LOS ANGELES KINGS

All-Time Wild Record: 42-28-15 (23-11-8 at Xcel Energy Center, 19-17-7 at Los Angeles)

2023-24: Minnesota went 1-2-0 in the series against the Kings last season... The Kings won the series-opening game, 7-3, at Xcel Energy Center (10/19) and the second game, 6-0, at Crypto.com Arena (3/20)... Minnesota won the series finale, 3-1, in Los Angeles (4/15)... LW **Kirill Kaprizov** led the Wild with three points (2-1=3)... C **Joel Eriksson Ek** (1-1=2) and C **Marco Rossi** (0-2=2) each had two points... G **Marc-Andre Fleury** went 0-2-0 in two starts... G **Filip Gustavsson** entered the second game in relief and saved 10-of-11 shots faced, and earned a win in his lone start, stopping 33-of-35 shots... LW **Kevin Fiala** led Los Angeles with five points (1-4=5)... C **Adrian Kempe** had four points (1-3=4)... D **Drew Doughty** had three points (0-3=3)... G Cam Talbot went 1-1-0 with a 3.06 GAA and a .900 SV% while starting the first and third games... G **David Rittich** stopped all 31 shots faced to earn a shutout win in his lone start in the second game.

WILD LEADERS: RW **Mats Zuccarello** leads Minnesota with 18 points (5-13=18) in 29 career contests vs. Los Angeles... Kaprizov has 17 points (10-7=17) in 17 games... LW **Marcus Johansson** owns 14 points (7-7=14) in 25 games... D **Jonas Brodin** (3-10=13, in 37 games), Eriksson Ek (10-3=13, in 23 games) and D **Jared Spurgeon** (4-9=13, in 39 games) have 13 points each.

WILD GOALIES: Fleury is 12-11-4 with a 2.81 GAA, a .908 SV% and three shutouts in 28 career starts against the Kings... Gustavsson is 2-3-0 with a 2.16 GAA and a .932 SV% in six games (four starts).

KINGS LEADERS: C **Anze Kopitar** leads Los Angeles with 57 points (17-40=57) in 65 career games vs. Minnesota... Doughty owns 37 points (7-30=37) in 55 contests... Kempe has 16 points (6-10=16) in 26 games.

KINGS GOALIES: G **Darcy Kuemper** is 4-6-1 with a 2.98 GAA and a .901 SV% in 12 starts against Minnesota... Rittich is 4-0-1 with a 2.33 GAA, .931 SV% and one shutout in five starts.

CONNECTIONS: Minnesota Goaltending Coach **Frederic Chabot** went 3-3-2 with a 3.14 GAA and a .891 SV% in 12 games (nine starts) with the Kings in 1997-98... D **Jake Middleton** was selected by the Kings in the seventh round (210th overall) of the 2014 NHL Draft... D **Brock Faber** was drafted by the Kings in the second round (45th overall) of the 2020 NHL Draft... Fiala played three seasons (2019-22) with Minnesota, appearing in 215 games and tallying 186 points (79-107=186)... Kuemper was selected by the Wild in the sixth round (161st overall) of the 2009 NHL Draft and went 41-34-14 with a 2.60 GAA, a .910 SV% and seven shutouts in 102 games (82 starts) in five seasons with Minnesota (2012-17)... D **Mikey Anderson** hails from Fridley and skated one season at Hill-Murray (2013-14) and two seasons at the University of Minnesota Duluth (2017-19).

FAST FACTS: Minnesota is 19-10-4 in its last 33 games vs. Los Angeles with 16 games decided by one goal... The Wild is 11-3-1 in the last 15 contests played at Xcel Energy Center... Minnesota owns points in 12 of its last 20 games at Crypto.com Arena (9-8-3).

NOTES & MILESTONES

Team: With 18 points (7-1-2) through 11 games this season, has matched its best 11-game start in franchise history (9-2-0, 2006-07; 8-1-2, 2002-03)... Has scored 41 goals this season, a franchise record for through the first 11 games of a season... Ranks second in the NHL in points percentage (.818), third in points and T-3rd in wins... Third in the NHL with a .914 SV% and T-3rd with a 2.45 GAA... Fifth in the NHL with a plus-14 goal differential.
Matt Boldy: T-1st in the NHL with three GWG, T-9th with three PPG and T-10th with six PPP (3-3=6).

