2024-25: The Wild won the first-ever meeting between the two clubs, 5-4, in a shootout in Salt Lake City (12/10)...LW **Marcus Johansson** led Minnesota with three points (1-2=3)...LW **Kirill Kaprizov** (1-0=1), C **Marat Khusnutdinov** (1-0=1) and C **Marco Rossi** (1-0=1) also scored for the Wild...LW **Matt Boldy** (0-1=1) secured an assist and the game-winning goal in the shootout...G **Filip Gustavsson** stopped 21-of-25 shots faced to earn the win...RW **Dylan Guenther** (0-2=2), RW **Clayton Keller** (2-0=2) and D **Mikhail Sergachev** (0-2=2) led Utah with two points each...C **Kevin Stenlund** (1-0=1) and D **Juuso Valimaki** (1-0=1) also scored for Utah...G **Karel Vejmelka** saved 34-of-38 shots faced for Utah.

UTAH LEADERS: Keller leads Utah in scoring against Minnesota with 22 points (12-10=20) in 28 career games...C **Nick Schmaltz** owns 18 points (3-15=18) in 31 matches...LW **Lawson Crouse** (5-4=9 in 28 games) and Sergachev (1-8=9 in 11 games) each have nine points.

UTAH GOALIES: G **Connor Ingram** is 2-3-0 with a 2.17 GAA, a .937 SV% and one shutout in five career starts against the Wild...Vejmelka is 3-3-1 with a 3.40 GAA and a .898 SV% in eight career games (seven starts) vs. Minnesota...G **Jaxson Stauber** has not faced the Wild.

CONNECTIONS: C **Nick Bjugstad** is a Minneapolis native and played three seasons at the University of Minnesota (2010-13)...He tallied 30 points (13-17=30) in 101 games in two seasons with the Wild (2020-22)...D **lan Cole** collected eight points (1-7=8) in 52 games with the Wild in 2020-21...D **Dakota Mermis** posted eight points (3-5=8) in 54 games across four seasons (2020-24)in the Wild organization...C **Logan Cooley** played one season at the University of Minnesota (2022-23)...C **Jack McBain** was selected by the Wild in the third round (63rd overall) of the 2018 NHL Draft...Stauber is from Wayzata and played one game at Minnesota State University Mankato in 2019-20.

FAST FACTS: lowa Wild Goaltending Coach **Richard Bachman** (Salt Lake City) is the only Utah-native to appear in a NHL game as a goaltender.

NOTES & MILESTONES

Team: With a 20-8-4 record, ranks T-3rd in the NHL in points (44), fourth in point percentage (.710), and T-4th in wins...44 points is tied for the franchise's highest total through a season's first 32 games (also 2016-17, 2011-12)...Third in the NHL with a .909 team SV% and fifth with a 2.59 team GAA...Also leads the NHL by allowing only 1.84 even-strength goals per game...Leads the NHL with 27 road points (12-2-3) and a a .794 road point percentage and is T-1st with 12 road wins.

Matt Boldy: With a goal vs. PHI (12/14), reached 200 career points (88-112=200) in his 233rd career game, becoming the second-fastest Wild player to reach the mark (Kaprizov, 169 gp)...Ranks T-2nd in the NHL with six GWG and eighth with 112 shots...Ranks second on the Wild in points (13-17=30), goals and assists.

Brock Faber: Leads Wild defensemen and ranks T-4th among skaters with 17 points (3-14=17)...Sixth in the NHL with 25:09 of TOI/G this season.

Marc-Andre Fleury: Made the 1,004th start of his NHL career vs. FLA (12/18), moving past Patrick Roy (1,003) for third-most in NHL history.

Marcus Foligno: T-7th in the NHL with 111 hits this season...Currently owns 1,449 hits in a Wild sweater, trailing only Cal Clutterbuck (1,457) for most in franchise history.

Brendan Gaunce: Made his Wild debut vs. FLA (12/18), becoming the 321st player (299th skater) to play in a regular-season game for the franchise.

Filip Gustavsson: Is 14-5-3 and ranks third in the NHL with a .922 SV% and a 2.24 GAA, T-5th with 14 wins and T-6th with two shutouts...Has allowed two-or-fewer goals in 15 of his 22 starts this season, tied for most in the NHL.

