GAME NOTES

THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

- Tonight is the third of four games that the Stars will play against the Predators this season and the second time they are playing in Dallas this year. The series is currently split between the two teams: The Stars defeated the Predators with a 4-3 win on Oct. 10. Dallas fell short to Nashville with a 4-1 loss on Dec. 12.
 - o The teams face each other once more this season on April 16 in Nashville.
- The Stars enter tonight's game with a 49-21-4 record for 102 points and a .689 points percentage. Their point total, points percentage and 49 wins ranked third in the NHL this season entering play Wednesday.
- Jamie Benn enters tonight's game one goal shy of scoring his 400th career goal. When he reaches the milestone, he
 will become...
 - o The second player in franchise history to score 400 goals, joining Mike Modano (557). 438 of Modano's 557 goals were scored with the Star after the team relocated to Dallas.
 - The second player drafted in 2007 to score 400 goals, with the other being Detroit's Patrick Kane (490).
 - o The 10th active skater to score 400 career goals.
- In 18 games since the Four Nations break (since Feb. 22), the Stars have outscored their opponents 22-8 at even strength when **Cody Ceci** has been on the ice. His plus-14 on-ice even-strength goal differential was tied for the fifth-best mark in the NHL during that span entering play Wednesday.
- Mikael Granlund has eight points (4-4-8) in his last eight games dating back to Mach 18 against Anaheim.
- Mason Marchment has been playing at a point-per-game pace since March 14, totaling 10 points (4-6—10) in 10 games.
- Entering play Wednesday, the Stars were the only team this season to have not lost more than two consecutive games.
- Entering play Wednesday, the Stars ranked in the top five in the NHL this season in goals for per game (3.41, fourth) and in goals against per game (2.53, third).

Dallas has allowed two or fewer goals in 38 of the 74 games that they have played this year.

PLAYOFF BOUND

- Dallas became the third team to clinch a berth to the 2025 Stanley Cup Playoffs with their 5-1 win over the Kraken in their game on March 29.
- 2024-25 season marks the 37th postseason appearance in franchise history and their fifth time in the past five seasons tied for the most among all teams in that span according to NHL Stats.
- The Stars have made the Conference Finals in each of their past two postseasons and can become the fifth team in the past 20 years to do so in three straight (also TBL, CHI, LAK & DET) according to NHL Stats.
- The Stars have won nine series in the past 10 years, tied with the Penguins for the third most in the NHL in that span according to NHL Stats behind only the Lightning (18) and Golden Knights (11).

PREDATORS TO PREY

- Dallas is 58-40-12 all-time vs. Nashville, including a 34-16-4 mark at home.
- Jamie Benn has totaled 43 points (16-27—43) in 67 career games against the Predators, which is fourth-most among all active NHL skaters.
 - o Benn's 43 points against Nashville are the most by a Stars skater in franchise history.
- Matt Duchene has totaled 37 points (14-23—37) in 40 regular-season games against the Predators. Duchene's 37 career
 points rank ninth all-time among active NHL skaters.
 - o **Duchene** has six points (3-3–6) in six games against the Predators as a member of the Stars.
- Jason Robertson has totaled 24 points (10-14—24) in 22 career games played against Nashville, his highest assist and point total against a single opponent.
 - His 1.09 points-per-game against the Predators rank 19th among active NHL skaters that have played Nashville at least 10 times in their career.
- Mikko Rantanen enters tonight's contest riding a two-game point streak vs. Nashville, earning four points (1-3—4) during those games. In all, Rantanen has registered 31 points (11-20—31) in 27 career games against the Predators, averaging more than a point per game against them (1.15).
- Mikael Granlund enters tonight's matchup riding a four-game point streak against the Predators, earning seven points (4-3—7) during that span. Granlund has put up 26 points (11-15—26) in 29 career games vs. Nashville.
- Wyatt Johnston has totaled seven points (4-3—7) in 10 career games played against the Predators.
- Roope Hintz has totaled 25 career points (12-13—25) in 27 regular-season games against Nashville, his highest total against a single opponent.
- Mason Marchment (2-3—5) has tallied five points in his last five games vs. Nashville.
- Sam Steel has recorded three points (1-2-3) in his last three games against the Predators.

