PRESIDENT AND CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD

The Sabres will be celebrating their 20th birthday during the 1989-90 season, and one of the constants of that era has been the strong leadership from the team's ownership. Seymour H. Knox, III, along with his brother, Northrup, has provided the club with stability and direction for the entire life of the franchise.

The Knox brothers' first attempt to bring the NHL to Buffalo came in September, 1965, when they first applied for a franchise. The city was passed over in the 1967 league expansion, so in 1968 Seymour and Northrup signed a contract to purchase the Oakland franchise with the intent of moving it to Buffalo. The NHL Board of Governors decided to keep the Seals in Oakland, but the Knox brothers continued to work towards their goal. Finally, their efforts were rewarded on December 2, 1969, when the city was granted an expansion franchise for the 1970-71 season.

Seymour added the President's duties in May, 1988 (he succeeded Northrup, who resigned to become Chairman of the Board at Marine Midland Bank N.A.), and represents the Sabres on the NHL's Board of Governors.

Seymour currently serves as a Vice President of Kidder, Peabody and Co. He is a director of Pratt & Lambert, Inc. and the F.W. Woolworth Company, and he is a director of several community organizations. Seymour formerly was nationally ranked as a squash racquets player, and is a three-time winner of the U.S. court tennis doubles championships. His hockey career ended as a schoolboy because of a football injury.

Seymour and his wife, Jean, live in Buffalo. They have four children: Seymour IV (who this past summer was named Assistant to the President), W.A. Read, Avery F. and Helen Edith.

GERRY MEEHAN



GENERAL MANAGER

This only will be Gerry Meehan's third full season as General Manager of the Sabres, but he already has gained the respect of practically everyone in the hockey world.

Meehan took over the position on December 22, 1986. In his first full year on the job in 1987-88, the Sabres jumped to a tie for seventh in the overall standings. He finished in a tie for second in voting by The Sporting News for the NHL's Executive of the Year. The club again was above the .500 mark in 1988-89 despite a great many injuries to key players.

Meehan's performance as General Manager is another sign of the Sabres' wisdom in drafting him in the Expansion Draft of 1970. He spent four seasons in Buffalo as a player and was the second captain in the team's history. The center played in the team's first regular season game ever (and had the Sabres' first penalty ever). Meehan's most memorable moment in a Buffalo uniform came in the 1971-72 season, when his goal in the final seconds of the season's last game knocked the Flyers out of the playoffs.

The Toronto native spent 10 seasons in the National Hockey League in all, also playing with Toronto, Philadelphia, Vancouver, Atlanta and Washington.

After retiring from hockey, Meehan received his undergraduate degree from Canisius College and a law degree at the University of Buffalo. Upon graduating in 1982, he joined the law firm of Cohen, Swados, Wright, Hanifin, Bradford and Brett, where he was involved in some of the Sabres' legal work. He was named the team's assistant general manager in the summer of 1984, the first ex-Sabre player to move into the club's front office.

Gerry lives in Amherst with his wife, Mirella, and their three children, Danny, Adam and Katie.

RICK DUDLEY



HEAD COACH

Rick Dudley certainly has taken the long way to returning "home" to coach the Sabres. Now he hopes he'll be here for a while.

Dudley was named the team's 12th head coach in its history on June 16, 1989, as he replaced Ted Sator.

About 20 years ago, the betting was that Dudley would be spending his professional athletic career in the sport of lacrosse, where he was a standout performer. He joined the Sabres' organization for the 1971-72 season, where he played in Cincinnati for future Buffalo coaches Joe Crozier and Floyd Smith.

Dudley finally reached the varsity in 1973-74, and he quickly became a fan favorite in Buffalo with his aggressive style. Dudley had his best year as a Sabre in 1974-75, when his 31 goals helped the Sabres reach the Stanley Cup Finals.

He returned to Cincinnati in the fall of 1975, when he jumped to the Stingers of the World Hockey Association. There the left winger led the team in scoring in his first season, and teamed up with such players as Mike Liut, Mark Messier and Mike Gartner.

