



SEYMOUR H. KNOX III Chairman of the Board and President

It's been a decade since the determination and drive shown by the Sabres' president put Buffalo's first National Hockey League team on the ice, and his ambitions for the team and the community which supports it still remain the same: a first Stanley Cup for Buffalo, and many more to follow. Seymour and his brother Norty worked long and hard to get NHL hockey here and didn't slow down in the first nine seasons of the Sabres. Their leadership was the key factor in the successful hockey

history the franchise has chalked up.


Formerly a nationally-ranked squash racquets player and ex-president of the United States Squash Racquets Association, Seymour had his hockey career ended as a schoolboy with a football injury. But he continued his interest in the game and it paid off in December, 1969, with the grant of the Sabres franchise. He is a vice president of Kidder, Peabody and Co., Inc. member of the New York Stock Exchange, and active as a leader in a variety of community organizations. He is the Sabres' representative on the NHL Board of Governors.



NORTHRUP R. KNOX Vice Chairman of the Board

Dogged-persistence by the Knox brothers and their hockey associates led to the Buffalo Sabres franchise, and persistence to build toward championship status describes Norty Knox's life style. He was world champion in the grueling sport of court tennis for ten years, and captain and number one player on the U. S. Polo team in 1966 and 1969. A varsity goalie at Yale University, he was one of the first in the sport to wear contact lenses in the nets, and is the Sabres'

alternate representative on the NHL Board of Governors.



ROBERT O. SWADOS

Vice President and Counsel

There are a few men who worked long and hard to convince the nation that Buffalo was a big league sports town in the days when there wasn't a big league sports franchise on the Niagara Frontier. Bob Swados was one of those men, and in large part it was his dedication and articulate advocacy for big time sport here that resulted in this becoming one of pro sports premier hotbeds in the past few years.

Former vice president of the Buffalo

Bisons Baseball Club and vice president of Major League for Buffalo Inc., he has been counsel to the Knox brothers since their first NHL application in 1965. He is a partner in the law firm of Cohen, Swados, Wright, Hanifin & Bradford. This past summer he was re-elected secretary to the NHL Board of Governors.



DAVID G. FORMAN Administrative Vice President

The day-to-day headaches of the business of sport have been handled since the beginning of the Sabres by Dave Forman, whose administrative ability centers on separating the wheat from the chaff when problems are put before him. If it's sometimes hard to find Dave Forman at his desk, it's because he's out in the Auditorium - in hard hat if need be - checking out some construction, or off at a TV studio arranging for a broader schedule of game telecasts.

A well-known business and civic leader in Western New York for three decades, he

was named administrative vice president and a member of the Sabres' executive committee in the fall of 1970, after serving as club VP since the franchise was awarded.



WILLIAM SCOTT BOWMAN General Manager and Director of Hockey Operations/Coach

William Scott Bowman is the most successful hockey executive currently active in the game, and his record in 12 years with National Hockey League clubs is already one of the best in NHL history. His teams in Montreal won five Stanley Cups in eight years, the last four in succession, and when Scott was general

manager and coach of the expansion St. Louis Blues in the late 1960's, the Blues were Stanley Cup finalists in three of four seasons.

He guided the Canadiens to that fourth consecutive Stanley Cup last spring, despite a string of injuries and personnel setbacks which began in the fall and extended through the final five-game series with the New York Rangers.

The 46-year-old native of Montreal is no stranger to the post of NHL general manager. He was GM and coach of the St. Louis Blues, the latter job for three of four seasons, from 1967 through 1971, and guided the Blues to three Stanley Cup final appearances during his tenure.

He was chief coach of Team Canada, winner of the 1976 Canada Cup tournament, and coach of this year's NHL All-Stars in the three-game series against the Soviet Union. In 1977 he was named NHL Coach of the Year.

NHL teams under Bowman in Montreal and St. Louis over a 12-year period have won 529 games, lost 193, and tied 150. In Stanley Cup play-off competition Bowman clubs have won 96 games and lost 54 enroute to five Cups.

Scott coached minor hockey clubs from 1954-57 after a head injury ended his promising playing career. In 1957 he was named supervisor of all minor league operations for Montreal. He then became assistant to Sam Pollock as manager and coach of the Hull-Ottawa Canadiens in the old Eastern Professional Hockey League, coached the Peterborough Petes and the Junior Canadiens of the OHA Junior "A" League, and later Omaha of the Central Hockey League.

