**2023-24 DALLAS STARS REGULAR SEASON  
(52-21-9, 113 PTS., 1st CENTRAL, 1st WESTERN CONFERENCE)**

**2023-24 REGULAR SEASON TEAM NOTES:**

- Clinched the top seed in the Western Conference for the fifth time in franchise history and first since 2015-16.
- Clinched first place in their division for the 11th time in franchise history and first since 2015-16, when they concluded the season atop the Central Division and Western Conference.
- Recorded the second-most points in a regular season since the club relocated to Dallas in 1993-94, one point shy of the 1998-1999 squad that went on to win the Stanley Cup.
- Finished the season with 52 wins, which is the second time in franchise history the club has won as many (the Stars had 53 in 2005-06).
- Scored the most goals (294) in Dallas Stars history (1993-present) and seventh most in franchise history (1967-present).
- The Stars wrapped up their most productive road season in franchise history with 26 wins and 57 points in 41 games (26-10-5), besting last season's point total by two points (55 points; 25-11-5) and set a franchise mark in points percentage (.695%).
- Had the second-best faceoff win percentage in the league (54.0).
- Established a franchise-record eight-game winning streak with a victory March 16-April 3.
- Had eight players with 20 goals in a season for the first time in franchise history: **Wyatt Johnston** (32), **Roope Hintz** (30), **Jason Robertson** (29), **Joe Pavelski** (27), **Tyler Seguin** (25), **Matt Duchene** (25), **Mason Marchment** (22) and **Jamie Benn** (21).

**2023-24 REGULAR SEASON PLAYER NOTES:**

**CAPTAIN STANDS ON BUSINESS**

- Captain **Jamie Benn** (21-39—60) reached the 20-goal mark for the 11th time in his NHL career, surpassing **Brian Bellows** (10) for the second most in franchise history behind **Mike Modano** (16).
- Benn had a career-tying six-game goal streak (7-3—10) from March 16-28. The last time he had a goal streak of six games was 13 years ago (March 1-11, 2011). He also had a season-high eight-game point streak (7-5—12) from March 12-28.
- Benn (383-524—907) – who during the 2023-24 regular season passed **Neal Broten** (274-593—867) for sole possession of second place on the franchise's all-time points list – earned his 900th career point with an assist on March 28 at Vancouver.
- Among team leaders, Benn ranked fifth in assists (39), sixth in points (21-39—60) and eighth in goals (21).
- He skated in his 1,100th career NHL game (all with Dallas) on March 20 vs. Arizona. Benn is one of two players in Dallas Stars history to play 1,000 or more games with the club – the other being **Mike Modano** (1,182).
- He recorded his seventh career game of four or more points with a goal and three assists (1-3—4) March 5 at San Jose.
- Benn concluded his 11th season as the Stars captain and is the longest-tenured captain in franchise history.
- With his 500th career assist on Dec. 11, 2023 vs. Detroit, Benn became the third player in franchise history to post 500 assists with the franchise, joining **Mike Modano** (802) and **Neal Broten** (593). Benn is also just the third player from the 2007 Draft class to hit 500 assists, joining **Patrick Kane** and **Jakub Voracek**, and the fifth player selected in the fifth round all-time to reach the milestone.

**JOHNNY B. GOOD**

- At just 20 years of age, forward **Wyatt Johnston** led the Stars in goals (32), shared third in points (32-33—65) and ranked seventh in assists (33) in 82 GP. He also co-led the squad in shorthanded tallies (3), sharing fifth overall in the league in that category.
- With 65 points, Johnston tied **Brian Bellows** (35-30—65 in 1982-83) for the third-most points in a single season by a player age 20 or younger in franchise history. The only players with more in a single campaign are Bellows (41-42—83 in 78 GP in 1983-84) and **Mike Modano** (29-46—75 in 80 GP in 1989-90).
- On April 3 vs. Edmonton, Johnston tallied his 30th goal of 2023-24 and joined **Brian Bellows** (35 in 1982-83 & 41 in

