- Seven different Stars skaters registered a point during the game. Matt Duchene and Wyatt Johnston both had multipoint outings.
- With the win, the Stars extended their road point streak against the Devils to five games, tying their second-longest active run versus a single franchise (also 5 GP vs. Nashville).
- Thomas Harley (10-20—30 in 54 GP) scored his 10th goal of 2024-25 and became the fourth Stars defensement or reach the mark in consecutive seasons in the past 20 years, according to NHL Stats.
- Wyatt Johnston (1-1—2) recorded his 32nd multi-point game to pass Dino Ciccarelli (31) for the fifth-most instances by a player age 21 or younger in franchise history, according to NHL Stats.

GAME NOTES

THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

- Tonight is the final of two games the Stars will play against the Islanders this season and the only time the teams are facing off in New York this year. Dallas shutout New York 3-0 in the two teams' previous meeting on Oct. 12.
- Tonight's game against the Islanders and yesterday's game against the Devils is the eighth of 11 back-to-back sets that the Stars will play this season.
- Since Jan. 1, Matt Duchene (9-15—24) and Wyatt Johnston (8-16—24) have each totaled 24 points in 20 games. Entering play Sunday, their 24 points since the start of the new year were tied for the fifth-most in the NHL.
 - o Jason Robertson's 23 points (11-12-23) since Jan. 1 were tied for eighth in the NHL entering play Sunday.
- The Stars enter tonight's game with a 36-18-2 record for 74 points and a .661 points percentage. Their win total, point total and points percentage all ranked third in the NHL this season entering play Sunday.
 - o Of the top eight ranked teams, six of them are in the Western Conference: Winnipeg (.728), Dallas, Edmonton (.643), Vegas (.643), Minnesota (.632) and Los Angeles (.620). The Washington Capitals (.732) top both the NHL and the Eastern Conference and the Toronto Maple Leafs (.625) rank seventh.
- Entering play Sunday, the Stars and the Washington Capitals were the only NHL teams this season that have not lost more than two consecutive games.
- The Stars have allowed only 2.50 goals against per game this season, which was tied for the second-best mark in the NHL entering play Sunday. Dallas has allowed two or fewer goals in 30 of the 56 games that they have played this year.

CONNECT FOUR

- Five Stars players represented their home country at the recently completed 4 Nations Face-Off: Mikael Granlund (Finland), Thomas Harley (Canada), Roope Hintz (Finland), Esa Lindell (Finland) and Jake Oettinger (United States). Dallas defenseman Miro Heiskanen was originally selected to Finland's roster but had to withdraw from the tournament due to injury.
- The Stars were also well-represented among the 4 Nations staff, with Jim Nill (Associate GM), Pete DeBoer (Assistant Coach) and Misha Donskov (Assistant Coach) all joining Canada's staff for the tournament. Additionally, former Star Jere Lehtinen served as Finland's General Manager.
- Harley, Nill, DeBoer and Donskov won the 4 Nations Face-Off Championship after Canada defeated the Untied States 3-2 in overtime on Feb. 20.
- Harley, who was originally added to Canada's roster as an injury replacement, appeared in two games for his home country, both against the United States. He tallied one assist and averaged 20:07 of ice time per game.
- When Harley was on the ice during 5-on-5 play in the two games he played, the Canadians outshot the Americans 17-11. His plus-6 on-ice shot differential was the best mark of any Canadian defenseman in those two games.
- Granlund finished the tournament with four points (3-1-4) in three games for the Finns. His three goals were tied for the second-most among all skaters and his four points tied for fourth.
- Lindell and Hintz each appeared in three games for Finland, with Lindell scoring one goal.
- The 4 Nations Face-Off marked the first time that Granlund, Hintz and Lindell played for Finland together. Granlund and Lindell had previously represented Finland together three times: at the 2016 and 2022 IIHF World Championships and at the 2016 World Cup of Hockey.
- Oettinger started one game for the Americans, stopping 21 of the 23 shots he faced for a .913 save percentage and a 2.06 goals-against average.