Marc-Andre Fleury: Played in his 100th career game for Minnesota at PIT (10/29)... Currently at 1,028 career games played, needs one game appearance to tie Patrick Roy (1,029 career games) for third-most all time.

Marcus Foligno: Currently at 297 career points (128-169=297)... Fifth in the NHL with 45 hits this season.

Brock Faber: Recorded a three-game point streak (2-1=3) from 10/26 - 11/1... Ranks fifth in the NHL with 25:28 of TOI/G... T-8th among NHL defensemen with a plus-8 rating.

Freddy Gaudreau: Owns active three-game point and assist streaks (2-3=5), tied for his career-long assist streak... Tied his career high with two goals and three points (2-1=3) at PIT (10/29).

Filip Gustavsson: Owns a 6-1-1 record through eight starts, ranking T-2nd in the NHL in wins, third in GAA (2.12) and fourth in SV% (.924) among qualified goalies... Has allowed two or fewer goals in six starts this season, tied for most in the NHL.

Kirill Kaprizov: Leads the NHL with 15 even-strength points (6-9=15) and ranks T-1st with 21 points (7-14=21) and eight multi-point games, third with a plus-12 rating, and T-3rd with 14 assists... Leads NHL forwards in TOI/G (22:58)... Recorded a seven-game multi-point and assist streaks (6-11=17) from 10/15 - 11/1... His streak of seven consecutive games with multiple points is a franchise record and T-4th longest in the NHL since the 2000-01 season... The assist streak was tied for the longest in the NHL this season, T-3rd longest of Kaprizov's career and T-5th longest in franchise history... With a three-point performance (2-1=3) vs. TBL (11/1), notched the 35th game with three-plus points of his career and moved past Mikko Koivu (34 games) for most in franchise history... Needs one PPG to tie Mikko Koivu (60 PPG) for second-most all-time in franchise history... Currently with 23 career GWG, needs one GWG to move past Eric Staal for sole possession of fourth-most in team history... Named the NHL's Third Star of the Month for October (5-3=18 in 9 GP), averaging two points/game (first in NHL) and tallying a point in eight of nine contests to lead the Wild to a 6-1-2 record. Is the fourth Wild player to be named an NHL Star of the Month, joining Eric Staal, (First Star-Feb. 2018); Devan Dubnyk (4x) and Josh Harding (Third Star-Nov. 2013).

Jake Middleton: Recorded a five-game point streak (1-6=7) from 10/22 - 11/1, a career long... T-8th in the NHL with 33 blocked shots this season... T-5th among NHL defensemen with a plus-9 rating.

Marco Rossi: Has recorded a point in nine of 11 games (3-7=10) this season.

TEAM NOTES



HOT START

- With 18 points (7-1-2) through 11 games this season, has matched its best 11-game start in franchise history (9-2-0, 2006-07; 8-1-2, 2002-03).

- Minnesota has recorded 41 goals through its first 11 game this season, setting a new franchise record.
- The Wild began the season with a seven-game season-opening point streak (5-0-2) from 10/10 - 10/24, marking the fourth time in franchise history achieving the mark following 2007-08 (7-0-1 in 8 GP), 2008-09 (6-0-1 in 7 GP) and 2001-02 (3-0-4 in 7 GP).
- Of the 121 previous teams in NHL history to record 16 points or more in a season's first 10 games, 87 have made the playoffs.
- Of the 60 previous occurrences of a season-opening seven-game point streak in NHL history, 53 teams made the playoffs. 13 of those teams won the Stanley Cup.

OUT IN FRONT

- The Wild has allowed seven first-period goals this season, T-4th fewest in the NHL. Minnesota owns a plus-4 goal differential (nine goals for, five goal against) in the first period this season, seventh in the NHL.
- Minnesota began the season by not trailing in regulation for 391:31, the second-longest season-opening mark in NHL history (1969-70 Boston Bruins, 457:21) and the second-longest streak at any point in a season in franchise history (414:32, 2014-15).

- The run was also the second-longest streak at any point in Wild history, trailing only a 414:32 mark in 2014-15.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN

- Minnesota ranks third in the NHL with 11 road points this season (5-1-1) and is T-3rd with five road wins.
- The Wild recorded a five-game road point streak from 10/13 - 10/24, tied for the longest in franchise history to start a season (also 2002-03 season, 3-0-2).
- Minnesota's five road wins and 11 road points this season mark the first time in franchise history the club has reached either mark in the month of October.