- 1983-84) as the second player in franchise history to record a 30-goal season prior to their 21st birthday.
- With his second point (assist) on March 30 at Seattle, Johnston recorded his 100th career point (53-47—100 in 157 GP). He became the third player in club history with 100 career NHL points before age 21, following **Brian Bellows** (102-108—210 in 234 GP) and **Mike Modano** (57-82—139 in 159 GP).
  - In his two NHL seasons, Johnston has seven games with three-or-more points - the third most by a player before age 21 in franchise history on a list topped by **Brian Bellows** (17) and **Mike Modano** (11).
  - Johnston's six career multi-goal games are the third most by a player age 20 or younger in franchise history behind only **Brian Bellows** (19) and **Mike Modano** (10).
  - His goal on March 16 vs. LA marked the 50th goal of his NHL career, making him the third player in franchise history to reach the milestone before age 21, following **Brian Bellows** (102) and **Mike Modano** (57).
  - On March 12 vs. Florida, Johnston recorded his 50th and 51st points of the season (24-27—51) with a goal and an assist. Johnston joined **Brian Bellows** (3x), **Mike Modano** (2x) and **Glen Sharpley** as the only players in franchise history to reach the 50-point mark in a campaign at age 20 or younger.
  - Johnston (3-2—5) had himself a breakout game in Dallas' 7-6 comeback victory over San Jose on March 5, recording his first career three-goal performance and five-point outing. He became the fifth player in franchise history to record a hat trick at age 20 or younger, joining **Mike Modano** (March 17, 1990), **Todd Harvey** (April 22, 1995), **Steve Payne** (March 21, 1979) and **Brian Lawton** (Feb. 19, 1986). At 20 years, 296 days, he became the youngest player in franchise history to record five points in a game, besting the previous mark set by **Dino Ciccarelli** (21 years, 276 days on Nov. 11, 1981 w/ MNS).
  - On Jan. 23 at Detroit (at 20 years, 254 days), he became the second-youngest player in Stars team history to record a three-assist game, behind only **Valeri Nichushkin** (18 years, 278 days on Dec. 7, 2013).
  - With his second point against the Devils (goal) on Jan. 20, Johnston (37-32—69 in 127 GP) passed **Miro Heiskanen** (20-48—68 in 150 GP) for the most points before age 21 in Stars team history.
  - The Toronto native joined rare company during the 2023-24 regular season, becoming the second player in franchise history to score a shorthanded goal on consecutive days (Nov. 11, 2023 at Winnipeg and Nov. 12, 2023 at Minnesota). He also became just the third player to accomplish the feat in the past 10 years alongside **William Karlsson** (March 30-31, 2018 w/ VGK) and **Matt Read** (March 15-16, 2014 w/ PHI).
  - His shorthanded goal on Nov. 12, 2023 at Minnesota represented his 30th career goal in his 96th game. Among players to debut with the Dallas Stars, only two have reached the mark in as many contests or fewer: **Jason Robertson** (81 GP) and **James Neal** (88 GP).
  - At 20 years, 182 days, he became the fourth-youngest player in franchise history to score 30 career goals behind **Brian Bellows** (18 years, 196 days), **Mike Modano** (20 years, 126 days) and **Tom McCarthy** (20 years, 145 days).
  - He appeared in his 100th career NHL game on Nov. 22, 2023 vs. Vegas.