Ryan Hartman: Tied his career high with 14 face off wins vs. VGK (12/15). **Kirill Kaprizov:** Owns an active three-game point streak (4-1=5)...Scored two goals (2-0=2) vs. VGK (12/15), his 34th career multi-goal game...Also posted 28:03 of TOI vs. VGK (12/15), the second-highest mark of his career (29:09, OT win vs. MTL, 12/21/23) and the highest in a non-OT game. The total was also the highest by a forward in a non-OT game in Wild history... Leads the NHL with a plus-23 rating, 37 even-strength points (19-18=37) and six multi-goal games while ranking second with 48 points (22-26=48), 22 goals and 29 points on the road (11-18=29), T-2nd with 16 multi-point games and third with 1.55 points/game...Second among NHL forwards in TOI/G (22:35)...With two goals (2-0=2) vs. PHI (12/14), tied Marian Gaborik (29 GP in 2006-07) for the franchise mark of fewest games to 20 goals... Has notched a point in 14-of-16 road games played this season (11-18=29), including a franchise-record 11-game road point streak (8-16=24) from 10/15 - 11/21.

Marco Rossi: Owns nine points (6-3=9) in his last 10 games and ranks third on the Wild in goals (12) and points (12-14=26) and T-3rd in assists (14). **Mats Zuccarello**: With two assists (0-2=2) vs. VGK (12/15), recorded his 37th multi-assist game in a Wild uniform, passing Pierre-Marc Bouchard (36 mpg) for fifth in franchise history.

4 NATIONS FACE-OFF

The National Hockey League Players' Association (NHLPA) and National Hockey League (NHL) has announced the full rosters for the 4 Nations Face-Off, as selected by each National Association (Hockey Canada, Finnish Ice Hockey Association, Swedish Ice Hockey Association and USA Hockey). Minnesota Wild left wing Matt Boldy (United States), defenseman Jonas Brodin (Sweden), center Joel Eriksson Ek (Sweden), defenseman Brock Faber (United States) and goaltender Filip Gustavsson (Sweden) will each represent their respective country.

The Bell Centre in Montreal and TD Garden in Boston will serve as the host venues and cities for the 4 Nations Face-Off in 2025, which will consist of a total of seven games played over a nine-day period from Feb. 12 to 20, along with two designated training/practice days (Feb. 10 and Feb. 11).

All 4 Nations Face-Off games will be played in accordance with NHL rules. Each team will play three tournament games in a traditional Round Robin format, under the following points system: three points for a win in regulation time; two points for a win in overtime/shootout; one point for a loss in overtime/shootout; and no points for a loss in regulation time. The two teams with the best tournament record will then advance to a one-game Final.

HOT START

 With 44 points (20-8-4) this season, the Wild has tied the franchise record for most points through a season's first 32 games.

- Has scored 99 goals this season, fourth most in franchise history through the first 32 games of a season.
- Minnesota's plus-14 goal differential through 32 games is the fifthbest mark in franchise history
- Is one of 89 teams in NHL history to record 30 points in a season's first 20 games, including the 2024-25 Winnipeg Jets. Of the 87 teams to reach the mark prior to this season, 64 made the Stanley Cup Playoffs.
- The Wild began the season with a seven-game season-opening point streak (5-0-2) from 10/10 10/24, marking the fourth time in franchise history achieving the mark following 2007-08 (7-0-1 in 8 GP), 2008-09 (6-0-1 in 7 GP) and 2001-02 (3-0-4 in 7 GP).
- Of the 121 previous teams in NHL history to record 16 points or more in a season's first 10 games, 87 have made the playoffs.
- Of the 60 previous occurrences of a season-opening seven-game point streak in NHL history, 53 teams made the playoffs. 13 of those teams won the Stanley Cup.

OUT IN FRONT

- The Wild has allowed 20 first-period goals this season, tied for seventhfewest in the NHL.
- The Wild is 14-0-0 when leading through two periods and 10-0-1 when leading through one period this season.
- The Wild has scored first in a 19 games this season, T-2nd most in the NHL, and holds a 14-3-2 record when doing so.
- Minnesota began the season by not trailing in regulation for 391:31, the second-longest season-opening mark in NHL history (1969-70 Boston Bruins, 457:21) and the second-longest streak at any point in a season in franchise history (414:32, 2014-15).

 The run was also the second-longest streak at any point in Wild history, trailing only a 414:32 mark in 2014-15.