Dudley jumped back to the Sabres in the spring of 1979. He helped the club reach the Stanley Cup semi-finals a year later. Dudley was claimed off waivers by Winnipeg on January 12, 1981, and he finished his NHL career with the Jets that season.

Rick served as a player-coach in Fredericton in 1981-82, and moved on to full-time coaching duties in 1982 with Carolina of the Atlantic Coast Hockey League. He stayed for four seasons, winning 3 championships. Dudley then moved up to the Flint Spirits of the International Hockey League, where he turned in two more fine seasons. (The Sabres had an agreement to send some players to Flint at that time, so Dudley often visited Buffalo's training camp during those years.) In 1988-89 Dudley jumped to New Haven of the American Hockey League. After a slow start, the Nighthawks lost in the Calder Cup Finals.

ASSISTANT COACH

The coaching staff of the Sabres won't have a completely new look to it this season. Don Lever will be back for his third season as an assistant coach.

Don is considered one of the most well-liked people in hockey, and Rick Dudley will be relying on his advice about his players and other NHL teams during the course of the coming season.

Lever completed his professional playing career in 1986-87 and moved straight into the coaching ranks with the Sabres. He spent much of his time working with the players individually; he frequently stayed on the ice after practice to share some tips with members of one of the youngest teams in the NHL.

Lever played his junior hockey in nearby Niagara Falls, Ontario. After scoring 126 points in 63 games for the Flyers, he was the first draft choice (and third pick overall) of the Vancouver Canucks in 1972. He spent almost eight full seasons there, and he set his career-high of 38 goals there in 1974-75.

Don was traded to Atlanta in February, 1980, and moved with the Flames to Calgary that summer. He was dealt to Colorado in 1981, and again he was a part of a franchise shift as the Rockies became the New Jersey Devils in 1982.

The Sabres acquired his rights from the Devils on September 9, 1985, and he spent two seasons as a player in Buffalo's organization. During that time he played his 1,000th NHL game. Lever split his playing time between Buffalo and Rochester, and in 1986-87 he served the Amerks as a player-assistant coach under John Van Boxmeer. A Calder Cup championship was a fitting ending for the playing career of this true professional. Lever was named an assistant coach under Ted Sator on June 12, 1987.

Don, his wife Karen and their children, Michael, Sarah and Caitlin, live in Amherst.

JOHN TORTORELLA



ASSISTANT COACH

The Sabres didn't only hire Rick Dudley from the New Haven Nighthawks of the American Hockey League this summer. John Tortorella also moved from the Connecticut city to Buffalo in the off-season.

Tortorella and Dudley have known each other for most of the decade. Tortorella served as Dudley's assistant in New Haven last season. In Buffalo, he will specialize in conditioning, team and game analysis and practice planning.

Tortorella won three letters while playing hockey at the University of Maine. In 1980-81, the senior forward had 12 goals and 30 assists for 42 points in 34 games. He served as a player in the Atlantic Coast Hockey League after that, playing for such teams as Virginia, Hampton Roads and Erie. Dudley was a coach for Carolina in the ACHL during that time. Tortorella was Virginia's top scorer during the 1985-86 season.

In 1986, he was named General Manager and Head Coach of the Virginia Lancers of the ACHL. In two years he had an 87-31 record, and won the league championship and coach of the year honors both times. In 1988, Tortorella worked as an assistant coach for the Fort Wayne Comets during the International Hockey League playoffs.

It's Don Luce's job to try to find the next generation of Buffalo Sabres. If he's lucky, maybe he'll find some Don Luce-types out there.

Don works with Chief Scout Rudy Migay and the rest of the team's scouting staff during the course of the season. Together they search Canadian junior leagues, American high schools and colleges and European leagues in search of promising young players.