## KING OF THE NEW AGE

- At 39 years of age, forward **Joe Pavelski** ranked second on the Stars in points (27-40—67), shared third in assists (40) and ranked fourth in goals (27). He also paced the club in power-play goals (11), shared third in power-play points (11-10—21) and ranked fourth in even-strength points (16-30—46).
- With an assist on April 7 at Colorado, Pavelski (475-591—1,066) surpassed **Keith Tkachuk** (538-527—1,065) for fifth place on the all-time points list among U.S.-born players.
- Pavelski recorded his 14th multi-point game of the season with two assists on March 28 at Vancouver. The last player to record at least that many multi-point games in a season at age 39 or older was **Jaromir Jagr** in 2015-16, when he posted 16 multi-point games at 43 years old.
- On March 22 vs. Pittsburgh, Pavelski (1-0—1) recorded his 12th season with at least 25 goals, the third most among U.S.-born players behind only **Keith Tkachuk** (13x) and **Mike Modano** (13x).
- On Feb. 22 at Ottawa, Pavelski reached the 20-goal mark for the 14th time in his career, a feat only three other U.S.-born players in NHL history have achieved: **Mike Modano** (16), **Patrick Kane** (16) and **Keith Tkachuk** (15). Pavelski became the second player in franchise history to record a 20-goal season at age 39 or older, joining **Dean Prentice** (26 in 1972-73 & 20 in 1971-72).
- Pavelski skated in his 1,300th career game on Feb. 6 at Buffalo to become the seventh U.S.-born player in NHL history to reach the milestone. Pavelski joined **Doug Gilmour** (1,474 GP; Round 7 in 1982) and **Luc Robitaille** (1,431 GP; Round 9

in 1984) as the third player selected during the sixth round or later in an NHL Draft to reach the milestone.

- Pavelski had points in nine consecutive games (6-6—12) from Nov. 12-Dec. 2, 2023 – the longest point streak in franchise history by a player at his age and the lengthiest by any NHL skater 39 or older since **Teemu Selanne** with the Ducks from Dec. 2-19, 2011 (3-10—13 in 9 GP).

- Pavelski scored his 456th career NHL goal on Nov. 18, 2023 vs. Colorado, surpassing **Theo Fleury** (455-633—1,088 in 1,084 GP) for sole possession of the third most in league history among players selected in the seventh round of the NHL Draft or later. The top two are **Luc Robitaille** (668-726—1,394 in 1,431) and **Peter Bondra** (503-389—892 in 1,081 GP).

- His goal against the Wild on Nov. 12, 2023 marked his 100th with the Stars (100-153—253), joining eight other active players with 100 tallies for multiple franchises. Also: **TJ Oshie** (STL & WSH), **Jordan Staal** (PIT, CAR), **Adam Henrique** (NJD, ANA), **John Tavares** (NYI, TOR), **Brayden Schenn** (PHI, STL), **Jeff Skinner** (CAR, BUF), **James van Riemsdyk** (PHI, TOR), and **Jeff Carter** (PHI, LAK).

- On Nov. 2, 2023 at Edmonton, Pavelski (1-2—3) factored on three consecutive goals in Dallas' 4-3 win to become the fourth different player age 39 or older with a three-point game for the franchise. It marked his 236th career contest with multiple points, surpassing **Neal Broten** (235) for sole possession of the 10th-most by a U.S.-born player in NHL history.

- Pavelski's currently tied with **John LeClair** (67) for sole possession of the sixth most multi-goal games by a U.S.-born player in NHL history. The list is topped by **Pat LaFontaine** (96), **Mike Modano** (92), **Joe Mullen** (85), **Keith Tkachuk** (75) and **Jeremy Roenick** (74).

#### ONE BY ONE, HIDDEN UP MY SLEEVE

- For the second consecutive season, forward **Jason Robertson** led the Stars in points, this time with 80 points (29-51—80). Appearing in all 82 games, Robertson paced the club in assists (51) and points and ranked third in goals (29).

- He became the third Stars player to record consecutive 80-point seasons, a feat achieved by only **Jamie Benn** (2 from 2014-15 to 2015-16) and **Mike Modano** (multiple times) since the club began play in Texas.

- On April 3 vs. Edmonton, Robertson notched his second consecutive 50-assist season and became just the sixth player in franchise history to accomplish the feat, joining **Bobby Smith** (4 from 1979-80 – 1982-83), **Dennis Hextall** (3 from 1972-73 – 1974-75), **Mike Ribeiro** (2 from 2007-08 – 2008-09), **Neal Broten** (2 from 1989-90 – 1990-91) and **Craig Hartsburg** (2 from 1981-82 – 1982-83).