WILD UNDER HYNES

- The Wild has played 95 regular-season games under Head Coach John Hynes dating back to Nov. 28, 2023 vs. STL.
- Hynes owns a 54-32-9 record (.616) during that span. His .616 point percentage ranks second all-time among Wild head coaches.
- The Wild ranks eighth in the NHL in points (117) and wins (54) since Hynes took the bench on Nov. 28, 2023.

YOUNG GUNS.

- The Wild ranks T-3rd in the NHL with 76 points (29-47=76) registered by players aged 23 years or younger to start the season (Boldy, Faber, Khusnutdinov, Rossi).
- Matt Boldy is T-4th among NHL players who started the season age 23 or younger with 13 goals and 30 points (13-17=30). Marco Rossi ranks T-10th with 26 points (12-14=26).
- Minnesota ranked second in the NHL last season with 0.42 rookie points scored per game played (min. 100 games played by rookie skaters).
- Minnesota finished second in the NHL last season with 104 points scored by rookies (34-70=104) and third with 245 games played by rookie skaters (248 including goalies).

STINGY PLAY

- Minnesota ranks third in the NHL with a .909 team SV% and fifth with a 2.59 team GAA. Also leads the NHL by allowing only 1.84 even-strength goals per game.
- The Wild has recorded 19 games allowing two-or-fewer goals this season. T-1st in the NHL.
- The Wild is allowing 2.41 opponent power-play opportunities per game, the fourth-best mark in the NHL this season.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN

- Leads the NHL with 27 road points (12-2-3) and a a .794 road point percentage and is T-1st with 12 road wins.
- Recorded a nine-game road point streak (7-0-2) from 11/29 12/6, tied for the longest streak in the NHL this season and T-4th longest in franchise history.
- According to NHL Stats, the only teams with as many points through the first 15 road games of a season are the Kings in 2023-24 (13-1-1, 27 points), Blackhawks in 2012-13 (12-1-2, 26 points) and the Ducks in 2006-07 (12-1-2, 26 points).
- Reached 10 road wins in the team's 14th road contest of the season at BUF (11/27), besting the team's previous low mark of 15 games (2011-12)
- The Wild recorded a five-game road point streak from 10/13 10/24, tied for the longest in franchise history to start a season (also 2002-03 season, 3-0-2).
- Minnesota's recorded five road wins and 11 road points in October, marking the first time in franchise history the club has reached either mark in that month.
- Minnesota recorded 12 road points in November (5-0-2), the highest total in franchise history in that month.

KIRILL THE THRILL

- Kirill Kaprizov scored two goals (2-0=2) vs. VGK (12/15), his 34th career multi-goal game. Also posted 28:03 of TOI, the second-highest mark of his career (29:09, OT win vs. MTL, 12/21/23) and the highest in a non-OT game. The total was also the highest by a forward in a non-OT game in Wild history.
- Leads the NHL with a plus-23 rating, 37 even-strength points (19-18=37) and six multi-goal games while ranking second with 48 points (22-26=48), 22 goals and 29 points on the road (11-18=29), T-2nd with 16 multi-point games and third with 1.55 points/game. Second among NHL forwards in TOI/G (22:35)
- Scored two goals (2-0=2) vs. PHI, tying Marian Gaborik (29 GP in 2006-07) for the franchise mark of fewest games to 20 goals.
- Finished with three points (1-2=3) at ANA (12/6), extending his franchise record with his 38th career three-point contest.
- With his first assist at ANA (12/6), reached the 40-point landmark in his 25th game played this season, fastest in franchise history.
- Kaprizov reached 370 career points (176-194=370) with his first assist at ANA (12/6) and surpassed Ryan Suter (55-314=369) for sole possession of fifth place on the Wild's all-time scoring list.
- Scored his franchise-leading ninth career overtime goal vs. VAN (12/3).
 He has now factored on 10 GWG in 2024-25 (4-6=10), most in the NHL.
- Kaprizov scored his 61st career PPG vs. Nashville (11/30), moving past Mikko Koivu for second on the Wild's all-time PPG list (Parise, 69 PPG).
- Played in his 300th career game vs. CHI (11/29), tallying an assist to move his career point total to 366 (174-191=366). The only active players with more points through 300 games include: Sidney Crosby (407), Connor McDavid (394), Alex Ovechkin (384) and Evgeni Malkin (371). Only Ovechkin (204) and Auston Matthews (176) have more goals through 300 games among active skaters.
- Among players selected in the fifth round of the NHL Draft or later, only four skaters have tallied as many goals as Kaprizov at the time of their 300th career contest: Brett Hull (226), Pavel Bure (187), Luc Robitaille (185) and Alexander Mogilny (176).
- With two goals (2-0=2) at STL (11/19), became one of 19 players in NHL history (29 total occurrences) to record 12 multi-point outings in a team's first 18 games played. He is the first to achieve the feat since Peter Forsberg (2005-06)
- With two points (1-1=2) vs. MTL, became the fastest player in franchise history (16 GP) to reach 30 points in a season, shattering the mark he set in 2022-23 (22 GP). Also became the ninth NHL player born outside of North America to reach the 30-point mark in 16 or fewer games.
- With three points (2-1=3) in the 292nd game of his career at ANA (11/8), tied Evgeni Malkin as the fourth-fastest active NHL player to record 100 multi-point games (Crosby 235 games; McDavid 270 games; Ovechkin 272 games; Kaprizov 292 games; Malkin 292 games). Tied Malkin and Glenn Anderson as the 27th fastest player in NHL history to reach the mark. Among Wild players, Marian Gaborik was previously the fastest to reach 100 multi-point games, doing so in 455 contests.
- Ranks third in Wild history with 106 multi-point games (Koivu, 153; Gaborik, 114).
- With three assists (0-3=3) at SJS (11/7), recorded his eighth career three-assist game and tied Mats Zuccarello and Pierre-Marc Bouchard for the second most in franchise history (Mikko Koivu, 16 three-assist games).
- Kaprizov was named the NHL's Third Star of the Month for October (5-3=18 in 9 GP), averaging two points/game (first in NHL) and tallying a point in eight of nine contests to lead the Wild to a 6-1-2 record. Is the fourth Wild player to be named an NHL Star of the Month, joining Eric Staal, (First Star-Feb. 2018); Devan Dubnyk (4x) and Josh Harding (Third Star-Nov. 2013).
- Currently with 40 career multi-assist games, needs one more to tie Jared Spurgeon (41) for third-most in franchise history.

