- The Stars will have a day off on Sunday, Nov. 19. They'll hold morning skate on Monday, Nov. 20 at 10:30 a.m. CT at American Airlines Center prior to their game against the New York Rangers at 7 p.m. CT.

NOTES:

- Dallas' four-game winning streak ended in a 6-3 defeat to Colorado on Saturday.
- Forward **Tyler Seguin** (2-0—2) opened the scoring and has recorded multiple points in each of the Stars' past two games. The last time he had multiple points in three straight games was Nov. 14-19, 2019.
- His first-period tally marked his 40th game-opening goal since he joined the Stars a decade ago the only Dallas player with as many through that span is **Jamie Benn** (51).
- Seguin has points in three consecutive games (3-3—6) and 12 points (5-7—12) in 16 GP this season.
- Forward **Mason Marchment** picked up his first multi-point game of the season with two assists (0-2—2). Marchment has three points (0-3—3) in his past three games and eight points (3-5—8) in 16 GP this season.
- Forward **Joe Pavelski** (1-0—1) recorded his seventh goal of the season to place him in a tie with **Wyatt Johnston** for the team lead in that category. Career goal No. 456 for the 39-year-old, Pavelski has amassed 1,016 points (456-

 With an assist, forward **Jason Robertson** (0-1—1) extended his point streak to three consecutive games.
- Robertson has five points (2-3—5) over that span, including a two-goal, three-point performance on Nov. 12 at Minnesota.
- Forward **Matt Duchene** (0-1—1) pushed his point streak to five consecutive games (4-5—9), his second point streak of five games this season (Oct. 24-Nov. 2).
- Goaltender Jake Oettinger made 32 saves on 37 shots in the loss, dropping his record this season to 8-3-1.
