COLORADO AVALANCHE

All-Time Wild Record: 61-55-13 (34-26-5 at Grand Casino Arena, 27-29-8 at Colorado)

2024-25: Minnesota went 2-2-0 against Colorado...Colorado won the series-opening game, 6-1, at Grand Casino Arena (1/9), and the third game, 5-2, in Denver (2/28)...Minnesota won the second game, 3-1, at Ball Arena (1/20) and the series finale, 2-1, in a shootout in Saint Paul (3/11)...C **Freddy Gaudreau** (0-2=2), D **Brock Faber** (1-1=2), D **Jake Middleton** (1-1=2), C **Marco Rossi** (0-2=2) and C **Yakov Trenin** (1-1=2) each led the Wild with two points against the Avalanche...G **Filip Gustavsson** went 1-2-0 with a 3.59 GAA and a .869 SV% in three games...G **Marc-Andre Fleury** saved 21-of-22 shots faced to earn the win in the second game...C **Ross Colton** led Colorado with five points (3-2=5)...C **Nathan MacKinnon** had four points (2-2=4), and LW **Jonathan Drouin** (1-2=3) and LW **Joel Kiviranta** (1-2=3) each had three points...G **Mackenzie Blackwood** went 2-1-1 with a 1.74 GAA and a .926 SV% in starting all four games for Colorado.

WILD LEADERS: RW **Vladimir Tarasenko** leads Minnesota with 35 points (15-20=35) in 47 games against Colorado...RW **Mats Zuccarello** owns 32 points (7-25=32) in 34 career matches...LW **Kirill Kaprizov** (12-8=20, in 18 games) and D **Jared Spurgeon** (5-15=20, in 61 games) each have 20 points...C **Ryan Hartman** owns 18 points (9-9=18) in 38 contests.

WILD GOALIES: Gustavsson is 2-7-1 with a 3.81 GAA and a .884 SV% in nine starts against Colorado...G **Jesper Wallstedt** has not faced Colorado.

AVALANCHE LEADERS: MacKinnon leads the Avalanche with 63 points (23-40=63) in 51 career games against Minnesota...LW **Gabriel Landeskog** owns 42 points (20-22=42) in 42 games...D **Brent Burns** has 29 points (5-17=29) in 45 games...D **Cale Makar** has 22 points (5-17=22) in 25 games.

AVALANCHE GOALIES: Blackwood has a 2-4-2 record with a 2.72 GAA and a .904 SV% in eight career starts vs. Minnesota...G **Scott Wedgewood** has a 1-1-2 record with a 2.94 GAA and a .900 SV% in five games (three starts) against the Wild.

CONNECTIONS: Trenin recorded three points (2-1=3) in 16 games with the Avalanche in 2023-24...Burns was selected by Minnesota in the first round (20th overall) of the 2003 NHL Draft and collected 183 points (55-128=183) and 325 PIM in 453 games with the Wild across seven seasons (2003-11)...C **Brock Nelson** is from Warroad...D **Sam Malinski** is from Lakeville.

NOTES & MILESTONES

Team: Owns an active nine-game point streak (8-0-1), the team's longest run since a franchise-record 14-game run (11-0-3) from 2/17 - 3/15/23...The Wild's current six-game winning streak (6-0-0) is its longest since a seven-game streak (3/16 - 3/29/23)...Is 10-1-1 (.875) in November, ranking T-1st in the NHL in wins and points (21)...Minnesota's 10 wins this month rank T-2nd most in team history (3x) in November, trailing the 11-win total in Nov. 2011....Since Nov. 1, leads the NHL in team SV% (.944) and ranks T-1st in team GAA (1.63) and second with a plus-19 goal differential...From 11/7 - 11/26/25, did not trail in regulation for over eight consecutive games, a franchise-record span of 505:41 minutes, the 17th longest streak in NHL history...The Wild scored the game-opening goal in 12 consecutive contests from 10/30 - 11/23, a franchise record. The run was tied for the 10th-longest streak in NHL history and is the longest since Colorado's 13-game streak in the 2022-23 season...Has scored first in 15 games this season, T-3rd in the NHL...Leads the NHL with five shutouts.

Matt Boldy: Tallied three points (1-2=3) at CHI (11/26), recording his 72nd career MPG to tie Ryan Suter for seventh-most in Wild history...Recorded his 22nd career game with three-plus points at CHI (11/26), moving past Mats Zuccarello (21) for fourth in franchise history...Since Nov. 6, owns nine goals (T-2nd in the NHL) and 15 points (T-4th in the NHL) in 10 games...T-1st on team in in goals (14), assists (14) and points (14-14=28)...Ranks T-3rd in the NHL in goals (14), T-6th with 12 PPP (5-7=12) and T-10th with five PPG.

