4 NATIONS RECAP

The NHL's 4 Nations Face-Off wrapped up on Thursday night with Sidney Crosby captaining Team Canada to the Championship over Head Coach Mike Sullivan's Team USA.

■ Crosby recorded five points (1G-4A) in four games, including three assists in the opening game when he was named Player of the Game. His five points were the second most in the entire tournament:

- Crosby joined Wayne Gretzky as the second player to captain two championship teams in NHL International Tournament play.
- Penguins Rickard Rakell and Erik Karlsson represented Team Sweden and went 1-0-2-0 in three games, just barely missing out on the Championship Game as they tied Team Canada with five points apiece.
- Karlsson recorded a goal and two assists in three games, while Rakell was a plus-1 in two outings. Karlsson's three points led all Swedish players throughout the tournament:

Sidney Crosby, who is historically successful in day games, faces the Washington Capitals today at 3:00 PM.

■ In 152 career day games, Crosby has tallied 80 goals, 120 assists and 200 points. His 200 points are the second most in NHL history while his 80 goals are the fifth most:

SHUT THE DOOR

BLUELINE BLITZ

Pittsburgh's one-two punch on the blueline of Kris Letang and Erik Karlsson have put up points against the Washington Capitals throughout their respective careers.

- Letang has tallied seven goals, 27 assists and 34 points in 61 games against Washington, while Karlsson has accumulated five goals, 26 assists and 31 points in 37 games played.
- Letang and Karlsson rank first and second, respectively, in assists and points against the Capitals among active defensemen:

TWO-HEADED MONSTER

Sidney Crosby and Evgeni Malkin have both been dominant in their careers against the Washington Capitals.

- Crosby and Malkin rank first and second, respectively, in goals, assists and points against Washington among all active players.
- In games that Crosby and Malkin both suited up against the Capitals, the duo has combined for 142 points, which is the second most by a duo against Washington in NHL history:
