- The Stars' victory extended their win streak to five games, matching their season high that they set from Nov. 8 to 15. The team has won each of those five games by a one-goal margin.
- Thomas Harley** scored the sixth overtime goal of his career, which is tied for the fourth-most in franchise history. **Harley** and John Klingberg are the only two defensemen in franchise history to score six overtime goals.
 - Harley's** six goals since the start of the 2023-24 season are tied for the eighth-most in the NHL and top all NHL defensemen during that span.
- Jake Oettinger** extended his personal win streak to five games, becoming the seventh American goalie in NHL history to record 10 separate winning streaks of at least five games according to NHL Stats.
- Matt Duchene** tallied two assists to extend his point streak to five games. His first assist of the night was his 100th as a member of the Stars, making him the 61st player in franchise history to have 100 assists with the team.
- Nils Lundkvist** scored his third goal of this season, which is the second-most of his career, trailing only the six goals he scored in 60 games in 2022-23.
- Roope Hintz** recorded an assist and went 11-for-15 at the faceoff dot, making Monday's game the 16th time this season he has won 10 or more faceoffs in a game.
 - He extended his point streak against the Jets to three games, collecting four points (1-3—4) during that span.
- Mikko Rantanen** registered a goal and an assist during the game and now has eight points (2-6—8) in his last three consecutive games played vs. Winnipeg.
- Jason Robertson** opened scoring for the Stars and extended his point streak against the Jets to three games, earning four points (3-1—4) during that span.

GAME NOTES

THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

- Tonight is the fourth and final game that the Stars will play against the Blues this season. Dallas defeated St. Louis in their last two consecutive games on Jan. 27 (4-3 W) and Jan. 23 (3-2 W) while falling short against them in their first meeting this season on Oct. 18, 2025 (3-1 L).
- The Stars ranked in the top five in the NHL in wins (33, tied fourth), points (75, third) and points percentage (.670, fourth) this year entering play Tuesday. The team's success this season comes despite having 191 combined man games lost with **Oskar Bäck**, **Jamie Benn**, **Lian Bichsel**, **Matt Duchene**, **Adam Erne**, **Thomas Harley**, **Roope Hintz**, **Nils Lundkvist**, **Ilya Lyubushkin** and **Tyler Seguin** all missing multiple games with injury at various points this year.
- **Jake Oettinger** has won the last five games he has played dating back to Jan. 20, taking down the Bruins, Blues, (2x), Golen Knights and Jets. It marks the second win streak of at least five games this season, after winning six straight games from Nov. 20 to Dec. 7.
- **Roope Hintz** has gone 423-for-714 at the faceoff dot this season for a 59.2 percent success rate, which was tied for the fifth-best mark in the NHL this season among skaters to take at least 500 draws entering play Tuesday.
- **Jason Robertson** enters tonight's game one goal shy of scoring 200 NHL goals. When he reaches the milestone, he will become the...
 - First player taken in the 2017 NHL draft to score 200 career goals.
 - Twenty-fifth active American, and 80th in NHL history, to reach the 200-goal milestone.
 - Twelfth skater in franchise history to score 200 goals with the team.
- **Colin Blackwell** is two points shy of notching 100 career points. We he reaches the milestone, he will become the ninth active, seventh-round pick to total 100 NHL points.

