- With Tuesday's win, the Stars improve to 8-3-0 in their last 11 games played against the Capitals and extend their home winning streak against Washington to four games.
- Tuesday's game marked the 32nd time in franchise history that the Stars have recorded a 1-0 win and the first time that they have done so since April 13, 2023, a 1-0 home victory against the St. Louis Blues.
- **Lian Bichsel** tied his single game career high (that he set on Oct. 25 against Nashville) with eight hits tonight. He is the only player in the NHL this season to record eight hits in a game on two separate occasions

GAME NOTES

THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

- Tonight is the first of two games the Stars will play against the Lightning this season. The two teams will face each other again on Jan. 18 in Dallas.
- A win tonight would give the Stars their first four-game win streak of the season, and a win or an overtime loss would extend the team's point streak to five games.
- Tonight's matchup against Tampa Bay marks the second of three consecutive games the Stars will play against Eastern Conference teams. They played the Capitals (a 1-0 win) on Tuesday and will take on the Panthers on Saturday.
- The defensive pair of **Miro Heiskanen** and **Esa Lindell** (65.3 percent) ranked second the NHL in expected goal share among defensive pairs to play at least 100 minutes together entering play Wednesday according to MoneyPuck.com.

- **Oskar Bäck** scored his first goal of the year in his first game played of the season on Sunday against the Predators, making him the 15th Stars skater to score a goal for Dallas this season. Entering play Wednesday, only the Edmonton Oilers (17) and Detroit Red Wings (16) had more goal scorers than the Stars this year.
- **Lian Bichsel** has totaled a team-high 33 hits this season, which ranked third among all NHL defensemen entering play Wednesday.
 - If **Bichsel** were to have at least eight hits in a game again, he would become the ninth player in franchise history to have recorded three eight-hit games and the sixth player to do so in one season, joining Mark Fistic (3; 2009-10, 5; 2011-12), Jani Hakanpää (3; 2023-24), Joel Lundqvist (4; 2006-07), Brendan Morrow (3; 2005-06, 3; 2009-10), Steve Ott (5; 2008-09, 7; 2009-10, 6; 2011-12) and Stephane Robidas (3; 2009-10)
- **Adam Erne** has totaled 31 hits in seven games played this season. Entering play Wednesday, his 25.80 hits per 60 were the third-best mark in the NHL among players to appear in at least three games this season.
- Since the start of the 2024-25 season, **Casey DeSmith** has a 11-5-0 record on the road, posting 2.27 goals-against average, .925 save percentage and two shutouts in those games. Among netminders to play in at least 10 road games since the start of last season, **DeSmith** tied for second and ranked fourth, respectively, in save percentage in goals-against average in the NHL during that span entering play Wednesday.

LIGHTNING STRIKES TWICE

- Dallas is 30-23-7 all-time vs. Tampa Bay, including a 16-12-3 mark on the road.
- The Stars have earned points in five of their last seven games played against the Lightning (3-2-2) dating back to April 12, 2022.
- **Mikko Rantanen** has put up 10 points (3-7—10) in 16 career games against the Lightning.
- **Tyler Seguin** has registered a team-high 26 points (10-16—26) in 33 career games vs. Tampa Bay.
- **Roope Hintz** has 13 points (5-8—13) in 19 career games played against the Lightning.
- **Jason Robertson** has tallied 12 points (4-8—12) in 15 career games played vs. Tampa Bay, including recording four multi-point outings.
- **Miro Heiskanen** ranks sixth in time on-ice per game against the Lightning (24:28) among active NHL defensemen who have played Tampa Bay at least five times in their careers.
- **Sam Steel** enters tonight's contest riding a two-game point streak against the Lightning, earning two points (0-2—2) during that span. In all, **Steel** has totaled five points (2-3—5) in 10 career games vs. Tampa Bay.
- **Oskar Bäck** registered a goal in his last outing against the Lightning and holds a plus-minus rating of +2 in his career against them (1-0—1, 2 GP).
- **Matt Duchene** enters tonight's game riding a two-game point streak vs. Tampa Bay (1-2—3). In all, **Duchene** has 25 points (11-14—25) in 31 career games against Tampa Bay.

