- The victory over the Ducks extended the Stars' home win streak to eight games, giving the team eight consecutive home wins for the first time since Jan. 23 to March 13, 2006.
- Their home winning streak is the second-longest active such streak, and they are one five teams this season to win at least eight consecutive home games, joining Carolina, Colorado, Los Angeles and Vegas.
- **Mikael Granlund** scored two goals, including the overtime winner, marking his first multi-goal game with the Stars.
- **Granlund's** game-winning goal was the 600th point of his career, making him the 11th Finnish player in NHL history to reach the milestone.

GAME NOTES

THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

- Tonight is the final of two games the Stars will play against the Lightning this season and the first time that they have played in Dallas this year.
 - Dallas defeated Tampa Bay, with a 4-2 win on Nov. 23.
- The Stars enter tonight's game with a 43-21-3 record for 89 points and a .664 points percentage. Their point total, points percentage and 43 wins ranked third in the NHL this season entering play Wednesday.
- **Jamie Benn** enters tonight's game one goal shy of scoring his 400th career goal. When he reaches the milestone, he will become...
 - The second player in franchise history to score 400 goals, joining Mike Modano (557). 438 of Modano's 557 goals were scored with the Star after the team relocated to Dallas.
 - The second player drafted in 2007 to score 400 goals, with the other being Detroit's Patrick Kane (485).
 - The 10th active skater to score 400 career goals.
- If **Mason Marchment** were to record an assist tonight, it would give him assists in three consecutive games for the first time this season.
- Entering play Wednesday, the Stars were the only team this season to have not lost more than two consecutive games.
- Entering play Wednesday, the Stars ranked in the top five in the NHL this season in both goals for per game (3.38, fourth) and goals against per game (2.63, tied fifth).
 - Dallas has allowed two or fewer goals in 33 of the 67 games that they have played this year.

FROM START TO FINNISH

- Prior to the 2025 NHL Trade Deadline, the Stars acquired forward **Mikko Rantanen** from the Carolina Hurricanes in exchange for forward Logan Stankoven, a 2026 first-round pick, a 2026 third-round pick, a 2027 third-round pick and a 2028 first-round pick. Once the trade was completed, **Rantanen** signed an eight-year, \$96 million extension with the Stars.
- **Rantanen**, who averaged 1.13 points per game in 2024-25 at the time of the trade, was scoring at the highest rate of any player dealt on the NHL trade deadline since Joe Juneau (1.14) in 1994 according to Sportsnet Stats.
- **Rantanen** scored a goal and added an assist in his first game with Dallas on March 8 at Edmonton, making him the fifth player in the past 10 years to record multiple points in their Stars debut according to NHL Stats. The others are **Marchment** (2-0—2 on Oct. 13, 2022), Mats Zuccarello (1-1—2 on Feb. 24, 2019), Connor Carrick (0-2—2 on Oct. 4, 2018) and Adam Cracknell (1-1—2 on Oct. 13, 2016).
- **Rantanen's** goal was also his 250th career power-play point. He became the seventh Finnish player in NHL history to reach the mark according to NHL Stats, behind Teemu Selanne (588), Jari Kurri (395), Kimmo Timonen (332), Saku Koivu (290), Teppo Numminen (274) and Mikko Koivu (251).
- **Rantanen** scored again in his second game with the Stars, becoming the sixth player in Stars team history to score in each of their first two games with the club according to NHL Stats. He joined Pelle Eklund in 1993-94, Lane MacDermid in 2012-13, Brett Ritchie in 2014-15, Mattias Janmark in 2015-16 and **Marchment** in 2022-23.
- **Rantanen** tallied the 400th assist of his career in Dallas' game on March 16 against Colorado. He became the 46th active skater and third player from the 2015 draft class (Connor McDavid, Mitch Marner) to record 400 NHL assists.
- **Rantanen** also become the 10th Finnish player in NHL history to record 400 career assists. He required the third-fewest games (636) to reach the mark behind Jari Kurri (523 GP) and Teemu Selanne (603 GP) according to NHL Stats.
- Entering play Wednesday, **Rantanen** ranked 13th in the NHL in scoring this season with 74 points (29-45—74) in 67 regular-season games with the Colorado Avalanche, Carolina Hurricanes and Stars. His assist and point totals top all Stars skaters this season.
- **Rantanen's** next goal will be his 30th of the season, which will make him the third Finnish player in NHL history to record five straight 30-goal seasons according to NHL Stats, following Jari Kurri (10 from 1980-81 – 1989-90) and Teemu Selanne (6 from 1995-96 – 2000-01).
- **Rantanen** has totaled 691 points (291-400—691) in 637 regular-season games. Among Finnish-born players in NHL history, he ranks fourth in goals (291), seventh in points (691) and 10th in assists (400).
 - **Rantanen** is now one of five Finnish players on Dallas' roster, joining **Mikael Granlund**, **Miro Heiskanen**, **Roope Hintz** and **Esa Lindell**.