GOING FOR GOLD

- Tonight's marks the Stars' final game before the NHL pauses for the 2026 Winter Olympic Games in Milan.
- Seven Stars players have been selected to represent their home countries at the upcoming Winter Olympic Games in Milan – **Radek Faksa** (Czechia), **Thomas Harley** (Canada), **Miro Heiskanen** (Finland), **Roope Hintz** (Finland), **Esa Lindel** (Finland), **Jake Oettinger** (United States) and **Mikko Rantanen** (Finland).
- The Stars are one of seven NHL teams to have at least seven Olympians on their roster, joining the Colorado Avalanche (8), Florida Panthers (9), Minnesota Wild (8), New Jersey Devils (8), Tampa Bay Lightning (10) and Vegas Golden Knights (7).
- The Stars and the Wild are the only teams to have four of their players on the same Olympic team – Four Stars will play for Finland and four Wild will play for Sweden.
- This marks the first Olympic selection for **Faksa**, **Harley**, **Hintz**, **Lindell**, **Oettinger** and **Rantanen**.
- **Heiskanen** previously represented Finland at the 2018 Winter Olympic games, scoring one goal in five games. He has also represented Finland in international play at the IIHF U18 World Junior Championship (2016, 2017), IIHF U20 World Junior Championship (2017, 2018) and IIHF World Championship (2018, 2022).
- **Lindell** has played for Finland's national team at nearly every level of international competition – the IIHF U18 World Junior Championship (2012), IIHF U20 World Junior Championship (2014), IIHF World Championship (2015, 2022) and World Cup of Hockey (2016).
- **Rantanen** has previously represented Finland at the IIHF U18 World Junior Championship (2014), IIHF U20 World Junior Championship (2015, 2016) and IIHF World Championship (2016, 2017, 2018, 2023).
- Prior to last year's Four Nations Face Off, **Hintz** played for Finland at the 2015 and 2016 IIHF World Junior Championship.
- The Winter Olympics will mark the first time that all four Finns on Dallas' roster will play in an international tournament together.
- Although born in Syracuse, New York, **Harley** holds dual citizenship and has elected to represent Canada in international competition, doing so at the 2019 IIHF U18 World Junior Championship and the 2021 IIHF U20 World Junior Championship prior to last year's Four Nations Face Off.
- **Oettinger** – a native of Minnesota – has previously played for Team USA at the IIHF U18 World Junior Championship (2015, 2016), IIHF U20 World Junior Championship (2017, 2018) and IIHF World Championship (2021).
- **Harley**, **Oettinger** and all four Finns were selected for their country's roster for the Four Nations Face Off that was played last February. **Heiskanen** ultimately had to withdraw from the tournament due to injury.
- **Faksa** has previously played for Czechia's national team at the IIHF U18 World Junior Championship (2011), IIHF U20 World Junior Championship (2012, 2013, 2014), IIHF World Championship (2016, 2018, 2019) and at the 2016 World Cup of Hockey.

GOING STREAKING

- The Stars enter tonight's game riding a five-game win streak, which was tied with Columbus for the longest active winning streak in the NHL entering play Tuesday.
- Dallas is one of 10 teams this season to have two separate win streaks of at least five games. They previously won five straight games from Nov. 8 to 15.
- A Stars victory tonight would give the team six consecutive wins for the first time since they won seven straight games from March 22 to April 3, 2025.
- Dallas has scored first in each of the last five games that they have played and have only trailed for 14:55 of game time during the five-game win streak.
- The team has gone 7-for-18 on the power play over the course of this winning streak for a 38.9 percent success rate.

- **Matt Duchene** is the team's leading scorer during the streak, totaling seven points (5-2—7) since the start of the streak on Jan. 23. In all, seven Stars skaters have played at a point-per-game pace over the course of the streak: **Duchene** (1.40), **Jason Robertson** (1.20), **Jamie Benn** (1.00), **Miro Heiskanen** (1.00), **Roope Hintz** (1.00), **Wyatt Johnston** (1.00) and **Mikko Rantanen** (1.00).

