TOP NOTES

Victor Olofsson's goal marked his first power-play goal of the season and the 35th of his career. He has recorded the second-most power-play goals among all Sabres skaters since joining Buffalo (2018-19) and he trails only **Tage Thompson** (40) in that span.

JJ Peterka registered the primary assist on **Olofsson's** goal, which gave him one point in back-to-back games (1+1). It marked the ninth time this season he has notched at least one point in two or more consecutive games. It was the first time he has recorded a point against the Islanders in his career.

With his goal, **Dylan Cozens** has registered eight points (4+4) in his last eight games against New York. He has now recorded one goal in three consecutive home games against the Islanders.

Jeff Skinner was credited with an assist on **Cozens**' goal. **Skinner** has totaled seven points (3+4) in his last seven games against the Islanders, including at least one point in each home game in that span.

With two goals in tonight's game, **Zach Benson** (18 years, 307 days; 3+2) became the youngest Sabres skater since **Rasmus Dahlin** (18 years, 247 days; 1+4) from Dec. 15 to 16, 2018 to record five or more points in any two-game span. In two games against the Islanders in his career, **Benson** has recorded four points (2+2).

Owen Power notched assists on **Olofsson's** goal and **Benson's** first goal and he has now recorded four multi-assist games this season and 10 in his NHL career.

With his assist on **Benson's** second goal, **Bowen Byram** joined John Van Boxmeer (Oct. 11 to 17, 1979; 1+4) as the only two Sabres defensemen to record five or more points in their first four games with Buffalo (3+2).

Including tonight's game, the Sabres have not allowed a power-play goal to the Islanders in the last eight matchups between the two teams (19 penalty-kill opportunities). It marked the longest streak by Buffalo against New York since they did not allow a power-play goal against the Islanders in nine straight contests from Nov. 26, 1972 to Jan. 19, 1974.

Ukko-Pekka Luukkonen made 21 saves in tonight's game and recorded his fifth shutout of 2023-24. Since Jan. 1, **Luukkonen** has notched more shutouts than any NHL goaltender (four). He is now the fourth-youngest Sabres goaltender to record five or more shutouts in a single season.
