2024-25: Colorado won the series-opening game, 6-1, at Xcel Energy Center (1/9), and the third game, 5-2, in Denver (2/28)...Minnesota won the second game, 3-1, at Ball Arena (1/20)...C **Freddy Gaudreau** (0-2=2), D **Brock Faber** (1-1=2), D **Jake Middleton** (1-1=2), LW **Liam Ohgren** (0-2=2) and C **Yakov Trenin** (1-1=2) each lead the Wild with two points against the Avalanche this season...G **Filip Gustavsson** is 0-2-0 with a 5.04 GAA and a .821 SV% in starting the first and third games...G **Marc-Andre Fleury** saved 21-of-22 shots faced to earn the win in the second game...C **Nathan MacKinnon** (2-2=4) and C **Ross Colton** (3-1=4) lead Colorado with four points each against Minnesota this season...LW **Jonathan Drouin** owns three points (1-2=3)...G **Mackenzie Blackwood** is 2-1-0 with a 2.04 GAA and a .915 SV% in starting all three games for Colorado.

WILD GOALIES: Fleury is 17-12-3 with a 2.48 GAA, a .916 SV% and three shutouts in 33 career games (32 starts) against Colorado...Gustavsson is 1-7-1 with a 4.16 GAA and a .880 SV% in nine starts against Colorado.

AVALANCHE LEADERS: MacKinnon leads the Avalanche with 63 points (23-40=63) in 50 career games against Minnesota...D **Cale Makar** has 22 points (5-17=22) in 24 games...D **Samuel Girard** owns 18 points (1-17=18) in 31 contests...D **Devin Toews** has 14 points (2-12=14) in 20 games.

AVALANCHE GOALIES: Blackwood has a 2-4-1 record with a 3.00 GAA and a .898 SV% in seven career starts vs. Minnesota...G **Scott Wedgewood** has a 1-1-2 record with a 2.94 GAA and a .900 SV% in five games (three starts) against the Wild.

NOTES & MILESTONES

Team: Has scored a power-play goal in three consecutive games and seven of the last nine games...Leads the NHL with 47 road points (22-10-3) and 22 road wins while ranking second with a .671 road point percentage...T-6th in the NHL with a .904 team save percentage this season...Sixth in the NHL with 33 goals scored by defensemen this season...Has scored first in 38 games this season, tied for most in the NHL.

Matt Boldy: Owns nine points (3-6=9) in his last nine games...Currently T-3rd in the NHL with eight GWG this season, tied for the most GWG in a single season in franchise history...Currently tied for seventh in franchise history with 22 career GWG, needs one to tie Jared Spurgeon and Eric Staal (23 GWG) for fifth in franchise history...Ranks T-5th in the NHL with 223 shots this season...Leads the Wild with 54 points (21-33=54) and 33 assists and is T-2nd with 21 goals.

Declan Chisholm: Blocked a game-high six shots vs. PIT (3/9), establishing a new career high.

Brock Faber: T-1st among Wild defensemen and T-6th among Wild skaters with 24 points (7-17=24)...Sixth in the NHL with 25:11 of TOI/G this season.

Marc-Andre Fleury: Made the 1,015th start of his career vs. PIT (3/9), moving past Roberto Luongo (1,014 GS) for second-most all-time among NHL goaltenders...Made the 1,045th game appearance of his career at DET (2/22) to move past Roberto Luongo for sole possession of second-most all-time among NHL goaltenders...Recorded the 69th overtime victory of his NHL career at DET (2/22) to tie Martin Brodeur for most in league history.

Marcus Foligno: T-9th in the NHL with 205 hits this season.

Filip Gustavsson: Owns a 24-15-3 record for the season and ranks T-2nd in the NHL with four shutouts and is T-6th in wins and save percentage (.914)...Stopped a penalty stop at SEA (3/4) to remain a perfect 4/4 against penalty shots for his career.

Vinnie Hinostroza: Owns four goals (4-0=4) in 10 games played since being claimed off waivers from Nashville on Feb. 5...Currently at 99 career NHL assists and 397 NHL games.