YOUNG GUNS

- The Wild ranks fifth in the NHL with 31 points (11-20=31) registered by players aged 23 years or younger to start the season (Boldy, Faber, Khusnutdinov, Rossi).
- Matt Boldy is T-2nd among NHL players who started the season age 23 or younger with 13 points (6-7=13).
- Minnesota ranked second in the NHL last season with 0.42 rookie points scored per game played (min. 100 games played by rookie skaters).

- The Wild is allowing 2.09 opponent power-play opportunities per game, the fourth-best mark in the NHL this season.

PLAYER NOTES

KIRILL THE THRILL

- **Kirill Kaprizov** leads the NHL with 15 even-strength points (6-9=15) and ranks T-1st with 21 points (7-14=21) and eight multi-point games, third with a plus-12 rating, and T-3rd with 14 assists.
- Leads NHL forwards in TOI/G (22:58)
- With a three-point performance (2-1=3) vs. TBL (11/1), notched the 35th game with three-plus points of his career and moved past Mikko Koivu (34 games) for most in franchise history.
- Kaprizov was named the NHL's Third Star of the Month for October (5-3=18 in 9 GP), averaging two points/game (first in NHL) and tallying a point in eight of nine contests to lead the Wild to a 6-1-2 record. Is the fourth Wild player to be named an NHL Star of the Month, joining Eric Staal, (First Star-Feb. 2018); Devan Dubnyk (4x) and Josh Harding (Third Star-Nov. 2013).
- Recorded the 37th multi-assist game of his career with two assists (0-2=2) at PHI (10/26), passing Pierre-Marc Bouchard and Mikael Granlund for sole possession of fourth-most in franchise history.
- Scored his 27th career game-opening goal at TBL (10/24) to pass Jason Zucker for the fourth most in Wild history.
- Needs one PPG to tie Mikko Koivu (60 PPG) for second-most all-time in franchise history.
- Kaprizov led Minnesota in points (46-50=96) and goals and was second in assists last season. Ranked T-3rd in the NHL with 19 PPG, fifth with 41 PPP (19-22=41), T-8th in goals, T-11th with eight GWG and 11th in points.
- Is the first player in franchise history to post three consecutive seasons with 40-plus goals.
- Is one of four NHL players (Matthews, Pastrnak, Draisaitl) with 40-plus goals in each of the last three seasons (2021-24).
- Kaprizov has been named an NHL Star of the Week five times in his career, trailing only Devan Dubnyk (6x) for most in franchise history. He is the only Wild player to receive four First Star awards (also 1/18/21).

STONE-COLD KIRILL-ER

- Kaprizov notched the 23rd GWG of his career at CBJ (10/19), moving into a tie with Eric Staal for fourth-most in team history.

- Kaprizov recorded a seven-game multi-point and assist streaks (6-11=17) from 10/15 - 11/1.
- His streak of seven consecutive games with multiple points is a franchise record and T-4th longest in the NHL since the 2000-01 season.

PLAYER NOTES

CROWN JOEL

- **Joel Eriksson Ek** recorded a three-game goal and point streak (3-2=5) from 10/22 - 10/26.
- Eriksson Ek played in his 500th career NHL game vs. SEA (10/12).
- Opened the season with a goal (1-0=1) and five hits vs. CBJ (10/10), tied for the ninth-highest single-game hit total of his career.
- Currently with 38 career PPGs, Eriksson Ek needs one PPG to tie Brian Rolston (39 PPGs with MIN) for sixth on the franchise's all-time list.
- Eriksson Ek ranked second on the Wild with 12 PPGs and a career-high 30 goals last season while ranking third in points (30-34=64).
- Became the 11th player in franchise history to record 30 goals in a single season, reaching the mark vs. SJS (3/28/24).
- Eriksson Ek posted an eight-game point streak (7-8=15) from 2/9/24 to 2/24/24, a career long.
- Posted a career-long four-game goal streak (7-4=11) from 2/12/24 to 2/19/24.