LIGHTNING STRIKES TWICE

- Dallas is 30-23-6 all-time vs. Tampa Bay, including a 14-11-3 mark at home.
- The Stars have earned points in six of their last 11 games played against the Lightning (5-5-1). Dallas has also won three of their last four games at American Airlines Center against Tampa Bay.
- **Jamie Benn** has registered 22 points (11-11—22) in 30 career games against the Lightning.
- **Roope Hintz** has nine points (3-6—9) in his last nine games against Tampa Bay dating back to May 5, 2021.
- **Jason Robertson** has tallied 12 points (4-8—12) in 14 career games played against the Lightning.
- **Evgenii Dadonov** has 14 points (5-9—14) in 20 career games against Tampa Bay.
- **Mikko Rantanen** has put up 10 points (3-7—10) in 15 career games against the Lightning.
- **Matt Duchene** has 24 points (11-13—24) in 30 career games vs. Tampa Bay, which includes registering a multi-point game (1-1—2) in Dallas' last meeting against the Lightning on Nov. 23.

GOING STREAKING

- The Stars enter tonight's game riding an eight-game home winning streak dating back to Jan. 24 against the Vegas Golden Knights. During that span, the Dallas has outscored its opponents 37-22.
- Dallas' eight-game home winning streak was the second-longest active such streak in the NHL entering play Wednesday, trailing only the Colorado Avalanche who have won their last nine home games.
- It is also the Stars' longest home winning streak since they also won eight straight games at the American Airlines Center from Jan. 23 to March 13, 2006. Their eight-game win streak is tied for the second-longest in franchise history, trailing only the 11-game home win streak that the team had in 1972-73 while the franchise was located in Minnesota.
- A Dallas victory tonight would make the Stars the third team this season to win nine consecutive games at home, joining Colorado (Jan. 31 to present) and Los Angeles (Nov. 23 to Jan. 4).
- Since Jan. 24, the Stars have gone 11-for-24 on the power play at the American Airlines Center. Their 45.8 percent success rate on the power play at home was the second-best mark in the NHL during that span, and their 11 home power-play goals were tied for second entering play Wednesday.
- In all this season, the Stars have a 25-7-1 record at home. Entering play Wednesday, they ranked in the top five in the NHL in home wins (tied second), points (tied third) and points percentage (.773, fourth).
 - Dallas' 25 home wins are just one shy of matching their total of 26 from all of last season.
- The Stars are currently on pace to finish the season with 31 home wins, which would set a franchise record. The team's 29 home victories in 1989-99 are currently the most in a single season in franchise history.

