PHILADELPHIA FLYERS

All-Time Wild Record: 12-16-4 (7-5-3 at Xcel Energy Center, 5-11-1 at Philadelphia)

2023-24: Minnesota went 0-1-1 in the season series against Philadelphia...The Flyers won the series-opening contest, 6-2, at Wells Fargo Center (10/26) and won the second meeting, 4-3, in overtime at Xcel Energy Center (1/12)...C **Ryan Hartman** (1-1=2) and LW **Marcus Johansson** (1-1=2) led Minnesota with two points each... LW **Matt Boldy** and LW **Marcus Foligno** each scored a goal...G **Filip Gustavsson** saved 29-of-35 shots faced in the first meeting...G **Marc-Andre Fleury** stopped 31-of-35 shots faced in the second game...RW **Travis Konecny** led Philadelphia with four points (1-3=4)...RW Cam Atkinson (0-3=3), D **Travis Sanheim** (1-2=3), C **Sean Couturier** (1-2=3) and LW **Owen Tippett** (2-1=3) all had three points...G Carter Hart went 2-0-0 with a 2.43 GAA and a .912 SV% in two starts.

WILD LEADERS: Johansson leads Minnesota with 21 points (8-13=21) in 41 career games against the Flyers...RW **Mats Zuccarello** has 20 points (5-15=20) in 33 matches against the Flyers...Foligno (4-5=9, in 25 games) and D **Jared Spurgeon** (1-8=9, in 17 games) have nine points each...Boldy owns eight points (6-2=8) in five games.

WILD GOALIES: Fleury is 32-19-4 with a 2.89 GAA, a .901 SV% and three shutouts in 61 career games against Philadelphia...Gustavsson is 0-1-0 with a 6.01 GAA and a .829 SV% in one start vs. the Flyers (10/26/23).

FLYERS LEADERS: D **Erik Johnson** leads Philadelphia with 12 points (2-10=12) in 53 career games against Minnesota...Couturier owns 10 points (6-4=10_ in 16 games...D **Ryan Ellis** has eight points (3-5=8) in 32 games...C **Scott Laughton** (2-5=7, in 14 games) and Sanheim (1-6=7, in 14 games) have seven points each.

FLYERS GOALIES: G Samuel Ersson and G Ivan Fedotov have not faced Minnesota.

CONNECTIONS: Minnesota Goaltending Coach **Frederic Chabot** went 0-1-1 in four games with the Flyers in the 1993-94 season...C **Ryan Hartman** skated in 19 games with Philadelphia during the 2018-19 season...Flyers Vice President & Assistant General Manager **Brent Flahr** served as Wild Assistant General Manager (2009-18) before joining Philadelphia...LW **Noah Cates** is from Stillwater and played four seasons at the University of Minnesota Duluth (2018-22)...LW **Nicolas Deslauriers** recorded three points (3-0=2) in 20 games with the Wild (2021-22)...RW **Bobby Brink** is from Minnetonka...D **Erik Johnson** is from Bloomington and played one season at the University of Minnesota (2006-07)...D **Ryan Poehling** is from Lakeville and played at St. Cloud State University for three seasons (2016-19)...D **Nick Seeler** was selected by the Wild in the fifth round (131st overall) of the 2011 NHL Draft and collected 11 points (2-9=11) in 99 games with Minnesota (2017-20).

FAST FACTS: The Wild is 6-3-2 in its last 11 contests against the Flyers...Minnesota's five goals on March 3, 2022, set a new team-high against Philadelphia...Minnesota has posted back-to-back shutouts twice against Philadelphia (last, 11/11-11/14/17)...The frst time was Feb. 10-12, 2003, which also marked the first back-to-back shutouts in team history...The Wild has shutout the Flyers five times in the 28 all-time meetings — tied for its most shutouts against an Eastern Conference team.

NOTES & MILESTONES

Team: Owns a season-opening point streak of seven games (5-0-2), marking the fourth time in franchise history achieving the mark following 2007-08 (7-0-1 in 8 GP), 2008-09 (6-0-1 in 7 GP) and 2001-02 (3-0-4 in 7 GP)... Did not trail in regulation for 391:31 to start the season, the second-longest season-opening mark in NHL history (1969-70 Boston Bruins, 457:21), and the second-longest streak at any point in a season in franchise history (414:32, 2014-15)...Is T-1st in the NHL with a 1.86 GAA and second with a .936 SV%...Owns a 31.2 PP% (7/22), fifth-best in the NHL.