SINGING THE BLUES

- Dallas is 125-132-56 all-time vs. St. Louis, including a 77-50-28 mark on home ice.
- The Stars have earned wins in six of their last seven games played against the Blues dating back to April 17, 2024, outscoring them 19-13 during that span. Dallas has also won six consecutive games played against St. Louis at American Airlines Center.
- Dallas' all-time home record of 77-50-28 (182 points) vs. St. Louis is the second-best mark in the NHL, trailing Chicago with 95-50-24 (214 points).
- **Mikko Rantanen** has five points (4-1—5) in his last four games played against the Blues, dating back to March 19, 2024. In all, **Rantanen** has totaled 34 points (19-15—34) in 34 career games played vs. St. Louis, averaging 1.00 points per game and carrying a plus-minus rating of +3.
- **Matt Duchene** enters tonight's matchup riding a two-game point streak against the Blues, collecting three points (3-0—3) during that span, including putting up two goals in Dallas' last game against them on Jan. 27. In all, **Duchene** has registered 40 points (17-23—40) in 55 career games played vs. St. Louis, upholding a plus-minus rating of +2.
 - His 40 career points against them rank second among active Stars skaters and tied for 10th in the League among all active skaters.
- **Jason Robertson** enters tonight's game riding a two-game point streak against the Blues, tallying four points (1-3—4) during that span, both games being multi-point outings. In 17 career games played vs. St. Louis, **Robertson** has put up 16 points (6-10—16), carrying a plus-minus rating of +5.
- **Wyatt Johnston** enters tonight's contest riding a four-game point streak against the Blues, earning seven points (4-3—7) during that span, including tallying a primary assist on the game-winning goal in Dallas' last game against them on Jan. 27. In all, **Johnston** has totaled 13 points (8-5—13) in 13 career games played vs. St. Louis, carrying a plus-minus rating of +4.
 - **Johnston's** five career power-play goals against the Blues are tied for the league-lead since the start of his rookie season in 2022-23.
- **Roope Hintz** enters tonight's matchup riding a two-game point streak against the Blues, collecting three points (1-2—3) during that span. He has also recorded nine points (2-7—9) in his last six games played against them, dating back to Dec. 14, 2024. In 24 career games vs. St. Louis, **Hintz** has registered 16 points (8-8—16), upholding a plus-minus rating of +3.
- **Miro Heiskanen** enters tonight's game riding a two-game point streak against the Blues, tallying two assists in those games. In all, **Heiskanen** has totaled 12 points (2-10—12) in 24 career games played vs. St. Louis with a plus-minus rating of +10. He is also averaging 24:50 of time on ice per game, which ranks sixth in the NHL among active skaters who have played the Blues at least 10 times in their career.
- **Jamie Benn** has registered 51 points (22-29—51) in 60 career games played vs. St. Louis, carrying a plus-minus rating of +15. His 51 career points against them top active Stars skaters while ranking fourth in the League among active skaters.
- **Thomas Harley** recorded the game-winning goal and an assist in Dallas' last contest against the Blues on Jan. 27. In his 13 career games played vs. St. Louis, **Harley** has notched five points (1-4—5) with a plus-minus rating of +6 and averaging 21:36 of time on ice per game.

BIKER GANG

- **Thomas Harley** scored the sixth overtime goal of his career in Dallas' last game, which is tied for the fourth-most in franchise history. **Harley** and John Klingberg are the only two defensemen in franchise history to score six overtime goals.
 - **Harley** also scored the series-clinching overtime goal against Winnipeg in Game 6 of the Second Round of the 2025 Stanley Cup Playoffs.
- **Harley's** six overtime goals since the start of the 2023-24 season are tied for the eighth-most in the NHL and top all NHL defensemen during that span.
- Three of **Harley's** five goals this season have stood as game winners, which is tied for the most in his career in a single season. He also scored three game-winning goals in both 2023-24 and 2024-25.
- **Harley's** three game-winning goals this year were tied for the seventh-most among all NHL defensemen this season entering play Tuesday.
- **Harley** enters tonight's contest having recorded six points (3-3—6) in his last seven games played.
- If he were to score again tonight, it would give **Harley** goals in three consecutive games for the second time in his career after previously doing so from Feb. 7 to 22, 2025. He would become the sixth defenseman in franchise history – and fourth in Dallas Stars team history – to have two separate goal streaks of at least three games.
 - Lou Nanne holds the franchise record for consecutive games played with scoring a goal by a defenseman with four, a feat he achieved from Jan. 19 to 27, 1972.
- **Harley** has totaled 22 points (5-17—22) in 44 games this season. Despite missing 12 games with an injury, his 22 points rank second among Stars defensemen this year, trailing only **Miro Heiskanen's** 44 points (7-37—44).
- **Harley** has scored 37 goals in his career and enters tonight's game one goal shy of tying Richard Matvichuk (38) for the 14th-most in franchise history by a defenseman.

IT'S NOT OVER 'TIL IT'S OVER

- The Stars scored a goal with less than a minute and a half in two consecutive games to win in regulation, taking down the Blues in both contests. **Jason Robertson** scored with 60 seconds left on Jan. 23 to defeat the Blues 3-2 and **Thomas Harley** scored with 67 seconds left on Jan. 27 to secure a 4-3 Stars win.
- **Robertson's** goal was the latest game-winning goal in regulation for the Stars since **Harley** scored at 19:55 on March 4, 2025 to help Dallas defeat the New Jersey Devils 4-3.
- With his game-winning goal on Jan. 27, **Harley** became the first defenseman in franchise history with multiple go-ahead goals within the final 90 seconds of regulation according to NHL Stats.
- **Harley** became the fourth active defenseman with multiple go-ahead goals within the final 90 seconds of regulation according to NHL Stats, alongside Shea Theodore (3x), Drew Doughty (2x) and Charlie McAvoy (2x).