HOME COOKING

- **Wyatt Johnston** has recorded a point in each of the last 15 games he has played at the American Airlines Center, making him the third player in franchise history to have a point in at least 15 consecutive home games according to NHL Stats, joining Mike Modano (16 games; Jan. 31 to April 3, 2000) and Neal Broten (18 games; Oct. 5 to Dec. 14, 1989).
- **Johnston's** home point streak is tied for the fourth-longest by any NHL skater this season and is the second-longest active such streak in the league, trailing only Nathan MacKinnon's 21-game home point streak.
- **Johnston** has also scored in each of the last six games that he has played at the American Airlines Center. If he were to do so again tonight, he would become the first Stars skater to score in seven consecutive home games since Jamie Benn did so from Nov. 14 to Dec. 11, 2015.
- **Johnston** (34 points, 33 games played), **Jason Robertson** (38 points, 33 games played) and **Roope Hintz** (36 points 31 games played) are all playing at a point-per-game pace at home this year.
 - **Robertson's** 38 home points this year are the most of any Stars skater this season.
- **Hintz** has scored 18 goals at the American Airlines Center this season, which was tied for the 10th-most home goals in the NHL entering play Wednesday. He enters tonight's game riding a five-game home point streak, recording multi-point efforts in each of those games.
- **Thomas Harley** has recorded 16 points (4-12—16) in his last 14 home games dating back to Dec. 31. His 16 home points during that span were tied for fourth among all NHL defensemen entering play Wednesday.
 - Eleven of those 16 points have come in the six home games that he has played since Feb. 2
 - He has 24 home points (6-18—24) in all this season, which was tied for 11th-most in among NHL defensemen entering play Wednesday.
- **Matt Duchene** has tallied 14 points (3-11—14) in his last 13 home games.
- **Jake Oettinger** has won the last six games that he has played at the American Airlines Center dating back to Jan. 24, posting a .909 save percentage and a 2.62 goals-against average in those games.
- **Casey DeSmith** has a 4-1-0 record at home this year, which includes winning his last three starts at the American Airlines Center.

CAREER YEARS ARE NEAR

A TALE OF TWO SEASONS

- Prior to Dec. 1, the Stars had a 14-8-0 record for 28 points and a 0.636 points percentage. Their 0.636 points percentage was the seventh best mark in the NHL during that span.
- Since Dec. 1, the Stars have posted a 29-13-3 record in 44 games for 61 points and a 0.678 points percentage. The team's win total during that span was tied for the most the NHL entering play Wednesday and their point total and points percentage ranked third and fourth, respectively.
- Special teams have also been a point of improvement for the Stars since Dec. 1. Prior to the start of December, the Stars power play was clicking at an 18.6 percent success rate and the team was killing off 81.5 percent of the penalties they took. Since Dec. 1, the Stars have a 24.8 percent and 85.8 percent success rate on the power play and penalty kill, respectively.
- Several Stars skaters have also seen significant spikes in their offensive production:

- **Robertson** (seventh) and **Johnston** (tied 10th) both ranked in the top 10 in the NHL in scoring since Dec. 1 entering play Wednesday.

BIKER GANG

- **Thomas Harley** matched his single-game career high with three points in Dallas' last game, scoring one goal and adding two assists. He now has 19 points (6-13-19) in his last 17 games played dating back to Jan. 31.
 - His 19 points during that span rank fifth on Dallas' roster.
 - With his three points on March 18, **Harley** surpassed Larry Murphy (93) for the 25th-most points by a defenseman in team history.
- In Dallas' last game, the Stars outshot the Ducks 15-2 when **Harley** was on the ice during 5-on-5 play according to Natural Stat Trick.
- **Harley's** 19 points since Jan. 31 were the second-most during that span among all NHL defensemen entering play Wednesday, trailing only Colorado's Cale Makar (22).
- Since Jan. 31 – Dallas' first game without **Miro Heiskanen** – **Harley** has been averaging 25:16 of ice time per game, which tops all Stars skaters and ranked sixth in the NHL entering play Wednesday.
 - Prior to Jan. 31, **Harley** was averaging 22:27 of ice time per game.
- In all, **Harley** has totaled 42 points (13-29-42) in 65 regular-season games this season, which puts him on pace to finish the 2024-25 regular season with a career-high 16 goals, 36 assists and 52 points.
 - His 13 goals this season were tied for the seventh-most among all NHL defensemen this season entering play Wednesday.
- **Harley** enters tonight's game five points shy of totaling 100 career points. He will become the third defenseman drafted in 2019 to reach the 100-point milestone, joining Detroit's Moritz Seider and Buffalo's Bowen Byram.