GOING STREAKING

- The Stars enter tonight's game having won each of their last six games played, which is the second-longest active win streak in the NHL (St. Louis; 10).
- If the Stars were to win again tonight, it would give them seven consecutive victories for the second time this season, after previously doing so from Dec. 29 to Jan. 11. It would also make them the third team this season to have two separate win streaks of at least seven games, joining the Winnipeg Jets (3) and the Carolina Hurricanes (2).
- The team has also earned at least a point in each of their last nine games played (7-0-2). A win or an overtime loss tonight would give them points in 10 consecutive games for the first time since the team had a point in 12 consecutive games from Oct. 29 to Nov. 25, 2019, posting an 11-0-1 record during that span.
- A win or overtime loss tonight would also give the Stars their ninth point streak of at least 10 games since the team relocated from Minnesota to Dallas.
 - o The Stars had two point streaks of at least 10 games when the team was located in Minnesota.
- Dallas' nine-game point streak is the second longest active point streak in the NHL, trailing only the St. Louis Blues (10). If they were to earn at least a point tonight, they would become the sixth team this season to have a point streak of at least 10 games, joining the Capitals (12), Jets (11), Blues (10), Lightning (10) and Rangers (10).

ROAD TRIP RECAP

- The Stars return to the American Airlines Center tonight having gone a perfect 4-0-0 on their most recent road trip, defeating the Oilers 4-3, the Flames 5-2 and the Kraken 5-1 and 3-1. All four of the team's wins came in regulation.
- It marks the first time that Dallas has swept a road trip that was at least four games long since March of 2024 when the team defeated Arizona. San Jose, Vancouver and Seattle over the course of a four-game road trip.
- Jake Oettinger and Casey DeSmith split the road trip, with each netminder playing in two games. The combined to post a .957 save percentage on the trip, stopping 157 of the 164 shots they faced over the course of four games.
- Fifteen of the 20 skaters to appear in at least one game for the Stars during the trip record a point, with Jason Robertson (4-3-7) and Roope Hintz (2-5-7) tying for the team lead with seven points each.

JOHNNY B. GOODE

- Wyatt Johnston has scored in each of the last five games that he has played, matching his career high that he set earlier this year from Feb. 28 to March 8. If he were to score again tonight, it would give him goals in six consecutive games for the first time in his career.
- If Johnston were to extend his goal streak tonight, he would be the first Stars skater to score in six consecutive games since Jamie Benn did so from March 16 to 28, 2024.
- Johnston's five-game goal streak is the longest active such streak in the NHL. If he extends his streak tonight, he would become the eighth skater this season to score in at least six consecutive games, joining Filip Forsberg (7), Jake Guentzel (7), Leon Draisaitl (7), Matthew Tkachuk (6), Anthony Cirelli (6), Zach Hyman (6) and Quinton Byfield (6).
- With his goal against the Kraken on March 31, **Johnston** became the fifth player in the past 30 years to have multiple goal streaks of at least five games in the same season at age 21 or younger according to NHL Stats. The others to achieve this feat are Patrik Laine (3x in 2017-18), Alex Ovechkin (3x in 2005-06), Patrick Kane (2x in 2009-10) and Steven Stamkos (2x in 2009-10).
- His goal against Seattle was also his 30th of the season, making him the second player in franchise history to have consecutive 30-goal seasons at age 21 or younger following Brian Bellows (1982-83 to 1983-84) according to NHL Stats.
- Johnston's goal was the eventual game winner, the 10th of his career, becoming the fourth player in franchise history
 to reach the double-digit mark at age 21 or younger, following Brian Lawton (13), Brian Bellows (13) and Mike Modano
 (12) according to NHL Stats.
- Johnston's goal in Dallas's March 29 game against Seattle was his 66th point of the season, which set a career high for the forward.

