GAME NOTES

THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

- Tonight is the second of three games the Stars will play against the Golden Knights this season and the only time the teams are facing off in Dallas this year. They will next play on Jan. 28 in Vegas.
- Since Jan. 1, the Stars have gone 9-for-28 on the power play for a 32.1 percent success rate, which was the fourth-best mark in the NHL during that span entering play Thursday.
 - o Only the Detroit Red Wings (14) have scored more power-play goals than the Stars since Jan. 1.
- **Jake Oettinger** has a 7-2-0 record in his last nine games played dating back to Dec. 29, posting a .932 save percentage and a 1.76 goals-against average during that span.
 - His seven wins since Dec. 29 were tied with Toronto's Joseph Woll for the second-most in the NHL entering play Thursday.
 - Among goalies that have played in at least five games since Dec. 29, Oettinger ranked fifth in both save percentage and goals-against average entering play Thursday.
- Entering play Thursday, the Stars and the Washington Capitals were the only NHL teams this season that have not lost more than two consecutive games.
- The Stars have allowed only 2.49 goals against per game this season, which was the fourth-best mark in the NHL entering play Thursday. Dallas has allowed two or fewer goals in 27 of the 47 games that they have played this year.

ROLLING THE DICE

- Dallas is 6-8-4 all-time vs. Vegas, including a 3-4-3 mark on home ice.
- Roope Hintz has recorded six points (2-4-6) in his last seven games against Vegas.

- Evgenii Dadonov has three goals and five points (3-2—5) in 11 career games against his former club. Dadonov recorded 43 points (20-23—43) in 78 regular season games with the Golden Knights in the 2021-22 season.
- Jason Robertson has six points (3-3—6) in 10 career games played against the Golden Knights. On home ice vs. Vegas, Robertson has registered three points (2-1—3) in five games.
- Jamie Benn has tallied eight points (3-5—8) in 17 career games against Vegas. Of Benn's eight points against the Golden Knights, four (2-2—4) have come on home ice.
- **Jake Oettinger** holds a 4-2-2 record in eight games played against Vegas, with a .925 save percentage and a 2.17 goals-against average.

BACK TO DECEMBER

- Since Dec. 23, the Stars have posted an 10-4-1 record for 21 points and a .700 points percentage. The team's win and point total during that span were both tied with Montréal for the best marks in the league entering play Thursday and their .750 points percentage ranked fourth.
- During that span, the Stars have outscored their opponents 46-34. Their plus-12 goal differential was tied with Columbus for the third-best mark in the league since Dec. 23 entering play Thursday, trailing only the St. Louis Blues and Washington Capitals (both plus-14).
- Thirty-three of the Dallas' 46 goals since Dec. 23 have been scored at 5-on-5, which was tied for second in the NHL entering play Thursday, trailing only St. Louis (37).
- The Stars have gone 468-for-867 at the faceoff dot since Dec. 23 for a 54.0 percent success rate, which was the second-best mark in the league during that span entering play Thursday (NY Islanders, 54.1 percent).
- Jason Robertson is the team's leading scorer since Dec. 23, totaling 20 points (8-12—20) in 15 games played. His 20 points were tied for the third-most in the NHL during that span entering play Thursday.
- Fourteen different Stars skaters have scored at least one goal since Dec. 13: Jason Robertson (8), Jamie Benn (6), Roope Hints (5), Matt Duchene (5), Wyatt Johnston (5), Evgenii Dadonov (4), Mavrik Bourque (3), Thomas Harley (3), Logan Stankoven (2), Oskar Bäck (1), Colin Blackwell (1), Matěj Blümel (1), Miro Heiskanen (1) and Esa Lindell (1).
 - o Robertson's eight goals since Dec. 23 were tied for the sixth-most in the NHL entering play Thursday.

JOHNNY B. GOODE

- Wyatt Johnston assisted on Thomas Harley's goal in Dallas' last game to extend his point streak to five games. With the assist, Johnston now has 30 points (9-21–30) in 30 games since Nov. 28.
 - Johnston's assist brought his career total up to 76, which trails only Matty Beniers (77) and Owen Power (77) for the most by a skater drafted in 2021.
- Johnston's five-game point streak was tied for the eight-longest active point streak in the NHL entering play Thursday.
- A goal or an assist tonight would give Johnston points in six consecutive games for the third time this season, matching
 his career high that he set from Nov. 20 to Dec. 1 and hit again from Dec. 23 to Jan. 4.
- **Johnston** is now pacing to finish the year with 20 goals, 45 assists and 65 points
 - o 45 assists would be a career high for the forward.
 - 65 points would match his career high that he set last season.
- Since Nov. 28, the Stars are outscoring their opponents 20-13 at 5-on-5 when Johnston is on the ice according to Natural Stat Trick.
 - o His 20 5-on-5 on-ice goals for since Nov. 28 are tied with Esa Lindell for the most of any Stars skater.
- **Johnston** tied his single-game career high with three assists in Dallas' game on Jan. 18, factoring in on all three of the Stars' goals.
- **Johnston** also went 20-for-24 at the faceoff dot on Jan. 18, setting career highs in both faceoffs taken and draws won in a single game. It also made **Johnston** the first Stars skater to win 20 draws in a single-game since Brad Richards went 20-for-37 at the faceoff dot Dec. 18, 2008.

