# GAME NOTES

### THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

- Tonight is the third and final game the Stars will play against the Flames this season and the first time they are playing in Calgary this year. Dallas won their previous two meetings against Calgary defeating them 6-2 on Dec. 8 and 3-2 on March 6.
  - A win tonight could give Dallas a series sweep against Calgary for the first time since the 2018-19 season.
- Yesterday's game against the Oilers and tonight's game against the Flames is the ninth of 11 back-to-back sets that the Stars will play this season.
- The Stars enter tonight's game with a 46-21-4 record for 96 points and a .667 points percentage. Their point total, points percentage and 45 wins ranked third in the NHL this season entering play Thursday.
- Jamie Benn enters tonight's game one goal shy of scoring his 400th career goal. When he reaches the milestone, he will become...
  - The second player in franchise history to score 400 goals, joining Mike Modano (557). 438 of Modano's 557 goals were scored with the Star after the team relocated to Dallas.
  - The second player drafted in 2007 to score 400 goals, with the other being Detroit's Patrick Kane (489).
  - The 10th active skater to score 400 career goals.
- Entering play Thursday, the Stars were the only team this season to have not lost more than two consecutive games.
- Entering play Thursday, the Stars ranked in the top five in the NHL this season in goals for per game (3.37, fifth) and in goals against per game (2.58, fourth).
  - Dallas has allowed two or fewer goals in 35 of the 71 games that they have played this year.

### EXTINGUISHING THE FLAMES

• Dallas is 79-72-36 all-time vs. Calgary, including a 33-41-18 mark on the road.

- Jamie Benn has 46 points (23-23-46) in 45 career games against the Flames.
  - His 46 career points against Calgary rank tied for seventh among all active NHL skaters.
- Colin Blackwell has nine points (3-6–9) in nine career games against Calgary.
- Matt Duchene has 14 points (4-10–14) in his last 11 games against the Flames dating back to Feb. 27, 2020.
- Roope Hintz has nine points (2-7–9) in his last seven games against Calgary.
- Mason Marchment has six points (3-3–6) in eight career games against the Flames.
- Jason Robertson has 16 points (10-6—16) in 11 career games against Calgary and has totaled at least one point in 10 of those 11 games.
  - **Robertson** enters tonight's contest riding a 10-game point streak against the Flames.
- Wyatt Johnston enters tonight's contest riding a two-game point streak vs. Calgary, earning three points (2-1–3) in those games. In all, Johnston has six points (5-1–6) in eight career games played against the Flames.
- Mikael Granlund has totaled 11 points (3-8–11) in his last 11 games against Calgary. In all, Granlund has 21 points (5-16–21) in 32 career games against the Flames.
- Mikko Rantanen has recorded 24 points (11-13–24) in 21 career games vs. Calgary. Rantanen put up a four-point outing (2-2–4) against the Flames on March 12.

### **ROBO ON THE GOGO**

- Jason Robertson scored the sixth hat trick of his career (five regular season and one playoffs) in Dallas's last game a 4-3 win over the Edmont Oilers with all three of his goals coming in the second period.
- Robertson's hat trick was the first natural hat trick of his career, making him the sixth player in Stars/North Stars history with one in a single period. He joined Jamie Benn (April 7, 2018), Radek Faksa (Nov. 28, 2017), Tyler Seguin (Dec. 7, 2013), Neal Broten (Nov. 17, 1985) and Bill Goldsworthy (Dec. 11, 1973).
- It marked the second time this season that a Stars skater has scored a natural hat trick, joining **Wyatt Johnston** who did so on Jan. 28 against the Vegas Golden Knights. 2024-25 is now the second season in franchise history where the Stars/North Stars had multiple natural hat tricks, following 2017-18 (Jamie Benn & Radek Faksa) according to NHL Stats.
- **Robertson's** first goal of the night was his 30th of the season, making him the sixth player in franchise history with three 30-goal seasons at age 25 or younger according to NHL Stats, following Brian Bellows (5), Mike Modano (4), Steve Payne (4), Tyler Seguin (3) and Dino Ciccarelli (3).
- **Robertson's** third goal of the contest stood as the game winner as he surpassed Neal Broten (30) for the 10th most game-winning goals in Stars/North Stars history according to NHL Stats.
- **Robertson's** performance against the Oilers was also his 28th career multi-point game, tying Joe Nieuwendyk and Jere Lehtinen for 10th place on the franchise's all-time list according to NHL Stats.
- Robertson's third goal of the night was his 23rd since Jan. 1, which led the NHL entering play Thursday.