TYLER THE CREATOR

- **Tyler Seguin** is set to play in his 1000th regular-season game tonight, playing in the first 203 games of his career with the Boston Bruins and the next 797 with the Stars.
- In reaching the milestone, he becomes the 270th forward in NHL history, the 39th active player and the third player selected in the 2010 NHL Draft (Cam Fowler, Jeff Skinner) to skate in 1000 regular-season games.
- **Seguin** is set to become the 20th player in franchise history to play in his 1000 NHL games with the Stars/North Stars according to NHL Stats.
- **Seguin** enters tonight's contest having recorded 814 career points (363-451—814) in 999 regular-season games, ranking 24th among active NHL skaters and leading 2010 draftees in career scoring.
- **Seguin** has totaled 693 points (307-368—693) with the Stars ranking fifth in franchise history in goals, assists and points. His 796 regular-season games played with the club are the eighth-most in franchise history.
 - **Seguin's** 61 playoff points (23-38—61) with the Stars are the 10th-most in franchise history.
- **Seguin** has represented his team at the NHL All-Star Game six times (2012, 2015, 2016, 2017, 2018, 2020) and has also led his team in scoring five times (2011-12, 2013-14, 2016-17, 2018-19, 2019-20).

BIKER GANG

- Tonight will mark the first game that defenseman **Thomas Harley** has played in since signing an eight-year, \$84.696 million contract extension with the Stars. With the extension, **Harley** becomes the sixth Stars player signed through at least the 2029-30 season, joining **Roope Hintz**, **Wyatt Johnston**, **Esa Lindell**, **Jake Oettinger** and **Mikko Rantanen**.
- **Harley** has totaled 111 points (33-78—111) in 207 regular-season games with Dallas since making his NHL debut during the 2021-22 season. Originally selected by the Stars with the 18th overall pick of the 2019 NHL Draft, he ranks third among defensemen drafted that year in career scoring and leads all 2019 draftees with 27 career playoff points (5-22—27).
- Since the start of the 2023-24 season, **Harley** has totaled 105 points (32-73—105) in 167 regular-season games, tying for 14th among all defensemen in scoring during that span and tying for eighth among all NHL skaters with five overtime goals.
- **Harley** enters tonight's game tied for fourth on the team in scoring with eight points (1-7—8) in 10 games played this season. His eight points were tied for seventh among all NHL defensemen entering play Wednesday.
- **Harley** has also totaled a team-leading 30 blocked shots this year, which was the third-most in the NHL entering play Wednesday.
- Since Jan. 1 of this year, **Harley** has totaled 41 points (13-28—41) in 54 regular-season games, which was tied with Vancouver's Quinn Hughes for the ninth-most among all NHL defensemen during that span entering play Wednesday. Additionally, his 13 goals during that span were the third-most by any NHL defenseman entering play Wednesday.
 - He enters tonight's game four points shy of matching his point total from the 2024 calendar year (10-37—47).

- **Harley's** 13 regular-season goals since Jan. 1 are already tied for the 10th-most by a Stars defenseman in a single calendar year according to NHL Stats.
 - He's tied with Sergei Zubov in both 2001 and 1997, Mark Tinordi in 1993 and Craig Hartsburg in 1986.
- **Harley** began the 2025-26 season with a point in four consecutive games, marking the first time in his career that he began a season with a four-game point streak. It was also the third time in his career that he recorded a point in four consecutive games.
- **Harley** was one of four NHL defensemen to begin the 2025-26 season with a point in each of his first four games played, joining the Hurricanes' Shayne Gostisbehere (1-6—7) and Alexander Nikishin (1-3—4), and the Islanders Matthew Schaefer (1-3—4).
- With two assists in the season opener, **Harley** became the 25th defenseman in franchise history to have two or more points in a season-opening game according to NHL Stats and the first to do so since **Miro Heiskanen** (1-1—2) in the 2021 season opener.
- **Harley** had two points again the following game against the Avalanche, scoring a goal and adding an assist. His goal was the 33rd of his career, which is second most by a Stars/North Stars defenseman prior to his 200th contest behind Brad Maxwell (34) according to NHL Stats.
- **Harley** enters tonight's game three goals shy of surpassing Barry Gibbs (35) and Mark Tinordi for the 15th-most goals by a defenseman in franchise history. Gibbs and Tinordi both scored 35 goals in 375 regular-season games with the Stars.
- **Harley** played in his 200th NHL game in the Stars' game against the Wild on Oct. 14. In reaching the milestone, **Harley** became the 24th skater and fourth defenseman drafted in 2019 to play in 200 NHL games, and the 39th defenseman in franchise history to play in 200 games for the Stars.