Zeev Buium: Owns eight power-play points (2-6=8) this season, leading all NHL rookies and ranking T-2nd among NHL defensemen...Ranks fifth among NHL rookies with an 18:52 TOI/G and eight assists and T-6th with 11 points (3-8=11).

Joel Eriksson Ek: Ranks second in the NHL in faceoffs won (269) and total faceoffs taken (516).

Filip Gustavsson: Is 5-1-1 with a 2.09 GAA and .920 SV% in November and 3-0-0 with a 1.61 GAA and a .938 SV% in his last three starts...Stopped all 19 shots faced at PIT (11/21) to reach 13 career shutouts and pass Manny Fernandez (12 SO) for fourth-most in Wild history...T-2nd in the NHL with two shutouts this season.

Brock Faber: Tallied two points (1-1=2) at CHI (11/26) to push his active point streak to four games (3-3=6)...Scored his first career shorthanded goal at WPG (11/23), becoming the youngest defenseman in franchise history to do so (23 years, 93 days)...Since 10/26, ranks T-2nd among NHL defensemen in goals (six), T-6th in shots (38) and T-7th in points (6-9=15).

Marcus Foligno: Currently at 898 career games played...11th in the NHL with 77 hits this season...T-6th in NHL with 44 hits in November.

Marcus Johansson: Leads the team with a plus-9 rating and ranks third in points (8-12=20) and goals and T-3rd in assists...Owns 16 points (7-9=16) in his last 16 games.

Kirill Kaprizov: Owns an active five-game point streak (4-2=6)...Scored a PPG in OT at CHI (11/26), extending his franchise record to 12 career OTG. Since Kaprizov entered NHL in 2020-21, only Sebastian Aho (13) owns more OTG...Reached 69 career PPG with a PPG at CHI (11/26), tying Zach Parise for the franchise record...Currently owns 199 career goals, tied with Parise for third in franchise history...T-2nd in the NHL with seven PPG and T-3rd with 14 goals...T-1st on team in in goals (14), assists (14) and points (14-14=28)...Currently ranks third in franchise history with 142 power-play points (69-73=142), trailing Mikko Koivu (251) and Marian Gaborik (145).

Jake Middleton: Owns an active three-game assist (0-3=3), tying his career long. **Nico Sturm:** Scored his first goal of the season at CHI (11/26)...Made his season debut at WPG (11/23).

Yakov Trenin: Currently at 399 career games played...Leads the NHL with 108 hits.

Jesper Wallstedt: Is 5-0-0 in his last five starts, stopping 163 of 168 shots faced for a 0.99 GAA and a .970 SV%...Owns shutouts in three out of his last four games...For the season, leads the NHL with three shutouts and a .935 SV% and second with a 1.94 GAA...Has set the franchise benchmark for longest season-opening point streak (6-0-2), besting Niklas Backstrom (6-0-1 in 2008-09)...With a 32-save shutout victory at WPG (11/23), became the youngest goaltender in franchise history (23 years, 9 days) to register a five-game winning streak, besting Darcy Kuemper (5 GP in 2013-14, 23 years and 302 days)...Also became the fourth-youngest goaltender in NHL history with a season-opening point streak of at least eight games (G. Fuhr - 8 GP in 84-85 w/ EDM; F. Potvin - 9 GP in 93-94 w/ TOR; P. Peeters, 27 GP in 79-80 w/ PHI - all 22 years old).

Danila Yurov: Scored his third goal of the season at WPG (11/23)...Ranks T-1st among NHL rookies with two GWG.

Mats Zuccarello: Currently at 698 career points (218-480=698)...Owns eight points (1-7=8) in nine games played since making his season debut 11/7 at NYI...Team is 8-0-1 with him in lineup.

MILESTONE NIGHT FOR WORLEY

Minnesota Wild Head Athletic Trainer **John Worley** worked his 2,000th game of professional hockey when the Wild played Chicago on 11/26/25.

A native of Ridley Park, Pa., Worley owns 33 seasons of experience in professional hockey, including 17 seasons (2009-26) with the Minnesota Wild. Wednesday's contest in Chicago marked his 1,269th with the organization.