### IT TAKES TWO

- Jake Oettinger has an 18-6-2 record in his last 26 games played dating back to Dec. 29, posting a .911 save percentage and a 2.56 goals-against average during that span.
  - His 18 wins since Dec. 29 were tied for the most in the NHL during that span entering play Thursday.
- **Oettinger** made a season-high 41 saves in Dallas' March 26 game, a 4-3 win over the Oilers. The Stars were outshot 44-24 in that game.
- **Oettinger** made 33 saves for his 12th career shutout in Dallas' March 24 game, a 3-0 win over Minnesota, which tied Jon Casey for the sixth-most shutouts in franchise history.
  - **Oettinger** saved 5.74 goals above expected in the game according to MoneyPuck.com.
- **Oettinger's** shutout was also the 12th of his career, which tied teammate **Casey DeSmith** for the fifth-most by a U.S.born goaltender in NHL history according to NHL Stats.
- The Stars' victory over the Wild was also the 146th win of **Oettinger's** career, which passed Cesare Maniago (145) for the fourth-most wins by a goaltender in franchise history.
- **Oettinger** earned his 30th win of the season in Dallas' game on March 6, a 3-2 overtime win over the Calgary Flames. According to NHL Stats, he became the fourth goaltender in Stars/North Stars history with four or more 30-win seasons, joining Marty Turco (6x), Ed Belfour (4x) and Kari Lehtonen (4x). He also joined Turco (6 from 2002-03 to 2008-09) and Belfour (4 from 1997-98 to 2000-01) as the only netminders to do so in four consecutive campaigns with the franchise.
- **Casey DeSmith** has posted a 6-0-1 record in his last seven games played dating back to Jan. 25 against the St. Louis Blues, posting a .934 save percentage and a 1.98 goals-against average in those contests.
  - Among netminders that have played at least five games since Jan. 25, **DeSmith** ranked third and seventh, respectively, in save percentage and goals-against average.
- In all, **Oettinger** and **DeSmith** have combined for a .908 save percentage this season, which was the second-best mark of any team in the NHL this season entering play Thursday. The duo's 2.56 goals-against average this season ranked fourth in the NHL this year entering play Thursday.

### **BIKER GANG**

• Thomas Harley tallied two assists in Dallas' last game and now has 24 points (8-16–24) in his last 21 games played dating back to Jan. 31, which ranks third on Dallas' roster during that span.