JOHNNY B. GOODE

- On March 8, **Wyatt Johnston** signed a five-year, \$42 million contract extension with the Stars that will begin next season and carry an average annual value (AAV) of \$8.4 million.
- **Johnston** has 62 points (25-37-62) in 67 games this season, which ranks fourth on the Stars in scoring and makes the 2024-25 season his second-consecutive 60-point season. He's now on pace to finish the year with 76 points, which would be a career high.
- **Johnston** scored the third hat trick of his career and his second of the season in Dallas' March 2 game, a 6-3 win over the St. Louis Blues. **Johnston** tied Steve Payne for the second-most hat tricks in franchise history by a player before turning 22 according to NHL Stats.
- According to NHL Stats, **Johnston's** hat trick also made him the ninth active player to score at least three career hat tricks before his 22nd birthday.
- All three of **Johnston's** goals came on the power play, making him the second player this season to score three power-play goals in a game, joining Patrik Laine who did so on Dec. 17 against the Buffalo Sabres.

- **Johnston's** performance against the Blues marked the eighth time in franchise history – and first since Philippe Boucher on Nov. 24, 2006 – that a Stars/North Stars skater has scored three power-play goals in a single game.
- **Johnston's** first goal of the night was the 75th of his career, making him the third players in franchise history to score 75 career goals before turning 22 according to NHL Stats. The others are Bruan Bellows (133 in 311 games played) and Mike Modano (90 in 235 games played).
- His second goal of the night was his 20th of the season, which made him the third player in franchise history to record three 20-goal seasons before the age of 22 according to NHL Stats, joining Brian Bellows (4) and Mike Modano (3).
- **Johnston's** tallied his 34th assist of the season in Dallas' Feb. 25 game against the Columbus Blue Jackets, which set a career high for the forward.
- **Johnston** scored his third shorthanded goal of the season in Dallas' Feb. 22 game against the New Jersey Devils. Entering play Wednesday, his three shorthanded goals were tied for fifth in the NHL this year.
- The goal was also the sixth shorthanded tally of his career. Since **Johnston** made his NHL debut, his six shorthanded goals rank second on Dallas' roster (**Roope Hintz**; 7) and are tied for 10th in the NHL.

POWER UP

- Since Jan. 1, the Stars have gone 27-for-81 on the power play for a 33.3 percent success rate, which was tied with Detroit for the second-best mark in the NHL during that span entering play Wednesday.
- The team's 27 power-play goals since Jan. 1 were the second-most in the NHL entering play Wednesday, trailing only the Detroit Red Wings (30) for the league lead.
- **Wyatt Johnston** has scored seven power-play goals since Jan. 1, which was tied for the second-most in the NHL during that span entering play Wednesday, trailing only Edmonton's Leon Draisaitl (8).
 - In all this season, **Johnston** has scored a career-high nine power-play goals, which is six more than he had in both 2022-23 and 2023-24.
- The Stars went a perfect 4-for-4 on the power play in their game on March 2 against the Blues, marking the first time that they have scored four power-play goals in a game since Nov. 12, 2023.
 - Dallas' game against St. Louis marked one of four instances this year in which a team has scored four power-play goals in a game. The Ottawa Senators (10/14 vs. LAK), Winnipeg Jets (10/18 vs. SJS) and Florida Panthers (12/5 at PHI) all previously did so.
- Their performance against the Blues also was the first time in Stars team history that the team had a 100 percent success rate on the power play in a single game while scoring at least four power-play goals.