Zach Bogosian: Notched a plus-3 rating at TBL (10/24), tied for the sixth-best mark of his NHL career (855 games played).

Matt Boldy: T-3rd in the NHL with three PPG...T-4th in NHL with four multipoint games...T-12th in the NHL with 10 points (4-6=10).

Marc-Andre Fleury: Has appeared in 99 career games for Minnesota, needs one game appearance to reach 100 in a Wild sweater...Currently at 1,027 career games played, needs two game appearances to tie Patrick Roy (1,029 career games) for third-most all time.

Marcus Foligno: T-9th in the NHL with 3.7 hits per game (min. four GP). Brock Faber: Currently ranks fourth in the NHL with 25:39 of TOI/G.

Filip Gustavsson: Owns a 4-0-1 record through five starts, ranking second in the NHL in SV% (.952) and GAA (1.40) and T-2nd in wins among qualified goalies... Earned the NHL's Third Star of the Week for the period ending 10/20 after going 2-0-0, stopping 50 of 52 shots faced in two starts for a 1.00 GAA and a .962 SV%...Also scored the first goal of his hockey career, a power-play goal, at STL (10/15), becoming the first goaltender in franchise history to find the net...Is one of 15 goalies in NHL history to score a goal, a feat that has only been done a total 18 times...The play also marked the third PPG scored by a goalie in NHL history. Kirill Kaprizov: Owns an active four-game point streak (3-6=9)...Has also posted multiple points in four consecutive games, tied for a career long and tied for the longest road multi-point streak in franchise history (Pierre-Marc Bouchard, 2012-23)...T-1st in the NHL with five multi-point games this season...Leads the team and ranks T-2nd in the NHL with 13 points (4-9=13)...T-2nd among NHL forwards in TOI/G (22:17)...T-3rd in the NHL with eight assists...Scored his 27th career game-opening goal at TBL (10/24) and passed Jason Zucker for the fourth most in Wild history...Needs one PPG to tie Mikko Koivu (60 PPG) for second-most all-time in franchise history...Currently with 23 career GWG, needs one GWG to move past Eric Staal for sole possession of fourth-most in team history.

Jake Middleton: Third in the NHL with 26 blocked shots this season... Notched three assists (0-3=3) at FLA (10/22), tying his career high in points (two other occurrences) and assists (also 10/24/23 vs. EDM).

Marco Rossi: Owns an active six-game point streak (3-4=7), a career-long... Posted a three-game goal streak (3-0=3) from 10/12 - 10/22, also a career-long mark.

Mats Zuccarello: Owns an active four-game point streak (2-3=5)...With a 1-1=2 statline at FLA (10/22), became the fastest player in team history (ninth overall) to reach 200 assists with the Wild, doing so in his 330th game with the club. The previous mark was held by Mikko Koivu (400 games)...Also became the sixth player in team history to record 70 multi-point games with the club.

TEAM NOTES



HOT START

- The Wild currently owns a seven-game point streak (5-0-2) to start the season and is one of two teams (Winnipeg) without a regulation loss this season.
- Of the 60 previous occurrences of a season-opening seven-game point streak in NHL history, 53 teams made the playoffs. 13 of those teams won the Stanley Cup.

OUT IN FRONT

 Minnesota began the season by not trailing in regulation for 391:31, the second-longest season-opening mark in NHL history (1969-70 Boston Bruins, 457:21) and the second-longest streak at any point in a season in franchise history (414:32, 2014-15).

- The run is also the second-longest streak at any point in Wild history, trailing only a 414:32 mark in 2014-15.
- The Wild has allowed one first-period goal this season, T-1st in the NHL
 (also Dallas Stars). Minnesota owns a plus-7 goal differential (eight
 goals for, one goal against) in the first period this season, T-2nd in
 the NHL.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN

- The Wild currently owns an active five-game road point streak, tied for the longest in franchise history to start a season (also 2002-03 season, 3-0-2).
- Minnesota's four road wins and nine road points this season mark the first time in franchise history the club has reached either mark in the month of October.
- The Wild ranks second in the NHL with a 1.40 GAA and a .949 team SV% on the road this season. It is one of three teams (Jets, Rangers) to not suffer a regulation loss on the road this season.

ON THE POWER PLAY

- Minnesota currently ranks fifth in the NHL with a 31.2 power-play percentage (7/22) and is T-5th in PPG scored.
- The Wild finished the 2023-24 campaign with a 22.7 power-play percentage (62/273), the highest single-season percentage in franchise history.