POWER UP

- The Stars have gone 11-for-35 on the power play this season for a 31.4 percent success rate, which was the third-best mark in the NHL entering play Wednesday. Only the Minnesota Wild (14) and Ottawa Senators (13) had scored more power-play goals than the Stars entering play Wednesday.
 - The Stars didn't score their 11th power-play goal of the season until their 21st game played during the 2024-25 campaign.
- If the Stars were to score on the man advantage tonight, it would give them at least one power-play goal in four consecutive games for the first time since March 2 to 12, 2024.
- When playing at the American Airlines Center this season, the Stars have gone 9-for-21 on the power play for a 42.9 percent success rate, which was the best mark in the League entering play Wednesday. Their nine home power-play goals trailed only Minnesota (11) for the most in the NHL.
- Dallas has scored two power-play goals four different times this season – on Oct. 14 vs. Minnesota, on Oct. 16 vs. Vancouver, on Oct. 23 vs. Los Angeles and on Oct. 25 vs. Carolina. Entering play Wednesday, the Stars and the Wild were the only teams this season to have scored two or more power-play goals in four games.
 - In 2024-25, the Stars recorded their fourth multi power-play goal game in their 29th game of the season.
- Dallas' 11 power-play goals have been scored by seven different skaters: **Wyatt Johnston** (3), **Mikko Rantanen** (2), **Jason Robertson** (2), **Matt Duchene**, **Miro Heiskanen**, **Tyler Seguin** and **Sam Steel**. Entering play Wednesday, only the Ottawa Senators (8) had more players score a power-play goal this season than the Stars.
 - **Steel's** power-play goal against the Hurricanes was only the second of his career and his first since Nov. 18, 2018 against the Washington Capitals while he was playing for the Anaheim Ducks.
- Entering play Wednesday, **Johnston's** three power-play goals were tied for the sixth-most in the NHL. His three power-play goals this season are already tied for the second-most in a single season in his career.
 - **Johnston** didn't score his third power-play goal of the 2024-25 season until his 52nd game played on Feb. 2, 2025 against the Columbus Blue Jackets.
- **Rantanen** has totaled eight points (2-6—8) on the power play this season, which was tied for the second-highest mark in the NHL entering play Wednesday.

OTTER DOMINANCE

- **Jake Oettinger** turned away all 24 shots he faced in the Stars last game on Oct. 28 against Washington to record the 13th shutout of his career.
 - **Oettinger** saved 3.59 goals-against in the game according to MoneyPuck.com.
- His 13 career shutouts rank sixth in franchise history and are the fifth-most among active, American goaltenders.
- **Oettinger** is now 6-0-0 in his career against the Capitals, posting a .958 save percentage, 1.25 goals-against average and one shutout in those games.
- **Oettinger** has not allowed a goal against in 100:11 of play, which was the longest active shutout streak in the NHL and the fourth-longest overall entering play Wednesday.

THE MOOSE IS LOOSE

- **Mikko Rantanen** has tallied 12 points (4-8—12) through the Stars' first 10 games of the season and enters tonight's game leading the team in scoring. He has recorded a point in all but one game this season.
 - A goal or an assist tonight would give **Rantanen** his second five-game point streak of the season.
- When **Rantanen** has been on the ice during 5-on-5 play this season, the Stars are outscoring their opponents 7-3 according to Natural Stat Trick. His seven on-ice goals for top Dallas' roster and his plus-4 goal differential is tied with Ilya Lyubushkin for the best mark on the team.

