Post-Game Notes

The Tampa Bay Lightning fell 4-0 to the Carolina Hurricanes on Saturday night at AMALIE Arena.
Tampa Bay's record dropped to 6-5-4 this season as they lost their second consecutive home game in regulation to move to 4-2-2 at AMALIE Arena.
The Lightning slid to 1-2-0 against Metropolitan Division opponents and to 3-4-3 against Eastern Conference opponents.
The Lightning are now 4-4-2 over their last 10 games against Carolina and 5-3-2 over their last 10 home games against the Canes.
The Bolts were shutout for the first time this season in their 15 th game. In 2022-23 the Lightning were not shutout until their 54 th game of the season (Feb. 15 at COL, 1-0 SOL).
The Lightning were outshot 32-23, including a 15-9 deficit in the first and a 9-3 deficit in the second. Tampa Bay recorded its lowest shot total through two periods this season with 12.
Austin Watson led the Bolts with three shots on goal.
The Lightning moved to 1-3-4 this season when they are outshot by their opponent.
Brandon Hagel (1-4—5, 3GP), Victor Hedman (2-6—8, 4GP) and Steven Stamkos (2-5—7, 5GP) had their point streaks snapped.
Tanner Jeannot and Steven Stamkos led Tampa Bay with four hits each.
The Lightning won 33 of 59 faceoffs (55.9%) and were led at the dot by Luke Glendening (6/9) and Anthony Cirelli (8/13).

Lightning goaltender Jonas Johansson made 28 saves and moved to 5-3-4 this season.
Teuvo Teravainen opened the scoring with a power-play goal at 3:10 of the first period to give Carolina a 1-0 lead.
Sebastian Aho scored at 4:32 of the second period to extend Carolina's lead to 2-0.
Brent Burns tallied a goal at 11:20 of the third period, widening the Hurricanes lead to 3-0.
Stefan Noesen redirected a shot at 17:54 of the third period to bring the Canes lead to 4-0.
The Lightning hit the road to take on the St. Louis Blues on Tuesday night at Enterprise Center (8:00pm puck drop).
Tampa Bay is 17-24-5 with three ties all-time against the Blues, including a road record of 5-15-3.