- Harley has recorded multi-point efforts in three of the last five games that he has played.
- Harley's 24 points (8-16–24) since Jan. 31 were the second-most during that span among all NHL defensemen entering play Thursday, trailing only Colorado's Cale Makar (26). His eight goals since Jan. 31 were also just one shy of Makar for the most among NHL blueliners during that span entering play Thursday.
- Since Jan. 31 Dallas' first game without **Miro Heiskanen Harley** has been averaging 25:24 of ice time per game, which tops all Stars skaters and ranked fifth in the NHL entering play Thursday.
  - Prior to Jan. 31, **Harley** was averaging 22:27 of ice time per game.
  - Harley skated a career-high 31:11 in Dallas' game on March 20 against the Tampa Bay Lightning. It was the highest time on ice total by a Stars skater in a regular-season game since Heiskanen skated 32:01 on April 11, 2021 against the Nashville Predators.
- In all, **Harley** has totaled 47 points (15-32–47) in 69 regular-season games this season. His goal, assist and point totals from this season all match his career high from last year.
  - His 15 goals this season were tied for the sixth-most among all NHL defensemen this season entering play Thursday.
  - His 15 goals this year are also tied for the eighth-most by a Stars defenseman in a single season in franchise history.
- When **Harley** has been on the ice during even-strength play this season, the Stars have outscored their opponents 81-50. His plus-31 on-ice even-strength goal differential was the third-best mark among all NHL defensemen this season entering play Thursday.
- **Harley** recorded the 100th point of his NHL career with an assist in Dallas' last game, making him the third defenseman drafted in 2019 to reach the 100-point milestone, joining Detroit's Moritz Seider and Buffalo's Bowen Byram. He also became the 24th defenseman in franchise history to total 100 points with the Stars.
- Harley's 100th career point came in his 188th career regular-season games, making him the fourth-fastest defenseman in Stars/North Stars history to record 100 career points according to NHL Stats, following John Klingberg (145 GP), Craig Hartsburg (170 GP) and Brad Maxwell (170 GP).
- **Harley** matched his single-game career high with three points (1-2–3) in Dallas' March 18 game against the Ducks, surpassing Larry Murphy (93) for the 25th-most points by a defenseman in team history.
  - In that game, the Stars outshot the Ducks 15-2 when **Harley** was on the ice during 5-on-5 play according to Natural Stat Trick.
- **Harley's** game-winning goal in Dallas' March 22 game against the Flyers came just nine seconds into overtime, which set a record for the quickest overtime goal in franchise history according to NHL Stats.
- **Harley** is one of four defensemen this season to score two overtime goals. In total, he has scored five overtime goals since the start of 2023-24, which leads all NHL defensemen and is tied for fourth in the NHL.
- Harley's two-goal performance against the Flyers brought his season total up to 15, matching his career high that he set last season. He is the third defenseman in franchise history to record consecutive 15-goal seasons according to NHL Stats, joining Phillippe Boucher (2 from 2005-06 2006-07) and Lou Nanne (1971-72 1972-73).

### **ROAD WARRIORS**

- Matt Duchene leads the Stars in road scoring this season, totaling 40 points (15-25-40) in 35 games. His 40 road points were tied for eighth in the NHL this season entering play Thursday.
  - **Duchene's** 25 road assists this season are already a career high and his 40 road points are the second-most of his 16-year NHL career.
- Mikael Granlund has recorded 37 points (12-25–37) in 31 road games this season, which includes notching seven points (1-6–7) in 11 road games with this Stars. Entering play Tuesday, he was tied for 15th in the NHL in road scoring this season.
  - **Granlund's** 25 assists and 37 points on the road this season are already career bests, and his 12 goals scored on the road are tied for the most of his career.
- Duchene's and Granlund's 25 road assists this year were tied for 11th in the NHL entering play Thursday.
- Jason Robertson has been playing at a point-per-game pace on the road since Nov. 10, totaling 29 points (15-14-29) in 29 games played.
  - Robertson's 18 road goals this year were tied for sixth in the NHL entering play Thursday.
- Wyatt Johnston has been playing at a point-per-game pace on the road since Jan. 12, totaling 16 points (7-9–16) in 16 games played.
- Roope Hintz has 13 points (1-12–13) in the last 13 games he has played on the road dating back to Jan. 12.
- **Thoams Harley** has nine points (4-5–9) in his last 10 games played on the road dating back to Feb. 7. His nine points during that span were tied for the second-most among all NHL defensemen entering play Thursday.
- Mikko Rantanen has five points (2-3–5) in five road games since being acquired by the Stars.
- **Casey DeSmith** has won each of the last four games that he has played on the road dating back to Jan. 25, posting a .948 save percentage and a 1.50 goals-against average during that span.