He and his wife, Suella, and family live in suburban Amherst.

JOHN ANDERSEN Assistant General Manager

When Scott Bowman was introduced to the Buffalo news media after being named Sabres general manager, he took the moment to announce what he described as "a key and vital move" to build his hockey organization in Buffalo: that John Andersen had accepted the post of assistant general manager.

Andersen had to quickly pick up the pieces in December of 1978 when the top hockey staff except for John was dismissed by the Sabres. And he picked

them up in an admirable fashion, running the club successfully through the rest of the season. Andersen received the title of Director of Player Personnel at that time; and it was his work which resulted in the return of Rick Dudley from the WHA, the trade which brought the aggressive Dave Schultz to the Sabres, and the timely recall of three young defensemen who sparkled through the last part of the schedule in Buffalo.

John has always been in charge of the day-to-day player personnel arrangements in the Sabres organization. He served as director of scouting from the club's beginnings and supervised the drafts which brought such established young stars as Richard Martin, Craig Ramsay, Jim Schoenfeld, Danny Gare, and Gil Perreault to Buffalo.

He also ran trade negotiations for former General Manager Punch Imlach, and his word and opinion is well respected throughout the NHL. A native of Denmark, John emigrated to Canada as a young man and got his first job in hockey with the Toronto Maple Leafs. He was with Toronto for 10 years, then spent a year with the California Golden Seals, and joined Imlach in Buffalo when the Sabres began operations in 1970.





ROGER NEILSON

Associate Coach

There's an apocryphal story about the intensity of the Sabres' bachelor associate coach's preoccupation with the game of hockey. Once, the story goes, when he was coaching the Peterborough Petes, Roger had a date with a young lady coming up that evening and called one of his Petes players over to tell him of a problem.

"I can't make up my mind," Roger reportedly said, "whether to take her to the midget game or the Junior 'B' game."

His concentration on his chosen profession eventually led Neilson to his first NHL coaching job in the fall of 1977 with the Toronto Maple Leafs. Prior to that he had coached the Leafs' farm club at Dallas, and spent seven seasons with the Petes, handling clubs that never finished lower than third in the highly-competitive Ontario Junior "A" league and winning one championship.

Roger was considered one of the best instructional coaches in junior hockey, turning out well disciplined teams each season, teams which included such fine all-around hockey players as Bob Gainey, Craig Ramsay, Doug Jarvis, and Stan Jonathan.


Neilson's association with new Sabres GM Scott Bowman goes back to the early 60's when Bowman was coaching that same Peterborough club and Roger was scouting for the Petes and the Montreal Canadiens.

He was also a high school teacher while coaching in Peterborough, giving up his teaching career to become both GM and coach of the Petes his last three years there.

He uses every instructional and research aid known to coaches, reads every article on the sport he can obtain, and has closely studied European and Soviet training and instructional methods. This summer he spent nearly a month in China working with hockey players and coaches in the world's largest country.

A native of Toronto, Roger marked his 45th birthday four days before joining the Sabres organization on June 20. During the off-season, when he's not traveling to China or coaching seminars around the world, he lives at his cottage home on a lake near Peterborough.





JIM ROBERTS

Assistant Coach

The newest member of the Sabres' coaching staff has been close to Sabres General Manager/Coach Scott Bowman through his entire hockey career. He played junior hockey in Peterborough with Scott his coach, and later under the same Bowman in Hull-Ottawa, Omaha, St. Louis and Montreal.

Roberts was never gifted NHL scorer, but was one of the hard-nosed hockey players which make a winning

and championship blend. He played both right wing and defense during his 16-season NHL career, and was only out of the playoffs once, in 1977-78 when he finished his playing career with St. Louis.

Roberts will assist Bowman, associate coach Roger Neilson and work with Rochester coach Bill Inglis, as well as perform special scouting duties as part of the Sabres novel coaching unit setup.

He and his wife, Judy, and their two daughters live in suburban Williamsville.



