TODAY'S GAME - BUFFALO vs. PITTSBURGH - THURSDAY, OCTOBER 6, 2023

Tonight's game marks Buffalo's seventh and final preseason game after the Sabres earned wins in three of their first six. Today's matchup is being broadcast on MSG and WGR 550 in Western New York.

After playing three games in as many nights from Sept. 26 to 28, Buffalo wrapped up a preseason home-and-home series with the Columbus Blue Jackets last night. The Sabres received another goal from Zach Benson, who now leads all Buffalo skaters in preseason points with five (3+2), in the 5-3 loss.

Buffalo and Pittsburgh have played 35 preseason games against each other all-time. The Sabres fell by a score of 3-1 in the first matchup on Sept. 28. The Sabres are 15-11-9 in preseason contests against the Penguins all-time. In their preseason history, the Sabres are 4-4-2 at Pittsburgh and 6-3-0 against the Penguins at home. Buffalo and Pittsburgh have played 16 preseason games at neutral sites and the Sabres hold a 5-4-7 record in those meetings. The Sabres have faced the Penguins in the preseason 15 times since 1998, going 10-4-1 in those games.

The Sabres and Penguins will meet three times in the regular season, beginning with a matchup in Pittsburgh on Nov. 11. After a second contest in Buffalo on Nov. 24, the two teams will conclude their season series in Pittsburgh on Jan. 6.

The Sabres are 170-175-53 all-time in the preseason, including a 57-39-7 preseason record since the 2005-06 season. These totals only include games against NHL opponents; the Sabres also defeated Adler Mannheim 8-3 in an exhibition game as part of the 2011 NHL Premiere Series.

Buffalo will open the regular season at home when they host the New York Rangers on Oct. 12. The Sabres will then begin their road schedule with a standalone trip to play the New York Islanders on Oct. 14. Following the first two games of their regular season, Buffalo will begin a four-game homestand consisting of matchups with Tampa Bay, Calgary, NY Islanders and Montreal from Oct. 17 to 23.

PENS CLAIM HARKINS

On Monday, the Penguins claimed forward **Jansen Harkins** off of waivers from the Winnipeg Jets. Harkins, 26, spent the 2022-23 campaign split between the Winnipeg Jets and the Manitoba Moose of the American Hockey League. With Winnipeg, Harkins notched five points (3G-2A) in 22 games. He also established AHL career highs in goals (25), assists (25), points (50) and was plus-11 in 44 games with the Moose. His 25 goals ranked first and his 50 points were second on Manitoba, respectively.

The 6-foot-2, 197-pound forward has played parts of four seasons in the NHL with Winnipeg, appearing in 154 regular-season games and registering 13 goals, 14 assists and 27 points. He also has one goal in four career Stanley Cup Playoff Games.

A native of Cleveland, Ohio, Harkins has dressed in 200 games at the AHL level, recording 132 points (52G-80A). He has seven points (4G-3A) in seven career Calder Cup Playoff contests, and was named an AHL All-Star in 2020.

PENS MAKE SECOND ROUND OF CUTS

On Thursday, September 28, the Penguins made a second round of cuts, reducing their training camp roster to 37 players.

Forwards Corey Andonovski, Avery Hayes, Marc Johnstone and Austin Rueschhoff, defensemen Isaac Belliveau, Justin Lee, Dmitri Samorukov and Jack St. Ivany and goaltender Joel Blomqvist were all assigned to Wilkes-Barre/Scranton's training camp in the American Hockey League.

A day later on Friday, September 29, the Penguins assigned forward **Jonathan Gruden** and defensemen **Taylor Fedun** and **Xavier Ouellet** to WBS brining their camp roster to 34.

PENS REDUCE CAMP ROSTER TO 47

On Monday, September 25, Pittsburgh reduced its camp roster to 47 players. Forwards **Matt Filipe**, **Dillon Hamaliuk**, **Sam Houde**, **Jagger Joshua** and **Evan Vierling**, as well as goaltender **Taylor Gauthier** were assigned to Wilkes-Barre/Scranton's training camp in the American Hockey League.

Three players – defenseman **Andre Anania** (Sudbury Wolves of the OHL), forward **Matthew Soto** (Kingston Frontenacs of the OHL) as well as goaltender **Michael Simpson** (Peterborough Petes of the OHL) were assigned to their junior teams.

Forward **Peter Abbandonato** was released from his professional tryout agreement, and defenseman **Mark Pysyk** was moved to the injured list after suffering a lower-body injury.

NEW REGIME

This offseason, the Penguins hired **Kyle Dubas** as President of Hockey Operations and General Manager, and **Jason Spezza** as Assistant General Manager. Dubas spent the previous nine seasons as a member of the Toronto Maple Leafs organization, including the last five as General Manager. During his tenure as General Manager, the Maple Leafs ranked fifth in the league in wins (221) and points percentage (.651) and he guided them to their first playoff series victory since 2004. He previously served as Toronto's Assistant General Manager from 2014-18 and led their AHL team, the Toronto Marlies, to their first Calder Cup championship in 2018. Prior to





Toronto, Dubas served as the General Manager for his hometown Soo Greyhounds of the OHL from 2011-14.

Spezza also joined the Penguins from the Toronto Maple Leafs, where he served as the Special Assistant to the General Manager in 2022-23. There, he spent time with all hockey operations departments including player personnel, player development, minor league operations and hockey research. Spezza retired from a 19-year NHL career in 2022, where he recorded 363 goals, 632 assists and 995 points in 1,248 career games split between the Ottawa Senators, Dallas Stars and Maple Leafs.

PROFESSIONAL TRYOUTS

Pittsburgh has four players competing in training camp on professional tryouts – defensemen Mark Pysyk and Libor Hájek, and forwards Austin Wagner and Colin White.

Drafted by Buffalo in the first round (10th Overall) in 2010, Pysyk enters the Penguins organization on a PTO with a decade of NHL experience. Pysyk most recently put up 12 points (3G-9A) in 2021-22 with Buffalo after missing the 2022-23 campaign due to a torn Achilles tendon. Having played for three organizations (Buffalo, Florida and Dallas), Pysyk has 521 regular-season games in the NHL. In those games, the Sherwood Park, AB native has 104 points (28G-76A). During 2019-20, Pysyk recorded a career-high with 18 points (9G-9A). During the same season, Pysyk also appeared in his only four career playoff games with Florida. In 145 AHL games, the defenseman notched 48 points (8G-40A) and is plus-11. Additionally, Pysyk won a WHL title in 2012 with Edmonton while teammates with goaltender **Tristan Jarry**. He's currently sidelined with a lower-body injury.

Hájek enters his PTO this preseason after skating in 16 games with the New York Rangers last year, tallying one goal and recording a plus/minus of plus-2. During the 2022-23 campaign, Hájek also appeared in 24 games with Hartford (AHL), totaling six points (2G-4A). Drafted by Tampa Bay in the second round (37th Overall) in 2016, Hájek has 12 points (4G-8A) in 110 NHL games played dates back to the 2018-19 season. The 25-year-old Smrcek, Czechia native, has also played in 118 AHL games, posting 17 points (4G-13A).

Drafted by Los Angeles in the fourth round (99th overall) of the 2015 NHL Draft, Wagner brings 178 career games of NHL experience to Pittsburgh. In his latest stint with Chicago last season, Wagner tallied two points (1G-1A) in seven games. In 178 regular-season games, the Calgary, AB native has 42 points (23G-19A). Wagner has also appeared in 138 regular-season games at the AHL level with Ontario, recording 54 points (35G-19A) and was plus-9. In eight Calder Cup Playoff contests, Wagner recorded two points (1G-1A). During 2016-17, Wagner led the WHL playoffs with 16 goals for Regina.