BOLDY AND THE BEAUTIFUL

- **Matt Boldy** is T-1st in the NHL with three GWG, T-9th with three PPG and T-10th with six PPP (3-3=6).
- recorded a four-game point streak (2-4=6) from 10/19 - 10/26.
- Boldy reached 100 career assists at CBJ (10/19), becoming the 26th player to reach 100 assists in a Wild sweater.
- Boldy opened the 2024-25 season with three points (1-2=3) vs. CBJ (10/10), marking his 12th career three-point game and becoming the sixth player in franchise history with three-plus points in the season opener.
- Finished T-15th in the NHL with seven GWG in 2023-24.
- Finished 2023-24 second on the Wild with 69 points (29-40=69), reaching a new single-season career high with an assist at VGK (4/12).
- Collected his 100th career point (45-55=100) in the 125th game of his career at PIT (4/6/23). Among players to debut with the franchise, he required the second-fewest games to reach the mark behind Kirill Kaprizov (92 GP).

THE GUS BUS IS ROLLING

- **Filip Gustavsson** owns a 6-1-1 record through eight starts, ranking T-2nd in the NHL in wins, third in GAA (2.12) and fourth in SV% (.924) among qualified goalies.
- Has allowed two or fewer goals in six starts this season, tied for most in the NHL.
- Earned the NHL's Third Star of the Week for the period ending 10/20 after going 2-0-0, stopping 50 of 52 shots faced in two starts for a 1.00 GAA and a .962 SV%.
- Gustavsson scored the first goal of his hockey career, a power-play goal, at STL (10/15), becoming the first goaltender in franchise history to find the net.
- Is one of 15 goalies in NHL history to score a goal, a feat that has only been done a total 18 times.
- The play also marked the third PPG scored by a goalie in NHL history.
- He is the 10th goalie to score a goal by shooting it into an empty net (the others were the last to touch an own-goal).

BROCKED AND LOADED

- **Brock Faber** recorded a three-game point streak (2-1=3) from 10/26 - 11/1.
- Ranks fifth in the NHL with 25:28 of TOI/G and T-8th among NHL defensemen with a plus-8 rating.
- Reached 50 career points (8-42=50) in his 89th career game at CBJ (10/19), becoming the second-fastest Wild defenseman to reach 50 points with the franchise (Ryan Suter, 83 games).
- Faber led all NHL rookies with 24:58 TOI per game and 150 blocked shots, ranked T-1st with 39 assists and third with 46 points (8-39=47). Faber finished sixth among all NHL skaters in TOI/game.
- With a blocked shot at LAK (4/15/24), became the ninth NHL rookie to post 150-plus blocks in a season since 2005-06.
- With two blocks at COL (3/8/24), reached 126 for the season and moved past Nate Prosser (124 blocked shots in 2011-12) for the highest single-season blocked shot total by a rookie in franchise history.
- With an assist vs. PIT (2/9/24), moved his season point total to 4-27=31 and surpassed Filip Kuba (9-21=30 in 2000-01) for the highest single-season point total by a Wild rookie defenseman. Also moved past Calen Addison (26 assists in 2022-23) for most single-season assists by a Wild rookie.
- Played in his 50th career game vs. NSH (1/25). With 29 points (4-25=29) in 50 career games, matched Marek Zidlicky for the second-most points by a Wild defenseman through their first 50 games with the Wild. The only blueliner with more is Ryan Suter (4-29=33 in 50 GP), per NHL Stats.
- Recorded five games with 30-plus minutes of TOI last season, four of which came in a five-game span from 12/14/23 to 12/21/23. Became one of two NHL rookies since 1997-98 to play four games with 30-plus minutes of TOI in a single season.
- **Skated a career-high 33:25 vs. MTL (12/21/23), the highest single-game total in the NHL last season and the third-highest by an NHL rookie since the start of the 2000-01 season.**
- Per NHL Stats, since time on ice began being tracked in 1997-98, Faber is only the 2nd rookie to record consecutive 30-plus-minute games (Atlanta's Toby Enstrom in March 2008), doing so vs. CGY (12/14/23) and vs. VAN (12/16/23).

