GAME NOTES

THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

- Tonight is the second of four games the Stars will play against the Wild this season and the first time the two teams are facing off in Dallas this year. The teams will play each other next on March 24 in Dallas.
- The Stars are 6-0-1 in their last seven games against the Wild, outscoring Minnesota 30-9 in those contests.
- Esa Lindell is expected to play in his 638th career game tonight, which will tie him with former Star Radek Faksa for 17th on the franchise's all-time games played list.
- Roope Hintz has five points (4-1—5) in his last five games and has scored four goals in his last four games. Hintz is now pacing to finish the season with 38 goals, which would be a career high for the forward.
- Miro Heiskanen is averaging 25:09 of ice time per game this season, which was the fifth-most in the NHL this year entering play Thursday.
- Thomas Harley has recorded a plus-17 on-ice, even strength goal differential this season, which was tied for fifth-best mark among all NHL defensemen this season entering play Thursday.
- Entering play Thursday, the Stars and the Washington Capitals were the only NHL teams this season that have not lost more than two consecutive games.
- The Stars have allowed only 2.58 goals against per game this season, which was the fourth-best mark in the NHL entering play Thursday. Dallas has allowed two or fewer goals in 18 of the 33 games that they have played this year.

WILD THINGS

- Jamie Benn has 11 points (6-5-11) in his last 12 games against the Wild since the start of the 2021-22 season. In all, Benn has 48 points (20-28-48) in 56 career regular-season games against Minnesota, which is the fifth-highest total of any active player.
- Casey DeSmith has a 5-1-1 career record in seven career games against the Wild, posting a .915 save percentage, 2.53 goals-against average and one shutout in those contests.
- Matt Duchene has 23 points (7-16-23) in his last 23 games against Minnesota dating back to Dec. 7, 2015. Additionally, he has posted six multi-point efforts in his last nine games against the Wild.
- Miro Heiskanen has five assists in his last five games against the Wild.
- Roope Hintz has 19 points (9-10-19) in 20 career games against the Wild. Sixteen of those points have come in 12 games since the start of the 2021-22 season, which is tied for the 11th-most in the NHL during that span.
- Wyatt Johnston has seven points (3-4-7) in eight career games against the Wild.
- Mason Marchment has 11 points (6-5-11) in nine career games against Minnesota. He scored both of Dallas' goals in the two teams last meeting on Nov. 16
- Jake Oettinger a native of Lakeville, Minnesota has a 6-0-1 career record against the Wild, posting a .917 save percentage and 2.30 goals-against average in those games.
- Jason Robertson has 17 points (10-7-17) in 12 career games against the Wild.
 - Robertson's 17 points against Minnesota since the start of the 2021-22 season are tied for the eighth-most in the NHL.
 - His 1.42 points per game against the Wild is the third-best mark of any active NHL skater that has played Minnesota at least three times in their career, trailing only Washington's Alex Ovechkin (1.61) and Sidney Crosby (1.52).

KILLING IT

- Entering play Thursday, the Stars had the fifth-ranked penalty kill in the NHL this season with an 85.0 percent success
- Dallas has allowed only 14 power-play goals against this season, which was the second-best mark in the NHL this season entering play Thursday. Their 0.42 power-play goals against per game were also tied for the second-best mark in the NHL entering play Thursday.
- The Stars have not allowed a power-play goal against in seven consecutive games, going 16-for-16 on the penalty kill dating back to Dec. 8 vs. Calgary.
 - The Stars are the only team in the NHL that has been perfect on the penalty kill since Dec. 8.
- If the Stars were to remain perfect on the penalty kill tonight, it would mark the first time that this team has gone eight straight games without surrendering a power-play goal against since Nov. 23 to Dec. 11, 2021 (nine games). They went 20-for-20 on the penalty kill during that stretch.
- Thomas Harley has allowed 3.34 power-play goals against per 60, which was the fourth-best mark in the NHL entering play Thursday among defensemen that have at least 40 minutes of shorthanded ice time this season.
- Esa Lindell has skated 117:03 minutes on the penalty kill this season, which was fourth-highest total of any NHL skater this season entering play Thursday.
 - Lindell, who skated 7:58 of shorthanded ice time, was on the ice for all but two seconds of Dallas' eight penalty kill minutes in their game on Dec. 16 against the Washington Capitals.

HOME COOKING

- The Stars enter tonight's matchup against Minnesota with an 13-5-0 record while playing at home this season.
 - One of Dallas' "home" losses this season came at Nokia Arena in Tampere, Finland.
 - With a win tonight, the Stars could tie the Toronto Maple Leafs and Vegas Golden Knights for the most wins at home this season (14).
- The Stars have allowed only 2.22 goals against and 40 goals in home games this year, which ranked second and fourth, respectively, in the NHL this season entering play Thursday.
- Dallas has gone 42-for-46 on the penalty kill at home this year. Their 91.3 percent success rate when playing a man down at home this year was the second-best mark in the NHL entering play Thursday.
 - No team has allowed fewer power-play goals against at home this year than Dallas' four.
- Dallas' next home win will be their 14th of the season. Last year, the Stars won their 14th home game of the season on Jan. 16, 2024 against the Los Angeles Kings.
- Jason Robertson (4-12-16) is the team's lead in scoring at home this season.
- Roope Hintz has nine points (7-2-9) in his last eight home games dating back to Nov. 20.

