JARR'D LOOSE

Tristan Jarry won his fourth-consecutive game on Saturday against the Devils, stopping 24 of New Jersey's 27 shots en route to the win.

- Since Jarry's first start on March 9 after being re-called from the Wilkes-Barre/Scranton Penguins, the goaltender is 4-0-0 with a .930 save percentage and 2.24 goals-against average.
- In that span, no goaltender has more wins than Jarry's four and his save percentage ranks third in the league (min. 3 GP):

Sidney Crosby recorded his third-consecutive multi-point game on Thursday against the St. Louis Blues en route to a 5-3 win.

Crosby enters tonight's game riding an 10-game home point streak, which is the third-longest active streak in the league:

Erik Karlsson scored his 10th goal of the season on Saturday against the Devils on the power play to extend his point streak to four games (2G-2A).

Karlsson has six goals, 11 assists and 17 points over his last 17 games. Since that stretch began on January 29, only two defensemen in the league have more points than Karlsson:
