AT A GLANCE

IT’S ALL ALEX

On Saturday in Ottawa, forward **Alex Laferriere** scored his fifth goal of the season to extend his point streak to a fourth game, dating back to the start of the Kings’ road-trip on Sunday, Nov. 9, in Pittsburgh. With his second goal in as many games (1 G, Nov. 13 at TOR), Laferriere matched his career-long four-game point streak achieved on two prior occasions: 2-2=4, Oct. 26 – Nov. 1, 2025, and 2-4=6, Apr. 5 – 12, 2025. With the 1-0 score holding through more than 50 minutes of action in Saturday’s contest, Laferriere’s goal stands as his first game-winner of the season and seventh of his career. The native of Chatham, N.J. can notch a new career-long point streak should he earn his first career point against the Washington Capitals tomorrow at Capital One Arena.





QB STREAK

Forward **Quinton Byfield** takes the ice tomorrow in the District of Columbia tied with **Adrian Kempe** (13 A) for the most assists by a Kings skater after recording his 13th of the season on Saturday in Ottawa. In doing so, the 23-year-old extended his point streak to a third game (2-3=5) dating back to Nov. 11 in Montreal. Byfield’s two-point performance in Montreal included his first game-winning goal of the year and followed two separate three-point games (2-1=3; Dec. 7, 2023, and 0-3=3; Feb. 5, 2025) against the Canadiens, making the forward the first player in Kings history to record three multi-point games against Montreal before his 24th birthday. Byfield then mirrored that performance by posting his team-leading sixth multi-point game (1-1=2) of the season on Thursday, Nov. 13, in Toronto.



THE KUEMPIRE STRIKES BACK

Goaltender **Darcy Kuemper** skates into Capital One Arena after stopping 12 of the Maple Leafs’ 15 shots on goal to earn his seventh win of the season on Thursday in Toronto, extending his point streak on the road to eight consecutive results (6-0-2), dating back to Oct. 13 in Minnesota. Last season, the 6-5, 215-pound goaltender earned his 199th and 200th career victories by posting consecutive shutouts against his former team and tomorrow’s opponent, the Washington Capitals, on March 13, and the Nashville Predators on March 15. The pair of wins were the first time a Kings goalie recorded back-to-back shutouts since Kuemper himself did so on Jan. 30 and Feb. 3, 2018.


