



FLAMES LAST GAME RECAP

April 7, 2026 – CALGARY FLAMES [3] vs. DALLAS STARS [4] (OT)

The Calgary Flames displayed a gritty effort on Tuesday night but ultimately fell 4-3 in overtime to the Dallas Stars. Calgary responded well after falling behind in the second with Joel Farabee and Yegor Sharangovich striking before Zayne Parekh's early third-period powerplay goal gave them control, while Adam Klapka contributed a pair of assists in a strong outing. However, the Dallas battled back as Wyatt Johnston and Jason Robertson scored just minutes apart to tie the game and force overtime. The Stars would find a winner in the extra frame and claim two points. Devin Cooley made 21 saves between the pipes for the Flames, including nine in overtime.

TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS

This is the second of three meetings this season between the Flames and Avalanche. Calgary began their six-game road trip in Colorado 10 days ago.

This is a Pacific Division versus Central Division matchup; the Flames have a record of 5-14-2 against Central Division teams and a record of 18-22-5 against Western Conference opponents.

THE BEEZ KNEES:

Joel Farabee found the back of the net on Tuesday in Dallas to give him goals in back-to-back contests, and points in five of his last six games. Farabee has now totalled 19 tallies on the campaign, and with one more he could reach the 20-goal plateau for the third time in his career, along with his career-best 22-goal 2023-24 season and 20-goal effort in 2020-21 as a member of the Philadelphia Flyers.

MATT SCOREONATO:

Matt Coronato registered an assist on Tuesday in Dallas to pick up his 14th powerplay point of 2025-26, the second-most on the Flames behind Morgan Frost (15). The helper also moved Coronato into a tie with Frost and captain Mikael Backlund for a team-leading 41 points on the campaign. The 23-year-old sits six points shy from matching his career-high of 47, which he set last season from 24 goals and 23 assists.

HIT THE GIRDDY:

Matvei Gridin registered an assist on Tuesday night in Dallas to record his third point in his last two games. Through the first 33 games of his NHL career, Gridin has amassed 18 points from six goals and 12 assists. Over his last 16 contests, he has found his way onto the scoresheet in 11 of them, sitting tied fifth in rookie scoring since March 5.

MÄÄTTÄ OF FACT:

Olli Määttä enters tonight's matchup with 799 games played in his NHL career and is looking to skate in his 800th contest tonight. Määttä was a first round pick by Pittsburgh in the 2012 NHL Draft, being selected 22nd overall. He would play the first 362 games of his career with the Penguins, winning back-to-back Stanley Cups in 2016 and 2017 before spending time with Chicago, Los Angeles, Detroit, Utah and now Calgary. During that time, Määttä has represented Finland at three best-on-best international events, including the 2016 World Cup of Hockey and is a two-time Olympic bronze medalist in 2014 and 2026. He has amassed 208 points through 799 games from 44 goals and 164 assists.

ROCKY MOUNTAIN TIES:

Nazem Kadri has spent time with both clubs, having been traded from Calgary to Colorado for his second stint as an Avalanche this past trade deadline on March 6. Kadri played 61 games this season, and 307 in total with the Flames, scoring 100 goals 139 assists for 239 points during his Calgary Flames tenure. Prior to that, he spent three seasons with Colorado from 2019-2022 scoring 155 points (58G, 97A) and helped the Avs win the 2022 Stanley Cup. Avalanche defenseman Cale Makar was born in Calgary and played his junior hockey just two hours east of his hometown with the Brooks Bandits of the AJHL.

Flames forward Victor Olofsson began the 2025-26 season with Colorado, skating in 60 games with the Avalanche before he was acquired by Calgary at the 2026 trade deadline. He has since appeared in 14 contests with the Flames, scoring two goals and four assists for six points.



LOOK BACKS AT IT:

Mikael Backlund enters tonight's contest with 16 goals on the campaign, seeing him tied with Owen Nolan for the third most goals by player age 35 or older in a single season in Flames history:

Olli Määttä recorded a career-high in time on ice on Tuesday in Dallas, skating in 30:00 minutes. His highest TOI in a game prior to Tuesday was 28:15 on December 10, 2024 against Minnesota.

Adam Klapka registered two assists on Tuesday night in Dallas to register his second multi-point game of the season (also Jan. 17 vs. NYI: 1-1 – 2), and fourth of his career. His first NHL multi-point game came at Ball Arena against Colorado on March 31, 2025 (1-1 – 2)