White's 113 career NHL points (44G-69A) through 292 games gives him the most points Pittsburgh has brought in via PTO this preseason. The 26-year-old was drafted by Ottawa in the first round (21st overall) in 2015 after playing two seasons at Boston College (NCAA) with 76 points (35G-41A) in 72 games. White spent six of his seven NHL seasons with Ottawa until moving south last season to play with Florida. In 2022-23, White tallied 15 points (8G-7A) in 68 games played. Additionally, White tallied two points (2A) in 21 playoff games with Florida in 2023. The Boston, MA native's best season to date came in 2018-19 when he totaled 41 points (14G-27A) in 71 games with Ottawa.

EK65

Erik Karlsson joins Pittsburgh this season after being traded from San Jose in a three-team trade. He is coming off of a campaign in which the defenseman recorded career highs in points (101), goals (25) and assists (76). In addition to leading all defensemen in goals, assists and points, he became only the sixth defenseman in NHL history, first since Brian Leetch in 1991-92, to have a 100-point season. Additionally, Karlsson finished 11th overall in the NHL in points and fourth overall in even-strength points with 74. Karlsson won his third Norris Trophy last season, given annually to the NHL's best defenseman. After spending five seasons with San Jose, the 33-year-old joins the Penguins blue line unit. Before his stint with the Sharks, Karlsson spent nine seasons with Ottawa, who drafted him in the first round (15th overall) of the 2008 NHL Draft. Karlsson also served as Ottawa's captain from 2014-18. Through 14 NHL seasons, Karlsson has played in 920 regular season games, totaling 761 points (178G-583A).

His past Norris Trophies came in the 2011-12 and 2014-15 seasons. Only four other defensemen in NHL history have more Norris Trophies than Karlsson's three (Bobby Orr, 8; Nicklas Lidstrom, 7; Doug Harvey, 7; Ray Borque, 5). The seven-time NHL All-Star ranks 22nd in NHL history among defensemen, and his 0.83 points-per-game average is the eighth highest in league history among blueliners (minimum 300 games played). Karlsson has hit 20 or more goals three times in his career (2013-14, 2014-15 and 2022-23) and scored 70 or more points five times (2011-12, 2013-14, 2015-16, 2016-17 and 2022-23). He leads all defensemen in assists and points since debuting in the NHL during the 2009-10 season. In addition to these feats, Karlsson has led his team in points among defensemen in eight seasons (2010-11, 2011-12, 2013-14, 2014-15, 2015-16, 2016-17, 2017-18 and 2022-23). Sporting number 65, Karlsson has led his team in points through five seasons (2013-14, 2014-15, 2015-16, 2016-17, and 2022-23).

2022-23 PENGUINS MVP – SIDNEY CROSBY

Pittsburgh's captain, **Sidney Crosby**, was named the recipient of the team's Most Valuable Player Award presented by PPG as selected by his teammates for the third consecutive season in 2022-23. This is Crosby's 11th team MVP Award, which trails only **Mario Lemieux** (12) for most in franchise history.





Crosby played his 18th season last year, the most in Penguins history. The captain skated in all 82 games, the second time he has done so in his career (2017-18). Only three other Penguins skated in every regular-season game (**Evgeni Malkin**, **Brian Dumoulin** and **Rickard Rakell**). Crosby led Pittsburgh in points (93), assists (60), game-winning goals (9) and shots (255) and finished second on the team with 33 goals, only trailing **Jake Guentzel** (36).

Among active players, Crosby leads all skaters in points and assists. He also ranks second among active players in goals, trailing **Alex Ovechkin** (822).

FRESH FACES AMONG FORWARDS

Pittsburgh will have new faces in its lineup this season after a plethora of offseason acquisitions, including Rem Pitlick, Lars Eller, Matt Nieto, Noel Acciari, Joona Kappanen, Vinnie Hinostroza and Andreas Johnsson.