HEATING UP

- **Matt Duchene** enters tonight's game riding a five-game point streak, totaling seven points (5-2—7) during that span. His five-game point streak was tied for the second-longest active streak in the NHL entering play Tuesday.
- A goal or an assist tonight would give him points in six consecutive games for the first time since he had a point in seven straight games (3-7—10) from March 27 to April 8, 2025.
- **Mikko Rantanen** has tallied at least a point in each of the last four games that he has played dating back to Jan. 27, totaling five points (1-4—5) during that span.
 - He enters tonight's game looking to extend his assist streak to at least five games for the second time this season. **Rantanen** previously had a six-game assist streak (2-10—12) from Dec. 15 to 27.
- **Jamie Benn** has recorded five assists in the Stars last three games. If he were to have an assist tonight, it would extend his assist streak to four games for the first time since he had a five-game assist streak from Feb. 2 to 22, 2025.
- A point of any kind would give **Benn** points in four straight games for the third time this season.
- **Miro Heiskanen** has recorded eight assists in his last seven games played dating back to Jan. 20.
- **Roope Hintz** has seven points (1-6—7) in his last seven games played dating back to Jan. 20 against the Boston Bruins.

POWER UP

- The Stars have gone 49-for-164 on the power play this season for a 29.9 percent success rate, which was the second-best mark in the NHL entering play Tuesday.
- No team had scored more power-play goals than Dallas' 49 entering play Tuesday.
- If the Stars were to score on the man advantage tonight, it would give them power-play goals in three consecutive games for the first time since the team scored a power-play goal in eight straight games earlier this season from Nov. 1 to 15.
- Dallas' 49 power-play goals are just six shy of the 55 they scored in 82 games last season. The team is currently on pace to finish the year with 72 power-play goals, which would tie for the sixth-most in Dallas Stars team history.
- Dallas has scored at least two power-play goals in a game 16 different times this season, most recently on Jan. 31 against the Utah Mammoth, a 3-2 win. The Stars had 12 multi-power-play-goal games in all of 2024-25.
 - Their 16 multi-power-play goal games are their most in a season since they scored at least two power-play goals in a game 17 times in 2022-23.
 - The Stars have scored two power-play goals in four of the last six games that they have played.
- The Stars scored two power-play goals 14 seconds apart in their game on Nov. 1 at Florida, which set the franchise record for the fastest consecutive power-play goals for according to NHL Stats. They bested the previous record of 15 second set by Steve Payne and Mike Fidler on March 21, 1979 against the Philadelphia Flyers while the team was still located in Minnesota.
- Dallas' 49 power-play goals have been scored by 11 different skaters: **Wyatt Johnston** (18), **Jason Robertson** (11), **Roope Hintz** (6), **Mikko Rantanen** (5), **Matt Duchene** (3), **Mavrik Bourque**, **Thomas Harley**, **Miro Heiskanen**, **Justin Hryckowian**, **Tyler Seguin** and **Sam Steel**.
- **Rantanen** (5-25—30) ranked fourth in the NHL in power-play points this season entering play Tuesday, followed by **Johnston** (18-11—29), who ranked fifth, and **Robertson** (10-16—26) who was tied for sixth.
 - **Johnston's** 29 power-play points are already a career high. **Robertson's** 27 power-play points are the third-most of his career and **Rantanen's** 30 power-play points are the sixth-most of his career.
- **Johnston's** 18 power-play goals led the NHL entering play Tuesday and were five more than the second-ranked skater (Vegas' Pavel Dorofeyev).
- His 18 power-play goals are already a career high and are tied with Mike Modano in 1993-94 for the second-most in a single-season in Dallas Stars team history (since 1993-94).
 - **Johnston's** 18 power-play goals are four shy of tying the single-season franchise record (Dino Ciccarelli with 22 in 1986-87).
- **Heiskanen** has totaled 18 points (1-17—18) on the power-play this season, which was tied for the fourth-most among all NHL defensemen entering play Tuesday.