GOALIE GANG

- **Jake Oettinger** has an 15-6-2 record in his last 23 games played dating back to Dec. 29, posting a .905 save percentage and a 2.68 goals-against average during that span.
 - His 15 wins since Dec. 29 were tied for the fourth-most in the NHL entering play Wednesday.
- **Oettinger** earned his 30th win of the season in Dallas' game on March 6, a 3-2 overtime win over the Calgary Flames. According to NHL Stats, he became the fourth goaltender in Stars/North Stars history with four or more 30-win seasons, joining Marty Turco (6x), Ed Belfour (4x) and Kari Lehtonen (4x). He also joined Turco (6 from 2002-03 to 2008-09) and Belfour (4 from 1997-98 to 2000-01) as the only netminders to do so in four consecutive campaigns with the franchise.
- **Oettinger** made a season-high 39 saves in Dallas' March 2 game, a 6-3 win over the Blues. The Stars were outshot 42-21 in that game.
- **Casey DeSmith** has won each of the last six games that he has played dating back to Jan. 25 against the St. Louis Blues, posting a .931 save percentage and a 2.01 goals-against average in those contests.
 - Among netminders that have played at least five games since Jan. 25, **DeSmith** ranked fifth and seventh, respectively, in save percentage and goals-against average.
- **DeSmith's** six-game win streak is the longest streak of his career and was the longest active such streak in the NHL entering play Wednesday. If he were to win the next game that he plays, he would become the seventh goaltender this season to have a win streak of at least seven games.
- In all, **Oettinger** and **DeSmith** have combined for a .904 save percentage this season, which was tied for the fourth-best mark of any team in the NHL this season entering play Wednesday. Only Winnipeg (.915), Tampa Bay (.907) and Washington (.906) ranked higher.
- The duo's 2.61 goals-against average this season was tied for fifth in the NHL this year entering play Wednesday.

BISCH BETTER HAVE MY MONEY

- Stars rookie **Lian Bichsel** has played in 16 games for Dallas since being recalled from Texas (AHL) on Jan. 23. In those games, the Stars have outshot their opponents 101-93 and have 109 scoring chances to their 91 when **Bichsel** has been on the ice during 5-on-5 play according to Natural Stat Trick.
 - His 54.4 shots for percentage tops all Stars skaters during that span.
- **Bichsel** has recorded at least four hits in 13 of the 16 games that he has played since being recalled from Texas (AHL). In all this season, he is averaging 16.8 hits per 60, which tops the Stars roster and ranked seventh among all NHL rookies this season to play in at least five games entering play Wednesday.

- Despite only playing in 24 games this season, **Bichsel** leads all Stars skaters with 100 hits. His 100 hits ranked seventh among all NHL rookies this season entering play Wednesday.
 - He is the only player rookie to record 100 hits this season to have played in fewer than 30 games this year.
- There have been nine instances of a Stars skater recording six hits in a single game this season, with **Bichsel** owning eight of them.
- **Bichsel** is the only rookie this season to have recorded at least six hits in a game eight times. No other rookie had done it more than four times this season entering play Wednesday.
- **Bichsel** is the first Stars skater to have at least six hits in a game eight times in a single season since Jani Hakanpää (9) did so in 2022-23.

KILLING IT

- The Stars have had an 84.3 percent success rate on the penalty kill this season, which was the second-best mark in the NHL this year entering play Wednesday.
- No team in the league this season has allowed fewer power-play goals against than the Stars' 28, and their -22 goal differential on the penalty kill this year was the third-best mark in the NHL entering play Wednesday.
- If the Stars maintain this pace, it would make the 2024-25 season their best on the penalty kill since 2007-08, when the team finished the season with an 85.6 percent success rate on the penalty kill.
- The Stars are also one of the least-penalized teams in the league, ranking 30th in the league in total penalty minutes (440) and 29th in penalty minutes per game (6:34) entering play Wednesday.
- Entering play Wednesday, **Esa Lindell** was leading all NHL skaters in both total shorthanded ice time (228:03) and shorthanded ice time per game (3:24) this season.
- Among players that have played at least 100 minutes on the penalty kill this season, **Thomas Harley** and **Sam Steel** both ranked in the top 15 in the NHL in power-play goals against entering play Wednesday.
 - **Harley**, who has played 105:54 of shorthanded ice time, ranked seventh with 3.97.
 - **Steel** ranked 12th with 4.44. He has totaled 121:38 of shorthanded ice time and is averaging 1:52 of shorthanded ice time per game, both of which top all Dallas forwards this season.

IRON SHARPENS IRON

- The Stars have four skaters that have played in at least 200 consecutive games: **Jamie Benn** (364), **Jason Robertson** (277), **Esa Lindell** (237) and **Wyatt Johnston** (231).
