

**FLAMES LAST GAME RECAP****March 31, 2025 – CALGARY FLAMES [3] vs. COLORADO AVALANCHE [2] (SO)**[Game Summary](#) | [Event Summary](#)

The Calgary Flames continued a three-game road swing on Monday night by travelling to Ball Arena to face the Colorado Avalanche. It would take 16 minutes for the games-opening goal, and it was Cale Makar who gave Colorado a 1-0 lead through 20. In the second, the Avalanche would double their advantage and take a 2-0 lead into the final frame. In the third, Ryan Lomberg would bang home a rebound on a mad scramble to give the Flames life, cutting the deficit to one. Calgary would come right back after that, with Ryan Lomberg this time finding Adam Klapka, and the big man ripped home his third of the season to even things at two. Overtime was required and after a furious back and forth pace still nothing could separate these clubs, and this game required a shootout. In the shootout, Yegor Sharangovich would be the only skater to convert, and the Flames picked up a big two points in Denver, knocking off the Avalanche 3-2.

TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS

This is the third and final meeting this season between the Flames and the Hockey Club. Calgary has fallen to Utah on both prior occasions.

This is a Pacific Division versus Central Division matchup; the Flames have a record of 9-11-2 against Central Division teams and a record of 20-15-6 against Western Conference opponents.

COMEBACK KIDS:

The Flames earned their third third-period comeback win of the 2024-25 season after erasing a 2-0 deficit last night in Colorado. Calgary has posted more third-period rallies in only three other seasons: 2019-20 (5), 2014-15 (5) and 2013-14 (4). In 2024-25, the only team that has more third-period multi-goal comebacks than the Flames is the Boston Bruins with four such efforts.

KLAP YOUR HANDS:

Adam Klapka helped the Flames storm back last night in Colorado, notching a goal and an assist in the third period to record his first career multi-point effort in the NHL. Klapka recorded 25 multi-point efforts in 158 American Hockey League outings from 2022-23 to 2024-25 with the Calgary Wranglers. His assist was also his first in the NHL.

THE LOMBORGHINI:

Ryan Lomberg also registered a goal and an assist in last night's come from behind win in Colorado to record his first multi-point game in Flames threads. Lomberg has now recorded four multi-point games in his NHL career, and last night he posted his first such effort since a three-point night on March 29, 2022 as a member of the Florida Panthers.

BAC1KLUND:

In Calgary and Utah's first meeting on October 30th, Mikael Backlund became the fourth-active Swedish-born skater in the NHL to reach 1,000 NHL games, joining Nicklas Backstrom (WSH), Victor Hedman (TBL), and Erik Karlsson (PIT). He became the 19th player of Swedish descent in NHL history to reach 1,000 NHL games, the second skater in Flames franchise history to skate in 1,000 games for the club (Jarome Iginla – 1,219), and the 397th player in NHL history to skate in their 1,000th game. Backlund also marked the 73rd player in NHL history (72 skaters & 1 goaltender) to play each of their first 1,000 career regular-season games with one franchise.

PATIENT PACHAL:

Flames defenceman Brayden Pachal skated in his 100th career NHL game in Calgary and Utah's most recent meeting on January 2nd, celebrating with a goal and a team-high +2 plus/minus. Pachal was originally signed as a free agent by the Golden Knights in September of 2019 before being claimed off waivers by Calgary from Vegas on February 4th, 2024. Since then, Pachal has skated in 99 games for the Flames and has a chance to play his 100th game in a Calgary Flames jersey tonight.

SHARKNADO:

With Yegor Sharangovich's marker on Saturday against Edmonton, he recorded his 97th career goal. With three more tallies, Sharangovich can become just the third skater of Belarussian descent in NHL history to reach the 100-goal plateau and join: Mikhail Grabovski (125) and Andrei Kostitsyn (103).



NEW KID:

The Calgary Flames announced the signing of forward Jacob Battaglia to a three-year entry-level contract on Saturday morning. Battaglia, a native of Mississauga, ON played in all 68 regular season games for the OHL's Kingston Frontenacs, scoring a team-leading 40 goals along with 50 assists and finished tied with a team-high 90 points. Over the month of March, the 19-year-old forward registered 12 points in 10 games from six goals and six assists to help the Frontenacs finish third in the Eastern Conference standings.

HEY DID YOU KNOW?

Utah defenceman Jusso Valimaki was drafted by the Flames in 2017 and spent the first three seasons of his NHL career with the Flames organization, skating in 78 games for Calgary.