SABRES CELEBRATE OVER-TIME PLAYOFF WIN

NEW DECADE, NEW LOOK

The Sabres organization has been radically overhauled as the club enters its second decade in the National Hockey League. Last season front office changes early in the schedule shocked the hockey world, but the team was able to pull itself together and posted the third best record in the league during the last 57 games of the regular schedule, a record good enough to have won the Adams Division if the season had started on Dec. 7, the day that Billy Inglis took over as coach and John Andersen as director of player personnel

Buffalo appeared to be a legitimate dark horse in 1978-79 for a long run in the Stanley Cup playoffs, but brilliant goaltending by Denis Herron in the nets for Pittsburgh, and what some observers have just termed "fate" knocked them out in the preliminary round.

The club was radically revamped off the ice during the summer, with Scott Bowman coming aboard as general manager and director of hockey operations, Andersen moving to the post of assistant GM, and Roger Neilson joining as Bowman's associate coach. Inglis accepted a coaching job with Buffalo's new American Hockey League affiliate, the Rochester Americans. Jim Roberts then signed on as assistant coach.

The decision to return to stocking a full development team in the AHL was one which brightens the future: The 1975 Sabres, who went to the Stanley Cup finals, were partly a product of the club's development program in Cincinnati, and it's hoped Rochester will provide the same kind of material over the coming decade.

Bowman, Neilson, Roberts and Inglis form what may be the wave of the future in pro hockey coaching, a multi-coach staff to provide better instructional, tactical and strategic methods.

The team's makeup meanwhile has been in the process of slow change. The Sabres obtained Rick Dudley late last year, and traded for the pugnacious Dave Schultz. Injuries caused recalls of three young defensemen from the minors and each one, Mike Boland, Ken Breitenbach and Larry Playfair, played effectively and are threats to be regulars this season.

Tony McKegney, who was a training camp standout last year, and later burned up the American League when put at his normal center spot, returns with a season's experience and shows promise of becoming an outstanding NHL player.

Don Edwards continued his outstanding goaltending, and Bob Sauve was brilliant down the stretch, proving himself a quality NHL goalie.

A nucleus of fast skaters with scoring power remains in Gil Perreault, Richard Martin and Rene Robert, and Don Luce and Ric Seiling are among the league's best two-way players. Their left winger, Craig Ramsay, had his best year as a pro, and was named the Sabres most valuable and popular player. He has to be considered one of the finest all-around players in the league during the past decade.

Defensively, much-injured Jim Schoenfeld and Jerry Korab, who was a tower of strength in 1978-79, return along with other regulars.

The expansion of the league into four new cities didn't cost the Sabres dearly, though some-time regulars Terry Martin and Lee Fogolin were both lost in the expansion draft.

The Sabres ended last season as the second-youngest club in the NHL, so the base for the future is still there in young legs. With special events scheduled through the year to mark Buffalo's 10th season in the NHL, it would seem that for the Sabres and their fans, the best *is* yet to come.



Hard-working Dudley was one of the most popular players in Sabres history despite only two years with the club in the mid-70's, and his return to Buffalo late last season from the WHA was greeted with great enthusiasm by the fans and his teammates. Rick didn't disappoint, leading the team the last third of the schedule in the league's plusminus figures and adding his vigorous brand of checking and skating to the club's lineup. In his first stint with the Sabres Rick developed his hockey skills in addition to a pugnacious style, and was captain of the defunct Cincinnati Stingers in the WHA before returning to Buffalo, cutting down his penalty minutes on return to the NHL. A health food and body building believer, Rick and his wife Linda ran their own store offering natural foods, etc. in Cincinnati during the off season. One of North America's better pro lacrosse players when the sport was played at that level, Rick was originally Minnesota North Stars property, but was released after a serious leg injury in 1971. On recommendation of an old lacrosse coach, he was given a tryout with the Sabres organization and proved he was a big leaguer.





Hockey teams, as their baseball counterparts, are only as good as their strength up the middle, and the 24-year-old Edwards is part of what many consider the finest one-two goaltending tandem in the NHL. 



Winger Terry Martin is off to Quebec; and center Derek Smith, who also shared Gare's Williamsville home as one of Buffalo's "bachelors three", was married during the summer. Gare, who got his nickname because of a seemingly-endless need for extra game tickets on the road, was ill during the summer with what was diagnosed as a severe case of mononucleosis. He is expected to be in good form by early this season, however. 