Marcus Johansson: Owns five assists (0-5=5) in his last five games.

Jake Middleton: Owns seven goals on the season, T-1st among Wild defenseman and tying his single-season career high (also 2023-24).

Marco Rossi: Ranks T-1st on the team in PPG (six), second in assists (31) and T-2nd in points (21-31=52) and goals (21).

Jared Spurgeon: T-1st among Wild defensemen and T-6th among Wild skaters with 24 points (7-17=24)...Tied his season high with six blocked shots at VAN (3/7).

Mats Zuccarello: Posted a three-game point streak (2-2=4) from 2/28 - 3/4...Finished with two points (1-1=2) at SEA (3/4) to notch his 79th multi-point game in a Wild sweater, tying Zach Parise for fourth-most in franchise history...Currently owns 321 points (98-223=321) with the Wild, tied with Andrew Brunette (119-202=223) for eighth in franchise history...Currently at 223 assists with the Wild, one short of tying Mikael Granlund (224) for fifth in franchise history.

TEAM NOTES



OUT IN FRONT

- The Wild is 24-0-0 when leading through two periods, one of two NHL teams (Seattle, 15-0-0) with a perfect record when holding a lead after 40 minutes of play.
- Is 19-4-1 when leading through one period this season.
- The Wild has scored first in 38 games this season, tied for most in the NHL (Columbus), and holds a 26-10-2 record when doing so.
- Minnesota began the season by not trailing in regulation for 391:31, the second-longest season-opening mark in NHL history (1969-70 Boston Bruins, 457:21) and the second-longest streak at any point in a season in franchise history (414:32, 2014-15).

- The run was also the second-longest streak at any point in Wild history, trailing only a 414:32 mark in 2014-15.

ROAD DAWGS

- Leads the NHL with 47 road points (22-10-3) and 22 road wins while ranking second with a .671 road point percentage.
- Reached 20 road wins in the 28th road game of the season, tying the 2022-23 Boston Bruins for the fourth fewest games in NHL history required to reach the mark.
- The Wild is 16-3-1 this season (.825) when scoring first in a road game, the fourth-best point percentage in the NHL in that situation.
- Recorded a nine-game road point streak (7-0-2) from 11/29 - 12/6, tied for the longest streak in the NHL this season and T-4th longest in franchise history.
- According to NHL Stats, the only teams with as many points through the first 15 road games of a season are the Kings in 2023-24 (13-1-1, 27 points), Blackhawks in 2012-13 (12-1-2, 26 points) and the Ducks in 2006-07 (12-1-2, 26 points).
- Reached 10 road wins in the team's 14th road contest of the season at BUF (11/27), besting the team's previous low mark of 15 games (2011-12).
- The Wild recorded a five-game road point streak from 10/13 - 10/24, tied for the longest in franchise history to start a season (also 2002-03 season, 3-0-2).
- Minnesota's recorded five road wins and 11 road points in October, marking the first time in franchise history the club has reached either mark in that month.
- Minnesota recorded 12 road points in November (5-0-2), the highest total in franchise history in that month.

YOUNG GUNS

- The Wild ranks T-6th in the NHL with 53 goals registered by players aged 23 years or younger to start the season (Boldy, Faber, Jiricek, Khusnutdinov, Ohgren, Rossi) and T-8th with 143 points (53-90=143).
- Matt Boldy ranks fifth among NHL players who started the season age 23 or younger with 54 points (21-33=54) and T-7th with 21 goals. Marco Rossi is T-6th with 52 points (21-31=52) and T-7th with 21 goals.