Luce has been with the Sabres almost from the beginning of the franchise. He was acquired with current Buffalo broadcaster Mike Robitaille from Detroit for Joe Daley in 1971. As a Sabre, Luce bloomed into one of the finest two-way players in the league.

Luce's best professional season came in 1974-75, when he had 33 goals and 43 assists for 76 points. The center also won the Masterton Trophy that season. He and Craig Ramsay ranked as two of the league's best penalty-killers throughout the 1970's

After a trade to Los Angeles, Luce went on to play for Toronto when he retired in the 1981-82 season. He rejoined the Sabres' organization in 1984, and worked on special assignments and U.S. Scouting before taking his current role in 1987.

CRAIG RAMSAY



DIRECTOR OF PROFESSIONAL EVALUATION AND DEVELOPMENT

Craig Ramsay spent 14 seasons playing for the Buffalo Sabres, and he's working on matching that record in the front office.

In his current role, Ramsay keeps track of the players who have been drafted by the Sabres but who have not become professional players yet. He travels throughout North America, keeping up with players in Canadian junior leagues and in American colleges. Ramsay also assists General Manager Gerry Meehan in a variety of other roles.

The former left winger was Buffalo's second round draft choice in 1971. After a brief slay at the team's farm club in Cincinnati, Ramsay was recalled after the retirement of Dick Duff. He stayed through the 1984-85 season, capping his career by winning the Frank Selke Trophy as the league's top defensive forward.

Ramsay then concentrated on his duties as assistant coach. He stayed in that post until November, 1986, when he was named Buffalo's head coach. Ramsay was shifted to the front office in December, 1986 as part of a reorganization by General Manager Gerry Meehan.

Season passes are available only to those media members who report on the team on a regular basis. Those who need media credentials for an individual game should contact Budd Bailey before noon the day of the game. Press box seats will be filled on a space-available basis.

The media entrance to Memorial Auditorium during Sabres' games is located on the Pearl Street side of the building at street level. Pearl St. runs along the west side of the Aud. There is no media parking area.

Press credentials will be held at this entrance until the start of the games, and they can be picked up earlier on game days from the public relations department. The hundreds of unclaimed credentials from the Sabres' 19 years of play will be the central attraction in the "Sabres' Press Pass Hall of Fame," which is scheduled to be part of the planned renovation of Memorial Auditorium.

The Sabres' press lounge opens two hours before game time, and it is located on the west side of the Auditorium between the second and third level. To reach the press box, take escalators on the west side of the building to the fifth and highest level. The entrance ramp is about 25 feet beyond the end of the escalator. Credentials should be displayed at all times for admission to the press box, press lounge and dressing room areas.

A limited amount of credit card phones are available for use, as well as one pay phone.

Most practices will be held at Sabreland, the Sabres' practice facility on Niagara Falls Boulevard in Wheatfield. Practices are open to the media, and reporters should contact the public relations department to verify times or receive directions to the facility.

NHL NOTES OF INTEREST

ENTRY DRAFT: It will be held on June 16, 1990 in Vancouver as part of the Annual NHL Congress.

GOALS-AGAINST AVERAGE: To calculate for a player or team, divide goals against by minutes played and multiply by 60.

GOALS-FOR AVERAGE: To calculate for a goalie, divide goals scored by his team while he played by minutes played and multiply by 60.

PLUS-MINUS RATING: A player received a "plus-one" when he is on the ice for an even-strength or short-handed goal by his team. He receives a "minus-one" when he is on the ice for an even-strength or short-handed goal by the other team. The overall season rating is determined by totaling all of the pluses and minuses for the season.

POWER PLAY RANKINGS: When a team scores during a five minute power play situation, it is considered that a new situation is about to begin. Therefore, if a team scores one power play goal in five minutes it is considered one for two in the official league rankings. If it scores two goals in that time, it is considered two for three. If a team has a two man advantage, it is considered to be two separate power-play opportunities for statistical purposes.

ROOKIE: In order to be considered a rookie, a player must not have played in 25 or more NHL games in any preceding season, nor in six or more NHL games in each of any two preceding seasons.