Pitlick joins the Penguins organization after spending the last two seasons in Montreal. In 2022-23, Pitlick split time between Montreal and Laval (AHL). Pitlick tallied 15 points (6G-9A) in 46 games with the Canadiens and skated in 18 games with Laval, totaling 22 points (5G-17A). Drafted in the third round of the 2016 NHL Draft (76th overall) by Nashville, Pitlick has appeared in 123 career NHL games between Nashville, Minnesota and Montreal, recording 54 points (21G-33A). In the AHL, Pitlick has skated in 89 games, spending one season in Milwaukee (2019-20), one with Chicago (2020-21) and last season with Laval accumulating 68 career points (33G-35A). Before professional hockey, Pitlick skated for three years at the University of Minnesota (NCAA), collecting 108 points (47G-61A) in 112 games.

Pittsburgh signed Eller on July 1, bringing in over 1,000 combined games of NHL regular season and playoff experience. In 2022-23, Eller skated in 84 games with Colorado, totaling 23 points (10G-13A), and appeared in seven playoff games with the Avalanche. Eller has played 954 regular-season games in his career, totaling 371 points (163G-208A). Eller has appeared in 103 games in the playoffs, recording 49 points (15G-34A). Eller was drafted in the 2007 NHL Draft's first round (13th overall) by St. Louis, where he spent one season (2009-10). The Danish forward has also played for Montreal and Washington before heading to Colorado last season. Eller scored in the final 10 minutes of the third period in Game 5 of the 2018 Stanley Cup Final against the Vegas Golden Knights to give the Capitals a 4-3 win and their first Stanley Cup in franchise history.

The Penguins signed Nieto on July 1 after he skated in 81 games last season with Colorado, totaling 24 points (12G-12A). The Long Beach, California, native also appeared in seven playoff games with the Avalanche in 2023. Appearing in 651 career regular-season games between San Jose and Colorado, the forward totaled 199 points (85G-114A). The 30-year-old forward also has 21 points (8G-13A) in 62 playoff games. Nieto also spent three seasons with Boston University (NCAA) from 2010-13.





Undrafted in the NHL and the 2014-15 National Champion Providence College (NCAA) captain, Acciari produced 65 points (32G-33A) in 113 collegiate games. Acciari has appeared in 384 career games throughout his NHL career, totaling 100 points (59G-41A). He started the 2022-23 season with St. Louis and then was traded to Toronto on Feb. 17, but put up 23 points overall (14G-9A) through 77 games played. Acciari also contributed two points (2G) in 11 playoff games with the Maple Leafs in 2023 and has nine points (6G-3A) through 65 career playoff games. Acciari has played for Boston, Florida, St. Louis and Toronto in eight NHL seasons.

Boston's 2016 fifth-round draft pick (135th overall), Koppanen, joins Pittsburgh after skating in his only five career NHL games in 2022-23 with Boston, tallying one point (1A). The Finnish skater has played in six seasons of professional hockey with Providence (AHL). In 2022-23, Koppanen tallied 35 points (12G-23A) through 64 games with Providence. In his AHL career, the 25-year-old has 93 points (39G-54A) in 245 games. Koppanen also has six career Calder Cup Playoff games totaling three assists.

A native of the Chicagoland area, Hinostroza was drafted in the sixth round (169th overall) of the 2012 NHL Draft by the Chicago Blackhawks. During 2022-23, Hinostroza skated in 26 games with Buffalo, totaling 11 points (2G-9A). The 29-year-old has appeared in 360 career games between Chicago, Arizona, Florida, and Buffalo, tallying 148 points (53G-95A). Additionally, the forward has appeared in eight playoff games between Chicago and Arizona, totaling two assists. Before professional hockey, he skated for two seasons at the University of Notre Dame (NCAA), totaling 56 points (15G-41A) in 52 games. He was also named to the Hockey East First All-Star Team in 2014-15 at Notre Dame.