LONELY ISLAND

- Dallas is 47-55-21 all-time vs. New York, including a 21-30-11 mark on the road.
- The Stars have earned points in 11 or their last 13 games against the Islanders, including recording points in their last six consecutive games (4-0-2). Since the 2017-18 season, Dallas has held a .731 point percentage against the Islanders, which ranks fifth among all NHL teams during that span.
- Matt Duchene has five points (2-3—5) in his last four games against the Islanders.
- In five career games played, Jake Oettinger has posted a 4-1-0 record against the Islanders, posting a 1.58 goals-against average and a .941 save percentage in those contests.
 - He enters tonight's matchup riding a four-game win streak.
- Logan Stankoven recorded a multi-point outing, adding one goal and one assist, against the Islanders which was played on Feb. 26, 2024 in Dallas.
- Wyatt Johnston enters tonight's matchup riding a two-game point streak against New York, earning two points (0-2— 2) in those games. In his career against the Islanders, Johnston has registered two points (0-2-2) in five games.
- Mason Marchment has four points (1-3-4) in seven career games against the Islanders. In Dallas' last game against New York on Oct. 12, 2024, Marchment recorded a multi-point outing (0-2-2).

DOUBLE DUTCH

- Matt Duchene has recorded multi-point efforts in each of Dallas' last three games, scoring two goals and adding an assist on Feb. 7 against the Kings and again on Feb. 8 against the Sharks, and then scoring the game-winning goal and notching an assist on Feb. 22 against the Devils.
- Duchene's performances against the Devils brought his season point total up to 57 (23-34-57), which leads all Stars skaters. It puts him on pace to finish the season with 33 goals, 50 assists and 83 points. Fifty assists would be a career high, and 33 goals and 83 points would both be the second-best marks of his career.
 - If he were to finish the year with at least 83 points, it would make him the highest-scoring Star since Jason Robertson had 109 points in 2022-23. It would also make him the third Stars skater in the last 10 years to have at least 83 points in a season, joining Robertson and Jamie Benn in 2014-15 and 2015-16.
- If Duchene were to have at least two points again tonight, it would give him four consecutive multi-point games for the second time this season.
- Since Jan. 1, Duchene has totaled 24 points (

BIKER GANG

- Thomas Harley has tallied seven points (3-4-7) in his last six games dating back to Jan. 31 against the Vancouver Canucks. His seven points during that span trail only Matt Duchene (9) for the team lead.
- Harley's seven points since Jan. 31 were also tied for the second-most among all NHL defensemen during that span entering play Sunday, trailing only Buffalo's Rasmus Dahlin (10).
- Harley has scored in each of Dallas' last three games on Feb. 7 against Los Angeles, on Feb. 8 against San Jose and on Feb. 22 against New Jersey. If he were to do so again tonight, it would give him goals in four consecutive games for the first time in his career.
 - His current three-game goal streak is already a career best.

- A point of any kind tonight would extend Harley's point streak to four games for the first time since March 14 to 22, 2024.
- When Harley had been on the ice during even-strength play this season, the Stars have outscored their opponents 65-35. Entering play Sunday, his plus-30 goal differential was tied for the second-best mark among all NHL skaters this year and his 65 goals for were tied for eighth.
 - Additionally, Harley has logged a plus-27 plus/minus rating this season, which ranked seventh in the NHL and ranked fourth among all NHL defensemen entering play Sunday.
- In all, **Harley** has totaled 30 points (10-20—30) in 54 regular-season games this season, which would put him on pace to finish the 2024-25 regular season with 14 goals, 30 assists and 44 points, all of which would be the second-highest totals of his career.
 - His 10 goals this season were tied for the sixth-most among all NHL defensemen this season entering play Sunday.

DALLAS MAVRIK

- Mavrik Bourque enters tonight's game riding a four-game point streak dating back to Feb. 2 against the Columbus Blue
 Jackets. A goal or an assist tonight would give him points in five consecutive games for the first time in his career.
 - Only four other rookies this season have had a point streak of at least five games: Macklin Celebrini, Lane Hutson, Matvei Michkov and Will Smith.
- Since Jan. 1, **Bourque** has scored six goals including the Stars fifth of the game in their game on Feb. 8 against the San Jose Sharks. His six goals during that span were the second-most among all NHL rookies entering play Sunday, trailing only Detroit's Marco Kasper (7).
 - o Bourque's six goals since Jan. 1 are tied for fourth on Dallas' roster.
- In all, **Bourque** has totaled 10 points (6-4—10) since Jan. 1, which is three points better than the seven he had from the start of the regular season through Dec. 31. His 10 points since Jan. 1 were tied for fourth among all NHL rookies entering play Sunday.

