PLAYER NOTES

- Mitch Marner scored the game-winning goal for the Maple Leafs 40 seconds into overtime, scoring his sixth goal of the season and the fifth overtime goal of his NHL career. With the goal, Marner scored the 200th goal of his NHL career. <u>He is the 16th skater in franchise history to score 200 goals as a Maple Leaf</u>. Marner also registered the secondary assist on McMann's first goal of the game, posting his 18th assist of the season. Marner has recorded four points (2G, 2A) in his last two games. Marner marked his ninth multi-point game of the season, five of which have been recorded in his last six games.
- **Bobby McMann** scored for the Maple Leafs at 3:53 of the first period and scored his second goal of the game at 14:07 of the third period. McMann marked his second multi-goal game of the season and fifth multi-goal game of his NHL career. McMann has scored three goals in his last two games.
- Matthew Knies scored for Toronto at 13:08 of the third period, scoring his eighth goal of the season. Knies has recorded a point in back-to-back games (1G, 1A).
- John Tavares posted the primary assist on McMann's first goal of the game, recording his eighth assist of the season. Tavares has posted three points (1G, 2A) in his last two games.
- **Oliver Ekman-Larsson** posted the lone assist on McMann's second goal of the game, recording his sixth assist of the season.
- Chris Tanev registered eight blocks tonight, the most he has recorded in a single game this season.
- Anthony Stolarz stopped 27 of 30 shots he faced in tonight's overtime win.
- William Nylander was on the ice for a team-high 18 Toronto shot attempts-for at 5-on-5.
- **Conor Timmins** finished the game with a team-high 5-on-5 shot attempt percentage of 55.56 percent (15 for, 12 against).

TEAM NOTES

- The Maple Leafs were 0-for-4 on the power play and 1-for-2 on the penalty kill tonight.
- Toronto has posted an 8-3-0 record on home ice this season. Eight wins on home ice currently ties for the league lead alongside Vegas and Winnipeg.
- Per NHL Stats, the Maple Leafs own an active seven-game home point streak against the Oilers dating back to Jan. 22, 2021 (6-0-1) tied for their second-longest active stretch (also 6-0-1 vs. PHI). The club's only longer active home point streak against one opponent is nine games (9-0-0 vs. MTL).