SEEING STARS

- Roope Hintz was named the NHL's Second Star of the Week for the week ending on March 30 after tallying nine points (2-7—9) in four games played.
- It is the third time in his career that he has earned Star of the Week honors after previously being named the NHL's Third Star of the Week on April 12, 2021 and the Second Star of the Week on March 3, 2025.
- Hintz is one of 10 players this season to earn Star of the Week honors on multiple occasions.
- Hintz joins Matt Duchene (week ending on Oct. 27, 2024) and Mason Marchment (week ending on Nov. 17, 2024) as the three Dallas players to earn Star of the Week honors this season.
- **Hintz** has totaled 28 points (5-23–28) in 17 games played since the Four Nation Break. Since Feb. 22, his 23 assists were the most in the NHL entering play Wednesday and his 28 points were tied for second.
- According to Natural Stat Trick, when Hintz has been on the ice during 5-on-5 play since Feb. 22, the Stars have outscored their opponents 13-6.
- Hintz recorded his 200th career assist in Dallas' March 29 game against Seattle. With the assist he became...
 - o The 28th skater in franchise history to total 200 assists with the team.
 - o The 18th skater selected in the 2015 NHL Draft to reach the 200-assist milestone.
 - o The 30th Finnish player in NHL history to have 200 career assists.
- In all this season, **Hintz** has totaled 64 points (27-37—64) in 68 regular-season games, making the 2024-25 campaign his fourth consecutive 60-point season.

THIRTY, FLIRTY AND THRIVING

- The Stars enter tonight's game with three players that have scored at least 30 goals this season: **Jason Robertson** (33), **Mikko Rantanen** (31) and **Wyatt Johnston** (30).
- Entering play Wednesday, the Stars were one of three teams this season to have at least three 30-goal scorers on its roster, joining the Tampa Bay Lightning (4) and the Washington Capitals (3).
- Entering tonight's game, Matt Duchene and Roope Hintz are one and three goals shy, respectively, of reaching the 30-goal mark. If they were both to score 30 goals by the end of the regular season, it would mark the first time in franchise history that the Stars would have five 30-goals scorers on its roster.
- Additionally, the Stars could become the first team to have five 30-goal scorers on its roster since the Pittsburgh Penguins and Detroit Red Wings, who both did so during the 1992-93 season according to NHL Stats. Please note that this includes players who did not score all 30+ of their goals with one team.

IT TAKES TWO

- **Jake Oettinger** has an 19-6-2 record in his last 27 games played dating back to Dec. 29, posting a .914 save percentage and a 2.50 goals-against average during that span.
 - o His 19 wins since Dec. 29 were the third-most in the NHL during that span entering play Wednesday.
- Oettinger made a season-high 41 saves in Dallas' March 26 game, a 4-3 win over the Oilers. The Stars were outshot 44-24 in that game.
- Oettinger made 33 saves for his 12th career shutout in Dallas' March 24 game, a 3-0 win over Minnesota, which tied Jon Casey for the sixth-most shutouts in franchise history.
 - o **Oettinger** saved 5.74 goals above expected in the game according to MoneyPuck.com.

- Oettinger's shutout was also the 12th of his career, which tied teammate Casey DeSmith for the fifth-most by a U.S.born goaltender in NHL history according to NHL Stats.
- The Stars' victory over the Wild was also the 146th win of **Oettinger's** career, which passed Cesare Maniago (145) for the fourth-most wins by a goaltender in franchise history.
- Oettinger earned his 30th win of the season in Dallas' game on March 6, a 3-2 overtime win over the Calgary Flames. According to NHL Stats, he became the fourth goaltender in Stars/North Stars history with four or more 30-win seasons, joining Marty Turco (6x), Ed Belfour (4x) and Kari Lehtonen (4x). He also joined Turco (6 from 2002-03 to 2008-09) and Belfour (4 from 1997-98 to 2000-01) as the only netminders to do so in four consecutive campaigns with the franchise.
- Casey DeSmith has posted an 8-0-1 record in his last eight games played dating back to Jan. 25 against the St. Louis Blues, posting a .943 save percentage and a 1.87 goals-against average in those contests.
 - Among netminders that have played at least five games since Jan. 25, DeSmith ranked second and sixth, respectively, in the NHL in save percentage and goals-against average.
- **DeSmith's** current run is the first time in his career that he has earned nine consecutive decisions without losing a game in regulation.
- DeSmith made 46 saves in Dallas' March 27 game against the Flames, a 5-2 Stars win. His 46 saves were the most by a
 Dallas netminder this season and the third-most in a single game in DeSmith's career.
- In all this season, **DeSmith** has saved .806 goals above expected per 60, which was the best mark in the NHL this season entering play Wednesday among netminders that have played in more than six games.
- In all, Oettinger and DeSmith have combined for a .911 save percentage this season, which was the second-best mark of any team in the NHL this season entering play Wednesday. The duo's 2.51 goals-against average this season ranked third in the NHL this year entering play Wednesday.