Last season, Johnsson split time between New Jersey, Utica (AHL) and San Jose. In 2022-23, he skated in 13 NHL games, totaling three assists. With Utica, Johnsson had 30 points (9G-21A) through 36 games. He has 116 points (48G-68A) throughout his NHL career, appearing in 259 games. In 14 playoff appearances with Toronto, Johnsson has six points (2G-4A). In the Swedish forward's AHL career, he has played in 165 games between Toronto and Utica, tallying 131 points (55G-76A). Additionally, Johnsson has skated in 29 Calder Cup Playoff games with Toronto, accumulating 30 points (16G-14A). Johnsson won the Calder Cup Championship in 2018, registering the most points (24) and assists (14) in the tournament. He was also awarded the Jack A. Butterfield Trophy (AHL Playoffs MVP) and was named to the AHL Second All-Star Team.

2022-23 DRAFT PICKS

The Pittsburgh Penguins selected six players at the 2023 NHL Draft at Bridgestone Arena in Nashville. The Penguins selected forward **Brayden Yager** in the first round (14th overall), defenseman **Emil Pieniniemi** in the third round (91st overall), forward **Mikhail Ilyin** in the fifth round (142nd overall), forward **Cooper Foster** in the sixth round (174th overall), forward **Emil**





Järventie in the seventh round (217th overall) and defenseman **Kalle Kangas** in the seventh round (223rd overall).

Yager enters the Penguins organization after spending the last three seasons playing with Moose Jaw (WHL). He put up 78 points (28G-50A) in 67 games with Moose Jaw during the 2022-23 season where he served as an alternate captain. He led Moose Jaw in points (78), finished second in assists (50) and third in goals (28) and was awarded the Brad Hornung Trophy (WHL Most Sportsmanlike Player). He was named the CHL Rookie of the Year and the Jim Piggott Trophy (WHL Rookie of the Year) in 2021-22.

Pittsburgh's second pick of 2023, Pieniniemi, skated in one game with Karpat (Liiga) and played in 31 games with Karpat's U20 team, tallying 13 points (1G-12A). Additionally, Pieniniemi won a Hlinka Gretzky Bronze Medal playing with Karpat's U18 team.

Ilyin has played in 25 games with Severstal Cherepovets (KHL) tallying five points (1G-4A). The forward also has skated in 53 career games with Almaz Cherepovets (MHL) providing his team with 36 points (8G-28A). In three MHL playoff appearances, Ilyin has one point (1A). The 18-year-old has also seven points (4G-3A) in 10 games with Metallurg Cherepovets (NMHL). In the NMHL playoffs, Ilyin totaled five points (2G-3A) in six games.

Foster, 18, spent the last two seasons with the Ottawa 67's of the OHL recording 19 goals, 21 assists and 40 points. The 5-foot-11, 172 pound forward split the 2021-22 season between the 67's and Soo Thunderbirds of the NOJHL where he tallied a team leading 60 points (18G-42A) in 38 games. The Sault Ste. Marie, Ontario native was named to the NOJHL First All-Star Team and awarded the NOJHL Best Overall Team Player, Champion, Most Valuable Player and Regular Season Champion.

A native of Tampere, Finland, Järventie, 18, split the 2022-23 season between Liiga, Finland's top professional league, Mestis and Ilves U18 and U20. The 5-foot-10, 168 pound forward picked up one goal in 15 games with Liiga. With Mestis, he recorded four goals, three assists and seven points. The Tampere, Finland native helped his home country to a bronze medal win at the 2022 Hlinka Gretzky Cup.

Kangas has suited up in two games with Jokerit of Mestis in 2023-24. The 18-year old spent last season with Jokerit U20 recording one goal, eight assists, nine points and a plus-15 in 42 games and four assists in 12 playoff games. The 6-foot-4, 205-pound defenseman won a bronze medal with Team Finland at the 2022 Hlinka Gretzky Cup. The Vantaa, Finland native also represented Finland at the 2023 World Under-18 Junior Championship, tallying two assists in five games.