PLAYER NOTES

BOLDY AND THE BEAUTIFUL

- **Matt Boldy** owns nine points (3-6=9) in his last nine games.
- Ranks T-5th in the NHL with 223 shots this season.
- Leads the Wild with 54 points (21-33=54) and 323 assists and is T-2nd with 21 goals.
- Posted a game-high eight shots on goal vs. BOS (3/2), tied for the second-highest total of his career.
- Recorded a four-game point streak (3-4=7) from 2/8 - 2/27.
- Currently T-3rd in the NHL with eight GWG this season, tied for the most GWG in a single season in franchise history.
- Currently tied for seventh in franchise history with 22 career GWG, needs one to tie Jared Spurgeon and Eric Staal (23 GWG) for fifth in franchise history.
- Is the second player in franchise history with three 30-assist seasons before turning 24, joining Pierre-Marc Bouchard (3x) Owns five points (3-2=5) in his last two games.
- Notched a game-high three points (2-1=3) vs. NYI (2/8), tying his season high.
- Boldy tied his single-game career high with three assists at CHI (1/26).
- Skated 26:35 of TOI at COL (1/20), the second-highest total of his season and NHL career.
- Scored his team-leading sixth PPG of the season at NSH (1/18).
- Skated a career-high 26:55 of TOI vs. EDM (1/15) and notched two points (1-1=2). He also registered seven shots on net, his second-highest total of the season and T-4th highest of his career, while his 15 shot attempts marked a season high and the second-highest total of his career.
- Tallied two points (1-1=2) and tied season-high plus-3 rating at SJS (1/11).
- Set a season-high with a plus-three rating at CAR (1/4) and tied his season high with three points (1-2=3).
- Scored the game-deciding goal in shootout at WSH (1/2), his second-such goal of the season and sixth of his career, and passed Matt Cullen for most game-deciding shootout goals in Wild history (Koivu, 18).
- Scored a goal vs. PHI (12/14) to reach 200 career points (88-112=200) in his 233rd career game, becoming the second-fastest Wild player to reach the mark (Kaprizov, 169 gp).
- Scored his fifth career game-deciding shootout goal at UTA (12/10), tying Matt Cullen for the second most in Wild history (Koivu, 18).
- Recorded a six-game point streak (3-4=7) from 11/10 - 11/23.
- Is the fourth NHL player since 2000-01 to record five GWG in a season's first 16 games, joining Fedorov (six, 2002-23), Draisaitl (five, 2021-22) and Matthews (five, 2020-21).
- Reached 100 career assists at CBJ (10/19), becoming the 26th player to reach 100 assists in a Wild sweater.
- Boldy opened the 2024-25 season with three points (1-2=3) vs. CBJ (10/10), marking his 12th career three-point game and becoming the sixth player in franchise history with three-plus points in the season opener.

MARCO POLO

- **Marco Rossi** won 9-of-11 draws taken (81.8 pct) at VAN (3/7), marking the third-highest faceoff percentage of his season (min. five face offs taken).
- Ranks T-1st on the team in PPG (six), second in assists (31) and T-2nd in points ((21-31=52) and goals (21).
- Notched his 30th assist of the season at COL (2/28) to become the second Austrian player in NHL history to reach the 30-assist mark in a single campaign (Thomas Vanek, 7x).
- Recorded a three-game goal and point streak (3-1=4) from 2/8 - 2/25, tying his career-long goal streak established earlier this season.
- Scored the game-winning goal in overtime at DET (2/22).
- Is the third Austrian player with multiple 20-goal seasons in the NHL, joining Thomas Vanek (11x) and Michael Grabner (4x). Also the third Austrian player with 50 points in a season, joining Vanek (9x) and Grabner (1x).
- Notched three assists (0-3=3) vs. CGY (1/25), his fourth three-plus point performance this season and fifth of his career, to move his season point total to 43 (17-26=43) and surpass the 40-point total (21-19=40) he established as a rookie in 2023-24. Also finished with a plus-2 rating vs. CGY (1/25).
- Recorded a career-high 24:51 time-on-ice total vs. EDM (1/15) while also scoring a goal.
- Named the NHL's First Star of the Week after recording eight points (3-5=8) in three games for the period ending Jan. 5.
- Posted four assists at CAR (1/4), establishing new career highs for most assists and points in a game.
- Rossi posted three points (2-1=3) and tied his season and career highs with two goals, seven shots and a plus-3 rating vs. NSH (12/31). Also won a career-high 12 faceoffs vs. NSH (12/31) out of 15 total faceoffs taken.
- Notched a career-high four hits vs. CHI (12/23).
- Scored a game-tying goal with 46 seconds left in regulation at UTA (12/10), finishing the game with a career-best-tying plus-3 rating.
- Rossi recorded a career-long six-game point streak (3-4=7) from 10/12 - 10/24.
- Posted a three-game goal streak (3-0=3) from 10/12 - 10/22, also establishing a career-long mark.

