



SEYMOUR H. KNOX III

Chairman of the Board and President

The Chairman of the Board of the Buffalo Sabres is a successful businessman and an outstanding athlete in his own right. Since his school days when a football injury ended his hockey career, Seymour Knox has been an avid hockey fan, and turned that interest into a long quest for an NHL franchise - one that paid off in 1970. Former president of the U.S. Squash Racquets Association and a nationallyranked player, he is Regional Vice President of Dominick & Dominick, members of New York Stock Exchange, and Sabres' representative on the NHL Board of Governors.



NORTHRUP R. KNOX

Vice Chairman of the Board

"Norty" Knox was an outstanding goalie at Yale and turned his athletic abilities to polo and court tennis after college. He was the court tennis World Champion for 10 years, and captain and number one player on the U.S. Polo team in 1969. Currently he serves as Chairman of the U.S. Polo Association. With his brother Seymour, Norty Knox was disappointed in the first expansion of the NHL when the well-prepared Buffalo application was turned down. But the Knox brothers and other local backers continued to be persistent, leading to the league's dynamic new franchise.



DAVID G. FORMAN

Administrative Vice President

Front office operations of the new Sabres organization have been under the direction of Dave Forman in the hectic months of putting together a new franchise.

No stranger to administration, he has been a well known and highly respected business and civic leader in Western New York for three decades.

He was named administrative vice president and a member of the Sabres' executive committee in the fall of 1970, after serving as a Sabres' vice president since the club's inception.



ROBERT O. SWADOS

Vice President and Counsel

Professional sports in Buffalo have been both vocation and avocation for Bob Swados, partner in the law firm of Cohen, Swados, Wright, Hanifin & Bradford.

He is a former vice president of the Buffalo Bisons Baseball Club, vice president, Major League for Buffalo, Inc., and was counsel to the Knox brothers when they first sought an NHL franchise in 1965.

A Buffalo native, he has a B.A. from the University of Buffalo and is a cum laude graduate of the Harvard University Law School.



GEORGE "PUNCH" IMLACH

Coach and General Manager

The new Buffalo Sabres presented a different kind of challenge to hockey's most colorful and quotable coach, and Punch met the challenge with more success than even his most ardent admirers had hoped.

His skill at getting the most from older players, combined with a knack for making the best possible trades, turned the Sabres into as good an expansion club as there was in the NHL over the last two thirds of their first year's schedule.

But success in building and rebuilding is one of Punch's strong suits. In 11 seasons as general manager and/or coach of the Toronto Maple Leafs, his teams won four Stanley Cups and made the playoffs 10 times.

Punch predicted the Sabres would be the first expansion team to win the Stanley Cup, and he is sticking to his prediction. But first, there's tough sledding to make the playoffs in the tougher NHL Eastern Division.

His dry acerbic wit is as much an Imlach characteristic as the intriguing hats he wears behind the players' bench.



FRED HUNT

Assistant General Manager

For 18 years general manager and four-time coach of the old American Hockey League Buffalo Bisons, and a star player here for nearly a decade before that, Fred Hunt and pro hockey in Buffalo go hand in hand. He joined the Sabres shortly after the new franchise was awarded, and in that first season was the club's principal trouble shooter in the complicated process of setting up a big league organization - on and off ice. There's a another Fred Hunt in hockey these days, Fred Jr. - a star winger with the University of Vermont collegiate team who was ECAC sophomore of the year and who may wear the Sabres colors in just a few years.



JOHN ANDERSEN Director of Scouting

Like his scouting staff, soft-spoken John lives out of a suitcase much of the year, crisscrossing Canada and the United States to scout both amateur and professional hockey talent.

Danish-born, Andersen worked for Punch Imlach in Toronto for 10 years and moved west to become director of scouting for the California Golden Seals when Punch parted company with the Maple Leafs. When Imlach joined the Sabres, Andersen joined Imlach once again.

THE FIRST YEAR

The best club in the NHL outside the playoffs, and perhaps better than a few that made them...

A parade of sellouts in Memorial Auditorium which resulted in Sabres tickets becoming a black market commodity by season's end...

A record-breaking rookie who already is blooming into one of the league's superstars...

That was the first year for the Buffalo Sabres and the best is yet

It appeared that Buffalo's first year in the NHL would be an artistic disaster during the first two months of the 1970-71 season. The Sabres won only twice in their first 14 games, but after the return to action by veterans Phil Goyette and Donnie Marshall, and the blossoming of Gerry Meehan and Steve Atkinson, the Sabres began to roll. From Christmas onward, Buffalo had the best record in the NHL eight-team expansion group, with the exception of the St. Louis Blues. And the Blues only had one more point than the Sabres over the last two thirds of the schedule.

At the box office, Buffalo averaged near capacity for the year, and had

sellouts for nearly all games from New Year's onward.

Gil Perreault brought many of those fans into the arena, as he scored a rookie record 38 goals and 34 assists on his way to winning the NHL Calder Trophy as rookie-of-the-year and a berth on the East Division NHL all-star team.

The next stop for Buffalo is a playoff spot in the Eastern Division, and Imlach dealed off-season to make the run in 1971-72.

Will the run be a successful one?

Imlach, the eternal optimist, won't make an outright prediction. "Let's just say I stick to my prediction that we will be the first expansion team to win the Stanley Cup. And we can't very well do that without making the playoffs, can we?"