BENN THERE DONE THAT

- Stars captain **Jamie Benn** enters tonight's game riding a five-game point streak, scoring one goal and adding five assists during that span.
- A goal or an assist tonight would give Benn points in six consecutive games for first time his he had a point in eight straight games from March 12 to 28, 2024. An assist tonight would also extend Benn's assist streak to six games for the second time since Feb. 21 to March 3, 2020.
- Benn enters tonight's game three goals shy of scoring his 400th career goal. When he reaches the milestone, he will become...
 - The second player in franchise history to score 400 goals, joining Mike Modano (557). 438 of Modano's 557 goals were scored with the Star after the team relocated to Dallas.
 - o The second player drafted in 2007 to score 400 goals, with the other being Detroit's Patrick Kane (483).
 - o The 10th active skater to score 400 career goals.

ROAD WARRIORS

- Matt Duchene is the Stars' leading scorer when playing on the road this year, recording 34 points (14-20—34) in 28 games played. His 34 road points this season were tied for fifth in the NHL entering play Sunday.
- Wyatt Johnston has totaled 20 points (8-12—20) in his last 20 road games dating back to Nov. 17.
- Jason Robertson has been playing at a point-per-game pace on the road since Dec. 3, totaling 16 points (6-10—16) in 16 games played.
- Mikael Granlund has seven points (2-5—7) in his last seven games played on the road, which includes tallying three assists in four road games since being acquired by Dallas.

KILLING IT

- The Stars enter tonight's game with the second-ranked penalty kill in the NHL this season, going 128-for-151 for an 84.8 percent success rate.
- No team in the league this season has allowed fewer power-play goals against than the Stars' 23, and their -18 goal
 differential on the penalty kill this year was also tied for the best mark in the NHL entering play Sunday.
- If the Stars maintain this pace, it would make the 2024-25 season their best on the penalty kill since 2007-08, when the team finished the season with an 85.6 percent success rate on the penalty kill.
- The Stars are also one of the least-penalized teams in the league, ranking 29th in the league in both total penalty minutes (367) and penalty minutes per game (6:33).
- Entering play Sunday, Esa Lindell was leading all NHL skaters it total shorthanded ice time (195:02) and ranked second in shorthanded ice time per game (3:29) this season.
- Sam Steel ranked four in the NHL entering play Sunday in power-play goals against per 60 (4.10) among players to have played at least 100 minutes on the penalty kill this season.
 - Steel has totaled 102:20 of shorthanded ice time and is averaging 1:54 of shorthanded ice time per game, both
 of which top all Dallas forwards this season.

 Among players that have played at least 50 minutes on the penalty kill this season, Thomas Harley (who has totaled 97:53 of shorthanded ice time) ranked ninth in the NHL in power-play goals against per 60 with 3.68 entering play Sunday.

BISCH BETTER HAVE MY MONEY

- Stars rookie Lian Bichsel had two assists in Dallas' game on Feb. 8, an 8-3 win over the San Jose Sharks. It marked both the first multi-point performance of his career and the first time that he has recorded a point in a road game.
- Bichsel's assists brought his season point total up to five (2-3—5), which tied him for fifth in scoring among rookie defensemen this season entering play Sunday. He is also averaging 0.29 points per game this year, which ranked sixth among rookie defensemen.
- **Bichsel** has recorded at least four hits in eight of the nine games that he has played since being recalled from Texas (AHL). In all this season, he is averaging 16 hits per 60, which tops the Stars roster and ranked eighth among all NHL rookies this season to play in at least five games entering play Sunday.
- Despite only playing in 17 games this season, Bichsel is tied for second on the Stars roster with 70 hits.
- There have been six instances of a Stars skater recording seven hits in a single game this season, with Bichsel owning five of them.