STONE-COLD KIRILL-ER

 Kaprizov notched the 24th GWG of his career at ANA (11/8), moving past Eric Staal (23 GWG) for fourth-most in franchise history.

- Joel Eriksson Ek notched two assists (0-2=2) and won 15-of-19 face offs taken vs. CHI (11/29).
- Leads the Wild with 215 face off wins on the season.
- Won 18-of-24 face offs (75.0 pct.) taken at CGY (11/23). His 18 total face off wins marked a season high and the fourth-highest total of his NHL career (19 face offs won, three occurrences). He last won 18-plus face offs on 2/19/24 vs. PIT (19-for-33).
- The Swede recorded a three-game goal and point streak (3-2=5) from 10/22 - 10/26.
- Currently with 38 career PPGs, Eriksson Ek needs one PPG to tie Brian Rolston (39 PPGs with MIN) for sixth on the franchise's all-time list.
- Eriksson Ek ranked second on the Wild with 12 PPGs and a career-high 30 goals last season while ranking third in points (30-34=64).
- Became the 11th player in franchise history to record 30 goals in a single season, reaching the mark vs. SJS (3/28/24).

BOLDY AND THE BEAUTIFUL

- **Matt Boldy** scored a goal vs. PHI (12/14) to reach 200 career points (88-112=200) in his 233rd career game, becoming the second-fastest Wild player to reach the mark (Kaprizov, 169 gp).
- Owns 17 points (7-10=17) in his last 20 games.
- Ranks T-2nd in the NHL with six GWG and eighth with 112 shots. Ranks second on the Wild in points (13-17=30), goals and assists.
- Scored his fifth career game-deciding shootout goal at UTA (12/10), tying Matt Cullen for the second most in Wild history (Koivu, 18).
- Finished with a 1-2=3 scoring line at ANA (12/6), marking the 13th game of his NHL career with as many points.
- Recorded a six-game point streak (3-4=7) from 11/10 11/23.
- With a GWG vs. MTL (11/14), reached 19 career GWG and tied Ryan Hartman and Pierre-Marc Bouchard for 10th-most in franchise history.
- Is the fourth NHL player since 2000-01 to record five GWG in a season's first 16 games, joining Fedorov (six, 2002-23), Draisaitl (five, 2021-22) and Matthews (five, 2020-21).
- Reached 100 career assists at CBJ (10/19), becoming the 26th player to reach 100 assists in a Wild sweater.
- Boldy opened the 2024-25 season with three points (1-2=3) vs. CBJ (10/10), marking his 12th career three-point game and becoming the sixth player in franchise history with three-plus points in the season opener.
- Collected his 100th career point (45-55=100) in the 125th game of his career at PIT (4/6/23). Among players to debut with the franchise, he required the second-fewest games to reach the mark behind Kirill Kaprizov (92 GP).

