- 15 different Stars skaters recorded a point during the game and six had multi-point outings.
- Dallas' eight goals were its most in a contest since Feb. 15, 2024 (9-2 W at NSH) according to NHL Stats.
- The Stars scored seven consecutive goals for the first time since Jan. 22, 2021, also marking the fourth time done so on the road (also March 29, 2008, Dec. 23, 2008 & Jan. 12, 1983) according to NHL Stats.
- Jason Robertson scored to record his fourth straight 20-goal season (20-31—51) and extended his point streak against San Jose to nine games (7-7—14).
- Wyatt Johnston (1-1—2) recorded his 31st career multi-point game and extended his point streak against the Sharks to five games (7-6—13).

GAME NOTES

THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

- Tonight is the first of two games the Stars will play against the Devils this season and the only time the teams are facing off in New Jersey this year. The teams face off again on March 4 in Dallas.
- Tonight's game against the Devils and tomorrow's game against the Islanders is the eighth of 11 back-to-back sets that the Stars will play this season.
- The Stars enter tonight's game with a 35-18-2 record for 72 points and a .655 points percentage. Their .655 points percentage was the fourth-best mark in the NHL this year entering play Saturday.
 - o Of the top four ranked teams, three of them are in the Western Conference: Winnipeg (.723), Edmonton (.655) and Dallas. The Washington Capitals (.727) top both the NHL and the Eastern Conference.
- Entering play Saturday, the Stars and the Washington Capitals were the only NHL teams this season that have not lost more than two consecutive games.
- The Stars have allowed only 2.51 goals against per game this season, which was the fourth-best mark in the NHL entering play Saturday. Dallas has allowed two or fewer goals in 29 of the 55 games that they have played this year.

CONNECT FOUR

- Five Stars players represented their home country at the recently completed 4 Nations Face-Off: Mikael Granlund
 (Finland), Thomas Harley (Canada), Roope Hintz (Finland), Esa Lindell (Finland) and Jake Oettinger (United States).
 Dallas defenseman Miro Heiskanen was originally selected to Finland's roster but had to withdraw from the tournament due to injury.
- The Stars were also well-represented among the 4 Nations staff, with Jim Nill (Associate GM), Pete DeBoer (Assistant Coach) and Misha Donskov (Assistant Coach) all joining Canada's staff for the tournament. Additionally, former Star Jere Lehtinen served as Finland's General Manager.
- Harley, Nill, DeBoer and Donskov won the 4 Nations Face-Off Championship after Canada defeated the Untied States 3-2 in overtime on Feb. 20.
- Harley, who was originally added to Canada's roster as an injury replacement, appeared in two games for his home country, both against the United States. He tallied one assist and averaged 20:07 of ice time per game.
- When **Harley** was on the ice during 5-on-5 play in the two games he played, the Canadians outshot the Americans 17-11. His plus-6 on-ice shot differential was the best mark of any Canadian defensemen in those two games.
- Granlund finished the tournament with four points (3-1—4) in three games for the Finns. His three goals were tied for the second-most among all skaters and his four points tied for fourth.
- Lindell and Hintz each appeared in three games for Finland, with Lindell scoring one goal.
- The 4 Nations Face-Off marked the first time that Granlund, Hintz and Lindell played for Finland together. Granlund
 and Lindell had previously represented Finland together three times: at the 2016 and 2022 IIHF World Championships
 and at the 2016 World Cup of Hockey.
- Oettinger started one game for the Americans, stopping 21 of the 23 shots he faced for a .913 save percentage and a 2.06 goals-against average.

DOWN GOES THE DEVILS

- Dallas is 61-44-13 all-time vs. New Jersey, including a 26-28-4 mark on the road.
- The Stars have earned points in seven of their last 10 games against the Devils (6-2-1). Dallas has also earned wins in their last four games at Prudential Center.
- Matt Duchene has earned seven points (3-4—7) over his last six games against New Jersey. Duchene ranks first among active Stars in goals (9), assists (15) and points (9-15—24) in 24 career contests vs. New Jersey. Duchene also paces the club in game-winning goals (3) against the Devils.
- **Jamie Benn** has 11 points (3-8—11) in 26 career games against the Devils. **Benn** enters tonight's contest riding a three-game point streak against New Jersey, earning three points (0-3—3) during that span.
- Roope Hintz has eight points (5-3—8) in nine career games vs. New Jersey.
- Jason Robertson has registered four points (0-4—4) in six career games against the Devils.
- Wyatt Johnston enters tonight's matchup riding a three-game point streak vs. New Jersey. Johnston has earned four points (2-2—4) in four career games against the Devils.
- Thomas Harley has recorded three assists in two career games against the Devils.
- Mikael Granlund has tallied 18 points (9-9—18) in 22 career games played against New Jersey.