HEATING UP

- Jake Oettinger has an 10-3-1 record in his last 14 games played dating back to Dec. 29, posting a .918 save percentage and a 2.19 goals-against average during that span.
 - o His 10 wins since Dec. 29 were tied for the third-most in the NHL entering play Sunday.
- Jason Robertson has been playing at a point-per-game pace since Nov. 8, totaling 44 points (16-28—44) in 44 games.
- Wyatt Johnston has 42 points (15-27—42) in his last 41 games played dating back to Nov. 15.
- A goal or an assist tonight would give **Mathew Dumba** a point in four consecutive games for the first time since Dec. 4 to 12, 2021.
- Colin Blackwell enters tonight's game riding a three-game personal point streak, scoring one goal and adding two
 assists during that span. If he were to score a goal or tally an assist in his next game, it would give him points in four
 consecutive games for the second time in his career and for the first time since Feb. 21 to 27, 2020.
- Mikael Granlund has 12 points (3-9—12) in his last 12 games played, including tallying four assists in his first five games as a member of the Stars.
- Roppe Hintz has nine points (3-6-9) in his last nine games dating back to Jan. 24.

BACK TO DECEMBER

- Since Dec. 23, the Stars have posted a 17-5-2 record for 36 points and a .750 points percentage. Dallas' win and point total were both the best marks in the league during that span entering play Sunday and their points percentage ranked second.
- During that span, the Stars have outscored their opponents 83-57. No team had scored more goals than the Stars since Dec. 23 entering play Sunday.
- The team's plus-26 goal differential was tied for the second-best mark in the league since Dec. 23 entering play Sunday, trailing only the Winnipeg Jets (plus-27).
- Fifty-nine of Dallas' 83 goals since Dec. 23 have been scored at 5-on-5, which was the second-most in the NHL entering play Sunday, trailing only the Buffalo Sabres (61).
- Wyatt Johnston is the team's leading scorer since Dec. 23, totaling 30 points (11-19—30) in 24 games played. His 30 points during that span were tied for fourth in the NHL entering play Sunday.
- Jason Robertson has scored 13 goals since Dec. 13, which tops all Stars skaters and was tied for third in the NHL entering play Sunday.

DADDY ISSUES

- Evgenii Dadonov scored a goal in Dallas' last game on Feb. 22 against the New Jersey Devils and now has nine points (4-5—8) in his last nine games.
- A goal or an assist tonight would give **Dadonov** points in four consecutive games for the first time since March 17 to 26, 2022.
- Dadonov's goal against the Devils brought his season point total up to 32 (16-16—32), with the 2024-25 season being the sixth 30-point season of his career.
- His goal was also his 16th of the season. **Dadonov** is the fourth-oldest player this season to have scored at least 15 goals, trailing Alex Ovechkin (26), Sidney Crosby (18) and Brad Marchand (20).
- Dadonov scored twice, including the game winner, in Dallas' game on Feb. 2 against the Columbus Blue Jackets. His second goal of the night was the 350th point of his career, which ranks ninth among active, Russian skaters.
- Dadonov is now on pace to finish the year with 23 goals and 46 points, both of which would be his highest totals since he had 25 goals and 47 points for the Florida Panthers in 2019-20.

IRON SHARPENS IRON

- The Stars have four skaters that have played in at least 200 consecutive games: Jamie Benn (353), Jason Robertson (266), Esa Lindell (226) and Wyatt Johnston (220). Entering play Sunday, Dallas was the only team in the NHL to have four players riding Iron Man streaks of at least 200 games.
- Dallas' last game on Feb. 22 against the Devils was the 353rd consecutive game that Benn played in, which is the fifthlongest active Iron Man streak in the NHL.
- Robertson's 266-game Iron Man streak is the 13th-longest in the NHL. The Stars and the Detroit Red Wings were the
 only teams to have two players ranked in the top 15 entering play Sunday.
- Lindell's 226-game Iron Man streak ranks eighth among all NHL defensemen.
- Johnston's Iron Man Streak began when he made his NHL debut on Oct. 13, 2022. He is one of 44 players in NHL history
 to begin their NHL career by playing in at least 200 consecutive games according to NHL Stats.