If the Sabres' 1978-79 injury record sounds like an episode from a soap opera about hospital life, then Bill Hajt could have played one of the leading roles. Usually a very durable player, he was felled by injuries on two occasions which caused him to miss more games than at any time in his pro career, and the Sabres' defense suffered for it. First, a back problem was aggravated by a collision with a goal post at Chicago Stadium; and later he severely jammed his wrist in a collision along the boards in another game. Hajt is one of the team's least noticed defensemen because he plays a conservative, economical style, content to make plays as cleanly and smoothly as he can and seldom rushes the puck. But he has led the Sabres' plus-minus ratings on several occasions, and coaches will agree that's a good telling point about a defenseman. 

The man they call "King Kong" responded magnificently, playing with a sure steadiness far beyond any other year in Buffalo. Korab's mistakes always seem to get Buffalo fans on his back, but his teammates will tell you even the mistakes are hard to criticize because they're usually made in attempting to do something positive on the ice. He scored three goals against Minnesota in one game, and has consistently been the Sabres' highest-scoring defenseman since arriving in Buffalo in a trade with Vancouver in December of 1973. In the off-season he plays golf (well) and pitches softball (better), the latter sport so well that he often shows up hurling in national tournaments. He and his wife Mary Ann and their son J.J. live in suburban Amherst year-round.

Richie Dunn's first major league scrap came two seasons back when he tangled with Boston's Stan Jonathan in Memorial Auditorium, and was a clear winner off the fireplug Boston winger. Richie has never picked his spots or had the easy road in pro hockey. His minor hockey was played in his hometown Boston area, and two years followed in the tough Junior "A" OHA. Invited as a free agent to Buffalo's training camp in 1977, he impressed the Sabres hockey staff and was turned pro and assigned to Hershey. Last year he played in Buffalo through the first half of the schedule and then was sent down to get more ice time and experience. He has a solid and quick-released wrist shot, and has scored 12 goals in 88 games of AHL play. A bachelor, he lives in the Boston area during the off season.

RADIO AND TELEVISION

Radio and television coverage of Sabres hockey is among the most

extensive in the National Hockey League.

All Sabres games are broadcast on WGR Radio (550 AM) in Buffalo and on a regional network. Rick Jeanneret is the play-by-play broadcaster for most radio games, with Ted Darling doing several. WGR Sports Director Sam Anson is color commentator and intermission host.

WGR-TV (Channel 2) will telecast 30 Sabres regular season games this year, with Ted Darling as play-by-play announcer, former NHL winger Pat Hannigan as commentator, and WGR-TV Sports Director

Ed Kilgore as intermission host.

A total of 29 Sabres home games will be available to cable television subscribers in upstate New York. Darling will serve as play-by-play announcer on cable TV, with Paul Wieland as commentator and

George Robertson as between-periods analyst.

Visiting radio and TV positions are in the press box, with camera positions available there, the balcony face at center ice, low center ice. corner balcony and ice level where the Zamboni enters and leaves the ice surface. Special requests for facilities should be directed to the Sabres public relations office. The WGR-TV and cable TV game schedule is indicated on the media guide outside back cover.

ACCOMMODATIONS/MEDIA SERVICES

The Sabres press box is located on the west side of Memorial Auditorium suspended from the ceiling. Telecopy transmitting facilities are located in the press box during games and in the post-game press interview room located between the Sabres and visitors dressing rooms at ice level.

The press lounge is located on the west (press box) side of the building between Level Two and Level Three, and is open two hours before game time, with meal service beginning 90 minutes before game time and ending before the opening faceoff. Refreshments are served in the press box during games, as well as in the press lounge

before games.

Application for single game press credentials must be made by 4 P.M. game days to the Sabres public relations office. They will be filled on a space available basis. The press entrance is located on the Pearl St. (west) side of the Auditorium at sidewalk level and entry must be made there in order to receive proper accreditation. Press identification must be displayed while in the building and for entrance to dress-

ing rooms, press lounge and press box.

Because of the height of the press box, and due to lack of elevators in Memorial Auditorium, the Sabres will operate hot air balloon service between ice level and the press box entrance. Service will be every five minutes "up", and every 10 minutes "down". Balloon attendant will be Jose Cantinflas. The balloon ramp is located on the Pearl St. side of the main lobby and is marked with the word "UP" and an arrow pointing toward the ceiling.