Worley previously spent 16 seasons (1993-2009) with the Philadelphia Flyers, including 10 seasons as Head Athletic Trainer. Worley will serve as an Athletic Trainer for the United States Men's National Team at the 2026 Winter Olympic Games in Milano-Cortina. He held the same position for the United States Men's National Team at the 2025 NHL 4 Nations Face-Off tournament, helping Team USA to a silver medal.

WILD AT THE OLYMPICS

Wild General Manager and President of Hockey Operations **Bill Guerin** is serving as the General Manager of the 2026 United States Men's Ice Hockey Team. He is joined on Team USA's staff by Wild Head Coach **John Hynes**, who will serve as an assistant coach; Wild Assistant General Manager **Chris Kelleher**, who will work on the management staff; Wild Head Athletic Trainer **John Worley** and Assistant Athletic Trainer and Massage Therapist **Travis Green**, who will work as athletic trainers, and Wild Orthopedic Surgeon **Joel Boyd**, who will serve as team physician.

Wild forward **Nico Sturm** was selected to Germany's preliminary roster. The native of Augsburg had eight points (six goals, two assists) in 10 games at the 2023 silver-winning Germany at the 2023 Worlds, and he also competed at the tournament the following year.

TEAM NOTES



ON THE POWER PLAY

- Ranks second in the NHL with 22 PPG and T-4th with a 25.3 PP% this season.
- Through the first 24 games of a season, ranks third in franchise history in PP% and fifth in PPG.
- Scored nine consecutive power-play goals, the longest streak in franchise history and tied for the third-longest streak in the NHL since the 1933-34 season, from 10/11 - 10/14.
- Since the 1933-34 season, only the 1987-88 New York Rangers (11 PPG) recorded more power-play goals in a season's first four games. Since 1977-78, no team with 20-plus power-play opportunities recorded a higher power-play percentage.
- The Wild opened the season by scoring a power-play goal in four consecutive games, achieving the feat for the sixth time in franchise history. The run trailed only the 2010-11 season (six-game streak) and the 2022-23 season (five-game streak) for the longest season-opening runs in franchise history.

BOLDY AND THE BEAUTIFUL

- **Matt Boldy** tallied three points (1-2=3) at CHI (11/26), recording his 72nd career MPG to tie Ryan Suter for seventh-most in Wild history.
- Recorded his 22nd career game with three-plus points at CHI (11/26), moving past Mats Zuccarello (21) for fourth in franchise history.
- Since Nov. 6, owns nine goals (T-2nd in the NHL) and 15 points (T-4th in the NHL) in 10 games.
- T-1st on team in goals (14), assists (14) and points (14-14=28).
- Ranks T-3rd in the NHL in goals (14), T-6th with 12 PPP (5-7=12) and T-10th with five PPG.
- Currently at 272 career points (116-156=272) in 309 games, the second-highest total in franchise history by a player 24 years or younger. Marian Gaborik leads the list with 299 points (150-149=299).
- Scored his first career SHG vs. CAR (11/19), as well as the game-deciding shootout goal.
- Has played in 179 consecutive games dating back to 11/2/23, the 26th-longest active streak in the NHL.
- Currently at 70 career multi-point games, tied with Ryan Suter for seventh in franchise history.
- Reached 259 career points (109-150=259) in his 300th career game game at CAR (10/6), the second-highest point total through a player's first 300 games with the franchise (Kaprizov, 366 pts).

THE GUS BUS IS ROLLING

- **Filip Gustavsson** stopped all 19 shots faced at PIT (11/21) to reach 13 career shutouts and pass Manny Fernandez (12 SO) for fourth-most in Wild history.
- Ranks T-2nd in the NHL with two shutouts this season. Is 5-1-1 with a 2.09 GAA and .920 SV% in November and 3-0-0 with a 1.61 GAA and a .938 SV% in his last three starts.
- Is now 37-26-10 with a 2.55 GAA, .915 SV% and eight shutouts in road games since joining the Wild prior to the 2022-23 season. He ranks first in the NHL in road shutouts, T-2nd in road SV% and T-3rd in road GAA during that span (min. 50 gp).
- Posted a 26-save shutout at STL (10/9) to become the first goaltender in franchise history to post a shutout in multiple season openers (also 10/12/23) and the only active goalie to accomplish the feat for any franchise.
- Is 80-53-19 in his career with the Wild since joining the franchise in 2022-23. Gustavsson ranks T-4th in the NHL during that span with a .913 SV% and T-5th with 13 shutouts (min. 50 games).