BROCKED AND LOADED

- Brock Faber leads Wild defensemen and ranks T-4th among skaters with 17 points (3-14=17). Ranks sixth in the NHL with 25:09 of TOI/G this season..
- Faber recorded a season-high 31:49 time on ice (TOI) total vs. EDM (12/12), the second-highest TOI total of his NHL career and the fourth-highest TOI total in the NHL this season. Faber now owns six career games with 30-plus minutes of TOI, with the Wild owning a 5-1-0 record in those games.
- Tied his career high with plus-3 ratings vs. VAN (12/3) and at ANA (12/6), becoming the seventh player in franchise history to notch a plus-three rating in consecutive games.
- Faber played in his 100th career NHL game vs. MTL (11/14).
- Recorded a three-game point streak (2-1=3) from 10/26 11/1.
- Reached 50 career points (8-42=50) in his 89th career game at CBJ (10/19), becoming the second-fastest Wild defenseman to reach 50 points with the franchise (Ryan Suter, 83 games).
- Faber led all NHL rookies with 24:58 TOI per game and 150 blocked shots, ranked T-1st with 39 assists and third with 46 points (8-39=47).
 Faber finished sixth among all NHL skaters in TOI/game.
- With a blocked shot at LAK (4/15/24), became the ninth NHL rookie to post 150-plus blocks in a season since 2005-06.
- With an assist vs. PIT (2/9/24), moved his season point total to 4-27=31 and surpassed Filip Kuba (9-21=30 in 2000-01) for the highest single-season point total by a Wild rookie defenseman. Also moved past Calen Addison (26 assists in 2022-23) for most single-season assists by a Wild rookie.
- Recorded five games with 30-plus minutes of TOI last season, four of which came in a five-game span from 12/14/23 to 12/21/23. Became one of two NHL rookies since 1997-98 to play four games with 30-plus minutes of TOI in a single season.
- Skated a career-high 33:25 vs. MTL (12/21/23), the highest singlegame total in the NHL last season and the third-highest by an NHL rookie since the start of the 2000-01 season.
- Per NHL Stats, since time on ice began being tracked in 1997-98, Faber is only the 2nd rookie to record consecutive 30-plus-minute games (Atlanta's Toby Enstrom in March 2008), doing so vs. CGY (12/14/23) and vs. VAN (12/16/23).

MARCO POLO

- Marco Rossi scored a game-tying goal with 46 seconds left in regulation at UTA (12/10), finishing the game with a career-best-tying plus-3 rating.
- Owns nine points (6-3=9) in his last 10 games and ranks third on the Wild in goals (12) and points (12-14=26) and T-3rd in assists (14).
- Has tallied a point in 22 of 32 games this season.
- Rossi recorded a career-long six-game point streak (3-4=7) from 10/12 - 10/24.
- Posted a three-game goal streak (3-0=3) from 10/12 10/22, also a career-long mark.
- Rossi picked up his 46th career point in his 108th career game at CBJ (10/19). Per NHL Stats, he surpassed Marko Dano (45 in 141 GP) for fifth most by an Austria-born player.
- Among NHL rookies, Rossi finished second in goals (21), T-3rd in shots (167), T-4th in GWG (two) and fifth in points (21-19=40) last season.
- With two assists at LAK (4/15/24), became the third rookie in franchise history with 40 points in a single season.
- Recorded a career-high seven shots on goal vs. STL (3/23/24) and notched his third career multi-goal game (2-0=2), moving his season total to 20 goals and joining Kirill Kaprizov (27 goals, 2020-21) as the only Wild rookies with 20-goal seasons. - Jared Spurgeon pushed his career TOI total to 19,726:58 with 24:08 skated at UTA (12/10), moving past Mikko Koivu (19,718:08 TOI) for most in franchise history.
- Spurgeon notched two points (1-1=2) vs. NSH (11/30), including the GWG in overtime, to reach 71 career multi-point games and tie Mats Zuccarello for sixth in franchise history. Now with five career OTG, tied Brent Burns and Mikko Koivu for third in franchise history.
- Recorded the game-winning goal in consecutive contests for the first time in his career (11/29 vs. CHI, 11/30 vs. NSH).
- Owns 22 career GWG, tying Jason Zucker for sixth in Wild history.
- Tallied two goals (2-0=2) on his 35th birthday vs. CHI (11/29 and reached 112 career goals, moving past Eric Staal (111 goals) for eighth on the Wild's all-time goal list.
- Ranks first in franchise history in plus-minus rating (plus-124), blocked shots (1,532), second in games played (892) and minutes skated (19,794:31), third in assists (282) and fourth in scoring (113-282=395) and shots (1,484).
- Since entering the NHL in 2010-11, has recorded the fewest PIMs (152) by a defenseman playing in 700-plus games.