ROAD TRIP RECAP

- The Stars swept their most recent three-game road trip, taking down the St. Louis Blues 4-3, the Vegas Golden Knights 5-4 and the Utah Mammoth 3-2. They did not trail at any point during the three games.
- It is the first time the team has swept a road trip of at least three games since they went a perfect 4-0-0 on a four-game trip from March 26 to 31, taking down the Oilers, Flames and Kraken.

- The Stars scored first in each of the three games they played on this most recent road trip.
- Dallas' penalty kill went a perfect 6-for-6 on the road trip.
- The team converted on four of nine power-play opportunities on the trip for a 44.4 percent success rate.
- Three players finished the road trip with four points: **Matt Duchene** (4-0—4), **Jamie Benn** (0-4—4) and **Sam Steel** (0-4—4).

REWRITING THE RECORD BOOKS

- **Wyatt Johnston** scored his 18th power-play goal of the season in Dallas' game on Jan. 31 against Utah, matching the Dallas Stars team record (since 1993-94) that Mike Modano set during the 1993-94 season, the Stars' first year playing in Texas.
- His 18 power-play goals are already tied for the eighth-most in a single season in franchise history and are four shy of tying the franchise record of 22 that Dino Ciccarelli set during the 1986-87 season.
 - **Johnston** is on pace to score 27 power-play goals this season.
- Since the start of the 2024-25 season, **Johnston** has scored 29 power-play goals, which tops the NHL during that span.

THE ROARING TWENTIES

- The line of **Mavrik Bourque**, **Roope Hintz** and **Jason Robertson** has played 197:43 together at 5-on-5 this season. During that time, the Stars have outscored their opponents 11-7, have a 65.4 expected goals for percentage, a 58.5 shots for percentage and a 59.7 Corsi rating according to Natural Stat Trick.
- According to MoneyPuck.com, the line has a 65.2 expected goals for percentage, which was the best mark of any forward line in the NHL to play at least 150 minutes together entering play Tuesday.
- In Dallas' game on Jan. 20 against Boston, when the trio was on the ice the Stars outscored the Bruins 2-0 and outshot them 8-1 at 5-on-5 according to Natural Stat Trick.
 - All three players had two points in the game – **Robertson** scored two goals, **Hintz** had two assists and **Bourque** had a goal and an assist.
- The Stars owned a 60 percent Corsi rating and a 58.7 expected goals for percentage at 5-on-5 when the line was on the ice on Jan. 22 against the Blue Jackets.
- In the Stars' game on Jan. 29 against Vegas, the team had a 79.9 expected goals for percentage and a 59.1 Corsi rating when the trio was on the ice during 5-on-5 play according to Natural Stat Trick.
- **Hintz** and **Robertson** both assisted on **Bourque's** first goal of the game on Jan. 29 against the Vegas Golden Knights. It marked the 199th time the two have factored in on the same goal according to NHL Stats, which is the third-most in Dallas Stars team history (since 1993-94). They trail only **Jamie Benn** and **Tyler Seguin** (272) and Mike Modano and Jere Lehtinen (242).
 - **Bourque's** performance against the Golden Knights was the first multi-goal game of his career.
- On Feb. 2 against Winnipeg, the line had a 74.8 percent on-ice expected goals for percentage and a 68.8 Corsi rating.
- Despite playing in only 56 games this season, **Bourque** (10-11—21) is one goal, three assists and four points shy of matching his totals from last season that he reached in 73 games. **Bourque** finished the 2024-25 campaign with 11 goals, 14 assists and 25 points.
 - He's currently pacing to finish the season with a career high 15 goals, 16 assists and 31 points.

