrlyn Bathe** will return serving as a reporter, delivering interviews and reports throughout the season. All games available on Bally Sports West and KCAL-TV will also be available through the subscription-based streaming service Bally Sports+.