ROAD WARRIORS

- Matt Duchene is the Stars' leading scorer when playing on the road this year, recording 32 points (13-19—32) in 27 games played. His 32 road points this season were tied for 12th in the NHL entering play Saturday.
- Jason Robertson has been playing at a point-per-game pace on the road since Nov. 27, totaling 17 points (6-11—17) in 17 games played.
- Wyatt Johnston has totaled 15 points (7-8—15) in his last 15 road games dating back to Dec. 4.
- Mikael Granlund has seven points (2-5—7) in his last six games played on the road, which includes tallying three assists in three road games since being acquired by Dallas.
- Roope Hintz has five assists in his last five games played on the road.
- Esa Lindell has tallied a point in four of the last five games that he has played on the road dating back to Jan. 25.

DOUBLE DUTCH

- Matt Duchene has recorded three points in each of Dallas' last two games, scoring two goals and adding an assist on Feb. 7 against the Kings and again on Feb. 8 against the Sharks.
- Duchene's performances against the Kings and the Sharks brought his season point total up to 55 (22-33—55), which leads all Stars skaters. It puts him on pace to finish the season with 33 goals, 49 assists and 82 points. Forty-nine assists would be a career high, and 33 goals and 82 points would both be the second-best marks of his career.
 - o If he were to finish the year with at least 82 points, it would make him the highest-scoring Star since **Jason Robertson** had 109 points in 2022-23. It would also make him the third Stars skater in the last 10 years to have at least 82 points in a season, joining **Robertson** and **Jamie Benn** in 2014-15 and 2015-16.
- If **Duchene** were to have three points again tonight, it would give him three consecutive three-point games for the first time in his career. It would also make him the second player in Stars team history to have three consecutive three-point games, joining **Jamie Benn** who did so from April 6 to 11, 2015.

• If **Duchene** were to score at least two goals tonight, it would also give him multi-goal efforts in three consecutive games for the first time in his career

BIKER GANG

- Thomas Harley has tallied six points (2-4—6) in his last five games dating back to Jan. 31 against the Vancouver Canucks. His six points during that span trail only Matt Duchene (7) for the team lead.
- Harley's six points since Jan. 31 are also tied for the third-most among all NHL defensemen during that span, trailing
 only Colorado's Cale Makar and Buffalo's Rasmus Dahlin, who each have seven points.
- Harley has scored in each of Dallas' last two games on Feb. 7 against Los Angeles and on Feb. 8 against San Jose. If he were to do so again tonight, it would give him goals in three consecutive games for the first time in his career.
 - o A point of any kind tonight would extend **Harley's** point streak to three games for the second time this season (previously: Oct. 22 to 26).
- When **Harley** had been on the ice during even-strength play this season, the Stars have outscored their opponents 64-35. His plus-29 goal differential is tied for the third-best mark among all NHL skaters this year and his 64 goals for are tied for ninth.
 - Additionally, Harley has logged a plus-26 plus/minus rating this season, which is tied for eighth in the NHL and tied for fifth among all NHL defensemen.
- In all, **Harley** has totaled 29 points (9-20—29) in 53 regular-season games this season, which would put him on pace to finish the 2024-25 regular season with 14 goals, 30 assists and 44 points, all of which would be the second-highest totals of his career.

