ANAHEIM DUCKS POSTGAME NOTES

The Anaheim Ducks earned a point in a 3-2 overtime loss to the Calgary Flames Tuesday night at Honda Center, extending their home point streak to four games (3-0-1). Despite the overtime loss, Anaheim is 4-1-1 it's last six games and 7-4-1 the last 12 overall.

ALEX KILLORN opened the scoring for the Ducks with his eighth goal of the season to surpass Jakub Voracek for the eighth-most goals among the 2007 NHL Draft class (224). He has two points his last two games (1-1=2) and three points his last four (1-2=3, +5).

JACKSON LACOMBE extended his point streak to a career-tying three games (third time, 2-1=3) with his ninth assist of the season. He has recorded points in six of his last seven games (2-4=6, +3. He leads Anaheim blueliners in points and assists (8-9=17).

MASON MCTAVISH scored his sixth goal of the season on the power play at 7:36 of the third period to tie the game at two goals apiece and force OT.

CUTTER GAUTHIER earned his 13th assist of the season to rank third among Anaheim leaders in helpers this season. He has four points his last six games (1-3=4) to rank tied for fifth among NHL rookies in points (5-13=18) and assists.

PAVEL MINTYUKOV recorded his sixth assist, marking his third point his last six games (0-3=3).

ISAC LUNDESTROM tallied the primary assist on Killorn's goal for his third on the campaign.

JOHN GIBSON made 30 saves in regulation and overtime and is now 3-1-1 his last six appearances.

Tonight's attendance was 17,396, a sellout including standing room only. The Ducks will embark on a season-long six-game road trip spanning 10 days beginning Jan. 9 at St. Louis (5 p.m. PT).

ALEX KILLORN

On the game

I think they came off really strong. They play a fast game, they are a good forechecking team. I think the beginning of the game was tough for us, but we found our way in the first period and throughout the game. Good of us to get a point out of it, I guess.

On the defense following Drew Helleson's game misconduct

Yeah, I think it is always tough on the D [defense] when you have five. Especially with the pairs, you can get out of the rhythm. But, I thought the D that were playing did a great job.

MASON MCTAVISH

On the team's performance

I think we battled really hard, competed really hard, too so that's something we can lay our head on at night. Obviously you want to get two points but we'll build on it for sure.

On his goal

Cutter [Gauthier] had a lane to the net and I was kind of in between it and just kind of got my stick there, yeah, just kind of redirected it and luckily it went in.

On the challenges of the first period

I don't know, they just came out pretty hard, a lot of pressure down the walls, you know, we expected that we just didn't execute and that's just the way it goes, I guess.

HEAD COACH GREG CRONIN

On the game

It was a tight-checking, playoff-type of game, crowd was awesome. You know, they came out early, they had like eight shots to none. They put everything deep and threw it to the net, I think it was a good strategy, I've seen it, obviously in the pre-scouts but after we got through that, it was just a back and forth game. I really felt, I felt we were gonna tie it, I think we could've shot the puck way more than we did and it's unfortunate the way it ended.

On Drew Helleson's hit and subsequent penalty

I know they're playing a one-on-one and there's no way he was intentionally trying to hit him with the knee. I don't think his skates ever came off the ice. He's trying to play a one-on-one and hit him with the shoulder, I just saw [Connor] Zary cut to the inside and from the bench, I couldn't see where the knees hit, but then I saw the replay and they definitely collided with the knee. Again, I don't know the definition of the penalty. I don't think there was any intention, I hope Zary is okay, he's a hell of a hockey player. Again, I asked (the referees), I said, 'is that an automatic major if there's a knee-on-knee hit?' and his answer, I think it was Brian [Pochmara], said that it was up to their discretion. So, it happened real quick, they looked at the replay and so they must have felt that was the right call.

On the game

On his winning goal in overtime
