# FLAMES LAST GAME RECAP January 7, 2024 – CALGARY FLAMES [3] at CHICAGO BLACKHAWKS [4]

**Game Summary I Event Summary** 

The Calgary Flames wrapped up a four-game road trip on Sunday afternoon at the United Center against the Chicago Blackhawks. The clubs would trade goals in the first with Colin Blackwell opening the scoring for Chicago, before Nazem Kadri drew the Flames level and the game was deadlocked at ones through 20. Andrew Mangiapane would help the Flames take their first lead of the night just over three minutes into the second, before Chicago scored a pair to go up 3-2 through 40. In the final frame, Chicago would extend their lead to 4-2, but Nazem Kadri would draw the Flames within one. That is as close as Calgary would come, and the Flames fell 4-3.

## **TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS**

This is the second of two meetings this season between the Flames and Senators. The Flames fell 4-1 in their first meeting.

This is a Pacific Division versus Atlantic Division matchup; the Flames have a record of 4-2-1 against Atlantic I Division teams and a record of 6-7-3 against Eastern Conference opponents.

#### HISTORY FOR BACKLUND:

Mikael Backlund is slated to skate in his 949<sup>th</sup> NHL game tonight against Ottawa which would tie Mark Giordano for the second-most games played in a Flames sweater in franchise history. Backlund was the Flames first round pick in 2007 (24<sup>th</sup> overall) and skated in his first NHL game at the Scotiabank Saddledome on January 8<sup>th</sup>, 2009. The Vasteras, SWE native's 949 games are the ninth-most among skaters from the 2007 NHL draft, and he has gone on to score 193 goals and 319 assists for 512 points over his time in Calgary. Backlund's 500<sup>th</sup> NHL point came earlier this year in Seattle, and he became the 11<sup>th</sup> skater in Flames franchise history to reach 500 NHL points.

## **LAST MEETING:**

The Flames and Senators first meeting came while the Flames were in the midst of their Eastern-Canadian road trip back in November. The only scoring of the opening 20 would come when Mathieu Joseph deflected a Jake Sanderson point shot home to give the Senators a 1-0 advantage. In the second, the teams would trade goals with Drake Batherson doubling the Sens advantage, before Blake Coleman scored late to give the Flames life and cut the deficit to one. However, that is as close as Calgary would come as Ottawa added two third period markers to take game one of the season-series 4-1.

#### **BREAD MAN:**

With his goal on Sunday afternoon in Chicago, Andrew Mangiapane now has 199 career-points and is just one away from 200. Mangiapane is looking to become the 11<sup>th</sup> active skater drafted in the sixth-round to reach the 200-point plateau and has 103 goals along with 96 assists so far in his NHL career.

## **RETURN OF THE MAC:**

MacKenzie Weegar scored his ninth goal of the season (40 GP), on Saturday in Philadelphia to establish a new career high. His previous high came in 2021-22 when he scored eight tallies in 80 games. The only other Flames defenseman in the past nine seasons with as many goals through 39 games played in a season was Mark Giordano (10 in 2015-16). Weegar's nine markers are tied for the third-most goals by a defenseman so far this season, trailing only Rasmus Dahlin (12) and Quinn Hughes (10).

## **CREEPING UP ON 600:**

After scoring two goals in Chicago on Sunday afternoon, Nazem Kadri is now sitting at 598 career points, two away from 600 NHL points. With two more points, Kadri can become the sixth skater from the 2009 NHL draft class to reach 600 points in the NHL along with John Tavares (1,009), Matt Duchene (779), Ryan O'Reilly (737), Victor Headman (691) and Brayden Schenn (605). Kadri's two goal effort on Sunday was his first multi-goal game of the season, and third as a member of the Flames.

## HEY NOW, YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR:

Elias Lindholm has been selected to represent the Calgary Flames at the 2024 NHL All-Star Game. Lindholm has registered eight goals and 17 assists for 25 points through 40 games so far this season and has two power play goals along with a shorthanded marker. This will be Elias Lindholm's first NHL All-Star Game appearance and is set to become the second Swedish player to represent the Flames in the NHL All-Star Game, following Kent Nilsson in 1980 (while the franchise was based in Atlanta) and 1981. Lindholm currently leads all Flames forwards in time on ice per game and skated 82:07 over the Flames four game trip to start off 2024.

# **HEY DID YOU KNOW?**

In his first NHL game on January 8<sup>th</sup>, 2009, Mikael Backlund became the first player in Flames franchise history to wear the number 60. Since then, only one other skater has worn number 60 for the Flames (Markus Granlund: 2014-2016).

MacKenzie Weegar was born in Ottawa, ON, and is slated to skate in his 15<sup>th</sup> game against his hometown team. Weegar has registered four assists in his previous 14 meetings with the Senators.

Flames defenceman MacKenzie Weegar and Senators forward Dominik Kubalik are two of three players drafted in the seventh round of the 2013 NHL draft that have played NHL games this season. The third skater in Sharks blueliner Kyle Burroughs.