THE GUS BUS IS ROLLING

- Filip Gustavsson is 14-5-3 and ranks third in the NHL with a .922 SV% and a 2.24 GAA, T-5th with 14 wins and T-6th with two shutouts. Has allowed two-or-fewer goals in 15 of his 22 starts this season, tied for most in the NHL.
- Stopped all 39 shots faced at BUF (11/27) to record his second shutout
 of the season and eighth of his career, moving past Darcy Kuemper
 for sixth all-time in franchise history. His 39 saves at BUF marked the
 sixth-highest total by a goaltender in a shutout victory in Wild history
- Made a season-high 38 saves vs. DAL (11/16).
- Is 53-31-7 in his career with the Wild since joining the franchise in 2022-23. Gustavsson's .918 save percentage ranks the third-highest among all goaltenders through that span, behind Linus Ullmark (.922) and Connor Hellebuyck (.921).
- Earned the NHL's Third Star of the Week for the period ending 10/20 after going 2-0-0, stopping 50 of 52 shots faced in two starts for a 1.00 GAA and a .962 SV%.
- Gustavsson scored the first goal of his hockey career, a power-play goal, at STL (10/15), becoming the first goaltender in franchise history to find the net.
- Is one of 15 goalies in NHL history to score a goal, a feat that has only been done a total 18 times.
- The play also marked the third PPG scored by a goalie in NHL history.
- He is the 10th goalie to score a goal by shooting it into an empty net (the others were the last to touch an own-goal).

IN FULL BLOOM

- Goaltender Marc-Andre Fleury owns a 6-2-1 record for the season. His season-opening six-start point streak marked the third longest of his career behind 2009-10 (8 GP: 8-0-0) and 2013-14 (7 GP: 7-0-0), both with Pittsburgh, and tied for the second-longest season-opening point streak in Wild history, trailing only Niklas Backstrom's seven-game run in 2008-09 (6-0-1).
- Made the 1,004th start of his NHL career vs. FLA (12/18), moving past Patrick Roy (1,003) for third-most in NHL history (Brodeur, 1,251; Luongo, 1,014).
- With a win vs. CHI (11/29) a day after his 40th birthday on Nov. 28, became the second goaltender in NHL history to earn a win both as a teenager and a 40-year-old joining Martin Brodeur.
- Played in the 1,030th game of his NHL career at EDM (11/21), passing Patrick Roy (1,029 gp) for third all time among NHL goaltenders (Brodeur, 1,266; Luongo, 1,044).
- Is playing in his 21st career NHL season, tied for second-most by a goaltender in NHL history and trailing only Martin Brodeur (22 seasons).
- Posted the 75th shutout of his NHL career vs. ANA (3/14/24) and needs one more to tie Tony Esposito and Ed Belfour (76 career SO each) for 10th most in NHL history.
- Fleury recorded his 552nd career win with a 5-0 victory vs. NYI (1/15/24), moving past Patrick Roy (551 career wins) for second-most in NHL history.
- Fleury became the fourth goaltender in NHL history to reach 1,000 games played when he started vs. WPG (12/31/23).
- He made 24 saves at NYR (11/9/23) to reach 25,808 career saves and pass Roy (25,800 career saves) for third most in NHL history.
- Fleury made a season-high 40 saves in a 4-3 OT win at BOS (12/19/23), his 40th career game with 40-plus saves (T-11th most in NHL history).
- Fleury notched the 65th shootout win of his career vs. NYR (11/4), further extending his all-time NHL record.
- Fleury has recorded a shutout against 29-of-32 NHL teams (St. Louis, Vegas and Minnesota), the most in league history.