PLAYER NOTES

OH CAPTAIN MY CAPTAIN

- **Jared Spurgeon** is T-1st among Wild defensemen and T-6th among Wild skaters with 24 points (7-17=24).
- Tied his season high with six blocked shots at VAN (3/7).
- Posted two points (1-1=2) at SEA (3/4) to record the 73rd multi-point game of his career and moved past Ryan Suter (72 mpg) for most multi-point games by a Wild defensemen. Also ranks sixth all-time in multi-point games among all Wild skaters.
- Recorded a four-game point streak (2-2=4) from 1/25 - 1/30.
- Reached 401 career points (116-285=401) with an assist at MTL (1/30) and moved past Zach Parise (199-201=400) for third on the Wild's all-time points list.
- Reached 400 career points (116-284=400) with a goal at TOR (1/29) and became the fourth player and first defenseman to reach 400 points in a Wild sweater.
- Also notched his 23rd career game-winning goal at TOR (1/29), tying Eric Staal for fifth-most in franchise history.
- Played in his 900th career NHL game vs. UTA (1/23), joining Mikko Koivu (1,028 games) as the only players to play 900-plus games for the Wild.
- Spurgeon pushed his career TOI total to 19,726:58 with 24:08 skated at UTA (12/10), moving past Mikko Koivu (19,718:08 TOI) for most in franchise history.
- Spurgeon scored the GWG in overtime vs. NSH (11/30) to reach five career OTG, tied Brent Burns and Mikko Koivu for third in franchise history.
- Recorded the game-winning goal in consecutive contests for the first time in his career (11/29 vs. CHI, 11/30 vs. NSH).
- Tallied two goals (2-0=2) on his 35th birthday vs. CHI (11/29) and reached 112 career goals, moving past Eric Staal (111 goals) for eighth on the Wild's all-time goal list.
- Ranks first in franchise history in plus-minus rating (plus-126), blocked shots (1,579) and minutes skated (20,270:58), second in games played (916), third in assists (291), third in scoring (117-291=408) and fourth in shots (1,517).
- Since entering the NHL in 2010-11, has recorded the fewest PIMs (158) by a defenseman playing in 750-plus games.