#### POWER UP

- Since Jan. 1, the Stars have gone 30-for-94 on the power play for a 31.9 percent success rate, which was the fourth-best mark in the NHL during that span entering play Thursday.
- The team's 30 power-play goals since Jan. 1 were the second-most in the NHL entering play Thursday, trailing only the Detroit Red Wings (33) for the league lead.
- Wyatt Johnston has scored eight power-play goals since Jan. 1, which was tied for the most in the NHL during that span entering play Thursday.
  - In all this season, **Johnston** has scored a career-high 10 power-play goals, which is seven more than he had in both 2022-23 and 2023-24.
- The Stars went a perfect 4-for-4 on the power play in their game on March 2 against the Blues, marking the first time that they have scored four power-play goals in a game since Nov. 12, 2023.
  - Dallas' game against St. Louis marked one of four instances this year in which a team has scored four powerplay goals in a game. The Ottawa Senators (10/14 vs. LAK), Winnipeg Jets (10/18 vs. SJS) and Florida Panthers (12/5 at PHI) all previously did so.
- Their performance against the Blues also was the first time in Stars team history that the team had a 100 percent success rate on the power play in a single game while scoring at least four power-play goals.

#### FROM START TO FINNISH

- Prior to the 2025 NHL Trade Deadline, the Stars acquired forward **Mikko Rantanen** from the Carolina Hurricanes in exchange for forward Logan Stankoven, a 2026 first-round pick, a 2026 third-round pick, a 2027 third-round pick and a 2028 first-round pick. Once the trade was completed, **Rantanen** signed an eight-year, \$96 million extension with the Stars.
- Rantanen, who averaged 1.13 points per game in 2024-25 at the time of the trade, was scoring at the highest rate of any player dealt on the NHL trade deadline since Joe Juneau (1.14) in 1994 according to Sportsnet Stats.
- Rantanen scored a goal and added an assist in his first game with Dallas on March 8 at Edmonton, making him the fifth player in the past 10 years to record multiple points in their Stars debut according to NHL Stats. The others are Marchment (2-0–2 on Oct. 13, 2022), Mats Zuccarello (1-1–2 on Feb. 24, 2019), Connor Carrick (0-2–2 on Oct. 4, 2018) and Adam Cracknell (1-1–2 on Oct. 13, 2016).
- Rantanen's goal was also his 250th career power-play point. He became the seventh Finnish player in NHL history to reach the mark according to NHL Stats, behind Teemu Selanne (588), Jari Kurri (395), Kimmo Timonen (332), Saku Koivu (290), Teppo Numminen (274) and Mikko Koivu (251).
- Rantanen scored again in his second game with the Stars, becoming the sixth player in Stars team history to score in each of their first two games with the club according to NHL Stats. He joined Pelle Eklund in 1993-94, Lane MacDermid in 2012-13, Brett Ritchie in 2014-15, Mattias Janmark in 2015-16 and Marchement in 2022-23.
- **Rantanen** tallied the 400th assist of his career in Dallas' game on March 16 against Colorado. He became the 46th active skater and third player from the 2015 draft class (Connor McDavid, Mitch Marner) to record 400 NHL assists.
- **Rantanen** also become the 10th Finnish player in NHL history to record 400 career assists. He required the third-fewest games (636) to reach the mark behind Jari Kurri (523 GP) and Teemu Selanne (603 GP) according to NHL Stats.
- Rantanen's next goal will be his 30th of the season, which will make him the third Finnish player in NHL history to record five straight 30-goal seasons according to NHL Stats, following Jari Kurri (10 from 1980-81 1989-90) and Teemu Selanne (6 from 1995-96 2000-01).

- **Rantanen** has totaled 693 points (291-402–693) in 641 regular-season games. Among Finnish-born players in NHL history, he ranks fourth in goals (291), seventh in points (693) and 10th in assists (402).
  - Rantanen is now one of five Finnish players on Dallas' roster, joining Mikael Granlund, Miro Heiskanen, Roope Hintz and Esa Lindell.

#### A TALE OF TWO SEASONS

- Prior to Dec. 1, the Stars had a 14-8-0 record for 28 points and a 0.636 points percentage. Their 0.636 points percentage was the seventh best mark in the NHL during that span.
- Since Dec. 1, the Stars have posted a 32-13-4 record in 48 games for 68 points and a 0.694 points percentage. The team's win total and point total (tied) during that span were the best marks in the NHL entering play Thursday and their points percentage ranked second.
- Special teams have also been a point of improvement for the Stars since Dec. 1. Prior to the start of December, the Stars power play was clicking at an 18.6 percent success rate and the team was killing off 81.5 percent of the penalties they took. Since Dec. 1, the Stars have a 24.7 percent and 85.8 percent success rate on the power play and penalty kill, respectively.
- Several Stars skaters have also seen significant spikes in their offensive production:

#### **KILLING IT**

- The Stars have had an 84.4 percent success rate on the penalty kill this season, which was the second-best mark in the NHL this year entering play Thursday.
- No team in the league this season has allowed fewer power-play goals against than the Stars' 30, and their -24 goal differential on the penalty kill this year was the third-best mark in the NHL entering play Thursday.
- If the Stars maintain this pace, it would make the 2024-25 season their best on the penalty kill since 2007-08, when the team finished the season with an 85.6 percent success rate on the penalty kill.
- The Stars are also one of the least-penalized teams in the league, ranking 29th in the league in total penalty minutes (476) and penalty minutes per game (6:42) entering play Thursday.
- Entering play Thursday, **Esa Lindell** was leading all NHL skaters in both total shorthanded ice time (247:24) and shorthanded ice time per game (3:29) this season.
- Among players that have played at least 100 minutes on the penalty kill this season, **Thomas Harley** and **Sam Steel** both ranked in the top 15 in the NHL in power-play goals against entering play Thursday.
  - Harley, who has played 110:42 of shorthanded ice time, ranked fifth with 3.79.
  - **Steel** ranked 14th with 4.59. He has totaled 130:50 of shorthanded ice time and is averaging 1:54 of shorthanded ice time per game, both of which top all Dallas forwards this season.

#### **BISCH BETTER HAVE MY MONEY**

• Stars rookie Lian Bichsel has recorded at least four hits in 15 of the 20 games that he has played since being recalled from Texas (AHL) on Jan. 23. In all this season, he is averaging 17.12 hits per 60, which tops the Stars roster and ranked sixth among all NHL rookies this season to play in at least five games entering play Thursday.

- Despite only playing in 28 games this season, **Bichsel** leads all Stars skaters with 118 hits. His 120 hits ranked fifth among all NHL rookies this season entering play Thursday.
- There have been 11 instances of a Stars skater recording at least six hits in a single game this season, with **Bichsel** owning 10 of them.
- **Bichsel** is the only rookie this season to have recorded at least six hits in a game 10 times. No other rookie had done it more than four times this season entering play Thursday.
- **Bichsel** is the first Stars skater to have at least six hits in a game 10 times in a single season since Jani Hakanpää did so in 2021-22.
  - If he were to have at least six hits in one more game this season, he would become the first Stars skater to have at least six hits in 11 games since Mark Fistric (16) did so in 2011-12.

#### **IRON SHARPENS IRON**

- The Stars have four skaters that have played in at least 200 consecutive games: Jamie Benn (368), Jason Robertson (281), Esa Lindell (241) and Wyatt Johnston (235). Entering play Thursday, Dallas was the only team in the NHL to have four players riding Iron Man streaks of at least 200 games.
- Dallas' last game on March 26 against the Oilers was the 366th consecutive game that **Benn** played in, which is the fifth-longest active Iron Man streak in the NHL.
- **Robertson's** 281-game Iron Man streak is the 10th-longest in the NHL. The Stars and the Detroit Red Wings were the only teams to have two players ranked in the top 10 entering play Thursday.
- Lindell's 240-game Iron Man streak ranks seventh among all NHL defensemen.
- Johnston's Iron Man Streak began when he made his NHL debut on Oct. 13, 2022. He is one of 44 players in NHL history to begin their NHL career by playing in at least 200 consecutive games according to NHL Stats.

### ONE FOR THE HISTORY BOOKS

- Thomas Harley is two assists shy of tying Gary Sargen (71) for 25th-most assists by a defenseman in franchise history.
- **Roope Hintz** is four goals shy of tying Danny Grant (176) for 15th-most goals in franchise history.
- **Esa Lindell** is six assists shy of tying Stephane Robidas (165) for 10th-most assists by a defenseman in franchise history.
- Esa Lindell is 12 points shy of tying Lou Nanne (225) for 10th most points by a defenseman in franchise history.