PLAYER NOTES

MARCO POLO

- **Marco Rossi** recorded a career-long six-game point streak (3-4=7) from 10/12 - 10/24. Owns points in nine of 11 games played this season (3-7=10).
- Posted a three-game goal streak (3-0=3) from 10/12 - 10/22, also a career-long mark.
- Rossi picked up his 46th career point in his 108th career game at CBJ (10/19). Per NHL Stats, he surpassed Marko Dano (45 in 141 GP) for fifth most by an Austria-born player.
- Among NHL rookies, Rossi finished second in goals (21), T-3rd in shots (167), T-4th in GWG (two) and fifth in points (21-19=40) last season.
- With two assists at LAK (4/15/24), became the third rookie in franchise history with 40 points in a single season.
- Recorded a career-high seven shots on goal vs. STL (3/23/24) and notched his third career multi-goal game (2-0=2), moving his season total to 20 goals and joining Kirill Kaprizov (27 goals, 2020-21) as the only Wild rookies with 20-goal seasons. Also moved past Marian Gaborik (18-18=36, 2000-01 season) for the fourth-highest single-season point total by a Wild rookie.
- Rossi became the third-fastest Wild rookie to record ten goals in a season by scoring vs. CGY (12/14/23), his 27th game played in 2023-24. The only others to require fewer than 30 games to reach the mark are Kirill Kaprizov (25 GP in 2020-21) and Matt Boldy (25 GP in 2021-22).

MATS-TER OF HIS CRAFT

- **Mats Zuccarello** recorded a four-game point streak (2-3=5) from 10/15 - 10/24.
- Posted a 1-1=2 statline at FLA (10/22) and became the fastest player in team history (ninth overall) to reach 200 assists with the Wild, doing so in his 330th game with the club. The previous mark was held by Mikko Koivu (400 games). He also became the sixth player in team history to record 70 multi-point games with the club.
- Zuccarello reached 200 career goals by scoring vs. SEA (10/12), becoming the first Norwegian-born player to reach the mark.
- He finished first on the Wild with 51 assists last season.
- With two assists at COL (4/9/24), reached the 50-assist mark for the second season in his career (also 2021-22, 55 assists).
- Needs one assist to tie Zach Parise (201 assists with MIN) for eighth-most in franchise history.
- Zuccarello tied his single-game career high with four points (1-3=4) vs. VAN (2/19/24) and four points (0-4=4) at SEA (2/24/24).
- His four-assist game at SEA (2/24/24) was tied for the second-highest single-game assist total in franchise history. Now has five four-point games with the Wild, second-most in franchise history (Gaborik, seven).

IN FULL BLOOM

- Goaltender **Marc-Andre Fleury** played in his 100th career game for Minnesota at PIT (10/29).
- Currently at 1,028 career games played, needs one game appearance to tie Patrick Roy (1,029 career games) for third-most all time.
- Is playing in his 21st career NHL season, tied for second-most by a goaltender in NHL history and trailing only Martin Brodeur (22 seasons).
- Posted the 75th shutout of his NHL career vs. ANA (3/14/24) and needs one more to tie Tony Esposito and Ed Belfour (76 career SO each) for 10th most in NHL history.
- Fleury recorded his 552nd career win with a 5-0 victory vs. NYI (1/15/24), moving past Patrick Roy (551 career wins) for second-most in NHL history.
- Fleury became the fourth goaltender in NHL history to reach 1,000 games played when he started vs. WPG (12/31/23).
- With his 20th save of the game vs. WPG (12/31/23), became the third goaltender in NHL history to reach 26,000 career saves.
- He made 24 saves at NYR (11/9/23) to reach 25,808 career saves and pass Roy (25,800 career saves) for third most in NHL history.
- Fleury made a season-high 40 saves in a 4-3 OT win at BOS (12/19/23), his 40th career game with 40-plus saves (T-11th most in NHL history).
- Fleury played 58:31 vs. LAK (10/19/23), moving his career minutes total to 57,164:32 and surpassing Terry Sawchuk (57,155:51) for fourth on the all-time list among NHL goaltenders.
- Fleury notched the 65th shootout win of his career vs. NYR (11/4), further extending his all-time NHL record.
- Fleury has recorded a shutout against 29-of-32 NHL teams (St. Louis, Vegas and Minnesota), the most in league history.
- Fleury faced his 28th career penalty-shot attempt at MTL (10/25). Per NHL Stats, Fleury's 22 saves on 28 all-time attempts trail only Roberto Luongo (33 PS SA, 29 PS saves) for the all-time lead in both categories.