- Matt Boldy leads all NHL players who started the season age 23 or younger with 10 points (4-6=10).
- Minnesota ranked second in the NHL last season with 0.42 rookie points scored per game played (min. 100 games played by rookie skaters).

KIRILL THE THRILL

- **Kirill Kaprizov** owns an active four-game point streak (3-6=9).
- Has posted multiple points in four consecutive games, tied for a career long (three other occurrences) and tied for the longest road multi-point streak in franchise history (Pierre-Marc Bouchard, 2012-23).
- T-1st in the NHL with five multi-point games this season.
- Leads the team and ranks T-2nd in the NHL with 13 points (4-9=13).
- T-2nd among NHL forwards in TOI/G (22:17).
- T-3rd in the NHL with eight assists.
- Scored his 27th career game-opening goal at TBL (10/24) to pass Jason Zucker for the fourth most in Wild history.
- Posted his 33rd career game with three-plus points at TBL (2-1=3, 10/24). Currently trails only Mikko Koivu (34 games with three-plus points) for most in franchise history.
- Needs one PPG to tie Mikko Koivu (60 PPG) for second-most all-time in franchise history.
- Kaprizov led Minnesota in points (46-50=96) and goals and was second in assists last season. Ranked T-3rd in the NHL with 19 PPG, fifth with 41 PPP (19-22=41), T-8th in goals, T-11th with eight GWG and 11th in points.
- Is the first player in franchise history to post three consecutive seasons with 40-plus goals.
- Is one of four NHL players (Matthews, Pastrnak, Draisaitl) with 40-plus goals in each of the last three seasons (2021-24).
- Kaprizov has been named an NHL Star of the Week five times in his
 career, trailing only Devan Dubnyk (6x) for most in franchise history. He
 is the only Wild player to receive four First Star awards (also 1/18/21).
- Kaprizov posted his fourth career regular-season hat trick vs. VAN (2/19/24) and finished with a career-high six points (3-3=6), which tied the single-game franchise record.

STONE-COLD KIRILL-ER

 Kaprizov notched the 23rd GWG of his career at CBJ (10/19), moving into a tie with Eric Staal for fourth-most in team history.

PLAYER NOTES

CROWN JOEL

- **Joel Eriksson Ek** played in his 500th career NHL game vs. SEA (10/12).
- Opened the season with a goal (1-0=1) and five hits vs. CBJ (10/10), tied for the ninth-highest single-game hit total of his career.
- Currently with 37 career PPGs, Eriksson Ek needs two PPGs to tie Brian Rolston (39 PPGs with MIN) for sixth on the franchise's all-time list.
- Eriksson Ek ranked second on the Wild with 12 PPGs and a career-high 30 goals last season while ranking third in points (30-34=64).
- Became the 11th player in franchise history to record 30 goals in a single season, reaching the mark vs. SJS (3/28/24).
- Eriksson Ek posted an eight-game point streak (7-8=15) from 2/9/24 to 2/24/24, a career long.
- Posted a career-long four-game goal streak (7-4=11) from 2/12/24 to 2/19/24.
- The Swede posted his second career hat trick vs. VAN (2/19/24) and finished with a career-high six points (3-3=6), which tied the singlegame franchise record. With the hat trick, he reached 120 career goals and moved past Andrew Brunnette (119 goals with MIN) for sixth on the franchise goal list.

BOLDY AND THE BEAUTIFUL

- Matt Boldy is T-3rd in the NHL with three PPG, T-4th with four multipoint games, and T-12th with 10 points (4-6=10).
- Boldy reached 100 career assists at CBJ (10/19), becoming the 26th player to reach 100 assists in a Wild sweater.
- Boldy opened the 2024-25 season with three points (1-2=3) vs. CBJ (10/10), marking his 12th career three-point game and becoming the sixth player in franchise history with three-plus points in the season opener.
- Finished T-15th in the NHL with seven GWG in 2023-24.
- Finished 2023-24 second on the Wild with 69 points (29-40=69), reaching a new single-season career high with an assist at VGK (4/12).
- Collected his 100th career point (45-55=100) in the 125th game of his career at PIT (4/6/23). Among players to debut with the franchise, he required the second-fewest games to reach the mark behind Kirill Kaprizov (92 GP).