- **Rantanen** had three points (1-2—3) in the season opener to make the 2024-25 campaign the fourth consecutive season opener that he had at least three points after scoring a hat trick in 2024, recording two goals and two assists in 2023 and notching four assists in 2022.
- **Rantanen** enters tonight's game two goals shy of totaling 300 career goals. When he reaches the milestone, he will become:
 - The fourth Finnish skater in NHL history to score 300 NHL goals, joining Teemu Selane (684), Jari Kurri (601) and Olli Jokinen (321).
 - The second player selected in the 2015 NHL Draft to score 300 NHL goals, joining Edmonton's Connor McDavid (364).
 - The 38th active skater to score 300 NHL goals.
- Since the start of the 2016-17 season – **Rantanen's** first full NHL year – his 298 goals are the eighth-most in the NHL and his 717 points (297-420—717) rank 10th.
- Thirty of those 298 goals have come from 10 hat tricks. Since the start of the 2016-17 season, only David Pastrnak (19), Alex Ovechkin (17), Auston Matthews (13), Connor McDavid (12) and Patrik Laine (11) have scored more hat tricks than **Rantanen's** 10.
 - His 10 hat tricks trail only Jari Kurri (23), Teemu Selane (22) and Laine (11) for the most by a Finnish skater in NHL history.

JOHNNY B. GOODE

- **Wyatt Johnston** has totaled 10 points (6-4—10) in Dallas' first 10 games played of the season and enters tonight's game ranked second on the team in scoring. He has recorded a point in all but two games this season.
- **Johnston's** tying goal against the Predators on Oct. 26 was the 95th goal of his career, tying Steven Payne for the fourth-most by a Stars/North Stars player prior to age 23 (**Johnston** turns 23 on May 14) according to NHL Stats. He trails only Brian Bellows (159), Mike Modano (123) and Dino Ciccarelli (102) on the list.
- He now enters tonight's game five goals shy of scoring 100 NHL goals. When he reaches the milestone, he will become:
 - The first player selected in the 2021 NHL Draft to score 100 NHL goals.
 - The 26th player in franchise history to score 100 goals for the Stars/North Stars.
- If **Johnston**, who is 22 years and 169 days old today, scores his 100th goal on or before Dallas' Nov. 1 game against the Florida Panthers, he will become the second-youngest player in franchise history to total 100 goals with the club according to NHL Stats.
 - Brian Bellows currently holds the franchise record, scoring his 100th goal with the Stars when he was 20 years and 179 days old.
 - Currently ranked second in franchise history, Mike Modano scored his 100th NHL goal when he was 22 years and 173 days old.
- **Johnston** scored in each of the Stars' first four games of the season, making him the fifth skater in franchise history to begin a season with a four-game goal streak. He and Minnesota's Matt Boldy were the only two skaters this year to score in each of their first four games played.
- With his goal against the Jets, **Johnston** became the ninth player in franchise history – and the first since Sergei Zubov (1996-97 to 2005-06; 9) – to record a point in at least four consecutive season openers according to NHL Stats.

IT AIN'T OVER 'TIL IT'S OVER

- Dallas played their first of 12 back-to-back set of the season this past weekend, facing off against the Hurricanes at home on Saturday and taking on the Predators in Nashville on Sunday. Five Stars skaters scored a goal during the team's back-to-back set: **Miro Heiskanen** (2), **Oskar Bäck**, **Wyatt Johnston**, **Mikko Rantanen** and **Sam Steel**.
- In both games the Stars...
 - Trailing 2-0 in the second period.
 - Scored two second-period goals to tie the game going into the third period.
 - Scored a game-winning goal on the power-play in the third period.
- According to NHL Stats, the Stars recorded multi-goal comeback wins in consecutive games for the ninth time in franchise history and first since 2019-20 (Dec. 29, 2019 – Jan. 1, 2020). It also marked the first time in franchise history that the team accomplished this feat in consecutive calendar days.
- According to Josh Clark of Victory+, the Stars were one of four teams this season with multiple multi-goal comeback games entering play Wednesday.
- The Stars have won two games this season after trailing at the first intermission, which was tied for the second-most in the League entering play Wednesday. Only the New Jersey Devils (3) have more.