DALLAS MAVRIK

- Mavrik Bourque enters tonight's game riding a three-game point streak dating back to Feb. 2 against the Columbus Blue Jackets. A goal or an assist tonight would give him points in four consecutive games for the first time in his career.
- If he were to score tonight, it would also give Bourque the first three-game goal streak of his career.
 - o Entering tonight's game, the only rookies to have a three-game goal streak this season are Nashville's Fedor Svechkov (Jan. 18 to 23), and San Jose's Macklin Celebrini (Nov. 25 to 29) and Will Smith (Nov. 27 to 30).
- Since Jan. 1, **Bourque** has scored six goals including the Stars fifth of the game in their last game on Feb. 8 against the San Jose Sharks. His six goals during that span are the second-most among all NHL rookies, trailing only Detroit's Marco Kasper (7).
 - o **Bourque's** six goals since Jan. 1 are tied for fourth on Dallas' roster.
- In all, **Bourque** has totaled nine points (6-3—9) since Jan. 1, which is two points better than the seven he had from the start of the regular season through Dec. 31. His nine points since Jan. 1 are tied for fifth among all NHL rookies.

BENN THERE DONE THAT

- Stars captain Jamie Benn enters tonight's game riding a four-game point streak, scoring one goal and adding four
 assists during that span. A goal or an assist tonight would give Benn points in five consecutive games for the third time
 this season.
- An assist tonight would also extend Benn's assist streak to five games for the second time this season.
- Benn enters tonight's game three goals shy of scoring his 400th career goal. When he reaches the milestone, he will become...
 - The second player in franchise history to score 400 goals, joining Mike Modano (557). 438 of Modano's 557 goals were scored with the Star after the team relocated to Dallas.
 - o The second player drafted in 2007 to score 400 goals, with the other being Detroit's Patrick Kane (483).
 - o The 10th active skater to score 400 career goals.

KILLING IT

- The Stars enter tonight's game with the top-ranked penalty kill in the NHL this season, going 125-for-147 for an 85 percent success rate.
- No team in the league this season has allowed fewer power-play goals against than the Stars' 22, and their -18 goal differential on the penalty kill this year was also tied for the best mark in the NHL entering play Saturday.
- If the Stars maintain this pace, it would make the 2024-25 season their best on the penalty kill since 2007-08, when the team finished the season with an 85.6 percent success rate on the penalty kill.
- The Stars are also one of the least-penalized teams in the league, ranking 29th in the league in both total penalty minutes (359) and penalty minutes per game (6:31). Only Vegas (132), the Islanders (140), Detroit (154) and Edmonton (162) have taken fewer penalties than Dallas (164) this season.
- Esa Lindell leads all NHL skaters it total shorthanded ice time (190:40) and shorthanded ice time per game (3:28) this season.
- Sam Steel ranks second in the NHL in power-play goals against per 60 (3.58) among players to have played at least 100 minutes on the penalty kill this season.
 - o Steel has totaled 100:41 of shorthanded ice time and is averaging 1:54 of shorthanded ice time per game, both of which top all Dallas forwards this season.

• Among players that have played at least 50 minutes on the penalty kill this season, **Thomas Harley** (who has totaled 96:26 of shorthanded ice time) ranks seventh in the NHL in power-play goals against per 60 with 3.11.

BISCH BETTER HAVE MY MONEY

- Stars rookie Lian Bichsel had two assists in Dallas' last game, an 8-3 win over the San Jose Sharks. It marked both the first multi-point performance of his career and the first time that he has recorded a point in a road game.
- Bichsel's assists brought his season point total up to five (2-3—5), which ties him for fifth in scoring among rookie defensemen this season. He is also averaging 0.31 points per game this year, which ranks sixth among rookie defensemen.
- Bichsel has recorded at least four hits in seven of the eight games that he has played since being recalled from Texas (AHL). In all this season, he is averaging 15.6 hits per 60, which tops the Stars roster and ranks ninth among all NHL rookies this season.
- Despite only playing in 16 games this season, Bichsel ranks third on the Stars roster with 64 hits.
- There have been five instances of a Stars skater recording six hits in a single game this season, with Bichsel owning four of them.