SHOTS AGAINST AVERAGE: To calculate for a player or team, divided shots against by minutes played and multiply by 60.

TIE-BREAKERS IN THE STANDINGS: According to the NHL, the following is the official method of determining which team is higher in the standings if two or more clubs have the same number of points:

- 1. Overall wins.
- 2. Points in head-to-head competition.
- 3. Overall goals scored minus overall goals allowed.

4. Special emergency meeting or conference call of general managers.

There is no provision for a coin flip. The same procedure is used for determining the order of the Entry Draft.


TRADING DEADLINE: The deadline is the 26th day preceding the final day of the NHL regular season. The date also marks the last day for loans and recalls from minor league teams except in emergency (usually injury-related) situations.





JOHN VAN BOXMEER



HEAD COACH

A veteran of 12 professional seasons, former Sabres' defenseman John Van Boxmeer this fall enters his filth full term as the coach of Buffalo's top farm club, the Rochester Americans of the American Hockey League. It took Van Boxmeer only two years to bring Rochester its fifth Calder Cup, which was won in 1986-87. After four years on the job, he ranks second on Rochester's all-time coaching victory list with 183. (Joe Crozier is the leader with 261 career wins.)

Van Boxmeer received his coaching start in the Sabres' organization during the 1984-85 season when he was named an assistant coach under Jim Schoenfeld in Rochester. When Schoenfeld returned to the active ranks with the Sabres in December of that year, Van Boxmeer was named interim coach. He has been behind the Rochester bench ever since.

Van Boxmeer's career coaching record is 183-149-37 (.546 winning percentage), and he, Crozier and Mike Keenan are the only Amerk coaches to win AHL championships.

The former high-scoring defenseman started his professional career in Montreal, as the Canadiens selected him in the first round of the 1972 Entry Draft. Van Boxmeer also played with Colorado and Quebec in addition to Buffalo. He enjoyed four productive seasons with the Sabres, registering a careerhigh 69 points in 1980-81. (That was a Sabre record for points by a defenseman until Phil Housley scored 70 in 1988-89.) Van Boxmeer was selected to take part in the 1982 NHL All-Star Game. He had 54 assists in 1982-83, which remains a one-season high for Sabres' defensemen. Van Boxmeer earned a Stanley Cup ring as a member of the Canadiens in 1975-76.

John and his wife, Judy, have a daughter, Ashley Marie, and a son, Henry Gerald.

While the Sabres' line-up on the ice changes from game to game, Buffalo's fans will watch hockey on the same broadcast outlets as they did in the previous two seasons.

WNYB-TV and the Niagara Frontier Sports Network (NFSN) will be back as the Sabres' television outlets. Ted Darling will return as the "Voice of the Sabres." Ted is celebrating his 20th season of describing the team's play. Before coming to Buffalo, Darling graduated from Ryerson Institute and worked for the CBC and for "Hockey Night in Canada."

Color commentator Mike Robitaille is starting his seventh season of broadcasting for the Sabres, and he's developed a large following during that time. Robitaille played for the Sabres from 1971 to 1974. He and current General Manager Gerry Meehan were traded to Vancouver together in 1974.

During home games, John Gurtler will be back as intermission host. Gurtler has been Buffalo's Director of Public Relations since 1986, and he has worked on the broadcasts since that time. Before coming to the Sabres, Gurtler had worked for the Colorado Flames and the Rochester Americans.

Gurtler will again join former Sabre Danny Gare in the studio between periods. Gare is one of the top players in Buffalo history, having played for the team from 1975 to 1981. Gare will supply analysis of highlights and keep viewers updated on news around the league.

On the radio side, WBEN (AM-930) will broadcast the entire Sabres' schedule. Rick Jeanneret and Jim Lorentz will be the announcing team for most of the games. Jeanneret is entering his 19th season as a Buffalo broadcaster, while Lorentz has been describing the action from the press box since 1981.