ROBO ON THE GOGO

- Jason Robertson enters tonight's matchup having totaled 29 points (10-19—29) in his last 25 games played dating back to Dec. 1 against the Winnipeg Jets. His 29 points during that span are the most of any Stars skater and were tied for ninth in the NHL entering play Thursday.
 - o Robertson has multi-point efforts in seven of the last 12 games that he has played.
- Robertson recorded two points against the Red Wings on Jan. 19 to bring his career total to 356 (148-208—356). He is now just one point shy of tying Loui Eriksson for 19th on the franchise's all-time scoring list.
- Robertson factored in on all three of Dallas' goals in their Jan. 18 game against the Avalanche, scoring two goals and adding an assist to bring his season total to 40 points (14-26—40). Robertson has recorded at least 40 points in each of the five full NHL seasons that he has played.
 - His two goals came just 39 seconds apart, marking the fastest two goals by a Stars skater since Joe Pavelski on Nov. 26, 2021 (0:19) according to NHL Stats.
- Robertson scored the deciding goal in the shootout in Dallas' Jan. 11 game, a 2-1 victory over the Montréal Canadiens.
 - o In his career, **Robertson** has gone 16-for-28 in shootout attempts. His 57.1 career percent success rate in the shootout is tied for the sixth-best mark among all active NHL skaters that have at least five shootout attempts.

- Robertson recorded two assists in Dallas' game on Jan. 2 against the Ottawa Senators for his 100th career multi-point game, becoming the 15th player in Stars/North Stars history to record 100 multi-point games according to NHL Stats.
 Only four players in franchise history have posted 100 multi-point games before age 26: Brian Bellows (151 GP), Mike Modano (126 GP), Bobby Smith (123 GP) and Dino Ciccarelli (101 GP).
- Robertson tallied three points (1-2—3) in Dallas' game on Dec. 31 against the Sabres to take sole possession of 21st on the franchise's all-time scoring list, passing Joe Nieuwendyk and Al MacAdam. Robertson has 344 career points (142-202—344) in 329 regular-season games.
- Robertson's second assist against the Sabres was the 200th of his career, making him the 27th player in Stars franchise
 history at the seventh player from the 2017 draft class to total 200 NHL assists.
- Additionally, Robertson who turned 25 on July 21 became the third player in Stars team history to register 200 career assists at age 25 or younger (all assists w/ DAL) according to NHL Stats.

KILLING IT

- The Stars have had an 85.8 percent success rate on the penalty kill this season, which was the best mark in the NHL
 entering play Thursday.
- Dallas has allowed only 18 power-play goals against and .38 power-play goals against per game played this year, which
 were both the top marks in the NHL entering play Thursday.
- Thomas Harley has allowed 3.10 power-play goals against per 60, which was the seventh-best mark in the NHL entering play Thursday among NHL skaters that have at least 50 minutes of shorthanded ice time this season.
- Esa Lindell has skated 165:42 minutes on the penalty kill this season, which was the most of any NHL skater this season entering play Thursday.
 - Since 2016-17 his first full NHL season no skater has spent more time on the penalty kill than Lindell, who
 has totaled 1946:27 of shorthanded ice time during that span.

LEAGUE LEADERS

- Miro Heiskanen is averaging 25:15 of ice time per game this season, which was the fifth-most in the NHL this year entering play Thursday.
- Thomas Harley enters tonight's matchup against the Golden Knights with a plus-24 on-ice, even-strength goal differential this season, which was tied for the fourth-best mark in the NHL this year entering play Thursday.
 - o In all this season, **Harley** has a plus-21 plus/minus rating, which was tied for the second-best mark among all NHL defensemen entering play Thursday.
- Oskar Bäck has gone 68-for-120 at the faceoff dot this season for a 56.7 percent success rate, which topped all rookies that have taken at least 20 draws this season entering play Thursday.