THE GUS BUS IS ROLLING

- Filip Gustavsson owns a 4-0-1 record through five starts, ranking second in the NHL in SV% (.952) and GAA (1.40) and T-2nd in wins among qualified goalies.
- Earned the NHL's Third Star of the Week for the period ending 10/20 after going 2-0-0, stopping 50 of 52 shots faced in two starts for a 1.00 GAA and a .962 SV%.
- Gustavsson scored the first goal of his hockey career, a power-play goal, at STL (10/15), becoming the first goaltender in franchise history to find the net.
- Is one of 15 goalies in NHL history to score a goal, a feat that has only been done a total 18 times.
- The play also marked the third PPG scored by a goalie in NHL history.
- He is the 10th goalie to score a goal by shooting it into an empty net (the others were the last to touch an own-goal).

BROCKED AND LOADED

- **Brock Faber** currently ranks fourth in the NHL with 25:39 of TOI/G.
- Reached 50 career points (8-42=50) in his 89th career game at CBJ (10/19), becoming the second-fastest Wild defenseman to reach 50 points with the franchise (Ryan Suter, 83 games).
- Faber led all NHL rookies with 24:58 TOI per game and 150 blocked shots, ranked T-1st with 39 assists and third with 46 points (8-39=47).
 Faber finished sixth among all NHL skaters in TOI/game.
- With a blocked shot at LAK (4/15/24), became the ninth NHL rookie to post 150-plus blocks in a season since 2005-06.
- With a two-point game (1-1=2) vs. STL (3/23/24), moved past Matt Boldy (15-24=39 in 2021-22) for the second-highest single-season point total by a Wild rookie.
- With two blocks at COL (3/8/24), reached 126 for the season and moved past Nate Prosser (124 blocked shots in 2011-12) for the highest single-season blocked shot total by a rookie in franchise history.
- With an assist vs. PIT (2/9/24), moved his season point total to 4-27=31
 and surpassed Filip Kuba (9-21=30 in 2000-01) for the highest singleseason point total by a Wild rookie defenseman. Also moved past Calen
 Addison (26 assists in 2022-23) for most single-season assists by a
 Wild rookie.
- Played in his 50th career game vs. NSH (1/25). With 29 points (4-25=29) in 50 career games, matched Marek Zidlicky for the second-most points by a Wild defenseman through their first 50 games with the Wild. The only blueliner with more is Ryan Suter (4-29—33 in 50 GP), per NHL Stats.

MATS-TER OF HIS CRAFT

- **Mats Zuccarello** owns an active four-game point streak (2-3=5).
- Posted a 1-1=2 statline at FLA (10/22) and became the fastest player
 in team history (ninth overall) to reach 200 assists with the Wild, doing
 so in his 330th game with the club. The previous mark was held by
 Mikko Koivu (400 games). He also became the sixth player in team
 history to record 70 multi-point games with the club.
- Zuccarello reached 200 career goals by scoring vs. SEA (10/12), becoming the first Norwegian-born player to reach the mark.
- He finished first on the Wild with 51 assists last season.
- With two assists at COL (4/9/24), reached the 50-assist mark for the second season in his career (also 2021-22, 55 assists).
- Needs one assist to tie Zach Parise (201 assists with MIN) for eighthmost in franchise history.

- Is playing in his 21st career NHL season, tied for second-most by a goaltender in NHL history and trailing only Martin Brodeur (22 seasons).

- Fleury recorded his 552nd career win with a 5-0 victory vs. NYI (1/15/24), moving past Patrick Roy (551 career wins) for second-most in NHL history.
- Fleury became the fourth goaltender in NHL history to reach 1,000 games played when he started vs. WPG (12/31/23).
- With his 20th save of the game vs. WPG (12/31/23), became the third goaltender in NHL history to reach 26,000 career saves.
- He made 24 saves at NYR (11/9/23) to reach 25,808 career saves and pass Roy (25.800 career saves) for third most in NHL history.
- Fleury made a season-high 40 saves in a 4-3 OT win at BOS (12/19/23), his 40th career game with 40-plus saves (T-11th most in NHL history).
- Fleury played 58:31 vs. LAK (10/19/23), moving his career minutes total to 57,164:32 and surpassing Terry Sawchuk (57,155:51) for fourth on the all-time list among NHL goaltenders.
- Fleury notched the 65th shootout win of his career vs. NYR (11/4), further extending his all-time NHL record.
- Fleury has recorded a shutout against 29-of-32 NHL teams (St. Louis, Vegas and Minnesota), the most in league history.
- Fleury faced his 28th career penalty-shot attempt at MTL (10/25). Per NHL Stats, Fleury's 22 saves on 28 all-time attempts trail only Roberto Luongo (33 PS SA, 29 PS saves) for the all-time lead in both categories.