TOUGH AS NILS

- In Dallas' last game on Dec. 23 against Utah, the Stars outshot the Hockey Club 13-7 when Nils Lundskvist was on the ice during 5-on-5 play. No skater or either team was on the ice for more shots for during 5-on-5 than Lundkvist.
- Since Dec. 8, when Lundkvist has been on the ice during 5-on-5 play, the Stars have outscored their opponents 4-2 and outshot them 40-26. His 59.7 percent Corsi rating during that span ranks tops Stars skaters to play in at least four games since Dec. 8.

- Lundkvist has totaled 20 shots on goal since Nov. 29, which was tied for second among NHL defensemen that have averaged less than 18 minutes off ice time per game during that span entering play Thursday.
 - This includes recorded six shots on Dec. 4 against Los Angeles, which match his career high and were the second-most by a Stars defenseman in a single game this season (Miro Heiskanen; 7 on 10/22 at BUF and 11/11 at PIT).
- In all this season, Lundkvist is averaging 16.3 shot attempts per 60, which is the sixth-best mark on the Stars roster and tops all Dallas defensemen.

BICHS BETTER HAVE MY MONEY

- Dallas' game against the Predators on Dec. 12 marked the first NHL game of defenseman Lian Bichsel's career.
- In making his NHL debut, Bichsel became:
 - The 33rd player and 13th defenseman selected in the 2022 NHL Draft to appear in an NHL regular-season
 - The eighth player drafted by the Stars between 2017 and 2024 to play in at least one regular-season game for
 - The 46th Swiss player and 15th Swiss defenseman in league history to appear in an NHL regular-season game.
- Bichsel scored his first NHL goal in the game, making him the third defenseman in franchise history to score in his NHL debut according to NHL Stats, joining Daniel Poulin (Dec. 12, 1981) and Bryan Maxwell (Feb. 16, 1987). Bichsel's goal came exactly 43 years to the day after Poulin's.
- Bichsel scored the second goal of his NHL career in Dallas' game (and his third NHL game) on Dec. 16 against the Washington Capitals, making him the second defenseman in franchise history to score two goals within his first three NHL games according to NHL Stats, joining Minnesota North Stars blueliner Derian Hatcher (2 in 1991-92).
- Bichsel's goal was the eventual game winner, making him the club's second-youngest defenseman with a game-winning goal according to NHL Stats, behind only Miro Heiskanen (4; youngest: 19 years, 99 days on Oct. 25, 2018).
 - Bichel was 20 years and 212 days old on Dec. 16.
- Bichel's two goals this season were just one shy of tying New Jersey's Seamus Casey for the league lead among rookie defensemen entering play Thursday.
 - o Bichsel, Casey and the Islanders' Isaiah George were the only rookie defensemen to score a game-winning goal this season entering play Thursday.
- Since making his NHL debut on Dec. 12, Bichsel has recorded 20 hits in six games played. His 20 hits are the most of any Stars skater during that span and 13 more than the second-ranked player (four tied with seven).
 - o This includes totaling six hits in Dallas' last game on Dec. 23 against Utah, the most by a Stars skater in a single game this season.
- Standing at 6'7", there are only four players to appear in a regular-season game this year that are taller than Bichsel: New York's Matt Rempe (6'9"), Vancouver's Tyler Myers (6'8"), Chicago's Louis Crevier (6'8") and Calgary's Adam Klapka (6'8").
- Bichsel was originally selected by the Stars with the 18th-overall pick of the 2022 NHL Draft, the only Swiss player to be drafted that year. It made him the seventh-highest drafted Swiss player in NHL history, behind Nico Hischier (first overall, 2017), Nino Niederreiter (fifth overall, 2010), Timo Meier (ninth overall, 2015), Kevin Fiala (11th overall, 2014), Sven Bärtschi (13th overall, 2011) and Michel Riesen (14th overall, 1997).
 - Defenseman Mirco Müller was also drafted 18th overall, taken by San Jose in 2013.

ROBO ON THE GOGO

- Jason Robertson enters tonight's matchup having totaled nine points (2-7-9) in his last nine games played dating back to Dec. 4 against the Los Angeles Kings.
- During that span, the Stars have outscored their opponents 6-4 and outshot them 70-45 when Robertson has been on the ice during 5-on-5 play according to Natural Stat Trick.
- With two assists in Dallas' game on Dec. 16 against Washington, Robertson moved into 23rd on the franchise's all-time scoring list with 335 (140-195-335) career points. He now sits three points shy of tying Al MacAdam for 22nd all-time.
- Robertson enters tonight's game three assists shy of recording 200 career assists. When he reaches the milestone, he will become the 27th player in Stars franchise history at the seventh player from the 2017 draft class to total 200 NHL assists.