DOUBLE DUTCH

- Matt Duchene had two assists in Dallas' game on Jan. 18 against the Red Wings and now has 15 points (5-10—15) in his last 13 games played dating back to Dec. 29 against the Chicago Blackhawks.
- His 15 points during that span are the second-most on the Stars roster and were tied for ninth in the NHL entering play Thursday.
- Duchene has 45 points (18-27—45) this season, which tops all Stars skaters. It puts him on pace to finish the year with 32 goals, 47 assists and 79 points.
 - o Thirty-two goals, 47 assists and 79 points would all be the second-highest totals of his 15-year career.
- In all, **Duchene** has totaled 110 points (43-67—110) in 127 regular-season games with the Stars since the start of the 2023-24 season, which is the second-most of any Stars skater during that span (**Jason Robertson**; 122).

IRON SHARPENS IRON

- The Stars have four skaters that have played in at least 200 consecutive games: Jamie Benn (344), Jason Robertson (257), Esa Lindell (217) and Wyatt Johnston (211). Entering play Thursday, Dallas was the only team in the NHL to have four players riding Iron Man streaks of at least 200 games.
- Dallas' last game on Jan. 21 against the Hurricanes was the 344th consecutive game that **Benn** played in, which is the fifth-longest active Iron Man streak in the NHL. He is one of seven players to have an Iron Man streak of at least 300 games.
- Robertson's 257-game Iron Man streak is the 13th-longest in the NHL. The Stars and the Detroit Red Wings were the only teams to have two players ranked in the top 15 entering play Thursday.
- Lindell's 217-game Iron Man streak ranks eighth among all NHL defensemen.
- **Johnston's** Iron Man Streak began when he made his NHL debut on Oct. 13, 2022. He is one of 44 players in NHL history to begin their NHL career by playing in at least 200 consecutive games according to NHL Stats.

ONE FOR THE HISTORY BOOKS

- Jake Oettinger's next shutout will be the 12th of his career, which will tie Jon Casey for the sixth-most in franchise history.
- Miro Heiskanen is one assist shy of tying Darian Hatcher (223) for sixth on the franchise's all-time assists list by defensemen.

- Esa Lindell enters tonight's contest two assists shy of tying Alex Goligoski (155) for 25th all-time among Stars/North Stars defensemen.
- Jason Robertson is two goals shy of becoming the 19th player in franchise history to score 150 goals with the team.

CONNECT FOUR

- Stars forward Roope Hintz (Finland), defensemen Miro Heiskanen (Finland) and Esa Lindell (Finland), and goaltender Jake Oettinger (United States) have all been selected to represent their home country at the 4 Nations Face-Off, which will be held in Montreal and Boston from Feb. 12 to 20, 2025.
- Dallas is one of six NHL teams to have at least one forward, defenseman and goaltender from their roster to be selected for the 4 Nations Face-Off, with the others being Boston, Minnesota, Vancouver, Vegas and Winnipeg.
- Only six teams have had more players selected to a 4 Nations roster than the Stars: Colorado, Florida, Minnesota, Tampa Bay and Vegas. The full breakdown is as follows:

- All four players have previously represented their home countries in international competition.
 - Heiskanen has played for Finland at the 2017 and 2018 IIHF World Junior Championships, 2018 and 2022 (gold)
 IIHF World Championships and at the 2018 Winter Olympic Games.
 - Lindell suited up for the Fins at the 2014 IIHF World Junior Championship, where he won a gold medal. He
 again represented Finland at the 2015, 2016 (silver) and 2022 (gold) IIHF World Championships and at the
 2016 World Cup of Hockey.
 - Hintz previously played for Finland at the 2015 and 2016 IIHF World Junior Championships, winning a gold medal at the later tournament.
 - Oettinger has played for Team USA at the 2017 and 2018 IIHF World Junior Championships and at the 2021 IIHF World Championship. He medaled in all three tournaments, winning bronze in 2018 and 2021 and gold in 2017.
- The 4 Nations Face-Off will mark the first time that all three of Heiskanen, Hintz and Lindell are playing for Finland together.
 - o Heiskanen and Lindell previously won a gold medal together at the 2022 IIHF World Championship.
- The Stars will also be well-represented among the 4 Nations staff, with Jim Nill (Associate GM), Pete DeBoer (Assistant Coach) and Misha Donskov (Assistant Coach) all set to join Canada's staff for the tournament. Additionally, former Star Jere Lehtinen will serve as Finland's General Manager.

- Stars defenseman Brendan Smith and forward Colin Blackwell were members of the New York Rangers when Vegas