- With a goal on Feb. 29 vs. Winnipeg, Robertson (1-0—1) recorded his third consecutive 20-goal season. Only five players have recorded a longer stretch with the Stars since they relocated to Dallas: **Mike Modano** (8), **Jamie Benn** (6), **Tyler Seguin** (6), **Joe Pavelski** (4) and **Loui Eriksson** (4).

- Robertson registered his 20th career game of 3+ points or more with two goals and an assist (2-1—3) on Nov. 12, 2023 at Minnesota.

- He logged a regular season career-high 26:17 TOI on Nov. 6, 2023 vs. Boston. (His career-high TOI is 29:34 in Game 1 of the Western Conference First Round vs. Minnesota on April 17, 2023; 2OT).

- Robertson, who won't celebrate his 25th birthday until July 22, 2024, currently has the seventh most goals by a player age 25 or younger in franchise history.

### **TRY TEXAS**

- In his first season with the Stars, forward **Matt Duchene** recorded 65 points (25-40—65) in 80 GP. He shared third on the club in assists (40), fourth in points and fifth in goals (25). He led the club in game-winning goals (7), ranked third in even-strength points (19-30—49) and shared fourth in even-strength tallies (19).

- He recorded his 800th career NHL point (339-461—800 in 1,034 GP) with a goal on Feb. 26 against the New York Islanders. He became the second member of the 2009 NHL Draft class to reach the mark, following Toronto's **John Tavares**.

- He had 29 points (11-18—29) through his first 30 games with Dallas – his highest total through that game count since his career-best season in 2021-22 (43-43—86 in 78 GP with Nashville).

- Duchene became the 384th skater in NHL history to reach the 1,000 regular-season games played mark with his appearance against the Washington Capitals on Dec. 7, 2023. He joined **Joe Pavelski**, **Ryan Suter** and **Jamie Benn** as the fourth active Stars skater to reach the milestone. Pittsburgh is the only other club with as many active players with 1,000 games (**Sidney Crosby**, **Evgeni Malkin**, **Jeff Carter**, **Kris Letang**).

- He became the 259th forward to reach the league-recognized milestone and is one of five players from the 2009 NHL Draft to reach 1,000 games (also **John Tavares**, **Ryan O'Reilly**, **Victor Hedman** and **Nick Leddy**).

- With an assist against the Caps, Duchene became the 11th player in franchise history to collect a point in their 1,000th career game. Only two other active players have done so with Dallas: **Andrew Cogliano** (0-1—1 on Feb. 13, 2020) and **Joe Pavelski** (0-1—1 on Dec. 20, 2019).

- Duchene became the sixth player to register his first 15 career points (6-9—15) with the Dallas Stars in 16 contests or fewer. **Tyler Seguin** (14 GP in 2013-14), **Benoit Hogue** (14 GP in 1995-96), **Brett Hull** (15 GP in 1998-99), **Jason Spezza** (16 GP in 2014-15) and **Alex Chiasson** (16 GP from 2012-13 – 2013-14) are the only ones to do so to date.

- He had a four-game goal streak from Nov. 9-14, 2023 (4-4—8). The last time he scored in four straight was Dec. 17-23, 2022 with Nashville.

- He became the sixth player in franchise history to score three winning goals in a four-game span (Nov. 9, 11 & 14, 2023), joining **Jamie Benn** in 2019-20, **Jere Lehtinen** in 2005-06, **Pierre Turgeon** in 2002-03, **Jude Drouin** in 1971-72 and **Wayne Connelly** in 1967-68.

### **THERE'S A SPARK, THERE'S A LIGHT**

- Forward **Roope Hintz** concluded the 2023-24 campaign ranking second on the Stars in goals (30), sharing third in points (30-35—65) and ranking sixth in assists (35). He also ranked third in power-play goals (8), shared fourth in even-strength goals (19) and ranked fifth in power-play points (8-11—19).