CAREER YEARS ARE NEAR

- **Mikko Rantanen** scored in Dallas' last game to become fifth Finnish player in NHL history to record nine-plus 20-goal seasons according to NHL Stats. He joined Teemu Selanne (17x), Jari Kurri (13x), Aleksander Barkov (10x) and Sebastian Aho (9x).
- **Rantanen** is currently pacing to finish the year with a career-high 72 assists and 103 points, which would be two points shy of matching his career high. If he were to maintain that pace, **Rantanen** would become the third Finnish skater in NHL history to record three 100-point seasons after also doing so in 2022-23 (55-50—105) and 2023-24 (42-62—104). He would join Jari Kurri (6x) and Teemu Selanne (4x).
 - 103 points would tie for the 12th-most in a single season by a Finnish player in NHL history.
- If **Rantanen** were to finish the year with 103 points, it would make his 2025-26 campaign tied for the fifth-highest scoring season by a Stars skater in franchise history.
- Seventy-two assists would be the second-most in a single season in franchise history and the most-ever by a Finnish skater in NHL history.
- **Rantanen** enters tonight's game two points shy of making the 2025-26 campaign the seventh season – and sixth consecutive – in his career in which he has totaled at least 70 points.
- **Wyatt Johnston** is currently on pace to finish the year with 43 goals, 44 assists and 87 points, all of which would be career highs. Forty-three goals would tie for the eighth-most by a Stars skater in a single season in franchise history.
 - **Johnston** enters tonight's game one goal shy of making the 2025-26 campaign his third consecutive 30-goal season. His is also one point away from recording his third straight 60-point season.
 - He is also just four goals shy of matching his career high of 33 that he set last season.
- **Johnston** is pacing to score 26 power-play goals this year, which would be the most by a Stars skater in franchise history and would be the most by any NHL skater since Florida's Sam Reinhart scored 27 power-play goals in 2023-24.
- **Jason Robertson** (46) and **Johnston** (43) are both pacing to finish the season with at least 40 goals. If they were to maintain that pace, they would become the first pair of 40-goal Stars teammates since Brian Bellows (55) and Dave Gagner (40) in 1989-90.
 - There have been five instances in franchise history of Stars teammates scoring at least 40 goals in the same year, but none have occurred since the team relocated to Dallas in 1993-94.
 - Forty-six goals would tie **Robertson's** career high and would also tie for the sixth-most in franchise history.

- **Esa Lindell** has totaled 21 points (5-16—21) in 56 games this year, which is the third-most among Stars defensemen this season. It puts him on pace to finish the season with 25 assists and 33 points, both of which would be career highs.
 - His 16 assists this season are only five shy of matching his career high that he's reached on four previous occasions, most recently last year.
- **Sam Steel** is currently on pace to finish the season with 21 assists and 31 points, both of which would be career highs.

SHOOT YOUR SHOT

- **Jason Robertson** and **Mikko Rantanen** both scored in the shootout and **Jake Oettinger** stopped each of the two shots he faced to help the Stars defeat the Golden Knights 5-4 in their game on Jan. 29.
- **Robertson's** goal – which stood as the game decider – was the 21st of his career, which passed Mike Ribeiro (20) for the most in franchise history.
 - The goal was also the sixth game-decider in his career, which is just one shy of the most in franchise history.
- His goal against the Golden Knights was also his fourth shootout goal of the season, which was tied for the third-most in the NHL entering play Tuesday.
- **Robertson** has gone 21-for-37 in his career in the shootout for a 56.8 percent success rate, which is the third-best mark in the NHL among active skaters to have at least 20 shootout attempts in their career.
- **Robertson's** 21 shootout goals since the start of the 2020-21 season are the most in the NHL during that span and are four more than the second-ranked skaters (Adrian Kempe and Trevor Zegras with 17 each).
 - Despite not taking a shootout attempt until the 2020-21 season, **Robertson's** 21 shootout goals are the most in the League since the start of the 2018-19 season.
- **Rantanen's** goal was the third shootout goal as a member of the Stars. Two of his three shootout goals with Dallas have been game deciders.
- **Rantanen** has scored 11 shootout goals in his career, which ranks eighth in NHL history among Finnish skaters.
- With the win, **Oettinger** improved to 3-1 in shootouts this season and has .750 save percentage against shootout attempts this year.
- His performance against the Golden Knights was the ninth time in his career that he has not allowed a goal against in the shootout.
- In all in his career, **Oettinger** has a 0.739 save percentage in the shootout, which is the seventh-best mark in the NHL among active goaltenders to play in at least 20 shootout games.