HOME COOKING

- The Stars have a 27-7-2 record at home this season. Entering play Wednesday, they ranked in the top five in the NHL in home wins (tied fourth), points (tied fifth) and points percentage (.778, third).
- Dallas is two home wins shy of matching the franchise record of 29 set by the team in 1998-99.
- The Stars have earned at least a point in each of the last 11 games that they have played at home dating back to Jan. 24 against Vegas. With a win or overtime loss tonight, the Stars would extend their home point streak to 12 games for the first time since they had a point in 13 consecutive home games from Oct. 30 to Dec. 23, 2010.
- Since Jan. 24, the Stars have gone 13-for-34 on the power play at the American Airlines Center. Their 38.2 percent success rate on the power play at home was the third-best mark in the NHL during that span, and their 13 home power-play goals were tied for second entering play Wednesday.
- Jason Robertson (39 points, 36 games played) and Roope Hintz (38 points, 34 games played) are both playing at a
 point-per-game pace at home this year.
 - o Robertson's 39 home points this year are the most of any Stars skater this season.
- Thomas Harley has recorded 19 points (6-13—19) in his last 17 home games dating back to Dec. 31. His 19 home points during that span ranked fourth on both the Stars and among all NHL defensemen entering play Wednesday.
 - o Thirteen of those 19 points have come in the nine home games that he has played since Feb. 2
 - He has 27 home points (9-18—27) in all this season, which ranked 10th among NHL defensemen entering play Wednesday.
- Matt Duchene has tallied 17 points (4-13—17) in his last 16 home games and enters tonight's game riding a five-game home point streak.
- Mikael Granlund has four points (2-2-4) in his last four games played at the American Airlines Center.
- Jake Oettinger has won the last eight games that he has played at the American Airlines Center dating back to Jan.
 24, posting a .922 save percentage, a 2.22 goals-against average and one shutout in those games.
 - o Oettinger's current eight-game home win streak is the longest such streak of his career.
- Casey DeSmith has a 4-1-1 record at home this year, which includes earning at least a point in his last four starts at the American Airlines Center.

R&R&R

- Roope Hintz, Jason Robertson and Mikko Rantanen have played 124:31 together in all situations since Rantanen was
 acquired from the Hurricanes prior to the NHL Trade Deadline. The line has logged a 53.3 percent Corsi rating together
 during that span according to Natural Stat Trick.
- According to Natural Sat Trick, when the trio has been on the ice together in all situations, the Stars have outscored their opponents 10-3.
 - During the Stars last road trip, Hintz, Robertson and Rantanen combined the score eight goals. All three players scored in Dallas' March 29 game against the Kraken.
- Since March 18 against the Ducks, Hintz (1.29), Robertson (1.14) and Rantanen (1.00) have been playing at a point-per
 game pace.
- The line also plays on the Stars' top power-play unit together along with forward **Wyatt Johnston** and defenseman **Thomas Harley**. In the 10 games that the unit has played together, the Stars have scored five goals in 25:39 of power-play ice time according to Natural Stat Trick.