HEATING UP

- Jake Oettinger has an 10-3-1 record in his last 14 games played dating back to Dec. 29, posting a .918 save percentage and a 2.19 goals-against average during that span.
 - o His 10 wins since Dec. 29 were tied for the second-most in the NHL entering play Saturday.
- Jason Robertson has been playing at a point-per-game pace since Nov. 7, totaling 44 points (16-28-44) in 44 games.
- Wyatt Johnston has 40 points (14-26-40) in his last 40 games played dating back to Nov. 15.
- Mikael Granlund has 13 points (4-9—13) in his last 13 games played, including tallying four assists in his first four games as a member of the Stars.
- Roppe Hintz tallied an assist in Dallas' last game and now has nine points (3-6—9) in his last eight games dating back to Jan. 24.
- Colin Blackwell enters tonight's game riding a three-game personal point streak, scoring one goal and adding two assists during that span. If he were to score a goal or tally an assist in his next game, it would give him points in four consecutive games for the second time in his career and for the first time since Feb. 21 to 27, 2020.
- A goal or an assist tonight would give **Mathew Dumba** a point in three consecutive games for the first time since March 27 to 31, 2022.

BACK TO DECEMBER

- Since Dec. 23, the Stars have posted a 16-5-2 record for 34 points and a .739 points percentage. Dallas' win and point total were both the best marks in the league during that span entering play Saturday and their points percentage ranked second
- During that span, the Stars have outscored their opponents 79-55. No team had scored more goals than the Stars since Dec. 23 entering play Saturday.
- The team's plus-24 goal differential was tied for the second-best mark in the league since Dec. 23 entering play Saturday, trailing only the Winnipeg Jets (plus-27).
- Fifty-seven of Dallas' 79 goals since Dec. 23 have been scored at 5-on-5, which was the most in the NHL entering play Saturday.
- The Stars have gone 719-for-1343 at the faceoff dot since Dec. 23 for a 53.5 percent success rate, which was the third-best mark in the league during that span entering play Saturday.
- Jason Robertson is the team's leading scorer since Dec. 23, totaling 29 points (13-16—28) in 23 games played. His 29 points during that span ranked fifth in the NHL entering play Saturday.
- Fifteen different Stars skaters have scored at least one goal since Dec. 23: Jason Robertson (13), Wyatt Johnston (10), Matt Duchene (9), Jamie Benn (8), Roope Hintz (8), Evgenii Dadonov (7), Mavrik Bourque (6), Thomas Harley (5), Logan Stankoven (3), Oskar Bäck (2), Colin Blackwell (2), Esa Lindell (2), Mason Marchment (2), Matěj Blümel (1) and Miro Heiskanen (1).
 - o Robertson's 13 goals since Dec. 23 were tied for third in the NHL entering play Friday.

DADDY ISSUES

- Evgenii Dadonov tallied an assist in Dallas' last game on Feb. 8 against the San Jose Sharks and now has eight points (3-5—8) in his last eight games.
- A goal or an assist tonight would give Dadonov points in three consecutive games for the first time this season, and
 assist would extend his assist streak to three games for the first time since March 9 to 13, 2023.
- Dadonov's assist against the Sharks brought his season total up to 31 (15-16—30), with the 2024-25 season being the sixth 30-point season of his career.
- Dadonov scored twice, including the game winner, in Dallas' game on Feb. 2 against the Columbus Blue Jackets. His second goal of the night was the 350th point of his career, which ranks ninth among active, Russian skaters.
- His second goal was also his 15th of the season. **Dadonov** is the fourth-oldest player this season to have scored at least 15 goals, trailing Alex Ovechkin (26), Sidney Crosby (17) and Brad Marchand (20).

• Dadonov is now on pace to finish the year with 22 goals and 46 points, both of which would be his highest totals since he had 25 goals and 47 points for the Florida Panthers in 2019-20.

IRON SHARPENS IRON

- The Stars have four skaters that have played in at least 200 consecutive games: Jamie Benn (352), Jason Robertson (265), Esa Lindell (225) and Wyatt Johnston (219). Entering play Saturday, Dallas was the only team in the NHL to have four players riding Iron Man streaks of at least 200 games.
- Dallas' last game on Feb. 8 against the Sharks was the 352nd consecutive game that Benn played in, which is the fifthlongest active Iron Man streak in the NHL.
- Robertson's 265-game Iron Man streak is the 13th-longest in the NHL. The Stars and the Detroit Red Wings were the
 only teams to have two players ranked in the top 15 entering play Saturday.
- Lindell's 225-game Iron Man streak ranks eighth among all NHL defensemen.
- Johnston's Iron Man Streak began when he made his NHL debut on Oct. 13, 2022. He is one of 44 players in NHL history
 to begin their NHL career by playing in at least 200 consecutive games according to NHL Stats.