MR. 300

- Forward **Wyatt Johnston** played in his 300th NHL regular-season NHL game on Jan. 29 against the Golden Knights. He became the fourth player selected in the 2021 NHL Draft to reach the 300-game milestone and the 82nd player in franchise history to play in 300 regular-season games with the team.
- **Johnston** has not missed a Stars game (regular season or playoffs) since making his NHL debut on Oct. 13, 2022. He became the 17th skater in NHL history – and first since Nick Suzuki – to begin his NHL career by playing in at least 300 consecutive regular-season games according to NHL Stats.
 - Suzuki played in 410 consecutive regular-season games from Oct. 3, 2019 to Dec. 31, 2024 to begin his NHL career.
- **Johnston** has totaled 235 points (117-118—235) in his career, which is tied for the 19th-most in franchise history through a player's first 300 games played with the team according to NHL Stats.

- **Johnston's** goal against Vegas tied Dennis Maruk for 19th. Maruk had 235 points (80-155—235) in his first 300 games with the Minnesota North Stars from 1978-79 to 1987-88.
- His 235 points are also the 10th-most in franchise history through a player's first 300 games played with the Stars from the start of his career according to NHL Stats.
 - **Jason Robertson** (137-183—320) is the only Stars skater who began his career with the team since the franchise relocated to Dallas to have more points than **Johnston** through his first 300 games played.
- **Johnston**, selected with the 23rd-overall pick in 2021, leads all 2021 draftees in career goals, assists, points, even-strength goals (77), even-strength points (158), power-play goals (34), power-play points (70) and shorthanded goals (6).

STAR SEARCH

- Three Dallas players have earned NHL Star of the Week honors this season: **Jason Robertson**, **Wyatt Johnston** and **Jake Oettinger**. Dallas is the only NHL team this season to have three different players be named a Star of the Week.
- **Robertson** was named the NHL's First Star of the Week for the week ending on Nov. 16 after leading the League in both goals (6) and points (9) in three games played. It marks the sixth time in his career that he has earned Star of the Week honors.
 - He was named the First Star of the Week for the week ending on Nov. 6, Nov. 27 and April 13 during the 2022-23 season and for the week ending on March 6 during the 2021-22 season.
 - He also earned Third Star of the Week honors for the week ending on Dec. 4, 2022.
- **Robertson** was then named the NHL's Second Star of the Month for November after leading the League with 13 goals and tying for the team lead with 26 points.
- **Johnston** was named the NHL's First Star of the Week for the week ending on Nov. 30 after totaling nine points (5-4—9) in four games played, tying for the league lead in goals and ranking second in points during that span. It marked the first time in his career that he earned Star of the Week honors.
- **Jake Oettinger** was named the NHL's Second Star of the Week for the week ending on Dec. 7. It marked the first time in his career that he earned Star of the Week honors.
 - He posted a 3-0-0 record with a .961 save percentage, 0.98 goals-against average and one shutout in three games that week.

IRON SHARPENS IRON

- The Stars have two players on their roster that have played in at least 100 consecutive regular-season games: **Jason Robertson** (348) and **Wyatt Johnston** (302).
- **Robertson's** 348-game Iron Man streak was the seventh-longest active such streak in the NHL entering play Tuesday.
- **Johnston** has not missed a regular-season game since making his debut in the 2022-23 season opener on Oct. 13, 2022, making him one of 16 players in NHL history to begin their NHL career by playing in at least 302 consecutive games according to NHL Stats. Entering play Tuesday, it was tied for the 11th-longest active Iron Man streak in the NHL.
- **Johnston** was one of 21 players to appear in at least 246 regular-season games from 2022-23 to 2024-25. Only Will Borgen (248) and Charlie Coyle (247) appeared in more.
 - Borgen (84) and Coyle (83), who were traded midseason, both played in more than 82 regular-season games in 2024-25.