BIKER GANG

- Thomas Harley has 24 points (8-16—24) in his last 24 games played dating back to Jan. 31, which ranks fifth on Dallas' roster during that span.
- Harley's 24 points (8-16—24) since Jan. 31 were tied with Buffalo's Rasmus Dahlin for the second-most during that span among all NHL defensemen entering play Wednesday, trailing only Colorado's Cale Makar (29). His eight goals since Jan. 31 were also just two shy of Makar for the most among NHL blueliners during that span entering play Wednesday.
- Since Jan. 31 Dallas' first game without **Miro Heiskanen Harley** has been averaging 25:11 of ice time per game, which tops all Stars skaters and ranked seventh in the NHL entering play Wednesday.
 - o Prior to Jan. 31, **Harley** was averaging 22:27 of ice time per game.
 - Harley skated a career-high 31:11 in Dallas' game on March 20 against the Tampa Bay Lightning. It was the highest time on ice total by a Stars skater in a regular-season game since Heiskanen skated 32:01 on April 11, 2021 against the Nashville Predators.
- In all, **Harley** has totaled 47 points (15-32—47) in 72 regular-season games this season. His goal, assist and point totals from this season all match his career high from last year.
 - His 15 goals this season were tied for the sixth-most among all NHL defensemen this season entering play Wednesday.
 - His 15 goals this year are also tied for the eighth-most by a Stars defenseman in a single season in franchise history.
- When Harley has been on the ice during even-strength play this season, the Stars have outscored their opponents 89-51. His plus-38 on-ice even-strength goal differential was the best mark in the NHL this season entering play Wednesday.
- Harley recorded the 100th point of his NHL career with an assist in Dallas' March 26 game against the Oilers, making him the third defenseman drafted in 2019 to reach the 100-point milestone, joining Detroit's Moritz Seider and Buffalo's Bowen Byram. He also became the 24th defenseman in franchise history to total 100 points with the Stars.
- Harley's 100th career point came in his 188th career regular-season games, making him the fourth-fastest defenseman
 in Stars/North Stars history to record 100 career points according to NHL Stats, following John Klingberg (145 GP),
 Craig Hartsburg (170 GP) and Brad Maxwell (170 GP).
- Harley matched his single-game career high with three points (1-2—3) in Dallas' March 18 game against the Ducks, surpassing Larry Murphy (93) for the 25th-most points by a defenseman in team history.
 - o In that game, the Stars outshot the Ducks 15-2 when **Harley** was on the ice during 5-on-5 play according to Natural Stat Trick.
- Harley's game-winning goal in Dallas' March 22 game against the Flyers came just nine seconds into overtime, which set a record for the quickest overtime goal in franchise history according to NHL Stats.
- Harley is one of four defensemen this season to score two overtime goals. In total, he has scored five overtime goals since the start of 2023-24, which leads all NHL defensemen and is tied for fifth in the NHL.
- Harley's two-goal performance against the Flyers brought his season total up to 15, matching his career high that he set last season. He is the third defenseman in franchise history to record consecutive 15-goal seasons according to NHL Stats, joining Phillippe Boucher (2 from 2005-06 2006-07) and Lou Nanne (1971-72 1972-73).

KILLING IT

• The Stars have had an 84.7 percent success rate on the penalty kill this season, which was tied with Carolina for the best mark in the NHL this year entering play Wednesday.

- No team in the league this season has allowed fewer power-play goals against than the Stars' 31, and their -25 goal
 differential on the penalty kill this year was tied for the third-best mark in the NHL entering play Wednesday.
- If the Stars maintain this pace, it would make the 2024-25 season their best on the penalty kill since 2007-08, when the team finished the season with an 85.6 percent success rate on the penalty kill.
- The Stars are also one of the least-penalized teams in the league, tying for 26th in the league in total penalty minutes (513) and ranking 27th in penalty minutes per game (6:55) entering play Wednesday.
- Entering play Wednesday, Esa Lindell was leading all NHL skaters in both total shorthanded ice time (262:08) and shorthanded ice time per game (3:33) this season.

IRON SHARPENS IRON

- The Stars have four skaters that have played in at least 200 consecutive games: Jamie Benn (371), Jason Robertson (284), Esa Lindell (244) and Wyatt Johnston (238). Entering play Wednesday, Dallas was the only team in the NHL to have four players riding Iron Man streaks of at least 200 games.
- Dallas' last game on March 31 against the Kraken was the 371st consecutive game that **Benn** played in, which is the fifth-longest active Iron Man streak in the NHL.
- Robertson's 284-game Iron Man streak is tied for the 10th-longest in the NHL. The Stars and the Detroit Red Wings
 were the only teams to have two players ranked in the top 10 entering play Wednesday.
- Lindell's 242-game Iron Man streak ranks seventh among all NHL defensemen.
- Johnston's Iron Man Streak began when he made his NHL debut on Oct. 13, 2022. He is one of 44 players in NHL history
 to begin their NHL career by playing in at least 200 consecutive games according to NHL Stats.

ONE FOR THE HISTORY BOOKS

- Thomas Harley is two assists shy of tying Gary Sargen (71) for 25th-most assists by a defenseman in franchise history.
- Roope Hintz is two goals shy of tying Danny Grant (176) for 15th-most goals in franchise history.
- Esa Lindell is four assists shy of tying Stephane Robidas (165) for 10th-most assists by a defenseman in franchise history.
