LONGEST WINNING STREAK: 10 (three times) last - 2023-24. Began 1/27, Ended 2/24

LONGEST HOME WINNING STREAK: 14 1939-40. Began 12/19 with 5-2 victory over Montreal. Ended 2/29 when defeated by Chicago, 2-1.

LONGEST ROAD WINNING STREAK: 9 2019-20. Began 1/16 with a 3-2 victory over NY Islanders. Ended 2/28 when defeated by Philadelphia, 5-2.

LONGEST WINNING STREAK AT START OF SEASON: 5 (twice) last - 2008-09. Began 10/4 with 2-1 victory over Tampa Bay. Ended 10/15 when defeated by Buffalo, 3-1.

LONGEST HOME WINNING STREAK AT START OF SEASON: 8 1990-91. Began 10/8 with 6-3 victory over Minnesota. Ended 11/2 when defeated by Islanders, 3-2.

LONGEST ROAD WINNING STREAK AT START OF SEASON: 41931-32. Began 11/2 with 4-1 victory over Montreal. Ended 12/3 with 1-1 tie against Detroit.

**LONGEST WINNING STREAK VS. A SINGLE TEAM:** 15 Began 1/24/29 with 3-1 victory over Pittsburgh. Ended 2/22/31 with 6-1 victory over Philadelphia. (Pittsburgh moved to Philadelphia prior to the 1930-31 season and subsequently folded following that season).

LONGEST HOME WINNING STREAK VS. A SINGLE TEAM: 16 Began 1/5/11 with a 2-1 victory over Carolina. Ended 2/8/19 when defeated by Carolina, 3-0.

LONGEST ROAD WINNING STREAK VS. A SINGLE TEAM: 8 (twice) last - Began 3/20/73 with a 6-1 victory over Minnesota. Ended 2/28/76 when defeated by Minnesota, 5-3.

 $\textbf{LONGEST UNDEFEATED STREAK: } 19 1939-40. (14-0-5-0) \ Began 11/23 with 1-1 tie against Montreal. Ended 1/14 when defeated by Chicago, 2-1. (Rangers then won next five games for overall stretch of 24 victories or ties in 25 games).$ 

LONGEST HOME UNDEFEATED STREAK: 26 (19-0-7-0) Began 3/29/70, with a 4-1 victory over Montreal.

Ended 2/3/71, when defeated by Chicago, 4-2. (The streak covered the final two games of the 1969-70 season and the first 24 games of the 1970-71 season).

LONGEST ROAD UNDEFEATED STREAK: 11 1939-40. (6-0-5-0) Began 11/5 with 1-1 tie against Detroit. Ended 1/14 when defeated by Chicago, 2-1.

LONGEST UNDEFEATED STREAK AT START OF SEASON: 5 (three times) last - 2008-09. Began 10/4 with 2-1 victory over Tampa Bay. Ended 10/15 when defeated by Buffalo, 3-1.

LONGEST HOME UNDEFEATED STREAK AT START OF SEASON: 24 (17-0-7-0) Began 10/14/70 with 3-0 victory over Buffalo. Ended 2/3/71 when defeated by Chicago, 4-2.

LONGEST ROAD UNDEFEATED STREAK AT START OF SEASON: 11 (6-0-5-0) Began 11/5/39 with 1-1 tie at Detroit. Ended 1/14/40 when defeated by Chicago, 2-1.

LONGEST UNDEFEATED STREAK VS. A SINGLE TEAM: 20 (15-0-5-0) Began 2/8/70 with 5-1 victory over Los Angeles. Ended 11/1/73 when defeated at Los Angeles, 2-1.

LONGEST HOME UNDEFEATED STREAK VS. A SINGLE TEAM: 30 (27-0-3-0) Began 2/8/69 with 2-0 victory over St. Louis, Ended 10/15/80 when defeated by St. Louis, 2-1.

**LONGEST ROAD UNDEFEATED STREAK VS. A SINGLE TEAM:** 17 (11-0-6-0) Began 2/25/55 with 2-2 tie at Chicago. Ended 11/3/57 with a 3-2 victory at Chicago.

LONGEST TIE STREAK: 4 (twice) last - 1997-98. Began 10/3 with 2-2 tie against Islanders. Ended 10/11 with 6-3 victory at Vancouver.

LONGEST HOME TIE STREAK: 3 1969-70. Began 11/29 with 2-2 tie against Philadelphia. Ended 12/7 with 6-3 victory over Montreal.

LONGEST ROAD TIE STREAK: 3 1929-30. Began 3/1 with 3-3 tie at Toronto. Ended 3/8 when defeated at Montreal, 6-0.

LONGEST TIE STREAK VS. A SINGLE TEAM: 7 Began 2/9/69 with 3-3 tie against Philadelphia. Ended 11/25/70 when defeated at Philadelphia, 3-1.

During the 2005-06 season, the NHL instituted the shootout to follow a scoreless five-minute overtime to eliminate ties.

The winning team in the shootout gains two points and a win in the standings, while the losing team receives one point, recorded as an "OT" in the standings.
