FLAMES LAST GAME RECAP November 13, 2025 – CALGARY FLAMES [2] vs. SAN JOSE SHARKS [0]

Game Summary I Event Summary

The Calgary Flames earned a 2–0 shutout victory over the San Jose Sharks on Thursday night at the Scotiabank Saddledome. After a scoreless first period which saw Calgary outshoot San Jose 13–1, the Flames broke through early in the second when Blake Coleman buried his team-leading seventh goal of the year at the 5:46 mark to give Calgary a 1–0 lead, and they would clamp down defensively from there. The Flames sealed the win in the final seconds when rookie Samuel Honzek scored into the empty net with just five seconds remaining in the contest. Dustin Wolf was perfect on the night, posting a 16-save shutout, his first of the season and the fourth of his NHL career to earn first-star honors.

TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS

This is the third and final meeting this season between the Flames and Jets. Calgary has fallen in both prior matchups with Winnipeg.

This is a Pacific Division versus Central Division matchup; the Flames have a record of 0-8-0 against Central Division teams and a record of 2-11-0 against Western Conference opponents.

THE TEXAS TIGER:

Blake Coleman opened the scoring on Thursday against San Jose, recording his 14th game-opening goal since joining Calgary in 2021–22. Only Mikael Backlund and Jonathan Huberdeau have more over that span (both with 15). His tally also stood as the game-winner, giving him 17 GWGs during his Flames tenure — the most by any Calgary skater in that timeframe. The Plano, TX product has two points (1G, 1A) in two games against Winnipeg so far in 2025–26 and leads the Flames with seven goals on the season.

HOWLIN FOR YOU:

With his 16-save effort against San Jose on Thursday, Dustin Wolf became just the second California-born goaltender to record a shutout against a California-based team in NHL history, joining Thatcher Demko (Dec. 6, 2021 vs. LAK). Wolf now has four NHL shutouts in his career, tying Pat Riggin for the third-most by a Flames goaltender before age 25. Only Dan Bouchard (11) and Trevor Kidd (10) had more at that age.

FROM CALEDON, WITH KER(INS):

On Thursday morning, the Flames recalled forward Rory Kerins from the AHL's Calgary Wranglers. In 13 American Hockey League contests, Kerins posted a team-leading 14 points (5G, 9A), tying him for fifth in league scoring at the time of his recall.

Last season, Kerins skated in his first NHL game on January 13, 2025, in Chicago and wasted no time making an impact — recording an assist on his first shift just 74 seconds into his debut to register his first NHL point. He added another helper later in the period, becoming just the fifth player in Flames franchise history to register multiple assists in their first NHL game, joining Kevin LaVallee (0-3—3 on Oct. 9, 1980), Sergei Makarov (1-2—3 on Oct. 5, 1989), Yves Courteau (0-2—2 on Oct. 13, 1984), and Kent Nilsson (1-2—3 on Oct. 10, 1979).

Kerins also became just the second Flames player since 2009-10 to record a point on their first NHL shift, joining Sam Bennett (April 11, 2015 at WPG).

FROSTY THE SNOWMAN:

Morgan Frost enters tonight's contest with 99-career assists and sits one helper away from reaching the 100-assist milestone. With one more, Frost would become the 11th player from the 2017 NHL Draft class to record 100 career assists. The Aurora, ON native collected his first career assist in his second NHL game on November 21, 2019, in Carolina, setting up the game-winning goal as a member of the Philadelphia Flyers.

RAZZLE DAZZLE:

Rasmus Andersson scored on Tuesday night in St. Louis to record his 50th-career goal in the NHL. Andersson has become the eighth defenseman in Flames history with 50 career goals. He is also one of just seven defencemen in Flames franchise history to record 250-or-more points in the regular season and playoffs combined. The others: Al MacInnis (924), Gary Suter (603), Paul Reinhart (517), Mark Giordano (516), T.J. Brodie (281), and Jamie Macoun (271).

FAMILY TIES:

Flames assistant coach Dave Lowry is the father of Jets captain Adam Lowry. Dave spent time in Winnipeg as an assistant coach in 2020 before taking over as interim head coach the following season. He has strong ties to Calgary, having served two stints as an assistant coach with the Flames and captained the club as a player from 2000 to 2002. Lowry also played his 1000th NHL game as a member of the Flames on December 8th, 2001.

HUBY DOO:

Johnathan Huberdeau has accumulated 790 points in his NHL career and is just 10-shy of reaching the 800-point mark. Huberdeau ranks third in points among all skaters drafted in 2011, trailing only Nikita Kucherov (1,008) and Mark Scheifele (827) There are 25-active skaters who has surpassed 800 points in the NHL.

HEY DID YOU KNOW?

Rasmus Andersson skated in his 500th NHL game against the Jets last season on January 18th, 2025 at Canada Life Center. The same night, Ryan Lomberg skated in his 300th NHL game.