MIRO THE HERO

- **Miro Heiskanen** notched the primary assist on Dallas' lone goal last game, a 1-0 win over Washington, and now has three points (2-1—3) in his last three games played.
- **Heiskanen** scored two goals in Saturday's game against the Hurricanes, opening the scoring for the Stars and tallying the game-winning goal on the power play in the third period. It marked the first multi-goal game by a Stars skater this season.
- His performance against Carolina marked the sixth multi-goal game of his career and first since Nov. 11, 2024. His first goal of the game also was his first power-play goal since Feb. 20, 2024 against the New York Rangers.
- **Heiskanen's** six multi-goal games are the third-most by a Stars defenseman in franchise history according to NHL Stats, trailing only Brad Maxwell (11) and Craig Hartsburg (8). He now also ranks fourth all-time among Finnish born defensemen in career multi-goal games behind only Reijo Ruotsalainen (12 GP), Kimmo Timonen (7 GP) and Risto Siltanen (7 GP) according to NHL Stats.
- **Heiskanen** has now scored 60 total goals in his career, making him the seventh Finnish defenseman in NHL history to have 60 or more career goals and the only active one to do so according to NHL Stats.

- **Heiskanen** is averaging 25:05 of ice time per game this season, which was the seventh-highest total in the NHL entering play Wednesday.

IRON SHARPENS IRON

- The Stars have two players on their roster that have played in at least 100 consecutive regular-season games: **Jason Robertson** (302) and **Wyatt Johnston** (256).
- **Robertson's** 302-game Iron Man streak was the seventh-longest active such streak in the NHL entering play Wednesday.
- **Johnston** has not missed a regular-season game since making his debut in the 2022-23 season opener on Oct. 13, 2022, making him one of 27 players in NHL history to begin their NHL career by playing in at least 256 consecutive games according to NHL Stats. Entering play Wednesday, it was tied for the 16th-longest active Iron Man streak in the NHL.
- **Johnston** was one of 21 players to appear in at least 246 regular-season games from 2022-23 to 2024-25. Only Will Borgen (248) and Charlie Coyle (247) appeared in more.
 - Borgen (84) and Coyle (83), who were traded midseason, both played in more than 82 regular-season games in 2024-25.

- Lightning forward Nick Paul was drafted by the Dallas Stars in the 2013 NHL Draft (101st overall).
- Stars defenseman **Ilya Lyubushkin** and Lightning forward Zemgus Girgensons shared the ice on the Buffalo Sabres during the 2022-23 season.
- Stars goaltender **Casey DeSmith** played with Lightning forward Jake Guentzel in Pittsburgh from 2017-18 to 2022-23.
- Stars forward **Matt Duchene** played with Lightning defenseman Ryan McDonagh as members of the Nashville Predators during the 2022-23 season.
- Stars defenseman **Ilya Lyubushkin** and Lightning defenseman J.J. Moser were both members of the Arizona Coyotes during the 2021-22 season.
- Stars forward **Matt Duchene** and Lightning forward Oliver Bjorkstrand played for Columbus during the 2018-19 season.
- Stars defenseman **Thomas Harley** played with Lightning forwards Anthony Cirelli, Brandon Hagel and Brayden Point for Team Canada during the 2025 Four Nations tournament.
- Stars goaltender **Jake Oettinger** played with Lightning forward Jake Guentzel for Team USA during the 2025 Four Nations tournament.
- Stars forward **Colin Blackwell** and Lightning forward Yanni Gourde played for the Seattle Kraken during the 2021-22 season.
- Stars forward **Wyatt Johnston** and Lightning forward Curtis Douglas were teammates on the Windsor Spitfire of the OHL during the 2019-20 season.
- Stars defenseman **Nils Lundkvist** and Lightning forward Pontus Holmberg represented Team Sweden during the 2019 IIHF World Junior Championship.
- Stars forward **Matt Duchene** and Lightning forward Brayden Point played for Team Canada during the 2017 IIHF World Championship.
- Stars forward **Mikko Rantanen** and Lightning goaltender Jonas Johansson shared the ice for a handful of games on the Colorado Avalanche from 2020-21 to 2021-22.
- Stars goaltending coach **Jeff Resse** played 19 games for the Lightning during the 1995-96 season. He also was on their coaching staff from 1999-00 until 2007-08, winning the Stanley Cup in 2004.
- Stars Player Development Coordinator **Ben Bishop** and Lightning GM Julien BriseBois were a part of the Lightning organization from 2012-13 and 2016-17. **Bishop** as a player, BriseBois as assistant GM and Roest as Director of Player Development.
- Lightning assistant GM Jamie Pushor played 62 games for the Dallas Stars in the 1999-00 season.
- Stars Player Development Coordinator **Ben Bishop** and Lightning Director of Player Development J.P. Cote played together for the Lightning for a short time in the 2013-14 season.