- With a goal on April 7 at Colorado, Hintz became the 11th player in franchise history to score 30 goals in three consecutive seasons. Since 1993-94 when the team relocated to Dallas, the only other players to achieve the feat are **Mike Modano** (4; 1998-99 – 2001-02), **Jamie Benn** (3; 2013-14 – 2015-16) and **Tyler Seguin** (3; 2013-14 – 2015-16).

- On Jan. 23 at Detroit, Hintz tied his career high for points in a game with four (2-2—4).

- With two goals on Jan. 20 at New Jersey, Hintz became the fourth Stars player in the past 10 years to record three straight 20-goal campaigns, joining **Jamie Benn**, **Tyler Seguin** and **Joe Pavelski**.



- Hintz tallied his 11th career shorthanded goal on Jan. 20 at New Jersey. Since he entered the NHL in 2018-19, only two players have more: **Sebastian Aho** (16) and **Blake Coleman** (14).
- On Dec. 29, 2023 vs. Chicago, Hintz (3-0—3) became the fifth player in franchise history to complete a hat trick with an overtime goal, joining **Jason Robertson** (March 4, 2022), **Dino Ciccarelli** (March 17, 1986), **Tom McCarthy** (March 12, 1984) and **Neal Broten** (Nov. 26, 1983). It was his fourth career hat trick and first by a Stars skater in 2023-24.
- He had three consecutive multi-point games from Oct. 30-Nov. 2, 2023, recording three goals and seven points (3-4—7) over that span.

### ELEVATING HIS GAME

- Defenseman **Miro Heiskanen** paced Stars blueliners in assists (45) and points (9-45—54) and ranked second in goals (9) in 71 GP.
- Heiskanen recorded his fifth game of the season with three or more points after scoring a goal and tallying two assists (1-2—3) on April 13 vs. Seattle. His third point of the game also placed him in seventh place for points among defensemen in franchise history.
- With an assist on March 26 at San Jose, Heiskanen became the fifth defenseman in franchise history to record multiple 40-assist seasons, joining **Sergei Zubov** (6), **Craig Hartsburg** (4), **John Klingberg** (3) and **Gordie Roberts** (2).
- After his four-point outing March 5 at San Jose (more on that below), Heiskanen (0-2—2 on March 8 at Anaheim) became the third Stars defenseman in the past 20 years with six points in a two-game span joining **John Klingberg** (6 from Jan. 29-31, 2015) and **Sergei Zubov** (6 from Dec. 10-12, 2007).
- On March 5 at San Jose, Heiskanen (0-4—4) established a new career high for points in a game with four points (all assists). It marked his 56th multi-point outing of his career and moved past **Darryl Sydor** for the fifth most by a defenseman in franchise history.
- On Jan. 25 vs. Anaheim, Heiskanen (49-183—232) passed **Trevor Daley** (231) for sole possession of eighth place for points by a defenseman in franchise history.
- Heiskanen holds the mark for the most assists (205) before age 25 by a defenseman in franchise history.

### THE CREATOR

- Despite missing 11 consecutive games (Feb. 24-March 16) with a lower-body injury, Seguin shared fifth on the club in goals (25) and ranked ninth in points (25-27—52) and 10th in assists (27) in 68 GP. He also shared fifth in even-strength points (22-20—42).
- On Feb. 15 at Nashville, Seguin scored to record his ninth 20-goal season with the Stars – the fourth most in franchise history behind **Mike Modano** (16), **Jamie Benn** (11) and **Brian Bellows** (10).
- He registered his 50th game-winning goal with the Stars on Feb. 10 at Montreal to become just the third player in franchise history with as many (**Mike Modano**: 92; **Jamie Benn**: 58).
- With an assist on Jan. 25 vs. Anaheim, Seguin recorded his 652nd point (287-365—652) with the Stars to move him into sole possession of fifth place all-time in franchise history.

- He had goals in four consecutive games Jan. 1-10 (5-1—6), one shy of his career high (five games; Feb. 1-9, 2018).
- Seguin had two separate point streak of five games: Jan. 4-12 (5-2—7) and Dec. 11-21, 2023 (1-4—5), and had multi-point performances in four consecutive games (Nov. 12-20, 2023; 4-4—8)
- On Jan. 4 vs. Colorado, Seguin recorded his 47th career multi-goal game with Dallas, moving into a tie with **Bill Goldsworthy** for the fourth most in franchise history.

## “STANK THE TANK”

- In his first NHL season, forward **Logan Stankoven** recorded 14 points (6-8—14), 51 shots and a +10 rating while averaging 14:40 TOI/G.
- On March 20 vs. Arizona, Stankoven (6-4—10 in 12 GP) became the third-fastest player in franchise history (tied) to record 10 career NHL points, trailing only **Mike Modano** (9 GP) and **Alex Chiasson** (10 GP).
- He was a catalyst in Dallas' 7-6 comeback victory over San Jose on March 5, recording his first career four-point outing (2-2—4).
- Stankoven had goals in three straight games (Feb. 26-29) to become the fifth Stars rookie in the past five years to record a three-game goal streak, joining **Wyatt Johnston** (2x: 5 GP & 3 GP in 2022-23), **Jason Robertson** (3 GP in 2020-21), **Denis Gurianov** (2x: 3 GP in 2019-20) and **Roope Hintz** (3 GP in 2018-19).
- He made his NHL debut on Feb. 24 at Carolina and led Stars forwards with three shots on goal in 15:20 TOI. Two nights later, Stankoven tallied his first career NHL goal as part of a multi-point performance (1-1—2) on Feb. 26 vs. the New York Islanders.
- A native of Kamloops, British Columbia, Stankoven was selected by Dallas in the second round (47th overall) of the 2021 NHL Draft.

## MY MIND IS SET ON OVERDRIVE

- In his first full NHL season, defenseman **Thomas Harley** led Stars blueliners in goals (15) and ranked second in assists (32) and points (15-32—47) in 79 GP.
- On April 7 at Colorado, Harley (0-3—3) assisted on each of the Stars' three goals in the second frame to tie the franchise record for most helpers in a period.
- Then, two nights later against Buffalo, he posted two assists (0-2—2) for his 13th career multi-point game - the fourth most by a defenseman at age 22 or younger in franchise history behind only **Craig Hartsburg** (32), **Brad Maxwell** (28) and **Miro Heiskanen** (24).
- On March 16 vs. LA, he became the third blueliner in franchise history with 15 goals in a season at age 22 or younger, joining **Brad Maxwell** (18 in 1977-78) and **Craig Hartsburg** (17 in 1981-82).
- With an assist on Feb. 19 at Boston, Harley (15-25—40 in 93 GP) became the fourth-fastest defenseman in franchise history to record 40 career NHL points behind **Brad Maxwell** (64 GP), **John Klingberg** (65 GP) and **Craig Hartsburg** (69 GP).
- Harley (2-0—2) scored his third overtime goal of 2023-24 (and his second OT winner in consecutive games) on Jan. 27

vs. Washington and tied **Tyler Seguin** (3 in 2019-20) and **John Klingberg** (3 in 2015-16) for the most by a player in a single season in franchise history.

- He became the sixth defenseman in NHL history with an overtime goal in consecutive games, joining **Harry Cameron** (1918-19 w/ SEN), **Greg De Vries** (2002-03 w/ COL), **Tom Poti** (2003-04 w/ NYR), **Brent Burns** (2006-07 w/ MIN) and **Dougie Hamilton** (2022-23 w/ NJD).

- Harley was the only defenseman in the NHL to have a power-play goal, shorthanded goal and an overtime goal this season.

- On Dec. 18, 2023 vs. Seattle, Harley (22 years, 121 days) became the fourth-youngest defenseman in franchise history to score an overtime goal, following **Julius Honka** (21 years, 122 days on April 4, 2017), **Bob Rouse** (21 years, 233 days on Feb. 6, 1986) and **Miro Heiskanen** (22 years, 88 days on Oct. 14, 2021).