BROCKED AND LOADED

- **Brock Faber** is T-1st among Wild defensemen and T-6th among Wild skaters with 24 points (7-17=24). Sixth in the NHL with 25:11 of TOI/G this season.
- With an assist at COL (2/28), became the fastest defenseman in Wild history to reach 70 career points (14-56=70), doing so in his 140th game of his career.
- Logged a game-high 30:05 in ice time at DET (2/22), marking the fourth game this season and ninth game in his NHL career he has skated 30-plus minutes.
- Skated 30:33 at CAR (1/4), his second consecutive game with 30-plus minutes of TOI and fifth-highest total of his career.
- Skated 31:29 of TOI at WSH (1/2), his second-highest total of the season and fourth-highest total of his career.
- Notched his first career OT goal and second career GWG (last 10/12/23 vs. FLA) at DAL (12/27). Per NHL Stats, Faber (0:35) scored the third-fastest overtime goal by a Wild defenseman, following Jonas Brodin (0:18 on Jan. 31, 2021) and Mathew Dumba (0:22 on March 17, 2015).
- Faber recorded a season-high 31:49 time on ice (TOI) total vs. EDM (12/12), the second-highest TOI total of his NHL career and the seventh-highest TOI total in the NHL this season.
- Tied his career high with plus-3 ratings vs. VAN (12/3) and at ANA (12/6), becoming the seventh player in franchise history to notch a plus-three rating in consecutive games.
- Reached 50 career points (8-42=50) in his 89th career game at CBJ (10/19), becoming the second-fastest Wild defenseman to reach 50 points with the franchise (Ryan Suter, 83 games).
- Faber led all NHL rookies with 24:58 TOI per game and 150 blocked shots, ranked T-1st with 39 assists and third with 46 points (8-39=47). Faber finished sixth among all NHL skaters in TOI/game.
- With an assist vs. PIT (2/9/24), moved his season point total to 4-27=31 and surpassed Filip Kuba (9-21=30 in 2000-01) for the highest single-season point total by a Wild rookie defenseman. Also moved past Calen Addison (26 assists in 2022-23) for most single-season assists by a Wild rookie.
- Recorded five games with 30-plus minutes of TOI last season, four of which came in a five-game span from 12/14/23 to 12/21/23. Became one of two NHL rookies since 1997-98 to play four games with 30-plus minutes of TOI in a single season.
- **Skated a career-high 33:25 vs. MTL (12/21/23), the highest single-game total in the NHL last season and the third-highest by an NHL rookie since the start of the 2000-01 season.**

THE GUS BUS IS ROLLING

- **Filip Gustavsson** owns a 24-15-3 record for the season and ranks T-2nd in the NHL with four shutouts and is T-6th in wins and save percentage (.914).
- Stopped a penalty stop at SEA (3/4) to remain a perfect 4/4 against penalty shots for his career.
- Made 28 saves to record his fourth shutout of the season vs. BOS (3/2), reaching 10 career shutouts with Minnesota and tying Josh Harding for fifth-most in franchise history.
- Is the fifth Swedish goaltender in NHL history to record three consecutive 20-win seasons.
- Stopped 37-of-38 shots faced to earn a win vs. CAR (2/6), his 63rd in his Wild career, to move past Dwayne Roloson for fourth-most in franchise history.
- Notched his third shutout of the season with 21 saves at CAR (1/4).
- Is 66-41-14 in his career with the Wild since joining the franchise in 2022-23. Gustavsson ranks fourth in the NHL during that span with a .914 save percentage (min. 50 games) and T-6th with 10 shutouts.
- Stopped all 39 shots faced at BUF (11/27) to record his second shutout of the season and eighth of his career, moving past Darcy Kuemper for sixth all-time in franchise history. His 39 saves at BUF marked the sixth-highest total by a goaltender in a shutout victory in Wild history.
- Made a season-high 38 saves vs. DAL (11/16).
- Earned the NHL's Third Star of the Week for the period ending 10/20 after going 2-0-0, stopping 50 of 52 shots faced in two starts for a 1.00 GAA and a .962 SV%.
- Gustavsson scored the first goal of his hockey career, a power-play goal, at STL (10/15), becoming the first goaltender in franchise history to find the net.
- Is one of 17 goalies in NHL history to score a goal, a feat that has only been done a total 20 times.
- The play also marked the third PPG scored by a goalie in NHL history.
- He one of 11 goalies to score a goal by shooting it into an empty net (the others were the last to touch an own-goal).

- With a win vs. CHI (11/29) a day after his 40th birthday on Nov. 28, became the second goaltender in NHL history to earn a win both as a teenager and a 40-year-old joining Martin Brodeur.
- Is playing in his 21st career NHL season, tied for second-most by a goaltender in NHL history and trailing only Martin Brodeur (22 seasons).
- Fleury recorded his 552nd career win with a 5-0 victory vs. NYI (1/15/24), moving past Patrick Roy (551 career wins) for second-most in NHL history.
- Fleury became the fourth goaltender in NHL history to reach 1,000 games played when he started vs. WPG (12/31/23).
- Fleury has recorded a shutout against 29-of-32 NHL teams (St. Louis, Vegas and Minnesota), the most in league history.