THE FINNISH FOUR

- Dallas' roster currently houses four Finns: **Miro Heiskanen**, **Roope Hintz**, **Esa Lindell** and **Mikko Rantanen**. Dallas' four Finns all hail from different Finnish cities: Espoo (**Heiskanen**), Nokia (**Hintz**), Nousiainen (**Rantanen**) and Vantaa (**Lindell**).
- **Heiskanen**, **Lindell** and **Rantanen** were three of the six players selected to Finland's preliminary Olympic roster with **Hintz** expected to join them in Milan this year. Prior to their time together on the Stars, various combinations of the four Finns had played together in international competition.
 - All four players were selected to represent their home country at the Four Nations Face-Off last February before **Heiskanen** had to withdraw due to injury.
 - **Heiskanen** and **Lindell** won a gold medal together at the 2022 IIHF World Championship.
 - **Heiskanen** and **Rantanen** represented Finland together at the 2018 IIHF World Championship.
 - **Lindell** and **Rantanen** won a silver medal together at the 2016 IIHF World Championship.
 - **Hintz** and **Rantanen** played together at the 2015 and 2016 IIHF World Junior Championships, winning a gold medal in 2016.
- The four Finns, along with current Ducks forward and former Star Mikael Granlund, started Game 2 of the Western Conference Final against the Oilers during the 2025 Stanley Cup Playoffs. It marked the first time in a regular-season or playoff game since the NHL began tracking starters in 1997-98 that all five skaters starting were from Finland.
- In all, 34 Finnish players (28 skaters and six goalies) have appeared in at least one regular-season game for the Stars, the most of any NHL franchise in League history.

- Blues GM Doug Armstrong was the assistant GM with the North Stars in 1992-93 and the Stars from 1993-94 to 2001-02 before becoming the GM in Dallas mid-season in 2001-02 until the middle of the 2007-08 season.
- Blues assistant coach Steve Ott was drafted by the Dallas Stars with the 25th pick of the 2000 NHL Draft. He played for the Stars in 2003-04 and 2005-06 to 2011-12.
- Stars GM **Jim Nill** played for the Blues during the 1981-82 season.

- Stars forward **Radek Faksa** skated for St. Louis during the 2024-25 season.
- Blues head coach Jim Montgomery played for the Stars for nine games during the 2001-02 and 2002-03 seasons. He also was the head coach in Dallas from 2018-19 to 2019-20.
- Stars forward **Colin Blackwell** and defenseman **Nils Lundkvist** both played with Blues forward Pavel Buchnevich as members of the New York Rangers. Blackwell during the 2020-21 season and Lundkvist the following season in 2021-22.
- Stars goaltending coach **Jeff Reese** and Blues forward Brayden Schenn were both with the Philadelphia Flyers from 2011-12 to 2014-15 when Reese was a goalie coach in Philadelphia.
- Stars forward **Sam Steel** and Blues forward Oskar Sundqvist were teammates in Minnesota, when Sundqvist played 15 games for the Wild during the 2022-23 season.
- Stars forward **Matt Duchene** and Blues forward Alexandre Texier played two games together with the Columbus Blue Jackets at the end of the 2018-19 season.
- Stars defenseman **Thomas Harley** and Blues defenseman Colton Parayko and goaltender Jordan Binnington both played for Team Canada in the 2025 Four Nations Faceoff tournament.
- Stars Player Development Assistant **Jordie Benn** and Blues assistant coach Steve Ott were teammates at the end of the 2016-17 season in Montreal.
- Stars Director of Player Development **Rich Peverly** and Special Assistant to the President **Marty Turco** played under Blues assistant coach Claude Julien when Julien was the head coach in Boston. Peverly played under Julien in Boston from 2010-11 to 2012-13, winning a Stanley Cup together in 2011, and Turco played under Julien in 2011-12.
- Stars defenseman **Alexander Petrovic** and Blues forward Nick Bjugstad were teammates on the Florida Panthers from 2012-13 to 2018-19
- Stars goaltender **Casey DeSmith** and Blues forward Nick Bjugstad shared the ice with Pittsburgh from 2018-19 to 2019-20.
- Stars defenseman **Thomas Harley** and Blues forward Dylan Holloway were both members of Team Canada in the 2019 IIHF U18 World Junior Championship.
- Stars forward **Sam Steel** and Blues forward Jordan Kyrou both skated for Team Canada during the 2018 IIHF World Junior Championship.
- Stars forward **Matt Duchene** and Blues forward Brayden Schenn were teammates on Team Canada during the 2015 & 2017 IIHF World Championships and the 2008 IIHF U18 World Championship.
- Stars forward **Tyler Seguin** and Blues forward Brayden Schenn represented Team Canada at the 2015 IIHF World Championship.
- Stars forward **Adam Erne** and Blues forwards Oskar Sundqvist and Pius Suter all skated together in Detroit from 2021-22 to 2022-23.