## MARCH-ING ON

- It was a career-setting season for Stars forward **Mason Marchment**, who set personal bests in goals (22), assists (31) and points (22-31—53) in a career-high 81 GP.

- Marchment ranked seventh on the Stars in goals, eighth in points (22-31—53) and ninth in assists (31). He also shared fifth in even-strength points (16-26—42) and sixth in even-strength goals (15).

- He became the seventh Stars player in 2023-24 to reach the 20-goal mark on March 26 at San Jose.

- Marchment had points in a career-best nine consecutive games (4-9—13) Jan. 23-Feb. 17.

- He had 13 multi-point games on the season, including a three-goal, four-point performance (3-1—4) Dec. 31, 2023 vs. Chicago.

- Marchment's three-goal output on New Year's Eve was the second hat trick of his career (also 3-0—3 on Feb. 18, 2022). It also marked the fifth hat trick on New Year's Eve by a player in franchise history. He joined **Loui Eriksson** (Dec. 31, 2009), **Joe Nieuwendyk** (Dec. 31, 2000), **Brian Bellows** (Dec. 31, 1991) and **Dino Ciccarelli** (Dec. 31, 1988).

The Stars are in the postseason for a third straight year, 19th time since relocating to Dallas in 1993-94 and 36th time in franchise history. They were the first Western Conference team to clinch a playoff spot this season.

1. This is the fifth time since 2018-19 that Dallas has reached the playoffs, with forward **Roope Hintz** (19-30—49) leading the club in scoring over that span, just ahead of defenseman **Miro Heiskanen** (10-35—45). Hintz is either among or within reach of the top 10 on various franchise playoff scoring lists, while Heiskanen is top-three in career playoff goals, assists and points among defensemen in franchise history.

2. Forward **Jason Robertson** was born one month after the Stars' Stanley Cup win in 1999 and looks to lead Dallas to its first championship since. He ranked second among Stars in playoff scoring last year, behind **Roope Hintz**, as Dallas came within two victories of its second Final appearance in four seasons (they lost in the 2020 SCF).

3. Forward **Joe Pavelski** enters his 16th postseason tied with former Minnesota North Stars forward **Dino Ciccarelli** for 13th place on the league's career playoff goals list. Pavelski's last playoff goal was in Game 4 of the 2023 Western Conference Final when he became the oldest player in NHL history to fend off elimination with an OT goal. Pavelski has the most career playoff games among active players who have yet to win the Stanley Cup.

4. Pavelski ranks third in career playoff scoring among U.S.-born players, five points back of tying **Chris Chelios** for second place and seven to equal former Stars captain **Mike Modano** for the most all-time. Pavelski (182) ranks fifth all-time for career playoff games played before winning the Cup (including those who never won), behind **Ray Bourque** (214; 2001 COL), **Patrick Marleau** (195), **Joe Thornton** (187) and **Dale Hunter** (186).

5. Defenseman **Ryan Suter** tops the list for most regular-season games by active players who have yet to win the Stanley Cup – a group that includes four Stars with 1,000+ contests (also **Joe Pavelski**, **Jamie Benn** & **Matt Duchene**). Suter ranks eighth all-time for regular-season games before winning the Stanley Cup (including those who never won).

6. Forward **Wyatt Johnston**, who turns 21 on May 14, scored the series-clinching goal in both the First and Second Round last year. He can become first player in NHL history with three series-clinching goals before age 21 (currently tied with **Jaromir Jagr** and **Jeremy Roenick**). Johnston can also become the first with three before age 22.

7. Head coach **Peter DeBoer**, 7-0 in career Game 7s, has reached at least the final four six times with four different franchises.

8. The Stars/North Stars franchise has advanced to the Stanley Cup Final five times, twice while based in Minnesota and three times in Dallas. They stand as one of two non-Original Six franchises with a Final berth in four different decades (1980s, 1990s, 2000s & 2020s), alongside Philadelphia (1970s, 1980s, 1990s & 2010s).
