

**FLAMES LAST GAME RECAP****March 29, 2025 – CALGARY FLAMES [2] vs. EDMONTON OILERS [3] (OT)**[Game Summary](#) | [Event Summary](#)

The Calgary Flames began a three-game road swing on Saturday night by travelling to Edmonton for the final Battle of Alberta of 2024-25. In the first, Yegor Sharangovich would record the only marker of the frame after driving the net and depositing a rebound into the yawning cage. The Oilers would score the only goal of the middle frame to knot things at one a piece heading into the third. In the final stanza, Brayden Pachal would give the Flames their lead back with his third of the campaign, but Edmonton would find a late equalizer to force overtime. The home side would go on to win in the extra frame and Calgary fell 3-2.

**TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS**

This is the third and final meeting this season between the Flames and Avalanche. Calgary has fallen to Colorado on both prior occasions.

This is a Pacific Division versus Central Division matchup; the Flames have a record of 8-11-2 against Central Division teams and a record of 19-15-6 against Western Conference opponents.

**NAZ-HIM KADRI:**

With his assist on Yegor Sharangovich’s game-opening goal on Saturday night in Edmonton, Nazem Kadri recorded his 700<sup>th</sup> NHL point. Kadri has become the fifth skater from the 2009 NHL Draft Class to reach the 700-point mark. He would also record another assist later in the night to give him 399 in his career and is looking to become the sixth player from his draft year to achieve at least 400 NHL helpers.

The London, ON native is currently riding a six-game point streak, with seven goals and three assist for 10 points since March 18<sup>th</sup>, with multi-point efforts in four of his last six outings.

**FROST 300:**

Morgan Frost skated in his 300<sup>th</sup> NHL game on Saturday night in Edmonton. Frost was drafted in the first round (27<sup>th</sup> overall) by the Philadelphia Flyers following a four-year junior career with the OHL’s Soo Greyhounds where he eclipsed the 100-point plateau twice and was named to the OHL’s First All-Star Team twice. He would make his NHL debut on November 19<sup>th</sup>, 2019 and score in his first game against the Florida Panthers. He has recorded 52 goals and 91 assists in his 300 NHL games and has become the 22<sup>nd</sup> skater from the 2017 NHL Draft to reach 300 NHL games.

**PATIENT PACHAL:**

Brayden Pachal scored his third of the season and recorded an assist on Saturday to earn his second multi-point game of 2024-25, and second such effort of his career. Pachal has played a career-high 66 games for the Flames in 2024-25 while also posting a career-high in points with nine, along with 84 penalty minutes and a +2 rating.

**SHARKNADO:**

With Yegor Sharangovich’s marker on Saturday against Edmonton, he recorded his 97<sup>th</sup> career goal. With three more tallies, Sharangovich can become just the third skater of Belarussian descent in NHL history to reach the 100-goal plateau and join: Mikhail Grabovski (125) and Andrei Kostitsyn (103).

**ROCKY MOUNTAIN TIES:**

Nazem Kadri spent time in Colorado, skating in 178 games over three seasons with the Avs scoring 155 points (58G, 97A) over that span. Kadri was also a key contributor in the 2022 playoffs for the Avalanche, scoring seven goals and eight assists for 15 points en route to winning the Stanley Cup. Fellow Flames forward Dryden Hunt spent 25 games in an Avalanche sweater during the 2022-23 season, scoring a goal while recording 13 penalty minutes.



Avalanche defenseman Cale Makar was born in Calgary and played his junior hockey just two hours east of his hometown with the Brooks Bandits of the AJHL.

**NEW KID:**

The Calgary Flames announced the signing of forward Jacob Battaglia to a three-year entry-level contract on Saturday morning. Battaglia, a native of Mississauga, ON played in all 68 regular season games for the OHL’s Kingston Frontenacs, scoring a team-leading 40 goals along with 50 assists and finished tied with a team-high 90 points. Over the month of March, the 19-year-old forward registered 12 points in 10 games from six goals and six assists to help the Frontenacs finish third in the Eastern Conference standings.