BENN THERE DONE THAT

- Dallas' game on Dec. 18 was the 1,143rd game of captain Jamie Benn's career, which is the most-ever by a Stars skater.
 - Benn surpassed Mike Modano's 1,142 games with Dallas.
- Benn's 1,145 career games rank second on the franchise's all-time list behind Modano, who played in 317 games for the North Stars before the team relocated to Dallas.
- Benn also ranks in the top five in franchise history in career goals (390, second), assists (539, third) and points (928, second).
- Dallas' last game on Dec. 23 against Utah was the 330th consecutive game that Benn played in, which is the fifthlongest active Iron Man streak in the NHL.
- Benn enters tonight's game 10 goals shy of scoring 400 career goals. When he reaches the milestone, he will become the 10th active skater to score 400 NHL goals.

ONE FOR THE HISTORY BOOKS

- Jake Oettinger's next shutout will be the 12th of his career, which will tie Jon Casey for the sixth-most in franchise history.
- Miro Heiskanen is one assist shy of tying Brad Maxwell (217) for seventh on the franchise's all-time assists list by defensemen.
- Matt Duchene is five points away from recording his 100th point with the Stars.
- Esa Lindell enters tonight's contest four assists shy of tying Alex Goligoski (155) for 25th all-time among Stars/North Stars defensemen.

CONNECT FOUR

- Stars forward Roope Hintz (Finland), defensemen Miro Heiskanen (Finland) and Esa Lindell (Finland), and goaltender Jake Oettinger (United States) have all been selected to represent their home country at the 4 Nations Face-Off, which will be held in Montreal and Boston from Feb. 12 to 20, 2025.
- Dallas is one of six NHL teams to have at least one forward, defenseman and goaltender from their roster to be selected for the 4 Nations Face-Off, with the others being Boston, Minnesota, Vancouver, Vegas and Winnipeg.
- Only six teams have had more players selected to a 4 Nations roster than the Stars: Colorado, Florida, Minnesota, Tampa Bay and Vegas. The full breakdown is as follows:

- All four players have previously represented their home countries in international competition.
 - Heiskanen has played for Finland at the 2017 and 2018 IIHF World Junior Championships, 2018 and 2022 (gold) IIHF World Championships and at the 2018 Winter Olympic Games.
 - Lindell suited up for the Fins at the 2014 IIHF World Junior Championship, where he won a gold medal. He again represented Finland at the 2015, 2016 (silver) and 2022 (gold) IIHF World Championships and at the 2016 World Cup of Hockey.
 - o Hintz previously played for Finland at the 2015 and 2016 IIHF World Junior Championships, winning a gold medal at the later tournament.
 - Oettinger has played for Team USA at the 2017 and 2018 IIHF World Junior Championships and at the 2021 IIHF World Championship. He medaled in all three tournaments, winning bronze in 2018 and 2021 and gold in
- The 4 Nations Face-Off will mark the first time that all three of Heiskanen, Hintz and Lindell are playing for Finland together.
 - Heiskanen and Lindell previously won a gold medal together at the 2022 IIHF World Championship.
- The Stars will also be well-represented among the 4 Nations staff, with Jim Nill (Associate GM), Pete DeBoer (Assistant Coach) and Misha Donskov (Assistant Coach) all set to join Canada's staff for the tournament. Additionally, former Star Jere Lehtinen will serve as Finland's General Manager.

CONNECTIONS

- Stars defenseman Matt Dumba was originally selected by Minnesota in the first round (seventh overall) in the 2012 NHL Draft. He played for the Wild from 2013-14 to 2022-23.
 - Dumba and Wild defenseman Jonas Brodin and Jared Spurgeon were teammates in Minnesota during Dumba's tenure there from 2013-14 to 2022-23.
- Stars forward Sam Steel and defenseman Matt Dumba both played together for one season in Minnesota during the 2022-23 season.
- Stars player development assistant Jordie Benn and Stars defenseman Matt Dumba both played together in Minnesota during the 2021-22 season.
- Stars forward Colin Blackwell and Wild forwards Ryan Hartman and Frederick Gaudreau were all members of the Nashville Predators during the 2018-19 season and played five games together.
- Stars goaltender Casey DeSmith played alongside the Wild's Frederick Gaudreau in part of the 2020-21 season with the Pittsburgh Penguins.
- Stars forwards Matt Duchene and Colin Blackwell played with Wild forward Yakov Trenin in Nashville during the 2019-20 season.
- Stars forward Evgenii Dadonov and Wild goaltender Filip Gustavsson played together in Ottawa in 2021-22.
- Stars forward Colin Blackwell and Wild forward Marcus Johansson were both members of the Seattle Kraken during the 2021-22 season.

- Stars defenseman Brendan Smith and Wild forward Mats Zuccarello both played for the New York Rangers from 2016-17 until 2018-19
- Wild forward Mats Zuccarello played two games for the Dallas Stars in 2018-19.
- Stars goaltending coach Jeff Reese and Wild associate coach Jack Capuano both played for the Toronto Maple Leafs in 1989-1990.
